Dedication of Public Highway.

City of Perth.

Corr. 1982/19.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for street or way within the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Resumption of Land in Victoria Locations 2044 and 2045.

Corr. No. 9912/12.

WHEREAS by Crown Grants under "The Land Regulations, 1887," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Volume 95, Folios 37 and 38, Victoria Locations 2044 and 2045, containing 100 acres and 150 acres, respectively, were granted to John Menhennet Pascoe, of Dongara, farmer, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvements works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of a Road: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grants as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being portions not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grants, was on the 14th day of May, 1919, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of a Road.

Those portions of Victoria Locations 2044 and 2045 containing 2 roods and 1/10th perches and 2 acres 3 roods and 22 perches, respectively, as surveyed and shown on Diagram 43187. (Plan 123/80, E2.)

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Grazing Lease 907/68 (Plantagenet Location 1155), as described hereunder should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 12 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say for Quarry (Gravel): Now therefore I, Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Grazing Lease 907/68 (Plantagenet Location 1155), for the purpose aforesaid.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 14 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, abolish a District and dissolve a Board thereof: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the Lake Grace Vermin District and dissolve the Board thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, abolish the aforesaid Lake Grace Vermin District and dissolve the Board thereof.

Agric. No. 1011/18.

WHEREAS it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, and specify the boundaries of any such District: And whereas it is further enacted by Section 45 of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District situated within the South-West Division of the State to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District or which is comprised in the Road District: And whereas it is deemed expedient that that portion of the Dumbleyung Road District which is situated within the South-West Division of the State should be constituted a Vermin District, and that the Board of the said Road District should be appointed the Board of such Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers him in this behalf enabling, constitute the said portion of the said Road District to be a Vermin District, under the name of the Dumbleyung Vermin District, and doth appoint the Road Board of the said Road District to be the Vermin Board of the said Vermin District.

The Public Works Act, 1902.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide a ballast pit for the Greenhills-Quairading Railway, in the Avon District, as is delineated and shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., No. 19888, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

Governor. Order of St. Michael and St. George,
[L.S.] Governor in and over the State of
Western Australia and its Dependen-
cies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, when it is inexpedient that a day appointed for a Bank holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare by Proclamation that such day shall not be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a holiday instead thereof: And whereas under the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Amendment Act, 1899," Monday, the 9th day of June would, except as hereinafter declared, be observed as a Bank Holiday in commemoration of the birthday of the Sovereign: And whereas it is desirable that Tuesday, the 3rd day of June, should be appointed to be a Bank Holiday, the intention being that the birthday of the Sovereign should be observed on that day instead of the 9th day of June: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the 9th day of June proximo shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I appoint the 3rd day of June proximo to be a Bank Holiday instead of the first-named day.
