WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor-in-Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in heads of departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointments of Cleaners (who are exempt from the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904,") employed in the Police Department should be vested in the officer whose name or office is set out in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby ordains and declares that the power of appointing such cleaners (who are exempt from "The Public Service Act, 1904,") in the Police Department shall be vested, and the same is hereby vested in each of the officers mentioned in the schedule hereto, and in the person for the time being acting in the place of any such officer, with effect from 1st March, 1919.

ACT, 1918.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under the above Act for the training and settlement of discharged soldiers or their dependants on the land.

REGULATIONS.

*Interpretations.*

1. "Board." The term "Board" throughout these Regulations shall mean Discharged Soldiers Land Settlement Board appointed under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1918.

"Act" means the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1918.

"Dependant" means the widow, or the parent, or a child, or ex-nuptial child, or an orphan brother, or an orphan sister of a deceased person who—

- (a) Was a resident in the Commonwealth or the Dominion of New Zealand; and
- (b) Was appointed as an officer or enlisted as a member of His Majesty's naval or military forces or of the Naval or Military forces of the Commonwealth or the Dominion of New Zealand for service outside the Commonwealth or the Dominion of New Zealand; and
- (c) Has served outside the Commonwealth or Dominion of New Zealand with any of such forces,

if such dependant was wholly or in part dependent upon the earnings of such deceased person at any time during the period beginning twelve months before his appointment or enlistment, and ending with—

- (i.) The termination of his appointment, or his discharge; or
- (ii.) His death, in any case where (whether before or after the termination of his appointment or his discharge) he has lost his life directly or indirectly in or in connection with the present war.

"Discharged soldier" means—

- (a) Any person who, being or having been a resident in the Commonwealth or the Dominion of New Zealand, was appointed as an officer or enlisted as a member of the naval or military forces of the Commonwealth, or was appointed as an officer or enlisted in the United Kingdom, or in any of His Majesty's Dominions for service in His Majesty's naval or military forces, and has served in such forces in the present war outside the Commonwealth.
- (b) Any person who, being or having been resident in the Commonwealth, was appointed as an officer or enlisted in the naval or military forces of the Commonwealth for active service abroad in the present war, but whose service was confined to the Commonwealth, and who, in the opinion of the Board, was unable, through circumstances not within his own control, to serve abroad as aforesaid; and in either such case—
- (c) Has received his discharge, and is resident in the Commonwealth.

The Minister may extend the above definition to include any person who, not being or having been resident in the Commonwealth or the Dominion of New Zealand, was appointed as an officer or enlisted as a member of the naval or military forces of the United Kingdom or of any of His Majesty's Dominions, and has been on active service in the said war, and has received his discharge and is resident in the Commonwealth.

"Minister" means the Minister for Lands or other the responsible Minister for the Crown charged for the time being with the administration of the Act.

*Land for Settlement.*

2. (1.) Land may be set apart for selection by "Discharged Soldiers" or "Dependants" by notice in the "Government Gazette" under the Act, or the Land Act, 1898, or the Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1909.

(2.) Alienated land (including homestead farms or conditional purchase holdings) or pastoral leases may be purchased by the Minister on the recommendation of the Board on behalf of any approved applicant, pro-

vided that such applicant must submit a written offer from the vendor together with sufficient description of the property to enable it to be located for inspection.

(3.) Lots within townsites and lots outside of townsites of not more than 10 acres may be set apart for the purpose of the erection thereon, by means of voluntary efforts and labour and public or private subscriptions, of buildings for discharged soldiers; and the Minister may permit or cause buildings to be erected thereon.

(4.) After the erection of any buildings the Minister may permit any person or body of persons to allow any discharged soldier to occupy such allotment and the buildings thereon, and upon the recommendation of such person or body of persons the discharged soldier may be granted the allotment on payment of such price (if any) that may be fixed; subject, however, to such conditions as may be decided upon.

*Applications.*

3. (1.) Applications for land set apart for selection by discharged soldiers or dependants may be lodged at the Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, or at the local land office of the district in which the land is situated, on or before the specified date on which the land is gazetted open. If more than one application is received for the same land on or before the closing date or for any unselected land on the same day after the closing date, the Board shall allot the land.

(2.) In the event of an applicant not having received his qualification certificate, he must lodge the prescribed deposit with his application, together with a declaration in the form of Schedule 1 if a discharged soldier, and Schedule 2 if a dependant. When he receives his qualification certificate the deposit may be refunded and debited as part of his advance as provided for herein, if he makes application accordingly.

(3.) A parent or relative of a soldier or sailor on active service abroad with any naval or military forces raised in the Commonwealth, or any other person acting with the authority of such soldier or sailor, may make application on his behalf for any land available for discharged soldiers.

(4.) Soldiers or sailors on whose behalf application is made must obtain a qualification certificate within six months from the date of discharge, and failing to do this, or in the event of the death of the soldier or sailor before entering into occupation of the land, or of his inability or unwillingness to occupy and work the land within such period after discharge as the Board may decide, or if in the opinion of the Board he has become disqualified to make application under the Act, the holding shall be forfeited.

*Qualification of Applicants.*

4. (1.) All applicants for land must lodge a declaration in the form of Schedule 1 or 2, as the case may be, and obtain a qualification certificate from the Board in the form of Schedule 3 before such land, or assistance under the Act, can be granted.

(2.) Applicants for qualification certificates in the case of discharged soldiers may be required to produce a doctor's certificate as to physical fitness for farm work, and give the names and addresses of the last and one previous employer to whom reference will be made as to character and experience. In the case of dependants, applicants must give the names of two persons, one of whom should be a minister of religion, magistrate, or justice of the peace, or Government official (State or Commonwealth) to whom reference can be made as to the past dependence on the deceased soldier. Applications must be made within two years from the date of the declaration of the Peace.

*Railway Fares and Freights.*

5. (1.) An applicant for a qualification certificate may, on the approval of the Board, obtain a refund of the railway fare which he paid to enable him to attend a Board meeting, and to inspect land.

(2.) Ticket orders for fares and freights for the settler, his family and goods, at reduced rates, may be secured on application up to six months from date of approval of the land in his favour.

*Rent.*

6. Land rents shall be payable in accordance with "The Land Act, 1898," as modified by the Act, and five years' exemption may be granted from date of approval of the lease of holdings under the Act.

*Conversion of Holdings.*

7. Any soldier prior to enlistment who held land in fee simple or under conditional purchase or homestead farm conditions may apply to have his holding brought under the operations of the Act; and if his application is approved, such holding shall be subject to the provisions of the Act and these Regulations.

*Advances.*

8. (1) All applications for advances must be made on the prescribed form set out in Schedule 4 herein, and application for the purchase of a property must be lodged on such form, showing total amount of advances required inclusive of the purchase money.

(2) Advances may be made by the Agricultural Bank, on the recommendation of the Board, under the provisions of "The Agricultural Bank Act, 1906," and these Regulations for any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Clearing, fencing, ring-barking, water supply, drainage, irrigation.
- (b) Erection of buildings, provision of household furniture and effects (maximum, £35 in each case).
- (c) Purchase of live stock, machinery, seed, fertilisers.
- (d) And such other improvements, commodities, or requirements as may be deemed necessary for the successful occupation and cultivation of the land.
- (e) For the purpose of purchasing improved properties or paying off existing liabilities on land already held by the applicant.

(3) Rate of interest payable on £625 of the advance shall be 3½ per cent. for the first year, rising by ½ per cent. per annum until the maximum rate of interest as fixed for the time being is reached.

(4) On any further advances the usual Agricultural Bank Act or Industries Act rates will be charged.

(5) After five years the advances under the Agricultural Bank Act will be repayable to that institution by instalments extending over 25 years with interest added.

(6) Advances under the Industries Assistance Act must be repaid with interest added as prescribed by the said Act.

*Sustenance.*

9. Nothing herein contained will be deemed to affect any allowance from the Commonwealth to which a discharged soldier may be entitled after obtaining land and advances from the Crown.

*Fees.*

10. The statutory fees required under the Act or under "The Land Act, 1898," "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1909," and "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," shall not be more than 50 per cent., and under "The Agricultural Bank Act, 1906," not more than five shillings per cent. of those prescribed. The fees required may be advanced to approved applicants by the Agricultural Bank, and such advance shall be deemed to be part of the advance under Clause 8 herein.

*Residence.*

11. Residence on land held under these Regulations is compulsory for at least six months of each of the first five years, and any request for exemption for special reasons will be subject to the approval of the Minister on the recommendation of the Board; each case to be dealt with on its merits.

*Transfers.*

12. No land acquired by a discharged soldier or dependant under the Act shall be transferred, mortgaged, or encumbered except with the consent of the Minister, on the recommendation of the Board, and subject to such conditions as the Minister may prescribe. Such consent shall not be given for a period of five years to a person who is not a discharged soldier or a dependant, unless the Board is satisfied that no discharged soldier is willing to acquire the holding and capable of working it.

If the land is transferred to any other than a discharged soldier or a dependant, the privileges under the Act and these Regulations shall cease, and the conditions of the holding shall, so far as practicable, revert to the ordinary conditions of selection.

*Price of Land.*

13. The price of Crown land exclusive of the value of improvements (if any) and survey fees will be one half of the price fixed under "The Land Act, 1898," and any discharged soldier holding land prior to his enlistment may apply for a reduction in price accordingly, in which case one half of the amount already paid by him as rent may be applied towards the payment of the balance of the purchase money.

Nothing herein contained shall apply to land made available under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1909," or otherwise acquired for settlement.

*Group Settlement.*

14. (1) Land may be set apart as a settlement for a group of discharged soldiers, and on subdivision the holdings shall be known as home maintenance areas.

After the Board is satisfied as to the fitness and suitability of any discharged soldier who joins a group, it may allot him a block in the settlement subject to such conditions as may be prescribed. Within twelve months from the date of such confirmation as notified in the allotment if satisfied with the fitness and suitability of the soldier, and his title to the holding shall commence from the date of such confirmation as notified in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) If the Board is dissatisfied with any discharged soldier in a group settlement, it may cancel the allotment at any time prior to confirmation thereof without payment of any compensation to the soldier.

*Experience necessary.*

15. Any applicant who, in the opinion of the Board, has not had sufficient practical farming experience may be required, before being granted a qualification certificate, to acquire further experience on a training farm or with some established farmer for such time as may be deemed necessary, and the Board on being satisfied that he is competent to manage his own farm may then grant him a qualification certificate.

*Training Farms.*

16. (1) Training farms may be provided for the training of those who, in the opinion of the Board, should have further farming experience; but no applicant will be granted permission to go to a training farm until he has applied to the Board for a qualification certificate

(2) Trainees will be required to place themselves unreservedly under the direction of the manager of the farm and will be expected to diligently carry out the duties allotted to them.

(3) Railway fare from Perth or such other place as may be decided by the Board will be advanced, and its value will not be claimed from the discharged soldier if his residence on the training farm should exceed one calendar month.

(4) During the first month the farm manager may keep back from the wages earned such sum as may be decided by the Board towards paying the cost of the railway fare; but should the discharged soldier of his own accord or compulsorily for breach of discipline leave the training farm prior to completion of one month's residence, the value of the railway fare will be forfeited.

(5) Discharged soldiers will be expected to take part under the direction of the manager or his assistant, in every class of work that may from time to time be in progress on the farm. The hours of work and holidays shall be such as may be decided by the manager from time to time with the approval of the Board.

(6) Sickness or accident incapacitating a discharged soldier from active work must be notified to the manager as soon as incurred, and if not traceable to personal misconduct, and duly recognised by the manager as sufficient reason for absence from work, the discharged soldier will receive half-pay and keep until he can take up work again, and so long as he continues in residence on the farm.

(7) The manager may in his discretion seek the opinion of a medical practitioner when he deems it necessary.

(8) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the removal of a discharged soldier to any medical or nursing institution in cases of serious or prolonged illness.

(9) The Board reserves to itself the right to remove from a training farm those whose condition is such to lead to frequent and repeated absence on account of sickness.

(10) Those required to work on King's Birthday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, or New Year's Day will be assigned an additional holiday on some other date in lieu thereof.

(11) Application for leave without pay for private reasons will be in the discretion of the manager subject to an appeal to the Board.

(12) Intoxicating liquor of any kind will not be allowed on the training farm, and anyone bringing it on the farm will be liable to be removed.

(13) Any discharged soldier found on the farm under the influence of liquor will for the first offence be fined one day's pay; for the second offence one week's pay, and for the third offence will be liable to be removed.

(14) Absence from the training farm without leave will render the offender liable to a fine of one day's pay, while repeated breaches of this rule will render him liable to removal.

(15) Insubordination or disobedience to those in lawful charge will render the offender liable to immediate removal at the discretion of the Board.

(16) No penalties or fines will be imposed by the manager prior to a personal interview with the offender, and full particulars of any offence and penalty must be kept by the manager in a book specially set apart for the purpose.

(17) Any discharged soldier desiring from personal reasons to leave a training farm will be expected to give one week's notice, in writing, to the manager stating, if possible, the reasons which have led to his withdrawal from the farm.

(18) The manager of a training farm shall report to the Board on the first of each month in respect to the general conduct and aptitude of every trainee on his farm, giving full particulars of any penalties imposed and the reasons thereof.

(19) Any discharged soldier who has been directed by the Board to obtain further practical farming experience may be permitted to apply for land and, provided the land is not lawfully granted to any other person, such land may be held for him during his period of training and will be approved to him at the expiration of such period. This provision will not apply to the purchase of an estate.

Progress Reports.

17. The inspectors of the Agricultural Bank will report from time to time to that institution as to the progress and prospects of the settlers holding land under these Regulations. If a settler is found guilty of neglect of stock, implements, machinery or improvements, or failure to carry on his operations in a proper manner, or proves unfit for a farm life, the Agricultural Bank, on the Board's approval, may stop further advances, recall the advances made, and enter into possession as mortgagee.

Crown Grant.

18. On compliance with the obligations under the lease and the conditions prescribed by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1918, and the Regulations thereunder, a Crown Grant will issue.

Security.

19. The selector to whom advances are approved must complete such documents of security as may be required by any legally constituted State authority before any advances are made.

Repeal.

20. The Regulations published in the "Government Gazette" of the 14th December, 1917, the 18th January, 1918, and the 7th June, 1918, relating to the selection of land by persons who have been on active service with His Majesty's naval and military forces are hereby repealed.
