*The Roads Act, 1911.*

WHEREAS by Section 185 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may, in his discretion, extend the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to any District or portion thereof: And whereas it is desirable to extend such provisions to the Broome Ward of the Broome Road Board District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Order in Council made under Section 185 of "The Roads Act, 1911," extend such provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to the Broome Ward, contained in the Broome Road Board District.

*The Vermin Act, 1918.*

WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, or alter regulations for carrying this Act into effect: And whereas the Governor, acting under the aforesaid Act, did on the 19th March, 1919, make certain regulations, which regulations were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st day of March, 1919: And whereas it is desirable that Regulation No. 93 shall be repealed, and that the Regulation hereinafter set out should be made under the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby repeal the aforesaid regulation and does make the regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

"93. Scalps and tails shall be handed to the Clerk to the Board, or a person authorised in writing by the Chief Inspector for that purpose, and shall be totally destroyed by fire by such clerk or authorised person in the presence of some other person, both of whom shall certify in writing that the requirements of these regulations have been fully complied with.

Any Vermin Board applying to the Minister for a refund of the Government bonus shall furnish with such application a statement in writing certified by the Chairman of the Board and the Clerk to the Board, giving the names and addresses of the persons to whom bonuses have been paid, the place where scalps have been destroyed, the number of scalps paid for to each person; the date of payment; the amount paid, and the amount claimed from the Department."

*Constitution of Health District at Gingin under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911."*

M.P.H. 2791/18.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Gingin Health District.

*By-laws.*

By-laws passed by the Beverley Road Board at an ordinary meeting held May 10, 1919, for the control by the Board of Common Reserve No. 231.

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meanings as stated:—

"District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Beverley District Road Board.

“Chairman”—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

“Board”—The Beverley District Road Board.

“Member”—A member of the Beverley District Road Board.

“Road”—Any road as defined by “The Roads Act, 1911.”

“Reserve”—Any reserve or common under the control of the Board.

“Person” shall include the plural, also a body corporate.

“Officer” shall mean any officer of the Board.

“Ranger” shall mean the Ranger appointed by the Board.

“Secretary” shall mean the Secretary of the Board.

1. All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.

2. That no person shall run or depasture stock of any description on the Common unless the owner of such stock is the holder of a license under these By-laws and prescribed fees are paid, except as herein provided, and the following fees shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon; persons residing within the boundaries of the Central Ward only have the right to a license to run stock upon the Common.

3. The scale of fees shall be as follows:—

Horses, mules, and asses—1s. 6d. per week per head.

Dairy cows (milking)—free.

All other cattle—1s. per week per head.

4. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Common at any time a greater number of horses than 10 head or cattle a greater number than 10 head, over the age of six (6) months.

5. Any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall pay commonage fees.

6. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Common as heretofore provided to furnish the Secretary of the Board or Ranger of the Board with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them on the Common within twelve hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

7. That all license fees shall be due and payable monthly or on the date of issue of license, if applied for and issued during a current year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall, at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two (2) members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid.

8. That no entire horse, donkey, or bull, over the age of six months (except by permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the Common, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereon if known, any such horse, donkey, or bull camel found thereon shall be dealt with in the manner prescribed by “The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882” (46 Vict., No. 7).

9. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any horse or cattle depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

10. The Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

11. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any constable, ranger, or officer of the Board.

12. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, and £2 per day for each succeeding breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

13. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.
