Smith, the Secretary of the abovenamed Union, there being no appearance on behalf of any party desiring to be heard in opposition, and upon being satisfied that the requirements of the Act and Regulations have been complied with, the Court doth declare that the industrial agreement, dated the 16th day of June, 1919, made between the Union and the Employers, and registered No. 10/1919, shall have the effect of an award and be a Common Rule of the Industry to which it relates within that portion of the State of Western Australia as is comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1911," and "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," the Perth Road Board has established a Public Pound on Lots 4 and 5 of Swan Location Y, situate in Government Road and Ferguson Avenue, in the Peninsula Ward.

The following Trespass, Impounding, and Sustenance Fees shall be charged and collected by the Pound-keeper:—

Poundage Fees.

- 3s. per head for every entire horse, ass, or bull.
- 1s. 6d. per head on all other great or small cattle.

Sustenance.

6s. per diem of 24 hours and 3s. 6d. per diem of 12 hours for every other head of great or small cattle. The following is the scale of fines which shall be imposed on owners of cattle for trespass upon or damage to land whereof the Perth Road Board is the owner, or upon land within the limits of the said Road Board District which shall not be enclosed by a sufficient fence:—

For every entire horse, ass, or bull, in the day-time, not less than £2 nor more than £4.
For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night-time, not less than £3 nor more than £5.
For every other head of great or small cattle, by night or by day, a sum not exceeding 20 shillings.
For trespass on a public street or thoroughfare within the limits of the District of the Perth Road Board:—
For every entire horse, ass, or bull, not less than £3 nor more than £5.
For every other head of great or small cattle, a sum not exceeding forty shillings.
By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* under date 27th August, 1915, page 3085, are hereby repealed.
