PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Privy Councillor, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the "Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1914," that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation restrict or prohibit the sale, offer for sale, supply or gift of liquor, either alone or mixed with water or other liquid, within any licensing district: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the

advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit by this Proclamation the sale, offer for sale, supply or gift of liquor, either alone or mixed with water or other liquid, within the Kalgoorlie Licensing District from the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* until the cancellation of this Proclamation.
