Broome Road Board.

Building By-laws.

The Broome Road Board, under and by virtue of the power conferred on them by Building Regulation No. 36 of the Second Schedule of "The Roads Board Act, 1911," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws, to apply only to that part of the Broome Road Board District enumerated and described in a certain Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th day of July, 1919, page 1231 (whereby the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act were extended to such part of the said Broome Road District):—

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) The word "Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor duly appointed under the provisions of the Second Schedule of "The Roads Act, 1911."
- (b) The expression "dwelling-house" shall mean a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation, not being a building the property of or occupied by or under the control or management of His Majesty's Government or any department thereof.
- (c) The expression "inhabited" applied to a room shall mean a room in which some person passes the night, or which is used as a living room, including a room with respect to which there is a probable presumption (until the contrary is shown) that some person passes the night therein, or that it is used as a living room.
- (d) The expression "habitable" applied to a room shall mean a room constructed or adapted to be inhabited.

2. Every person intending to erect any building or to alter or add to any building within the Broome Ward of the Road District of Broome shall, three days before commencing to erect, alter, or add to the same, make application in the form provided in Schedule I. hereof, and deposit with the Surveyor for a period of three clear days drawings showing the plan, elevation, and sections of the proposed building, addition, or alteration, together with full and complete specifications of the work to be done.

At the same time a locality plan showing location of proposed site, with cardinal or north point, the size and shape of the lot on which it is proposed to erect, alter, or make additions to the building, the position of the proposed building, and any building or buildings already on the lot, the relative levels of the lot with the street or way adjoining, and the position and size of any existing drains or sewers, and the position, size, depth, and gradients of all proposed drains or sewers, shall be deposited with the Surveyor, to remain permanently in his custody.

(a) All sizes and positions shall be figured and shown on the locality plan.

(b) Distinctive colouring shall be used on the locality plan for new and old buildings.

(c) The locality plan shall be drawn to a scale of 16ft. to 1in., and all other drawings to a scale of not less than 8ft. to 1in.

(d) All plans, drawings, and specifications must be signed by the building owner, or his duly authorised agent.

3. No person shall commence to erect, alter, or add to any such building until the Board shall have signified its approval of such plans and specifications by the issue to such person of a certificate of such approval to be called a "Building License," in the form provided in Schedule II. hereof.

4. No person who shall have obtained a "building license" in respect of any building shall in the construction of such building depart from the plans or specifications which have been approved by the Board without its consent in writing first had and obtained, and such alterations or departures from approved plans and specifications shall be drawn, described, and endorsed on and in the plans and specifications.

5. No person who shall hereafter erect any house or building shall construct the foundations of any such house or building upon any site or portion of any site which shall have been filled in or covered with any material impregnated or mixed with faecal, animal or vegetable matter, or which shall have been filled up or covered with dust or slop or other refuse or upon which any such matter or refuse shall have been deposited, unless and until such matter or refuse shall have been properly removed by excavation or otherwise from such site. Any holes caused by such excavation shall, if not used for a basement or a cellar, be filled in with hard brick or dry rubbish or concrete, sand, or other material to be approved by the Board.

6. Every person concerned in the erection of any building containing a habitable room or rooms shall cause—

- (a) Every such room to have a capacity of not less than three hundred cubic feet.
- (b) Every room wholly or partly in the roof of such building to be at least eight feet six inches in height from the floor to the ceiling throughout not less than one-half the floor area of such room.
- (c) Where skillions are erected the height from floor to ceiling must average not less than nine feet.
- (d) Every other room to be at least ten feet in height from the floor to the ceiling.
- (e) Every such room to have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies clear of the sash frames and free from any obstruction to the light, equal to at least one-twelfth the floor area of such room.

7. No person shall cause or allow to be constructed in any dwelling any habitable room, unless every window thereof opening directly into the external air at the side of such dwelling is provided with a clear air space, in the case of a single-storied dwelling of at least two feet six inches, and in any other case of at least three feet wide, measured square on to the exterior face of the wall in which such window is situate, such air space being in the same ownership as the dwelling.

8. No person shall convert into, or use as a dwelling-house, any building or any part thereof not originally built as and for a dwelling-house within the limits of the Broome Ward of the Broome Road District, whether built before or after the making of this By-law, without the previous consent of the Board.

9. (a) Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the intended site of any such building to be properly and thoroughly drained; and he shall cause any soakage or drainage from the adjoining sites or buildings to be completely diverted from the site of such new building.

(b) No person shall erect any building unless the underside of any part of the lowest wooden floor of any such building shall be not less than thirty inches above the surface of the land.

10. The external walls of all wooden or wood and iron buildings must be built at least 3 feet from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T. & G. jarrah, or other material approved of by the Board.

Penalties.

11. Where anything by these By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or, where

authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these By-laws. And every person guilty of a breach of these By-laws shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the work directed to be so executed and not so executed, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every breach of any such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
