WHEREAS by "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the advice of a Royal Commission, from time to time by proclamation, declare that payment of all debts then due or accruing due within the period mentioued in such due or accruing due within the period mentioned in such proclamation of the classes specified or of persons of the classes specified in the proclamation, or a specified proportion of any such debts, may, subject to such conditions and exceptions as may be contained in such proclamation, be postponed to a date or for a period to be therein specified: And whereas a Royal Commission appointed under the same Act has advised that payment of all debts of persons engaged in the farming industry and incurred in connection therewith now due, or to accrue due within the period commencing on the publication of this proclamation and ending the 31st or to accrue the winn the period commenting on the publication of this proclamation and ending the 31st day of December, 1918, should be postponed to the 1st day of January, 1920, but subject to the conditions that such persons are indebted to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board for moneys paid or advanced to them, and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in re-ceipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board, for stores to be procured by such settlers, and debts of settlers in receipt of advances only for the debts of settlers in receipt of advances only for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the Industries Assistance Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that payment of all debts of persons engaged in the farming industry and incurred in connection therewith now due or to accrue due within the period commencing on the date of the publication of this proclamation and ending on the 31st day of December, 1918, may be postponed to the 1st day of January, 1920, but subject to the conditions that such persons are indebted to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board for moneys paid or advanced to them or in respect of commodities supplied to them, and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash

advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and debts of settlers in receipt of advances only for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the Industries Assistance Act.

Regulations in relation to Public Fisheries.

1. No person shall fish or take any oysters in or from any public oyster fishery unless his action in so doing is authorised by the terms of a license granted

to him under these Regulations.

2. All oyster beds other than those included in private fisheries shall be deemed to be included in a

- Public Oyster Fishery, whether so declared or not.
 3. Applications for licenses shall be according to the form in the Schedule hereto and shall be forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Fisheries at the Fisheries Department, Perth, and be accompanied by the perscribed fee.
- The fees payable in respect of the license shall be as follows:
 - (a) Four Pounds on each license granted on or before the thirtieth day of June in each calendar year. Two Pounds in each other case.

- 5. The license shall be duly issued in the form—to the effect of the form—prescribed by the said Act, but may embody conditions or stipulations not repugnant to or inconsistent with the said Act and Regulations.
- All licenses shall terminate on the thirty-first day
- of December following the date of the grant thereof.
 7. The whole of the State or its waters containing oyster beds or fisheries shall be divided into two Dis-

tricts, namely: "The Northern District," from the Fremantle Harbour northward and eastward, and "The Southern District," from such harbour southward and eastward, and the Chief Inspector of Fisheries is solely authorised to sign and issue licenses for such Districts.

8. Two or more fisheries shall not be included in any

license unless they are situated in the same district.

9. The granting or refusing of a license shall, as regards the applicant, be in the discretion of the Chief Inspector of Fisheries.

10. Any applicant who shall have included more than one oyster bed or fishery in his application not approved shall be allowed to amend and re-submit his application without further charge and without obligaapplication without further charge and without obligation in any way upon the said officer or the Government to approve such amended application or necessarily to notify any applicant of any non-approval.

11. Nothing in these regulations shall prevent any person from fishing for or taking oysters for his personal consumption on the spot where they are gathered and not for barter or sale.

12. No license shall be deemed to give the licenses

No license shall be deemed to give the licensee

12. No heense shall be deemed to give the licensee an exclusive right in respect of any oyster fishery.

13. The references "applicant" or "person" throughout these or future regulations do and shall also apply to, mean, and include all the members of a firm partnership or syndicate and any corporation.

14. Every applicant who applies as Trustee or Agent for or with the authority or for the benefit of others shall fully disclose the same in or with his application and if requested by the said officer shall disclose the

and, if requested by the said officer, shall disclose the cestui que trust or principal, as the case may be, to such officer's satisfaction, and the onus shall be upon the applicant of proving to or satisfying such officer of his bona fides and also the bona fides from time to time of every person allegedly or presumably fishing or taking oysters from the licensed area by virtue of the said license.

Part I. shall comprise the whole of By-law No. 37 (including the schedules thereto) as it now stands, with

(a) the words "Part I." shall be inserted above
the word "signboards";

(b) in Clause 2 the words "overhanging lamp"
shall be deleted and the words "except an
illuminated sign" shall be inserted after the
word "thing" in line three thereof.

(c) Clauses 4, 5, and 9 are deleted.

(d) Clause 7 is amended by the insertion of the words "other than an illuminated sign," after the word "sign" in line one.

(e) Clause 11 is amended by the insertion of the words "other than an illuminated sign," after the word "attachments" in line two thereof.

(f) Clause 12 is amended by the insertion of the words "other than illuminated sign," after

the word "signboards" in line one thereof.

(g) Schedules 1 and 2 are amended by the insertion of the words "other than illuminated signs," after the word "signboard" whereever that word occurs.

3. The following clauses shall be added to and shall form part of the By-law:—

Part II.—Illuminated Signs.

1. For the purposes of this By-law illuminated sign shall mean and include any sign or signboard which is illuminated and shall include an overhanging lamp.

2. No person shall erect or maintain any illuminated sign over or near any public place, footway, street, or road without a permit in writing issued by the Council and signed by the Building Surveyor.

3. Application for permits in the form of Schedule No. 1 of Part II. of this By-law must be made to the Council. Such application shall be in writing addressed to the Building Surveyor signed by the applicant and shall state: shall state:

The applicant's name and address. (2) The exact position in which it is proposed to erect the sign.

The dimensions of the sign.

(4) The inscription or device to be inscribed on the sign.

The materials of which it is proposed to make (5)the sign.

The application shall be accompanied by a plan to a scale of not less than one-quarter of an inch to the foot.

If required so to do by the Building Surveyor, the applicant shall furnish any further particulars in addition

to those above detailed.

4. In the case of illuminated signs on roofs (hereinafter called "roof signs"), applications must be accompanied by-

(1) A drawing to a scale of not less than one-quarter of an inch to one foot, showing the position, design, and method of construction.

design, and method of construction.

(2) A certificate from a recognised architect that the building upon which it is proposed to erect the sign and the roof thereof are sufficiently strong and structurally sound to support such sign under all conditions, and that the design of such sign itself is structurally sound.

5. The following requirements must be complied with before permits for illuminated signs will be issued:—

(a) Illuminated signs under verandahs on balconies.—

These shall follow the contour of the roof or ceiling of verandah or balcony; shall not exceed a depth of 12 inches from the under side of such roof or ceiling; shall be fixed so that their

a depth of 12 inches from the under side of such roof or ceiling; shall be fixed so that their centre conicides with the centre of such veran-dah or balcony; may extend over the full width of such verandah or balcony; must be con-structed of approved materials (as to the frame work must be solely of metal), and of an approved design.

(b) Horizontal illuminated signs (excluding those on awnings and roofs) shall conform with the following scale as to dimensions:—

Height of bottom of sign above footway; Maximum height; Maximum projection.

12ft. up to 40ft. inclusive; 2ft.; 6in. 40ft. up to 60ft. inclusive; 3ft.; 6in. 60ft. up to 80ft. inclusive; 4ft.; 6in. 6in.

80ft. up to 100ft. inclusive; 5ft.; 6in.
100ft. and over; 6ft. 6in.; 6in.
Only one such sign will be permitted to each storey of a building, but such sign may occupy laterally the full width of the storey.

- (c) Vertical illuminated signs (excluding those on roofs) shall not extend vertically beyond the level of the floor lines immediately above and below the storey occupied by them; shall not have a projection of more than 21 inches beyond the face of the building to which they are fixed, excluding embellishments thereon, shall not have a width of more than 2 feet 6 inches not have a width of more than 2 feet 6 inches measured on the face of the building to which they are fixed; shall not be fixed within six feet of the point at which a building abuts on an adjoining building; shall have a clear horizontal space of not less than 12 feet between each sign if more than one is fixed.
- (d) Illuminated signs on roofs shall not be of a height greater than 20 feet measured from the eaves of the building on which they are fixed or, in the event of there being on such building a parapet wall, then 20 feet measured from the top of the lowest portion of such parapet wall; provided that the top of such sign shall in no case be higher than 150 feet from the ground level; shall not extend laterally beyond the walls of the building on which they are fixed; may be used for general advertising purposes, subject to the approval of the Council of the subject matter to be displayed on them.

(e) Flashing or intermittent illuminated signs shall be allowed only above the first floor level.

(f) Doctors and chemists shall be allowed to exhibit

(f) Doctors and chemists shall be allowed to exhibit an approved lamp showing a red light and so fixed as to be seen up and down a street.
(g) The wording on all illuminated signs (except those on roofs) shall be confined to—

(a) the names of the occupier or occupiers;
(b) the business carried on by such occupier

or occupiers.

The latter may in addition be notified by symbols.

symbols.

(h) Materials and designs.—All illuminated signs shall be constructed of materials and after a design to be approved of by the Building Surveyor; with the exception of the insulation of wires all materials shall be incombustible; lamps must not be enclosed with bunting or other combustible material.

(i) Construction and installation. Illuminated signs

(i) Construction and installation.—Illuminated signs shall be constructed, installed, and maintained in a safe, secure, and workmanlike manner and to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

(j) Electric installation.—The electric installation in

connection with illuminated signs shall be carried out in a workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the officer of the City of Perth in charge of the Gas and Electricity Department and in accordance with the regulations of the City of Perth and of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Western Australia.

6. The maintenance and use of illuminated signs shall be in accordance with the following conditions:—

(a) The light from illuminated signs shall at no time be sufficiently intense to cause annoyance to

the public.

(b) Illuminated signs shall be illuminated each and every night (Sundays excepted) from sunset until 9 o'clock p.m. and for no less time. (c) Flashing and intermittent illuminated signs shall

- be allowed to continue the flashing and intermittent effects only between such hours as the Council shall at their discretion from time to
- time prescribe.
 (d) Illuminated signs shall at all times be maintained as illuminated signs and shall be kept in a safe. secure, proper, and cleanly condition to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor and in accordance with the provisions of the By-law.

- 7. Permits shall be granted, continued, and renewed at the absolute discretion of the Council, and on any of the conditions or requirements set forth in this By-law the Council may serve on such permit holder notice in writing to conform to the By-law or to remove the illuminated sign in respect of which the breach of this By-law has been committed within three dams and on the By-law has been committed within three days, and on the failure of such permit holder to comply with the requirements of such notice the Council may forthwith, at the risk and expense of such permit holder, remove or have removed such illuminated sign, provided that if any illuminated sign is, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, in a condition dangerous to the public, the Building Surveyor may forthwith, without any notice to the permit holder and at the permit holder's expense and risk, remove or have removed such illuminated sign.
