Members of Parliament representing Electorates which necessitate travel by sea shall be entitled to free transport to and from their Constituencies by any State steamer which may be running, upon a sustenance charge of 8s. per day, or 2s. for each quarter day involved, the times for the computation of the charge to be fixed at 8 a.m., 1 p.m., 6 p.m., and 12 midnight. This concession does not apply to privately owned boats.

If for any reason State owned boats are not available at the times required, Members may be allowed one return trip during the financial year to and from their Constituencies upon payment to the State Government of the above sustenance charge. This concession shall not apply if any State owned boat is available within a period of six weeks.

Each Member of Parliament shall be entitled to a free return journey once in each year, available by State steamers only, for his wife and unmarried daughters, and sons under 18 years of age, on payment of the sustenance allowance hereinbefore fixed.

Under the Regulation immediately preceding, one child under three years may travel free, additional children under three years at quarter rate, between three years and 12 years half rate, 12 years and upwards full rates.

3. Any employee called back to work after leaving to be paid for at least one hour.
4. Overtime shall be paid as follows :—

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 62 of 1919.

In the matter of an Industrial Agreement, dated the 15th day of August, 1919, made between the Master Builders' and Contractors' Association Industrial Union of Employers; Millars' Timber and Trading Company, Limited; Whittaker Brothers; Bunning Brothers, Limited; A. D. Jones and Company; Mount Lyell Chemical Works; and Cuming Smith Proprietary, Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Employers"), and the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters' and Joiners' Industrial Union of Workers (Perth Branch), (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), and in the matter of an application by the above-named Union to have the said Industrial Agreement made a Common Rule.

UPON hearing Mr. E. Ketterer on behalf of the applicant Union, there being no appearance on behalf of any party desiring to be heard in opposition, and upon being satisfied that the requirements of the Act and Regulations have been complied with, the Court doth declare that the Industrial Agreement, dated the 15th day of August, 1919, made between the Employers and the Union and registered No. 18/1919, shall have the effect of an Award and be a Common Rule of the industry to which it relates within that portion of the State of Western Australia as is comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.
