THE DENTAL ACT, 1894.

Rules of the Dental Board.

C.S.O. 2180/19.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Dental Act, 1894," and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," the Dental Board may make Rules and may amend, repeal, and add to any such Rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth hereby add to the Rules made under the said Act the following, to stand as Rule 29a:—

- (1) The applicant shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board of his intention to enter upon a dental course prior to his enlistment.
- (2) He was resident in Western Australia for at least 12 months prior to his enlistment, and
- (3) He makes written application to the Board in accordance with this Rule within 12 months of the date of his discharge from war service.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ADMISSION OF
ENGINEERING CADETS, PUBLIC WORKS
DEPARTMENT.

Conditions.

1. An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to his character.

Qualifications.

2. An applicant will be required to produce evidence of the examinations passed by him. All other things being equal preference will be given to a candidate who has passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Western Australia in subjects set down for engineering cadets, viz., English and another modern language, Mathematics and Applied Mathematics, Chemistry, and Geology or Physics.

Competitive Examination.

3. Applications will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement, and in the event of more applications being received than the number of vacancies, a competitive examination may be held by the Department in trigonometrical computations, plotting, and plan drawing.

Probation.

4. Every Cadet shall, in the first instance, be appointed on probation for a period of not more than three months. Before the expiration of the period of probation, the Permanent Head shall report to the Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report, the Commissioner will confirm or annul the cadetship. Upon confirmation of a Cadet's appointment he will be article to the Engineer in Chief for the prescribed term of service.

Term of Service.

5. A Cadet who possesses the qualifications as prescribed in Section 2 will be required to serve for a term of four years, a part of which will be spent in the office where he will receive instruction in general engineering drafting, computations, specifications, office methods, etc. The balance of the term will be in the field on engineering surveys and the construction of works.

Remuneration.

6. The remuneration to a Cadet who has not passed the Matriculation Examination referred to in Clause 2 will be as shown under "A," and to those who have passed as shown under "B":—

An allowance of 2s. per diem will also be paid when in the field in camp.

General.

7. During the term of service a Cadet must become a student of the Institute of Civil Engineers, London, and will be expected to attend classes, whenever possible, at the University or Technical School in his own time for the further study of subjects necessary to enable him to pass the examination qualifying for a candidate as Associate Member of the Institute of Civil Engineers.

8. Should a Cadet desire to obtain an engineering degree at the University of Western Australia, section 7 will not apply. Time will be allowed him to attend the requisite lectures, such time to be without pay.

9. When a Cadet has completed one-half of the prescribed term of service, if in the opinion of the permanent head of the Department his progress and general conduct have not been satisfactory, his services may be dispensed with, on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

10. On the completion of the prescribed term of service a Cadet will be required to apply to the Institute of Civil Engineers, London, for the admission to the examination qualifying for candidature as an Associate. The Cadet's term of service shall be extended to cover the period between the completion of his service and the holding of the examination by the Institute at the same remuneration as that received for his last year of service.

11. When a Cadet takes advantage of Section 8 he must, on completion of the prescribed term of service, obtain the degree of Bachelor of Engineering of the University of Western Australia.

A Cadet who possesses the qualifications as prescribed in Section 2 will be required to serve for a term of four years and he will receive instruction in drafting, taking off quantities, drawing up specifications, etc. A portion of the time will be spent in supervising construction works, and a period of three months in the field under an engineering surveyor to gain experience in the use of the level and theodolite.
