Handling charges as per rates shown for other cargo according to service rendered in each case.

Rates of Wharfage and Handling Charges.

N.B.—The minimum wharfage due shall be 6d., and the minimum handling charge shall be 3d. per consignment.

NOTES :

- (1.) Transhipment cargo worked overside from a ship direct to another ship, free of wharfage charges.
 - (2.) Cargo landed on wharves or jetties from a vessel in distress or for convenience of a vessel and reshipped by same vessel, 1s. per ton wharfage. Handling charges will be made according as the said cargo is dealt with, on the same scale as other cargo.
 - (3.) Transhipment cargo is cargo appearing as such upon a vessel's manifest, or declared in writing to the Board before being landed as intended for transhipment into a vessel.
 - (4.) No wharfage dues will be charged in respect of ballast in the shape of stone, sand, shingle, or such like material transhipped overside vessel to vessel.
 - (5.) The Board will not supply labour to handle cargo transhipped overside vessel to vessel.
 - (6.) Cargo is allowed 48 hours' free storage in sheds, except transhipment cargo, which is allowed 72 hours.
 - (7.) Grain (as defined above), flour, agricultural and horticultural produce (including fruit) and coal, any of which being the product of the State of Western Australia, when brought to the Port of Bunbury for the purpose of transhipment for export beyond the State, shall be free of transshipping dues, but must pay handling charges incurred.
 - (8.) Cargo discharged (under Regulation 107) direct into trucks for consignment off the wharf will be charged at half handling rates, provided the Board receive only into trucks.
 - (9.) Goods from Foreign ports landed at Bunbury without transhipment in the Commonwealth (excepting rails, railway accessories, coal, coke, and kerosene), will be charged wharfage at a reduced rate of 25 per cent.
 - (10.) Wool landed for reclassing, scouring, marking, dumping, etc., and reshipped, will be regarded as transhipment cargo on a certificate from the shipper that it was the same wool as originally landed.
 - (11.) Wharfage dues on bulk kerosene and other like oils will be per ton of 250 gallons. Handling charges will be subject to arrangement according as the oils are dealt with.
 - (12.) For extra handling and other charges on goods, see Regulations Nos. 109, 122, 123, 124, 125, 133, 134.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Merredin Public Cemetery (Reserve 14424).

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, we the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Merredin on the 15th August, 1919.

BROOME COMMON.

(RESERVE 631.)

By-laws.

THE Broome Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Broome Common, do hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Broome Common.

Interpretation.

- "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Board"—The Broome District Road Board.
- "Member"—A member of the Broome District Road Board.
- "Person"—Shall include the plural also a body corporate.
- "Officer"—Shall mean any officer of the Board.
- "Ranger"—Shall mean the Ranger appointed by the Board.
- "Secretary"—Shall mean the Secretary of the Board.

1. All stock running on the Common otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock.

2. No person shall depasture any animal upon the Broome Common without having first obtained a license from the Board.

3. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list, in writing, of the number of horses, cattle, sheep, or other kind of animals that he or she shall intend to depasture on the said Common, and shall describe therein the brands, numbers, and other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license signed by the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Board to depasture on the Common according to these By-laws.

4. With the exception of stock owned by *bona fide* travellers, travelling teamsters, and packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common free of charge, and the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Broome Health District only to have the right to run stock upon the Common. All horses and cattle, including dairy cattle, shall be charged at the rate of 3/- per head per calendar month or part of a month, and except by special permission of the Board no person,

firm, or company shall depasture more than ten head of horses or cattle at any one time.

Sheep.—Only sheep kept for killing by *bona fide* butchers trading in Broome, for supplying the public shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Common, and shall be charged at the rate of 3d. per head per calendar month or part thereof. No one firm of butchers shall depasture more than fifty sheep at any one time, except by special permission of the Board.

Goats shall be charged the same rate as sheep.

Swine or Camels shall not under any circumstances be permitted to run on the Common.

5. Any person or persons running stock on the Common may change such stock from time to time, provided that he, she, or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he, she, or they shall have paid commonage fees. Provided that no person or persons shall be entitled to the benefit of this By-law, unless before changing any stock thereunder he, she, or they shall have furnished the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list and description in writing under By-law 3 of the stock proposed to be taken away, and also until the Secretary or Ranger shall have acknowledged the receipt of such list or description.

6. *Bona fide* travellers, teamsters and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the Common for the space of four clear days free of all charge; should that period however be exceeded they shall be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per day, or part of a day, for all horses and cattle. In no case shall such horses and cattle remain on the Common under this regulation longer than seven clear days at any one time.

7. No travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the Port of Broome, shall be allowed to cross the Common. The owner or drover in charge of such last-mentioned stock shall give written notice of his intention to travel such stock, and shall comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

8. The Secretary shall at any time with the approval of the Chairman or any two members have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

9. No stock on which commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Common, unless with the written sanction of the Secretary, until after all such fees have been paid in full.

10. Stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Common shall not be liable to pay commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

11. No entire horse or bull over the age of six months (except by special permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the Common; and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

12. The Ranger or Secretary for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Common.

13. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

14. The Board shall be sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, packer, and dairy cattle within the meaning of these By-laws.

15. No person shall cut, fell, or remove green, growing, or dead timber on or from the said Common without having first obtained a license from the Board and paid therefor the sum of five shillings per axe per month.

16. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any officer of the Board or any policeman.

17. (a.) Any person or persons who shall introduce any diseased animals into the Common shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of £5.

(b.) The Chairman, Secretary, or other duly authorised person may, on suspicion of any animal being diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common, and if he shall think fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined; and, if found to be diseased, all expenses incurred in connection therewith shall be borne by the owner, and, until paid, the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of such owner in the Common or Pound.

(c.) In the event of any owner or person in charge of stock being fined under these By-laws or the Acts herein referred to, the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of the same owner or person in charge on the Common or in the pound until such fine and all costs are paid and satisfied.

18. The Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws; and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

19. Any person using any gateway of the Common, either for himself or any vehicle or live stock, whether belonging to himself or otherwise, shall properly shut the gate of such gateway immediately after using same.

20. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner prescribed in "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under By-laws of the Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock.

21. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

ROEBOURNE AND COSSACK COMMONS.

Additional By-laws.

File No. 1715/89.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following additional By-laws made by the Roebourne Road Board for the management of the Roebourne and Cossack Commons, and such other Commons which may heretofore have been or hereafter may be placed under the control of the Roebourne Road Board:—

22. Horses shall be charged at the rate of 20s. per head per annum, 12s. 6d. per half year, or 7s. 6d. per quarter or part of a quarter for all residents who are not ratepayers to depasture stock on the Roebourne Common.

23. Burning off shall only be carried on by authorised employees of the Board. Any person or persons found setting fire to the grass or spinifex on the Common will be liable to penalty not exceeding £20.

24. Bull Fee.—A charge of 2s. 6d. will be made on all calves born on the Roebourne Common.

25. No female cattle over the age of eighteen months old to be removed off the Common until the bull fee has been paid.

26. Ratepayers are only allowed the right to run eight head of female cattle including their own milking cow.
