(d) 4in. cast iron water main in Archdeacon Street between Edward Street and Perth-Fremantle Road, including lifting existing 11/2 in. main.

(e) Sin. east iron water main in Perth-Fremantle Road between Archdeacon Street and Broadway, including lifting existing 4in. east iron main.
