LEONORA-MALCOLM DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

Bu-laws.

Common or Reserve, Number 7224, 7521, 7560.

- The Leonora-Malcolm District Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Commons and/or Reserves within the Road Board boundaries, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the existing Commons and/or Reserves.
- 2. These By-laws may be known and cited as the Leonora-Malcolm Road Board Commonage By-laws.
- 3. The following words and expressions in these Bylaws shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively:-
 - Owner.—The person having the property, or having the possession, control, management, or eustody of stock.
 - Travelling Stock .- Any stock taken or driven or about to be taken or driven to any place more than 20 miles from the place upon which such stock were depasturing previously to starting.
 - Stock.—Any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, camel, bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, pig, goat, or any number thereof.
 - Board .- The Leonora-Malcolm District Road Board. Common and/or Reserve.—All that country under the control and management of the Leonora-Malcolm District Road Board.
 - Officer .- Any duly authorised employee of the Leonora-Malcolm District Road Board and/or any member of the Western Australian Police Force.
 - -The Secretary of the Leonora-Malcolm District Road Board.
- 4. All stock running or depasturing on the Common and/or Reserves otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to the State of Western Australia "Cattle Trespass Act" and its amendments.
- 5. No person shall depasture any stock upon the Common and/or Reserves, or any part thereof, without laving first obtained a license from the Board. Such licenses shall be for a term of twelve months as from the first day of July in any year, and all license fees must be paid on or before the 7th day of July in any
- 6. No stock, whether licensed or unlicensed, shall trespass or depasture on the following areas within the above-mentioned Commons or Reserves, i.e., within 20 chains from the boundaries of the following localities, namely, the Leonora Ward and Townsite, the Gwalia Ward and Townsite, the Murrin Murrin Townsite, the Linden Townsite, the Leonora District Hospital site. Leonora District Hospital site.

- 7. That with the exception of stock owned by bonâ fâde travellers, travelling teamsters, or packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common or Reserves except as hereinafter provided.
- 8. Only ratepayers of the above Board who are not in arrears of rates and bonâ fide prospectors shall be allowed to run or depasture stock on the above-mentioned Commons or Reserves, and every ratepayer who has paid all his or her rates and taxes lawfully due to the Board and every bonâ fide prospector shall have the right to run or depasture free of charge all or either of the following stock, i.e., two horses, two cattle, two mules, two asses, two camels, ten goats, or ten sheep.
- 9. The following fees or scale of charges to be paid per annum or part thereof for running or depasturing stock on the Commons or Reserves is as follows:—

Horse, mare, gelding, colt, or filly .. 5s. rer head. Asses or mules : : :: 5s. rer head. Camel .. 40s. per head. Bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, or calf.. 5s. per head.
Ram, ewe, wether, lamb 6d. per head. 5s. per head. * * 1s. per head.

- 10. Bonâ fide travellers, teamsters, or packers shall be allowed to run their stock on the Commons for the space of seven (7) days free of charge. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of sevenpence per head rer week, or part of a week, for all stock so depasturing.
- 11. Any bona fide butcher or firm of butchers who are ratepayers of the above Board, and who are supplying meat to the residents of the above Board, shall be allowed to run or depasture sheep on the Commons free of charge, provided the number for any one butcher or firm of butchers shall not exceed 100, or provided that if there are more than one butcher or firm of butchers the total number shall not exceed 300.
- 12. Any bona fide dairyman or firm of dairymen, and who are ratepayers of the above Board and who are surplying milk to the residents of the above Board, shall be allowed to run or depasture twenty (20) head of cattle or 20 head of goats free of charge.
- 13. No fees shall be collected for any stock depasturing on the Common which are under the age of six months.
- 14. Any person or persons running stock on the Commons may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid license fees.
- 15. It shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Commons, as heretofore provided, to furnish the Secretary of the Board or the Ranger of the Common or respective Commons with a list giving the correct description of all stock and brands placed by them on the Common within 24 hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock and brands.
- 16. All travelling stock shall be allowed to cross the Common or Commons conditionally that the owner or person in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply with the provisions of the Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act of the State of Western Australia.
- 17. That no entire horse, boar pig, bull, bull camel, or jack donkey over the age of six months (except by permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the Common or Commons, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, any such entire horse, boar pig, bull, bull camel, or jack donkey found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with by any duly authorised officer in the manner prescribed by the Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Acts of the State of Western Australia.
- 18. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any stock depasturing on the said Common, under the provisions of these By-laws.
- 19. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bonâ fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

- 20. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his or her license upon being required to do so by any constable of police or officer of the Board.
- 21. The Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 22. The Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman of the Board or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of unpaid fees.
- 23. No stock on which commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Common, unless with the sanction of the Secretary, until all such fees have been paid in full
- 24. Any person who shall introduce any diseased animal or animals shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) for each offence, and two pounds per day for the continuance of such offence, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
- 25. The Secretary, with the approval of the Chairman of the Board or by any two members of the Board, may if, in his opinion, any animal appears diseased, order or cause to be removed from the Common and if he thinks fit cause same to be impounded and examined, and if diseased all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith shall be paid by the owner.
- 26. Each licensed goat must carry a regulation disc. 27. Any goat, whether licensed or unlicensed, found straying within the areas specified under Clause 6 may be seized and impounded or destroyed and removed by any officer duly authorised by the Chairman of the Board or any two members thereof.
- 28. The owner of any goat found straying shall be liable for all expenses attendant on the seizure, impounding or destruction, and removal of such goat.
- 29. Each person who shall keep any goat outside the limits of the areas prescribed in Clause 6 shall keep such goat under proper control, so as not to be a nuisance to any person or commit any depredation or damage to other persons' property.
- 30. Any goat so found out of control and/or committing any such damage or depredation, or being a nuisance to any person, may on the authority of the Chairman or any two members of the Board be destroyed by the person on whose property such depredation shall have been committed or whose property shall have been damaged by such goat.
- 31. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, and for any continuing breach thereof a further penalty of £2 per day, but such penalty shall not exceed in the aggregate £20.
- 32. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

BY-LAWS

Laverton, Beria, and Morgans Commons By-laws.

File 14818/99.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the management of the Laverton, Beria, and Morgans Commons, Reserves 6884, 6882, and 6999.

Bu-laws.

- 1. All stock running on the Commons, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.
- 2. That with the exception of stock owned by bona fide travellers, travelling teamsters, or as packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Commons free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and that the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Mt. Margaret Road Board District only to have the right to run stock upon the Commonage.
- Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses, eattle, asses, and camels on the Commons for the space of seven (7) clear days tree of charge; should that period, however, be exceeded they shall be charged at the rate of threepence per head per week or part of a week for all horses, cattle ,camels, mules and asses.
- 4. The scale of charges is as follows:—Sheep and goats, 1s. 6d. per head per annum; horses, cattle, mules, and asses, 7s. 6d. per head per annum; dairy cows, 5s. per annum; bulls, over six months, 20s. per annum; camels, 40s. per annum; cach family being allowed the following exemptions free of charge:—One horse, one cow, or three goats and progeny up to six months of age. Only sheep kept for killing by bona fide butchers, for supplying the public, shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Commons. One butchering firm may keep up to 300 head, or two firms may keep 150 each. keep up to 300 head, or two firms may keep 150 each. Should there be more than two butchering establishments, 150 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.
- 5. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Commons at any one time a greater number of horses than 20 head, or cattle a greater number than 40 head over the age of six months; camels more than 15 head; mules or asses more than 40 head.
- 6. Any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid Commonage
- 7. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Commons, as heretofore provided, to turnish the Secretary of the Board, or the Ranger of the Commons, with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them upon the Commons, within 12 hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 8. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the Commons, conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock, and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Viet., No. 7).
- 9. That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the first day of July in each year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall, at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two committeemen, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 10. That no entire horse, rig, bull, or bull camel, over the age of six months (except by permission of the Road Board) shall be allowed on the Commons, and the Road Board) shall be allowed on the Commons, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse, pig, bull, or bull camel found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
- 11. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, or asses depasturing on the said Commons under the pro-visions of these By-laws.
- 12. The Road Board shall be sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

- 13. The Road Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 14. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5.
- 15. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.
- 16. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any constable or officer of the Road Board.
- 17. If the Road Board should at any time require the services of a Ranger or Herdsman, the person so appointed by the Board will be required to find two sureties of £25 each for the full and faithful performance of his duty under these By-laws.
- 18. All existing By-laws relating to the said Commons are hereby repealed as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the Government Gazette.
