WHEREAS it is desirable that a Royal Commission should be appointed to inquire into the continued detention of Thomas Mable in the Hospital for the Insane at Claremont, and for that purpose should be entrusted with the powers hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, the said Governor, Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by these presents appoint you, the said Alfred Bowman Kidson, a Commissioner to inquire into and report to me on the following matters and questions, that is to say:—

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 894/20.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

*Description and location of reticulation works approved and exempted.*

Metropolitan Water Supply—Enlargement of main in Gloucester Street and extension of main in Armagh Street, City of Perth (Victoria Park Ward).

Lifting about six chains of existing one-inch diameter tube main and laying a three-inch diameter cast-iron

water main in Gloucester Street from eight-inch diameter main in Fremantle Road to Armagh Street and along Armagh Street to Lot 1; total length about 17 chains. The main to be provided with valves, hydrants, connections, and all other necessary apparatus as indicated in red on Plan W.S., S., & D.D. 3777.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 10th day of December, 1920.

D. MacPherson and A. P. Tucker, as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the aforesaid gentlemen as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

(b) The right to such extra payment shall be determined by the Commissioner on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, with the written concurrence of the Minister.

(c) Before any overtime payment is sanctioned, the Permanent Head shall satisfy the Commissioner that the overtime is necessary, and no overtime work for which payment or equivalent time off may be claimed shall be commenced without the Commissioner's previous consent in writing except in cases of emergency. A full record of all overtime worked shall be kept.

(d) Wherever it is possible to do so, equivalent time off shall be recommended by the Permanent Head in lieu of overtime payment.

(e) Officers not working under close supervision or those whose hours of duty are not definitely determined shall not be entitled to claim overtime, nor shall any officer in receipt of a salary exceeding £384 per annum.

(f) No claim for payment shall be allowed for a period of less than one hour, or for less than a quarter of an hour after the first hour.

(g) For the purpose of computing overtime where an allowance under Regulation 75 or 79 is paid, the amount of such allowance shall be added to the salary.

## PUBLIC SERVICE RECLASSIFICATION.

## Second Progress Report.

*To His Excellency Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.*

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

In pursuance of the terms of our appointment, we have the honour to submit herewith our Second Progress Report dealing with the balance of the offices classified in the Clerical and General Divisions not included in our previous Report.

Owing to the urgent and repeated requests for the early publication of the classification, the consideration of possible economies and reorganisations has been postponed for the present. It has, however, in some cases been found advisable to defer reclassification until the question of reorganisation has been dealt with.

The officers whose classification has been deferred, as mentioned in the preceding paragraph, as well as those engaged in Trading Concerns—whose classification is in abeyance pending a decision as to whether they are to be brought under the State Trading Concerns Amendment Bill now before Parliament—and also those who, although previously classified in the General Division, claim to be Professional Officers, will be entitled to a special allowance on the basis laid down in the decision of the Public Service Appeal Board, dated 1st instant, relating to an allowance as immediate relief to officers receiving a salary over £252 p.a.

Since the publication of the First Report the Public Service Appeal Board has given its decisions on the appeals lodged against the minima and maxima fixed for the Juniors, Male and Female (£72–£132), Adult Female (£144–£180), and Adult Male Officers (£168–£252). The minima and maxima of the two last classes have been increased under the decision of the Board by £12, but in order to preserve a correct basis for comparison we have decided to adhere to the scale of salaries adopted in our first Report, so far as positions classified in the above ranges are concerned. The higher positions have been classified on the basis of the revised rates.

Mr. R. A. Rolland, who formerly held the position of Assistant to the Engineer-in-Chief, has been appointed to act as Assistant Commissioner in connection with the reclassification of the officers in the Professional Division, and he commences his duties on 13th instant. It is anticipated that the whole of the Professional Division (as well as the Administrative Division) will be classified and published early in March next.
