WESTERN AUSTRALA, By His Excellency Jir Francis Alex-TO WIT. Ander Newdegate, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of F. A. NEWDEGATE, Governor. In and over the State of Westerno Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Re-Serve for Aborigines should be declared at Kyarra (Tuckanarra): Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of about 10 acres at Kyarra (Tuckanarra), more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 75 chains North and 32 chains East from the North-East corner of Reserve 9771, and extending North 10 chains and East 10 chains; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

WHEREAS by a Crown Grant dated the 14th day of July, 1886, Swan Location 1111 was granted to the person therein named, subject to the reservations to Her Majesty the Queen, her heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed neces-

sary to resume for roads and any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, as of her or their former estate, without mak ing to the said grantce any compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed from such location should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such buildings, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of a Trigonometrical Station: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Exe cutive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforethe land described in the Schedule hereto, being said portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the 28th day of April, 1921, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of a Trigovometrical Station.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter bylaws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve A15385, for Water and Park Lands at Jeelakin Lake, should be placed un-der the control of the Roe Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Exce cutive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Roe Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Ward Boundaries.

Schedule "A."

North-West Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the North boundary of the District from its intersection with the shores of the Indian Ocean to intersect the Western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve.

On the Eastward by the said side of the Railway Reserve from the latter intersection to intersect the North-Western side of the Perth-Bunbury Road.

North-East Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the District boundary from its intersection with the East boundary of the North-West Ward to intersect the production East of a South boundary of Timber Concession 84/11.

On the Southward by the said production and South boundary, and an East and again a South boundary of said Concession 84/11 and the last-mentioned South boundary's production West to the East boundary of Location 1, and along part of the East and the North boundary of Location 1, to intersect the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve.

On the Westward by the said side of the Railway Reserve from the aforesaid intersection to the Southern side of the Pinjarra Station Yard Reserve and along the Southern and Eastern sides of said Station Yard Reserve to the Northern side of the Perth-Bunbury Road and along said side of the road to the Western side of the Railway Reserve; thence by the Eastern boundary of the North-West Ward to the starting point.—One member.

Pinjarra Ward.—Bounded by lines commencing at the North-East corner of Reserve 525 and extending along part of the South boundary of Location 13 to the right bank of the Murray River and along said bank of the river to the Northern side of the Bridge on the Perth-Bunbury Road and along said side of the bridge and the Northern side of the said Perth-Bunbury Road to the production North of the Eastern side of the Pinjarra Station Yard Reserve; thence along said production and Eastern side and the Southern side of the said Station yard reserve and the latter side's production Westward to the right bank of the Murray River and along said bank of the river to the Northern boundary of Location 3 and along part of the said Northern boundary and the East boundary of Reserve 525 to the starting point.—One member.

South-West Ward .--- Bounded on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the North-West Ward from its intersection with the shores of the Indian Ocean to the South-East corner of Reserve 525; thence by part of the boundaries of the Pinjarra Ward to intersect the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve.

On the Eastward by the said side of the Railway Reserve from the latter intersection to the right bank of the Murray River and along said bank of the river to the production East of the North boundary of Location 16 and along said production and North boundary and the North boundaries of Location 128 and Coolup A.A. Lot 200 to the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve and along said side of the Railway Reserve to intersect the Southern boundary of the district.

On the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundaries from the last-mentioned intersection to the starting point.—Two members.

Secretary, Prices Regulation Commission.

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919. Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, that may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed deilvery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodities within the Metropolitan area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

PUBLIC SERVICE APPEAL BOARD AUT, 1920.

1. Every appeal or application to the Board shall be made in writing addressed to the Public Service Appea' Board, signed by the appellant or applicant, and served on the Clerk to the Board. Short particulars of the appellant's or applicant's claim or complaint must be stated therein.

2. Every appellant or applicant shall lodge with his notice of appeal or application as many copies as the Clerk to the Board may require for service on the other parties thereto and for the use of the Board.

3. Seven days' notice at least shall be given by the Clerk to the Board, to the parties concerned, of the date fixed for the hearing of every appeal or application to the Board.

4. Every appellant or applicant shall, within four days of the receipt of notice of the date fixed for the hearing, supply the other parties to the proceedings with lists of the witnesses he intends to call, and any party to an appeal or application who intends to oppose the same shall, if required so to do, forthwith supply to the appellant or applicant a list of the witnesses he intends to call.

5. Any person who, having been notified in writing, signed by the Clerk to the Board, that he is required to

attend as a witness before the Board at the time and place specified in the notice, and has been tendered reasonable conduct-money if resident more than two miles from the place of sitting, fails, without reasonable excuse, to attend before the Board accordingly, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. Notice of any appeal in respect to the classification published in the *Education Circular* of February and March, 1921, must be lodged with the Clerk of the Board not later than 31st May, 1921, and notice of any appeal from any subsequent re-classification must be lodged with the Clerk to the Board within one month after the receipt by the appellant of the *Circular* containing such re-classification. The Board may, in any particular case, in its discretion, extend the time prescribed by this regulation.

7. Every application under paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section six of "The Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920," in respect of alleged anomaly in treatment affecting the appellant, existing prior to the commencement of the Act, must be made to the Board within three months after the publication of these Regulations in the *Education Circular*.

8. The Board may at any time allow an appellant or applicant to amend the statement of the grounds of his appeal or application, on such terms (if any) as to the Board shall appear just.

9. The Board may at its discretion adjourn the hearing of any appeal or application for any good or sufficient reason.

10. After the decision of the Board or of a majority of the members of the Board has been reported in writing by the Board to the Governor, any party to the appeal or application shall be entitled to receive a copy of such report, in so far as it affects him, on application to the Clerk to the Board.
