WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (5) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation, issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Gnowangerup, praying that the day on which such shops in such district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in the said district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday.

*Greeting:*

KNOW Ye that I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you to be Commissioners to inquire into and report upon the subject of subletting on tribute in the Mining Industry, and the effect of the winding-up provisions of "The Companies Act, 1893," and particularly Section 114 thereof, on the observance of labour conditions of leases; and without limiting the general scope of the inquiry deal with the following questions:—

1. Are those portions of leases worked on tribute under the prevailing conditions less efficiently worked than would be the case if worked under the provisions of Part III. of "The Mining Act Amendment Act, 1920"?

2. Are the prevailing conditions just and equitable as between the State as lessor, the lessee, and the sub-lessees or tributers?

3. Do the provisions of the said Act seriously interfere with the operations of mining companies, and if so, in what way?

4. Do the provisions of the said Act hinder or tend to prevent the subletting on tribute; and if so, in what way and to what extent should the Act be amended?

5. Do the winding-up provisions of "The Companies Act, 1893," and particularly Section 114, unduly affect the right conferred on miners by Section 99 of "The Mining Act, 1904," to apply for forfeiture for breach of labour conditions; or do such provisions unduly facilitate the evasion of labour conditions of the leases of companies in liquidation, and if so, what remedy is suggested?

And I appoint you, the said William Lambden Owen, to be Chairman of the said Commission, and declare this to be a Royal Commission within the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners Powers Act, 1902."

And I hereby desire and request you, with as little delay as possible, to report to me in writing the result of your inquiries by virtue of this Commission.

The maximum prices at which Bran, Pollard, and Flour may be sold or supplied within the Geraldton Area, and which said prices shall include the containers in which the said Bran, Pollard, and Flour are sold or supplied, shall be as follows:—

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of Katanning Road District therefrom and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District, and to sever a portion of the Dumbleyung Road District therefrom and annex it to the Katanning Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Katanning Road District therefrom as described in Schedule A hereto and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District; and doth hereby sever that portion of the Dumbleyung Road District therefrom, as described in Schedule B hereto, and annex it to the Katanning Road District.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 421/21.  
 WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Storm-water Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and

Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

*Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.*

#### CUBALLING PUBLIC CEMETERY.

(Reserve 8405.)

##### By-laws.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Cuballing Public Cemetery (Reserve 8405).

##### By-Laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Cuballing, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office at Cuballing on the 5th July, 1921.

2. The following alterations are made in the forms in Section II. of Part I. of the Schedule to the Criminal Practice Rules, 1914.

3. Form 19 is amended by inserting the words "with intent to carry out a common purpose; namely (here set out the purpose)" between the words "persons" and "assembled," where such words appear in the first and third lines of the said form.

4. Form 24 is amended by deleting the word "fear" therein, and inserting in lieu thereof the word "terror."

5. Forms 136, 137, 138, and 139 are hereby cancelled, and the following forms are inserted in their stead:—

Form No. 136.—*Abusing girls under sixteen.*

## Section 187.

A.B. (being a person over the age of twenty-one years) had (or attempted to have) unlawful carnal knowledge of one E.F., a girl under the age of sixteen years.

Form No. 137.—*Defilement of idiots.*

## Section 188.

A.B. had (or attempted to have) unlawful carnal knowledge of a woman (or girl), namely, one E.F., an idiot (or imbecile): And that the said A.B. then knew the said E.F. to be an idiot (or imbecile).

Form No. 138.—*Indecent treatment of women and girls and idiots.*

## Section 189.

(1) A.B. (being over the age of twenty-one years) unlawfully and indecently dealt with one E.F., a girl (or woman) under the age of sixteen years.

(2) A.B. (being over the age of twenty-one years) unlawfully and indecently dealt with a woman (or girl), namely, one E.F., an idiot (or imbecile): And that the said A.B. then knew the aforesaid E.F. to be an idiot (or imbecile).

(3) A.B. (being over the age of twenty-one years) unlawfully and indecently dealt with a girl (or woman) under the age of seventeen years, namely, one E.F., of whom the said A.B. was the guardian (or employer or teacher or school-master).

(4) A.B. unlawfully and indecently dealt with one E.F., a girl under the age of thirteen years.

Form No. 139.—*Defilement by guardians, employers, teachers, and school-masters.*

## Section 190.

A.B., being the guardian (or employer or teacher or school-master) of one E.F., a girl under the age of seventeen years, did unlawfully and carnally know (or attempted to have unlawful carnal knowledge of) such girl (or woman).

6. A new paragraph is added to Form 143, as follows:—

(3) being the keeper of a brothel suffered one E.F., a girl (or woman) under the age of twenty-one years, to be therein.

7. Form 144 is amended by deleting the word "sixteen" therein and substituting the word "eighteen" in lieu thereof.

8. Paragraph 3 of Form 255 is hereby cancelled, and the following paragraphs inserted in lieu thereof:—

(3) Conspired together (or with one M.N.) to defraud one E.F. (or as the case may be) by deceitfully (or fraudulently) (here set out the nature of the deceit or fraud).

(4) Conspired together (or with one M.N.) to extort money (or as the case may be) from one E.F.

9. Form 257 is amended by adding the words "then well knowing the same to have been so stolen (or obtained) as aforesaid."
