The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Perenjori-Morowa, Dalwallinu, and Melbourne Road Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 288/19.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and annex it to an existing Road District, and may, when an addition has been made to a Road District, constitute such added land a portion of a Ward of the District: And whereas it is desirable to—

1. Sever portion of the Melbourne Road District therefrom and annex it to the South Ward of the Dalwallinu Road District.

2. Constitute all that land transferred from the Perenjori-Morowa and Yalgoo Road Districts to the Dalwallinu Road District by Order in Council dated 15th April, 1921, and all that territory in the South and Central Wards of the Dalwallinu Road District lying East of the Rabbit-proof Fence, part of the North Ward of the Dalwallinu Road District.

3. Constitute the territory transferred from the Yalgoo Road District to the Perenjori Road District, by Order in Council dated the 15th April, 1921, part of the Central Ward of the Perenjori-Morowa Road District.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby—

1. Sever portion of the Melbourne Road District, as described in Schedule "A" hereunder, and annex it to Dalwallinu Road District. The area to be included and form part of the South Ward of the Dalwallinu Road District.

2. Constitute all that land transferred from the Perenjori-Morowa and Yalgoo Road Districts to the Dalwallinu Road District by Order in Council dated 15th April, 1921, and all that territory in the South and Central Wards of the Dalwallinu Road District lying East of the Rabbit-proof Fence, part of the North Ward of the Dalwallinu Road District.

3. Constitute the territory transferred from the Yalgoo Road District to the Perenjori Road District by Order in Council dated 15th April, 1921, part of the Central Ward of the Perenjori-Morowa Road District.

All that territory situated in the Melbourne Road District and known as Reserve No. 16272, and Locations 836, 1619, 1618, 1620, and 1621.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Bayswater-Maylands Stormwater Drainage.

Preliminary Portion of the Permanent Scheme.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 12th day of August, 1921.

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919.
Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodities mentioned

in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodities within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

A COMMISSION passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet appointing Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Knight, to be Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, was read, by the Clerk, as follows:—

Dated 7th June, 1921. GEORGE R.I.

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Knight, Greeting.

Appointment of the Honourable Sir R. F. McMillan, Knight, to be Lieutenant-Governor.

WE do by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet appoint you, the said Robert Furse McMillan, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

To administer Government during Governor's absence. Recites Letters Patent constituting Office of Governor. Powers and authorities to be exercised according to Instructions.

II. And further, in the event of the Office of Governor becoming vacant, or of the Governor being incapable, or of his departure from Our said State, We do hereby authorise and require you to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor for the time being hath already received, or may hereafter receive

from Us or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said State.

Dormant Commission of 19th January, 1920, revoked.

III. And We do hereby revoke, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, Our Dormant Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the nineteenth day of January, 1920, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Francis Alexander Newdigate Newdegate, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and Saint George (now Our Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia) to administer the Government of Our said State and its Dependencies, in the events in the said Dormant Commission specified.

Officers, etc., to take notice.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Kukerin Public Cemetery (Reserve 16502).

By-Laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Kukerin, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.
 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—
1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.
1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Kukerin on the 3rd day of July, 1921.

Regulation 57:

After section (b) of paragraph 5 insert the following new paragraph:—

“If an unclassified instructor is employed, after his two years as ex-monitor he shall receive a salary of £192 per annum, provided that he has passed all the technical portion of the examination for a 3rd class instructor. After six years' good service his salary may be raised to £240, provided that he has passed all the technical portion of the examination for the second class certificate.”

In the fourth line of paragraph 8, after the words “for ex-students” delete the words “with the B2” and substitute therefor the words “of their grade.”

In the sixth line of paragraph 8, after the words “salary provided for” delete “B2,” and after the word “assistants,” in the same line, insert the words “of their grade.”

Regulation 58:

After section (b) of paragraph 4 insert the following new paragraph:—

“If an unclassified instructress is employed, after her two years as ex-monitor she shall receive a salary of £180, provided that she has passed all the technical portion of the examination for a third class instructress. After six years' good service her salary may be raised to £204, provided that she has passed all the technical portion of the examination for the second class certificate.”

In paragraph 9, after the words “Unclassified Assistants,” insert the words “with an addition of £15.”

After paragraph 9 insert the following new paragraph:—

“Classified teachers who are taken from the ordinary staff and trained as Household Management teachers shall, while employed as Household Management Assistants, be paid the salary provided for ordinary assistants of their grade, with the addition of £15.”

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Technical Schools.

REGULATIONS governing the members of the staff exempt from the provisions of “The Public Service Act, 1904.”

1. The teaching staff shall be classified in two divisions, *viz.*:—

Division 1.—Lecturers and Assistant Lecturers, devoting their whole time to the work of the School.

Division 2.—All other officers.

2. The Director of Technical Education shall have the direction and control of the entire staff, and shall from time to time define their duties.

3. When a vacancy in any office of Division 1 of the staff requires to be filled or an appointment made to a new office in that division, the Director shall obtain suitable applications from qualified persons, and shall make a recommendation to the Minister as to the applicant best qualified to fill the vacancy. Such appointments shall be made by the Governor. Vacancies in offices of Division 2 shall be filled by the Director, subject to the approval of the Minister.

4. Each officer of Division 1 must devote his whole time to the school, and may not engage in work outside his regular school duties without the consent of the Minister.

5. The appointment of an officer will date from the time that he reports himself to the Director for duty, and only train or other fares from the officer's point of departure within the State to his destination will be paid, unless otherwise specified at the time of the appointment.

6. Each officer shall be regular in the times of his arrival at and departure from his duties, and shall not absent himself without leave during class hours.

7. The members of the staff are required to regularly conduct their classes, as detailed in the syllabus, at the hours shown on the time table, and to commence their classes at the time specified. The regular hours of duty shall be from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. or an equivalent.

8. Each member of the staff shall be required to prevent an accumulation of arrears of work, and may be called upon to meet a temporary increase of work without additional payment.

9. Each member of the staff shall be held responsible for the proper conduct of his classes and the safe keeping of the material and apparatus used in connection with his work. He must at once report to the Director any damage to school property, disobedience

to Regulations, and misdemeanour which may come under his notice.

10. Correspondence from members of the staff to the head office must pass through the Director.

11. No information connected with the school or obtained by means of the school appliances is to be made public by any member of the staff, without the knowledge and consent of the Director.

12. Members of the staff are prohibited from seeking the influence or interest of any person in order to obtain promotion, transfer, or other advantage, except with the consent of the Director. All claims for advancement within the service must be made through the Director.

13. No member of the staff, in his official capacity, shall give to any person who is leaving or who has left the school, any written testimonial without the consent of the Director.

14. No address, testimonial, or presentation shall be accepted by any member of the staff, without the sanction in writing of the responsible Minister.

15. If any member of the staff is on an indictment convicted of any offence, he shall be deemed to have forfeited his office, and shall thereupon cease to perform his duties and receive his salary.

16. The recognised summer vacation shall extend from the week prior to Christmas up to the end of the first week in February. Before leaving for the vacation each member of the staff must have completed his year's work to the satisfaction of the Director, and must state his proposed postal address. Each member of the staff must report himself for duty on February 7th.

17. The school shall be closed on Public Service holidays.

18. Each member of the staff, whatever his grade, is required to give not less than one month's notice of his intended resignation, which shall take effect on the last day of the month indicated. Before receiving the salary for the last month, he must have arranged to the satisfaction of the Director the various matters under his charge.

19. Each member of the staff under Division 1 must give three months' notice of intended resignation. No such notice may terminate between the 1st January and the 31st March.

20. Each member of the staff under Division 2 must give at least one month's notice. No such notice shall terminate between the 1st January and the last day of February.

When full notice is not given, pay may be forfeited at the discretion of the Minister.

21. Any appointment in Division 1 may be terminated by three months' notice, and if in Division 2, by one month's notice on the part of the Department; but the appointment of any member of the staff may, in the case of misconduct, be terminated summarily by the Minister.

22. Members of the staff when travelling on the Public Service will be subject to Section E of the Public Service Regulations.

23. The granting of Long Service leave, Sick leave, Free Passes to the coast, and Goldfields Allowances, shall be in accordance with the Education Department Regulations.
