Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 3297/16.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Area or of any District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos. 2 and 5 should be altered: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos. 2 and 5, and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plan W.S., S., and D.D. No. 3449, and described in Order in Council dated 15th April, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 15th April, 1921, be altered in the following manner:—

By deleting the area described hereunder from Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 5, and including it in Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 2.

Schedule.

Commencing at a point on the North side of 6th Avenue, on the boundary between Lots Nos. 1 and 234; thence in a North-Westerly direction along the North side of 6th Avenue across Guildford Road to the dividing boundary between Lots 15 and 16; thence South-Westerly across 6th Avenue and along the dividing boundaries of Lots 10, 9, 8, 7, and 6, Guildford Road, and Lots 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, Railway Terrace; across Central Avenue and along the dividing boundaries of Lots 406, 405, 404, 403, 402, 401, 400, 399, and 398, Railway Terrace, and Lots 407, 551, 552, 553, 554, 555, 556, 557, and 558, Guildford Road; thence across 4th Avenue and along the dividing boundaries of Lots 385, 384, and 383, Railway Terrace, and Lots 559, 560, and 561, Guildford Road; thence South-Easterly along the dividing boundary of Lots 561 and 562, Guildford Road, across Guildford Road and along the dividing boundary of Lots 368 and 369, Guildford Road; thence North-Easterly along the dividing boundaries of Lots 368, 367, and 366, Guildford Road, and Lots 383, 384, and 385, Hardy Street; thence South-Easterly along the West side of 4th Avenue to its point of interception with Hardy Street; thence North-Easterly across 4th Avenue and along the dividing boundaries of Lots 365, 364, 363, and 362, Guildford Road, and Lots 347, 348, 349, and 350 Conroy Street; thence South-Easterly along the dividing boundary of Lots 350 and 351, Conroy Street, across Conroy Street; thence North-Easterly along the East side of Conroy Street to the dividing boundaries between Lot 4, Conroy Street, and Lot 1, Central Avenue; thence South-Easterly along the dividing boundaries of Lots 1, 2, and 3, Central Avenue, and Lot 4, Conroy Street, to the boundary of Lot 3, Central Avenue; thence North-Easterly along the dividing boundary of Lots 3 and 337 to Central Avenue; thence South-Easterly along the South side of Central Avenue to the East side of East Street; thence North-Easterly across Central Avenue and along the East side of East Street to the dividing boundary of Lot 270, East Street, and Lot 1, Peninsula Road; thence South-Easterly along the dividing boundary of Lot 270, East Street, and Lots 1, 2, and 3, Peninsula Road; thence South-Westerly along the Eastern boundary of Lot 270, East Street; thence South-Easterly along the Northern boundary of

Lot 3, Elizabeth Street; thence North-Easterly along the Northern boundary of Elizabeth Street to its point of interception with Peninsula Road; thence North-Easterly across Peninsula Road and along the dividing boundary of Lots 149 and 150, Peninsula Road, to the Creek; thence Northerly along the Creek and across 7th Avenue to the South corner of Lot 174; thence North-Westerly along the North side of 7th Avenue to the dividing boundary of Lots 195 and 196, 7th Avenue; thence South-Westerly across 7th Avenue and along the dividing boundary of Lots 219 and 220, 7th Avenue; thence North-Westerly along the dividing boundaries of Lots 220 and 221, 7th Avenue, and Lots 1, 2, and 3, 6th Avenue; thence South-Westerly along the dividing boundary of Lots 1 and 234, 6th Avenue, to the point of commencement in 6th Avenue, as shown in yellow on Plan W.S., S., and D.D. IN accordance with the provisions of Sections 65 and 76 of "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902," His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal paragraph (1) of Regulation 66 under Part V.—Survey and Plans of Mines (published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th September, 1915), and to approve the following paragraph being inserted in lieu thereof.

(1.) The surveys shall be made and the plans drawn by a Licensed Surveyor of the State of Western Australia, but surveys may be made by and plans may be accepted from the following persons, viz.:—

(a) A person who holds a certificate as Mining Surveyor in one of the other States of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand.

(b) A person who holds a degree, or, not having matriculated, has passed all examinations prescribed for the course in civil or mining engineering of an Australian University or of any University recognised by an Australian University, and who produces satisfactory evidence of having for not less than 12 months assisted to make underground surveys under a surveyor qualified under this regulation.

(c) A person who holds the certificate of Mine Surveyor from the School of Mines of Western Australia or a certificate in Mining Surveying from any other School of Mines, the course for which certificate is, in the opinion of the persons appointed by the Minister to investigate, equivalent to that prescribed for the Western Australian certificate, and who produces satisfactory evidence that he has assisted to make underground surveys for not less than 12 months under a Surveyor qualified under this regulation.

(d) A person who before the 31st day of October, 1916, produced satisfactory evidence of having, during not less than three years prior to that date, carried out underground surveys either as principal or as an assistant to a surveyor qualified to perform mining surveys under this regulation.

Provided that all such persons shall first have submitted to the Minister such evidence of their qualifications as aforesaid as he may from time to time require, and shall have satisfied him, after receiving the report of the Inspecting Surveyor or such person or persons as he may from time to time appoint to investigate such evidence, that they are competent to perform mining surveys, and also provided that the Minister may at any time refuse to accept plans from any of the aforesaid persons if he is satisfied that any of the surveys made or plans furnished by them are inaccurate or defective.
