ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may, by an Order in Council, declare any Crown Lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the Crown Lands described in Schedule hereto a Timber Reserve (No. 55/25) within the meaning and for the purpose of "The Forests Act, 1918":—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 2179/19.
WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves A 17860 to 17863, inclusive, for Recreation at Riverside Estate, Bicton, should be placed under the control of Melville Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Melville Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Where a person in receipt of wages, salary, or other emolument at a rate exceeding £5 per week is paid such wages, salary, or other emolument by the Paying Officer of a State Government Department, Trading Concern or Undertaking, such Paying Officer may in lieu of obtaining a stamped receipt upon every payment deduct the stamp duty in one or more sums in each year from the amount payable, in accordance with the following scale, and in such case he shall affix revenue stamps to the pay sheet or other document for the prescribed duty or for the total prescribed duty deducted in one sum in respect of all employees liable, or he may have the stamp duty for the required sum in any case embossed on such pay sheet or other document.

Reg. 65.—Add: "A third-year student, if resident, shall receive an allowance of £35; if living at home, an allowance of £50. The allowance for a fourth-year resident student shall be £50, and for one living at home £65."

Reg. 66.—Delete second sentence, and substitute: "They will receive the same allowances as third-year students."

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the cancellation of the existing Regulations regarding the Admission of Students to the Technical Schools, and the substitution of the following Regulations in lieu thereof.

R. HOPE ROBERTSON,

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Students will be admitted to classes in accordance with the following Regulations:—

1.—CLASS FEES:

(a.) Students under 21 years of age at the date of entry during the school year, who take subjects involving class attendance of not less than four hours per week, may be granted free tuition.

Students receiving free tuition will be charged laboratory fees of 10s. per term in Chemistry, Assaying, Physics, and in such other classes as may be determined by the Hon. the Minister for Education.

Students in receipt of free tuition shall pay a registration fee of 5s. for the school year.

(b.) Other students will be required to pay class fees.

(c.) All fees are payable in advance.

2.—CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Trade Classes.

The following may be admitted for one year:—

(a.) Students over 14 who are actually engaged in any trade for which practical classes are provided, on production of a certificate of employment from their employer, and on condition that they attend also for at least one other allied subject.

They must take English in the Continuation Classes, or such subjects as Practical Mathematics or Practical Workshop Drafting and Setting-out at the Technical School, or both.

(b.) Students who hold an Industrial Pass-out Certificate from the Continuation Classes, or an 8th Class Industrial Certificate.

(c.) Students over 16 years who show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction.

Science Classes.

The following may be admitted for one year:—

(a.) Students over 14 holding Pass-out Certificates from the Continuation Classes or 8th Class Certificates (Commercial and Domestic).

(b.) Students who have passed the University Junior Examination or any other examination which may be recognised by the Department as equivalent.

(c.) Students who have passed through the 7th Class in a State School, or the First Year of the Science Course in a Continuation School, or an equivalent course. Application for recognition of an equivalent course must be made in each case to the Department.

(d.) Students over 17 who show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction.

(Continuation Class students entering upon the Science Course will attend at the Technical School for Preparatory Chemistry and Physics.)

Commercial and Domestic Subjects.

(A)—*Evening Classes:*

The following may be admitted for one year:—

(a.) Students over 14 holding Pass-out Certificates from the Continuation Classes or 8th Class Certificates (Commercial and Domestic respectively).

(b.) Students who have passed the University Junior Examination, or any other examination which may be recognised by the Department as equivalent. Application for recognition of any other examination must be made in each case to the Department.

(c.) Students over 17 who show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction.

(B)—*Day Classes:*

Students over 14 may be admitted for one year if they show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction. If the complete course is not provided in the day-time, they may be required to take the remaining subject or subjects in the evening classes.

Art Classes.

Students over 14 may be admitted for one year if they show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction.

Miscellaneous Classes.

Unless special regulations are prescribed, the conditions of admission for other classes shall be the same as those laid down for Trade Classes.

GENERAL.

3. Students who complete a year's work satisfactorily may have their right of free tuition renewed for another year.

4. Where it is considered necessary, the Director may insist upon a student taking a subsidiary or allied subject in addition to that for which he has applied.

5. Returned soldiers and children of fallen and incapacitated soldiers and winners of Government scholarships and bursaries will be exempt from payment of fees.

6. The following will be exempt from the registration fee for the ensuing year:—

(a) Students who comply with the regulations and pass the class examinations.

(b) Students who have qualified for an 8th Class State School Certificate or have passed in English and Arithmetic at the Continuation Classes.

7. The right to free tuition, and with it the registration and laboratory fees, may be forfeited for irregular attendance, unsatisfactory progress, or misconduct on the part of the student.

8. For Chemistry, Assaying, Physics, and such other classes as may be determined, each student may be required to deposit an amount of £1 to cover breakages. Should this amount prove insufficient, further deposits may be required. Refunds, equal to the unused balance of the deposits, will be made to students at the end of the school year.

9. Students may be required to bring their own apparatus and material for class work.

10. In the enrolment of students, preference may be given to those whose occupations indicate that the class work will be of special value to them.

11. A student may be refused admission to a class—

(a) If the number of other students is insufficient.

(b) If the class is full.

(c) If application is made after the first month of the school year.

(d) If, in the opinion of the Director, the student is not fitted for the work of the class.

(e) If the student does not comply with the regulations.

12. The school year will consist of three terms, each of 12 weeks.

13. Students who make 75 per cent. of the possible attendances for the year will be qualified to sit for the annual examinations. Exemption allowing a smaller attendance may be granted in special circumstances.

14. Class Certificates will be issued on the results of the examinations.

15. Trade students under 21 years of age, who are not journeymen, must attend at least two classes, viz., one trade subject and one theoretical subject. They will be permitted to attend additional classes, one of which may be a second practice class in the trade subject.

Exemptions may be granted in special cases.
