## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 14818/99.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 6999 for Commonage at Mount Morgans should be placed under the control of Mount Morgans Local Board of Health, as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Mount Morgans Local Board of Health as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

## THE DENTAL ACT, 1894.

*Amendment to Rule 34.*

Whereas under the provisions of "The Dental Act, 1894," "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," the Dental Board may make rules and may amend, repeal, and add to any such rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth hereby amend the rules made under the said Act, by deleting rule numbered 34 and making the following to stand in lieu thereof:—

34. No person who has submitted to and failed to pass any examination shall be entitled to again submit himself for examination within a period of six months, provided (a) A registered apprentice, failing in one subject, but having in the opinion of the Board done well in the remaining subjects of his examination, may be permitted re-examination in that subject within six weeks without further charge. (b) An applicant for registration under Section 4 of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," having obtained a pass in one or both of the theoretical subjects shall not, on re-examination, be compelled to undergo a further examination in the theoretical subject, or subjects, already passed in.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to Section 17 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," by notices published in the *Government Gazette*, declared that the said lands had been set apart, taken, or resumed for the purpose of the said Roads, and that plans of the said lands might be inspected at the Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth.

And whereas the said Boards have caused a copy of the said notices to be served upon the owners and occupiers of the said lands resident within the State, or such of them as can with reasonable diligence be ascertained, either personally or by registered letter posted to their last-named places of abode.

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council has confirmed the said resolutions, it is hereby notified that the lines of communication described above are Roads within the meaning of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," subject to the provisions of the said Act.

#### MOUNT MAGNET, LENNONVILLE, AND PAYNESVILLE COMMONS.

##### *By-laws.*

Department of Lands and Surveys,  
Corres. 3589/07. Perth, 22nd December, 1921.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Mount Magnet, Lennonville, and Paynesville Commons—Reserves 11342, 12876, and 6270:—

1. All stock running on the Commons, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock and impounded.

2. No person shall depasture any animal on the Commons contrary to these By-laws without the permission of the Board.

3. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list, in writing, of the number of horses, cattle, camels, asses, sheep, goats, or other animals that he, she, or they intend to depasture on the Commons, and shall describe the brands, numbers, or other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license from the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Road Board to depasture on the Commons according to these By-laws. While the Board will exercise every care in the event of any person being unable to give an accurate description of the stock being registered, the Board accepts no responsibility if the said stock is subsequently impounded and sold through misrepresentation.

4. With the exception of stock owned by *bona fide* travellers, travelling teamsters, and drovers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Commons free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and the following charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first days of January and July in each and every year, in respect of all stock running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Mount Magnet Road Board District only shall have the right to run stock on the Commons. The scale of charges to be as follows:—

Horses, cattle, mules, and asses, 7s. 6d. per head per annum.

Dairy cows, 5s. per head per annum.

Camels, 30s. per head per annum.

Goats, 2s. per head per annum.

Dairy goats, 1s. 6d. per head per annum.

Butchers' stock, charges £7 10s. per annum for not more than 150 sheep and 10 head of cattle.

Any genuine prospector may, on application to the Secretary and Chairman of the Board, obtain permission to run one horse free on the Commons, and a list be kept of permits given.

5. No camel shall depasture on the Commons without the written permission of the Chairman or two members of the Road Board.

6. Stock under nine months of age shall be exempt from tax if running with the mother.

7. (a.) No license shall be granted to any person, except *bona fide* butchers and dairymen, to depasture on the Commons at any one time more than 10 head of cattle, mules, asses, goats, or camels, in the aggregate. Only sheep kept for killing by *bona fide* butchers for supply to the public shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Commons.

(b.) No firm of butchers shall depasture more than 150 sheep and 15 cattle at any one time, and no dairyman shall depasture more than 20 cows or 30 goats at any one time, except by special permission of the Road Board.

8. Any person running stock on the Commons may, with the permission of the Secretary in writing, change such stock from time to time, provided that he does not at any time exceed the number for which he shall have paid Commonage fees.

9. *Bona fide* travellers or teamsters on notifying the Secretary of date of arrival shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels on the Commons for the space of seven clear days free of charge; such stock, after being on the Commons for that time, must make a *bona fide* trip of at least fourteen miles from, where they unloaded, Mount Magnet or elsewhere, before being entitled to another term free. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per day or part of a day, for all horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels. In no case shall such horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels remain on the Commons under this regulation longer than 12 clear days at any one time.

10. Resident teamsters will be allowed to run their teams stocks on the Commons at an annual charge of five pounds (£5) per team per annum, payable quarterly in advance; such teams not to exceed 30 donkeys, 15 horses, or 18 camels. Any stock above these numbers to pay the ordinary rates of 7s. 6d. per head per annum.

11. No stock shall be mustered on or removed from the Commons without the written permission of the Secretary of the Road Board or Commonage Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand or earmark stock running or depasturing on the Commons, unless in the presence of the Secretary or Ranger.

12. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the Commonages conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with "The Drovers Act."

13. Travelling stock arriving by train will be allowed two clear days after arrival free of charge. Travelling sheep, if waiting for trucks to leave Mount Magnet, Lennonville, or Paynesville, or any railway siding within the Mount Magnet Road Board District, will be allowed three clear days free of charge.

14. Stray stock proved to be accidentally on the Commons shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be impounded.

15. No entire horse, jack donkey, or bull over the age of nine months shall be allowed on the Commons without the owner thereof obtaining written permission from the Chairman or Secretary of the Road Board, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner, if known, any such entire horse, jack donkey, or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

16. The Secretary or Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Commons from the owner or person in charge of such stock.

17. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the Commons under the provisions of these By-laws. The Secretary or any person appointed by him shall have power at any time to muster all stock on the Commons and for the purpose of ascertaining brands or marks may yard same in crush and may tar brand such stock.

18. The Road Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, and dairy cattle or dairy goats, within the meaning of these By-laws.

19. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being requested to do so by any member of officer of the Road Board or any policeman.

20. The Road Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed person of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

21. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Road Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.

22. (a) Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause or allow to be introduced or depastured any diseased animal or animals upon the Commons, or allow the same to depasture on the Commons, shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty hereinafter prescribed.

(b) The Chairman, Secretary, or Commonage Ranger or other authorised person may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common and, if he thinks fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased, all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid by the owner. If the owner cannot be found, and the animal is suffering from a disease which will endanger other stock coming in contact, the Chairman, Secretary, or Ranger shall lay a complaint before a Justice of the Peace and if the said Justice is satisfied that the said animal is a danger to other stock he may order the destruction of the said animal forthwith.

23. The Secretary or Commonage Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty, or for any breach of the within By-laws, or any of them, or for the enforcement

of the within By-laws or any one of them, and such legal proceedings shall be commenced by a complaint made by the Secretary or Commonage Ranger, and all the proceedings shall be in conformity with "The Justices Act, 1902," and its amendments, unless such proceedings are repugnant to the within By-laws or any of them.

24. Any person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and on conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and £2 per day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate, in default imprisonment.

25. No person shall be permitted to fell or remove any green or growing timber on the Commons, without the written permission of the Chairman or any two members of the Board.

26. Immediately a muster of the Commons is started all stock running on the Commons that have not been previously registered shall only be registered if the owner pays in addition to the registration fees the proportional cost and expenses of the muster of the said stock.

27. All stock registered to depasture on the Commons are registered subject to all the conditions mentioned in these By-laws.

#### *Pound.*

The main or declared Pound of the Mount Magnet Road Board shall be in the Paddock which is situated at the S.W. corner of the Mt. Magnet Commonage and shall be known as the Mount Magnet Road Board District Pound.

#### *Temporary Pound.*

Shall consist of any place of security in the Mt. Magnet Road Board District under the control of the Board, or used by permission of the owner or owners.

Any Officer of the Road Board may impound in the District or Temporary Pound any animals he may find in the district contrary to the By-laws of the Mount Magnet Road Board. All large stock impounded under the provisions of the By-laws shall be held for a space of seven days, and if unclaimed, or all fees and expenses of mustering, feeding, etc., pound fees and all expenses therewith, are not paid, said stock shall be sold by public auction.

On impounding any stock, the Secretary shall advertise in the local paper the description of the animal, viz., brands, colour, marks, and height, and date of sale of such animal, and, if the owner be known, to immediately notify him.

#### *Fees, etc.*

The undermentioned fees shall be payable on all stock impounded, and may be recovered before two or more Justices of the Peace summarily:—

Big cattle as described in 46 Vic., No. 7, page 891—

Mustering, 5s. per head.

Feeding, 5s. per day or part day.

Water, 6d. per drink.

Paddocking in lieu of feed, 1s. per day.

Small cattle—

Mustering, 1s. per head.

Pound Fees, 1s. 6d. per day or part day.

Water, 6d. per day.

For every entire, bull, or bull camel, or jack donkey, Pound fees, 10s. per day.

All the provisions of the By-laws shall apply to the Pound and stock impounded therein, and all officers of the Board.

Any person found trespassing on or in any Pound without written permission (which must be carried with him or her and produced on demand to any officer or member of the Board, or policeman), or shall break or interfere with, or attempt to interfere with any fence, gate, etc., of any Pound, shall be liable on conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace to a fine up to £100, or up to six months' imprisonment.

Any person who shall interfere, impede, or obstruct any officer of the Board in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a fine and imprisonment.

All goats impounded shall be held for a period of twenty-four hours and if unclaimed may be sold or destroyed. After twenty-four hours they will become the absolute property of the Board if unclaimed and fees unpaid.

When any unclaimed stock have been sold by public auction from the Pound, the Secretary shall pay out of the proceeds all expenses, and the balance shall be held in trust for the owner for 12 months. If at the expiration of the 12 months no claim had been made, the balance shall become the property and part of the general revenue of the Board and shall be applied to the requirements of the Common and Pound under the control of the Board.

For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Mt. Magnet Road Board By-laws governing the Common and Pound, "Officers" shall mean the Chairman, Secretary or any member of the Board, or any employee whether permanent or temporary employed by the Board.

These By-laws were approved by the Mount Magnet Road Board at a special meeting held on the 15th day of October, 1921, and are to take effect from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

All previous existing Common By-laws are hereby repealed.

1. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, the terms used have the meanings assigned to them by "The Gold Buyers Act, 1921," and the following words and expressions have the meanings herein set against the same, respectively, viz. :—

"The Act": the Gold Buyers Act, 1921; "The Department of Mines": the Head Office of the Department of Mines at Perth.

2. A "Gold Assayer," within the meaning of "The Gold Buyers Act, 1921," shall be :—

- (a.) A person who for two years prior to the 1st day of January, 1922, continuously carried on business publicly in Western Australia as a Gold Assayer; or
- (b.) A person who for three years prior to the 1st day of January, 1922, was actually continuously employed in Western Australia as a Gold Assayer by a person, company, or corporation carrying on business publicly as a Gold Assayer; or
- (c.) A person holding a certificate or diploma of competency as a gold assayer, or of a kind that necessarily imports competency as a gold assayer from a School of Mines or Technical School in Western Australia or any other school or institution approved by the Minister for Mines.

The Warden must, before issuing a certificate for a license as a gold assayer under Section 7 of the Act, be satisfied that the applicant is a gold assayer within the meaning of this regulation.

3. The forms prescribed under these regulations in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, shall be used in connection with any application, certificate, declaration, license, record, registration, report or return to which any such form shall be applicable.

4. 6. The Mining Registrar of the Warden's Court at which a certificate for the issue or renewal of any license is granted, or at which any license is revoked or transferred, shall enter the particulars of same in a register in the Form No. 7, and shall also keep a register in the Form No. 8 of all licenses issued by him.

7. A duplicate of all licenses issued by him and notification of all transfers, revocations, or dealing with such licenses, shall be sent by the Mining Registrar to the Under Secretary for Mines.
