WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purpose of the said Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, acting under the powers contained in the said Act and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 30th day of January, 1922, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 20 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board: And whereas it is desirable to increase the number of members of the Swan Road Board from nine to eleven: Now, therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare and determine that the number of members constituting the Swan Road Board shall be eleven in lieu of nine as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in the Schedule hereunder, also that the two additional members shall be allocated, one to the South and one to the East Ward respectively, to date from the 25th March, 1922, in order that the first election to fill the additional vacancies so created shall take place on the second Saturday in April, at the same time and place as the ordinary annual elections are held, in accordance with the provisions of Section 27 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations applying to Members of Parliament travelling on steamers:—

1. Members of Parliament representing electorates which necessitate travel by sea shall be entitled to free transport to and from their constituencies by any State steamer which may be running, upon a sustenance charge of 8s. per day, or 2s. for each quarter day involved, the times for computation of the charge to be fixed at 8 a.m., 1 p.m., 6 p.m., and 12 midnight. This concession does not apply to privately owned boats.

2. If for any reason State-owned boats are not available at the times required, members may be allowed one return trip during the financial year to and from their constituencies upon payment to the State Government of the above sustenance charge. This concession shall not apply if any State-owned boat is available within a period of two weeks.

3. Each Member of Parliament shall be entitled to a free return journey once in each year, available by State steamers only, for his wife and unmarried daughters, and sons under 18 years of age, on payment of the sustenance allowance hereinbefore fixed.

4. Under the regulation immediately preceding, one child under three years may travel free, additional children under three years at quarter rate, between three years and 12 years half rate, 12 years and upwards full rates.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Amendment of Regulations.

The Regulations of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners made the 1st day of July, 1921, are hereby amended as follows:—

Regulation No. 113.

The portion of Regulation No. 113 dealing with flour for shipment is hereby cancelled, and the following enacted in place thereof, *viz.*:—

Flour.—Wharfage nil; handling charges, (a) If stacked prior to shipment, 2s. 3d. per ton of 2,000 lbs.

(b) If handled direct from railway wagons to ships' slings, 1s. 2d. per ton of 2,000 lbs.

Where flour is brought to the port by water for export and has to be landed before shipment, the same conditions and charges as are herein set out for flour brought down by land will apply.

Where such flour is transhipped to the export vessel overside vessel to vessel direct and not landed, the Trust will not handle it.

This amendment shall be in force as from 1st January, 1922.

FREMANTLE BOAT LICENSING BOARD.

Amendment of Regulations.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Boat Licensing Board are hereby amended by adding the following new regulation, *viz.*:—

Smoking and Naked Lights on Motor Boats.

13. Smoking is prohibited near the engine or fuel tank, and naked or unguarded lights shall not be used in their vicinity.

As numerous fires and explosions have occurred on board petrol driven launches (resulting in fatalities in some cases), the greatest possible care must be taken to prevent any leakage of petrol or any accumulation of inflammable gas in any circumstances whatever. The use of naked or unguarded lights at any time in the vicinity of a petrol engine or fuel tank is extremely dangerous, being liable to at any moment cause a sudden fire or explosion. The Boat Licensing Board will take immediate action to exact the heaviest penalty possible for any breach of this regulation.

Further Suspension of operations on Government Railway Reserves.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Field's Find Common, Reserve 14350.

The Yalgoo Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Field's Find Common do hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Field's Find Common:—

By-laws.

1. All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.

2. No person shall depasture any animal on the Field's Find Common without having first obtained a license from the Yalgoo Road Board.

3. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list in writing of the number of horses, cattle, camels, asses, sheep, goats, or other animals that he, she, or they intend to depasture on the Common, and shall describe the brands, numbers, or other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license from the Secretary or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Board to depasture on the Common according to these By-laws.

4. With the exception of stock owned by *bonâ fide* travellers, travelling teamsters, and drovers, as herein-after provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common free of charge, and the following charges shall be chargeable quarterly in advance in respect of all stock running or depasturing thereon:—

Persons residing within a radius of two miles of Field's Find only have the right to run stock on the Common. Any prospector living or prospecting within a four-mile radius of Field's Find shall be allowed the same privileges as a resident of Field's Find. Horses, mules, asses, cattle, and camels shall be charged at the rate of 15s. per head per annum; dairy cattle at the rate of 10s. per head per annum; sheep, only sheep kept for killing by a *bonâ fide* butcher trading at Field's Find for the supply of the public shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common, except by special permission of the Road Board. No firm of butchers shall depasture more than 150 head of sheep and 10 head of cattle at any one time (except by special permission of the Board), and shall pay an annual fee of £7 10s. Goats shall be charged at the rate of 2s. 6d. per head per annum; each goat to carry a regulation disc. No person will be allowed to keep more than 10 head of goats at any one time. Swine will not under any consideration be allowed to run on the Common, Stock under six months of age shall be free.

5. Any person running stock on the Common may change such stock from time to time, provided he, she, or they do not at any time exceed the numbers for which he, she, or they have paid Commonage fees.

6. (By-law 6).—*Bonâ fide* travellers and teamsters will be allowed to run their horses, cattle, camels, mules or asses on the Common for seven clear days free of charge. Such stock after being on the Common for that period must make a *bonâ fide* trip of at least three days' absence from Field's Find before being entitled to another seven days free; should the seven days be exceeded, such stock will be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per day or part of a day, but in no case shall such stock remain on the Common under this By-law longer than 12 days at any one time.

6a. (By-law 6a).—Resident teamsters will be allowed to run their teams on the Common for an annual charge of £5, payable quarterly in advance, such teams not to exceed 30 donkeys, 17 camels, or 12 horses; any stock above these numbers to be charged as in By-law No. 4, namely, at the rate of 15s. per head per annum.

6b. (By-law No. 6b).—No stock shall be mustered on the Common without the written permission of the Secretary or Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand any stock running or depasturing on the Common unless in the presence of the Secretary or Ranger.

6c. (By-law No. 6c).—Any person who shall introduce, cause or allow to be introduced or depastured, any diseased animal or animals upon the Common or allow the same to depasture on the Common shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty hereinafter prescribed.

6d. (By-law No. 6d).—The Chairman, Secretary, Commonage Ranger, or other authorised person may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common and, if he thinks fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid by the owner.

7. No travelling stock, without the permission of the Board, will be allowed to cross the Common, and must be off the Common within 12 hours of coming on.

8. The Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or Road Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

9. No stock on which Commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Common unless with the written sanction of the Secretary until all such fees have been paid in full.

10. Strayed stock proved to be accidentally on the Common shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

11. No entire horse or bull over the age of six months shall be allowed on the Common without the owner thereof obtaining permission from the Road Board, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Viet., No. 7).

12. The Secretary or Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Common.

13. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

14. The Road Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a *bonâ fide* butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, and dairy cattle, within the meaning of these By-laws.

15. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any member or officer of the Board or any policeman.

16. The Road Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed person of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

17. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner described in "The Justices Act, 1902," and in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under

the By-laws of the Road Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounding stock.

18. All penalties and other sums recovered under these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Road Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.

These By-laws have been approved of by the Yalgoo Road Board and are to take effect from 9th November, 1921.

All previous By-laws and amendments thereof are hereby cancelled.
