#### Greeting:

WHEREAS on the 21st day of September, 1921, a Select Committee of the Legislative Assembly was appointed to investigate the methods adopted by financial agents and others regarding profiteering in the buying of war gratuity bonds from returned soldiers of the A.I.F., and the infringement of the Usury Act in relation to same; also in respect to certain land agents cashing war gratuity bonds in exchange for the purchase of blocks of land at fictitiously high values, and by such means indecently and flagrantly exploiting the returned soldiers: And whereas it is desirable to appoint the members of the Select Committee Honorary Commissioners to continue and conclude such inquiries: Know ye therefore that we do by these Our Letters Patent, issued in Our Name by Our Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, appoint you to be Honorary Commissioners to inquire into and report upon the matters aforesaid: And we appoint you the said Arthur Allan Wilson to be Chairman: And we require you to report as soon as possible to Our Governor in and over the said State of Western Australia the result of your inquiries into the matters entrusted to you by these Our Letters Patent, which We declare to be a Royal Commission to which "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902," applies.

## RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD ACT, 1920.

No. 1 of 1922.

*Between the Railways and Tramways Officers' Industrial Union of Workers (Applicant), and the Commissioner of Railways (Respondent).*

THE Railways Classification Board doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the application of the above-named parties:—

## AWARD.

## Conditions of Service.

1.—*Term of Award.*

This award shall date from the 18th February, 1922, and remain in force for three years from that date: Provided that either party shall have the right to apply for a variation of the same after the expiration of six months, as provided for under Section 21 of the Act.

2.—*Area and Scope of Award.*

This award shall apply to all officers employed in the Western Australian Government Railways, except Heads and Sub-heads of Branches.

3.—*Interpretations.*

For the purpose of this award—

“Head of Branch” shall mean Chief Traffic Manager, Chief Mechanical Engineer, Chief Engineer Way and Works, Chief Accountant, Auditor of Receipts, Comptroller of Stores, and Secretary for Railways, or such other head of branch as may hereinafter be appointed.

“Sub-heads” shall mean the following officers or such other sub-head as may hereinafter be appointed:—

Secretary for Railways Branch.—Principal Record Clerk, Officers-in-Charge Assets, Finance, Staff, Operations, etc., General Sections, Advertising Agent, Industrial Agent.

Traffic Branch.—Superintendent of Transportation, District Traffic Superintendents, Chief Clerk to Chief Traffic Manager, Claims Agent.

Locomotive Branch (including Workshops).—Superintendent of Loco. Running, District Loco. Superintendents, Workshops Manager, Chief Draftsman, Chief Boiler Inspector, Chief Clerk to Chief Mechanical Engineer.

Way and Works Branch.—Assistant Chief Engineer, District Engineers, Electrical and Signal Engineer, Assistant Engineer and Chief Draftsman, Chief Clerk to Chief Engineer.

Accounts Branch.—Auditor of Disbursements, Chief Bookkeeper, Chief Staff Clerk, Paymaster and Receiver.

Audit Branch.—Chief Clerk.

Stores Branch.—Chief Clerk, Stores Foreman, Mill Manager.

“Department” shall mean the Western Australian Government Railway Department.

“Union” shall mean the organisation registered as the Western Australian Government Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers, or such other title as it may hereinafter be registered under.

“Home Station.”—Wherever the words “Home Station” is used it shall mean the station to which an officer is attached.

“Married Officer” does not include a married officer whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him, but includes a single officer who has a parent or child solely dependent upon him and resident in the State of Western Australia.

4.—*Probation.*

(a.) A junior clerk who, in the second year of his service, passes the prescribed examination in—

- (i.) Pitman's Shorthand—80 words per minute, or
- (ii.) Telegraphy—15 words per minute, Sound; 20 words per minute, Transmission, or

(iii.) Railway Accounts, or any subject suitable to the Branch he has been appointed to, shall be granted the ensuing scale increase of salary three months prior to his birthday.

(b.) In addition, any junior clerk who holds certificates for Telegraphy and Railway Accounts, as per (a), and qualifies in Safe Working, or the qualifying examination suitable to his branch, on or before attaining the age of twenty-one years, will be granted a further advance of three months on the ensuing scale increase.

5.—*Hours of Duty.*

(a.) The hours of duty of officers (other than Transport Officers) employed in the Head and District Offices shall be:—

Mondays to Fridays—9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (with interval of one hour for lunch);

Saturdays—9 a.m. to 12 noon.

(b.) The hours of Telegraphists shall be six and a half per shift at the Perth Operating Room, exclusive of meal hour. At other stations, seven hours per shift, exclusive of meal hour.

(c.) Station-masters, Assistant and Night Station-masters, and Relief Officers shall work forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of Sundays.

(d.) The spread of shift for Station-masters, Assistant and Night Station-masters, and Relief Officers shall not exceed ten hours over all, except at stations where the train service renders it impracticable, where the spread may be extended to twelve hours.

(e.) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for Inspectors or other officers who are required to travel in the performance of their duties.

(f.) All other officers shall work forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of Sundays: Provided that, where the present custom is to work a lesser number of hours, such custom shall continue.

(g.) Any time taken by an officer in handing over at change of shifts shall not be counted as time worked.

6.—*Overtime.*

(a.) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours in any one week and can only be claimed under the following conditions:—

Less than 30 minutes—Not to be paid for.

30 minutes and up to 37 minutes—Half an hour.

38 minutes and up to 52 minutes—Three-quarters of an hour.

53 minutes and up to 67 minutes—One hour.

68 minutes and up to 82 minutes—One hour and a-quarter.

83 minutes and up to 97 minutes—One hour and a-half, and thereafter on similar basis.

(b.) Overtime shall be paid for at the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours up to two hours per day; over that period, time and a-quarter.

(c.) All officers engaged on work which may be defined by the Commissioner as special, in excess of the recognised working hours, shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a-quarter for the whole of such overtime.

(d.) The recognised hours of duty shall be as laid down in Clause 5, subclauses (a) to (g).

(e.) In computing the number of hours worked per week, time absent on sick leave and holidays, when paid for, shall be treated as time worked.

(f.) Any periods up to five minutes on any days are not to count in the week's total. The first two hours overtime, or any portion thereof, on any days may be adjusted in the week's total, but any overtime beyond the two hours in any days will stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.

(g.) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall apply to:—

(i.) The Head and Administrative Officers,

(ii.) Metropolitan and Suburban Station Officers,

(iii.) Station and other officers at Traffic Depôt Stations.

(h.) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall also apply to all other stations regarding overtime worked through—

(i.) The late or irregular running of trains,

(ii.) The running of special or conditional trains, or

(iii.) On account of the absence of other members of the staff.

(i.) All other overtime worked shall be paid for at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(j.) Any officer in receipt of a salary of £385 per annum and over shall not be entitled to overtime pay.

7.—*Sunday Time.*

(a.) Officers who are called upon for Sunday duty shall, if the work is of such nature that it cannot be carried out within the usual hours of duty, be paid for such duty as under, calculated at one-third hundred and thirteenth of a year's salary for each full Sunday worked:—

(i.) Officers who do not ordinarily work on Sundays, such as those specially brought on duty occasionally or in cases of emergency, shall be paid time and a-half;

(ii.) Other officers to be paid at ordinary rates and allowed the following paid leave, viz., one day for working each four full, five three-quarter, eight half, or sixteen quarter Sundays, not necessarily consecutively; Christmas Day and Good Friday to be considered as Sundays in so far as this subclause operates.

(b.) The following shall be the scale for calculating Sunday time:—

(i.) Less than a quarter of an hour worked in continuance of a shift beginning on a Saturday or in commencement of a shift terminating on Monday—Nil.

(ii.) Up to and including a quarter of a day's work—Quarter-day.

(iii.) Over one-quarter and up to and including half a-day—Half-day.

(iv.) Over half and up to and including three-quarters of a day—Three-quarters.

(v.) Over three-quarters and up to one day—One day.

(c.) An officer who on a Sunday works more than his ordinary week-day rostered shift shall be paid for the actual time worked.

(d.) If an officer works a broken shift on Sunday, each section of the shift shall stand alone for computing the time to be paid for.

(e.) No break of shift shall be allowed between the hours of 12 midnight and 6 a.m.

(f.) In computing Sunday time for Inspectors the ordinary hours of duty shall be deemed to be those worked at the Head and District Offices.

8.—*Leave of Absence, Annual.*

(a.) After twelve months' continuous service officers shall be entitled to annual leave of absence.

(b.) Officers connected with station or outside duties and who are ordinarily required to work on the majority of public holidays shall be granted three weeks' leave of absence each year.

(c.) Other officers, twelve days and public holidays, or day in lieu of any such holiday worked.

(d.) Officers stationed on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe line and Port Hedland-Marble Bar line shall be entitled to two and twelve days' extra leave respectively as travelling time.

(e.) Leave of absence shall be calculated to the close of each financial year, and shall be paid for at the salary the officer is in receipt of at the time such annual leave is taken.

(f.) The leave shall be applied for and taken out at a time convenient to the Department before the thirtieth June following the year for which it fell due; at the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse unless such leave shall have been deferred by the Department or the permission of the Commissioner obtained for its accumulation.

(g.) In urgent cases leave in addition to the foregoing may be granted, without pay, for a period not exceeding three months. Any public holidays falling due during the period in which an officer is on leave without pay shall not be paid for.

(h.) Subject to the proviso hereto, any officer with more than six months' service who may resign or be dismissed from the service, shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays *pro rata* up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that if an officer be dismissed for being under the influence of liquor or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid only for such leave (if any) as was due up to the thirtieth June previous, and if dismissed for peculation, tampering with ticket issues, or manipulation of the books of the Department, he shall not be entitled to payment for any holidays.

(i.) The next-of-kin of a deceased officer shall be granted payment of *pro rata* annual leave to the date of the decease of the officer.

9.—*Absence without Pay.*

Any term in excess of three months an officer is absent from duty from any cause without pay shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

10.—*Long Service Leave.*

(a.) The Commissioner shall grant to any officer who has continued on the salaried staff for ten years long service leave for three calendar months on full pay or six calendar months on half pay. For the subsequent period of ten years the same conditions shall apply, and thereafter for every seven years similar leave shall be granted.

*Note.*—In connection with the change over from ten years to seven, both parties agree to the incomplete year of service on delivery of this award being treated as follows:—

(i.) In the case of an officer with over six months' service the seven year period will be calculated from the completion of the year now being served.

(ii.) In the case of an officer with six months or less than six months, the seven year period will be calculated from commencement of year now being served.

(b.) Service prior to attaining the age of eighteen years shall not count in computing long service leave.

(c.) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(d.) Should a married officer who has completed half or more qualifying service for long service leave die,

his next-of-kin shall be granted payment for such leave *pro rata*.

(e.) In the case of an officer who, on account of the exigencies of the Department, is regressed to the wages staff and subsequently reappointed to the salaried staff, the time served on the salaried staff prior to regression shall be counted in computing service for long service leave.

(f.) Any officer who resigns or is retired from the service (through having reached the retiring age excepted), shall be paid for long service leave due at the time of resignation or retirement.

(g.) An officer who is retired upon reaching the retiring age shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

(h.) An officer dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment for long service leave.

11.—*Sick Leave.*

(a.) Any officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall, as soon as possible, advise his superior officer in sufficient time to admit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b.) Any officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will be able to resume duty to enable any necessary arrangements to be made.

(c.) Should the absence be prolonged beyond one day the officer shall, except as provided in paragraph (d), forward to his superior officer on the second day thereof a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner, showing the nature of the illness and probable duration.

(d.) Any such officer who resides more than five miles from a legally qualified medical practitioner shall intimate that fact to his superior officer, within whose discretion it shall lie as to whether a certificate is required or not.

(e.) Any officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown in the first certificate shall thereupon furnish a further certificate, and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the periods respectively covered by such certificates: Provided, however, that the maximum period between the dates of furnishing any two medical certificates shall be fourteen days.

(f.) In cases where incapacity for duty is obvious to the Head of the Branch, he may relieve the officer of the necessity of providing medical certificate.

(g.) Any officer shall, if so directed, present himself for examination by a medical officer at such time and place as may be fixed.

(h.) Any officer who has been absent for three days (not continuous) in one financial year shall, if instructed by his superior officer, furnish a medical certificate for absences of one day only.

(i.) Officers who have conformed to the foregoing may be granted sick leave (exclusive of annual and long service leave) as follows:—

Officers with six, or less than six months' service—  
Nil.

Officers with more than six months but less than three years' service—Two weeks on full pay for each completed six months' service.

Officers with three years' service and over—Three months on full pay and three months on half-pay.

(j.) Such leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay provided for must not be exceeded.

(k.) In no case shall an officer be granted more than three months on full pay and three months on half pay in any one triennial period, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner. The triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which payment is claimed.

(l.) No payment will be made for any absence due to an officer's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

(m.) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house will not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence will be granted under this section, excepting under special circumstances to be approved by the Commissioner.

12.—*Away from Home Allowances.*

(a.) Allowances to meet the travelling expenses of officers will be paid as under:—

3. General:

(f.) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purpose of computing expenses, in the case of arrival at home station, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later than 8 a.m., lunch if later than 1 p.m., tea if later than 6 p.m., and bed if later than 11 p.m.

(g.) When an officer is absent from home station for less than a full day and night, reasonable actual expenses, with a maximum of 2s. per meal in suburban areas and 2s. 6d. per meal outside suburban areas, will be allowed.

(h.) When a sleeping berth is provided, the bed allowance will not apply, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night.

(i.) Incidental expenses, such as cab fares and cartage of personal luggage, will be allowed provided the time away from home station is sufficient to warrant such expenditure.

(j.) Where an officer stationed within the metropolitan-suburban area is instructed to work during or over meal hour, he may be paid a maximum allowance of 2s. per meal, provided he could not conveniently have his meal in the usual way and that no payment for overtime is made.

(k.) In cases where an officer is engaged at other than his home station in receipt of weekly rate of allowance and is temporarily away from such station, the daily allowance will be paid in lieu of the weekly rate for the period of such temporary absence for one day or over; if the absence is less than one day, reasonable actual expenses will be paid.

(l.) Where an officer is relieving on expenses for a period of less than twenty-eight days, he shall not receive greater payment for relieving expenses than he would have received if he had been relieving for twenty-eight days.

(m.) Engineering officers whilst in camp provided by the Department shall be paid a daily allowance of 6s. in lieu of the scale allowance shown in subclause (d).

(n.) An additional allowance of twenty per cent. (20%) shall be granted an officer stationed outside the areas defined in Clause 15, subclauses (a) and (b), when travelling within such areas.

(o.) Where officers travel by steamer on which the fare paid includes sustenance, an allowance of fifteen per cent. (15%) of the passage money shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowance.

(p.) Officers travelling on duty to the Eastern States via the Trans-Australian Railway will be paid such allowance from time of leaving Kalgoorlie until return thereto, as the Commissioner may determine.

(q.) Any unmarried officer who is required to undertake duties away from his head-quarters and who remains at one foreign station for a period exceeding twenty-eight days, will not be granted away from home allowance, but will be paid any reasonable expenses incurred in travelling to and from his head-quarters.

(r.) Subclauses (c), (e), (l), and (q) will not apply until an officer has received information that his stay at one place will be of such duration as to bring him under the provisions of these subclauses.

(s.) In special cases the above scale may be increased by the Commissioner.

### 13.—Lodging Allowance.

(a.) Any junior in receipt of a salary of less than £120 per annum who, in the opinion of the Head of the Branch, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a board and lodging allowance equivalent to the difference between his annual salary and £120 per annum.

(b.) No allowance under this clause shall be continued—

- (i.) during absence from duty without pay;
- (ii.) during any period of annual leave;
- (iii.) during any period of other absence from duty with pay unless the officer concerned continues to reside away from his home;
- (iv.) during any period (after the expiration of one month) in which the officer is continuously in receipt of travelling or away from home allowance.

### 14.—Transfer Allowance.

(a.) Any officer transferred from one station to another over one mile distant, involving a change of residence, shall—

- (i.) be paid not less than £2 for a married officer and 15s. for a single officer;
- (ii.) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred;
- (iii.) be granted free passes for self and family and free railway transport of his furniture and effects, including one cow or not more than two goats.

(b.) Any officer who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provisions of subclause (iii.) only.

(c.) Married officers (if necessary) shall be allowed one day for packing and one day for unpacking.

(d.) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(e.) Officers transferred to districts necessitating travelling a full night shall be supplied with sleeping berths for themselves on trains which have the accommodation, provided such berths are available.

### 15.—District Allowances.

(a.) Officers stationed at Merredin or Eastward or Northward thereof on the Eastern Goldfields Line as far as Goongarrie (inclusive), or at Mullewa or Eastward or Northward thereof on the Murchison Goldfields Line as far as Mount Magnet (inclusive), or on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Railway, shall be paid district allowances as under:—

(d.) When an officer stationed in a district carrying an allowance is on long service leave, no allowance will be paid unless the officer or his family remain in such district.

(e.) An officer brought away temporarily for relief purposes from a district carrying an allowance shall be paid the allowance, provided such officer's family remains in such district.

(f.) District allowances shall not apply when an officer is absent without pay and in the case of an officer leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays, allowance shall not be paid for the period of such holidays.

### 16.—Free Passes and Freight.

(a.) After twelve months' continuous service an officer shall be allowed three first class passes, as under:—

- (i.) One station to station pass on the occasion of the annual leave, to cover the full term of annual leave due;
- (ii.) Two privilege passes from one given station to another, and return;
- (iii.) In addition to the foregoing, an officer shall be granted a station to station pass to cover the full term of long service leave.

(b.) The passes may be issued in favour of the officer, his wife, and members of his family (in the case of females, unmarried, and in the case of males, under eighteen years of age), solely dependent upon the officer's earnings. The concession may be extended to the mother of an officer resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings, or to the sister of an unmarried officer similarly situated.

(c.) Upon request an officer shall be granted a separate pass, station to station, for his wife and dependents, as mentioned in subclause (b) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time or in the same direction.

(d.) After six months' service an officer shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in subclause (a) in proportion to length of service.

(e.) An officer who resigns or is retired from the service and has annual leave due will be granted a free station to station pass for the term of such holiday.

(f.) On production of a certificate from the Master of the School or from the Secretary of the Railway Institute, passes shall be issued to an officer of the Department for the sole purpose of attending Government Technical Schools or approved Shorthand, Accounts, Safe Working, or other classes at the Railway Institute.

(g.) Officers in isolated parts may be issued free passes, at the discretion of the Head of the Branch, for the purpose of obtaining medical attention.

(h.) Officers stationed outside suburban areas will be issued market passes once per month to the most convenient market town. The passes may be issued in favour of the officer, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years. An officer's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight if required.

*Note.*—Free passes shall not apply to race specials, guaranteed specials, or special excursion trains within a fifty-mile radius, or when in the opinion of the Station-master at the station where the officer desires to commence his journey there is not ample room on the train.

(i.) Domestic supplies up to a maximum weight fortnightly of 2cwt. for married men and 1cwt. for single men, shall be carried free by rail to home station from the most convenient market town and, in addition, meat, bread, vegetables, and dairy produce, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the nearest town where same are procurable. All such supplies must be for the sole use of the officer and his family.

17.—*Privilege Tickets.*

After six months' continuous service an officer shall be allowed first class privilege tickets at one-half the ordinary single fare for the return or single journey (minimum 1s. for an adult and 6d. for a child), to be issued as provided in Clause 16.

*Note.*—Privilege tickets shall not apply to race specials, guaranteed specials, or special excursion trains, within a fifty-mile radius, or when in the opinion of the Station-master at the station where the officer desires to commence his journey there is not ample room on the train.

18.—*Privilege Season Tickets.*

(a.) First class season tickets at one-half the ordinary season ticket rates will, on application and on production of the departmental certificate, be issued to an officer to enable him to travel between his place of occupation and the station nearest to his place of residence. To an officer in receipt of £90 per annum or under, one-quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

(b.) These season tickets shall be available only whilst the holder is in the employ of the Department.

(c.) Should the holder resign or change his place of residence, a refund of the unexpired value of the ticket will be made if handed in at the time.

19.—*Resignations and Retirements.*

(a.) No officer shall leave the Department until the expiration of one month's written notice of his intention so to do without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b.) One calendar month's notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such officer whose services are no longer required, provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct or to officers for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work, or whom he may deem it unnecessary to employ by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, or for any cause beyond his control.

20.—*Promotions.*

(a.) Promotion and the selection of any officer to act in a higher position shall be governed by relative ability, suitability, record, and experience. If everything else is deemed equal, the senior officer shall be selected for promotion.

(b.) As a general rule officers and employees of the Branch in which the vacancy occurs will be promoted to the higher position, but the Commissioner may, when he considers it advisable for the good of the service, select an officer from one branch for position in another, either in the same or in a higher class.

(c.) When considered necessary, a person from outside the service may be appointed to any position in the service, provided there is not an officer in the service capable of filling the position.

(d.) No officer shall refuse compliance with any order directing his transfer from one position to another, but if on appeal the Commissioner is satisfied that the objection is sound, then such officer shall not be penalised.

(e.) An officer desiring to be passed over in the event of promotion being offered shall, if his request be acceded to, forfeit all claim to promotion for two years, but if good and sufficient reason be given the Commissioner, he may restore such claim.

(f.) All officers promoted to a higher position shall be subject to a probationary period of six months and paid the minimum rate of salary assigned to the class to which they are promoted. At the end of such period the Head of the Branch shall report to the Commissioner as to the fitness of the officer for the higher position; if the report is satisfactory, the appointment will be confirmed as from the date of taking up the duty; if unsatisfactory, the officer will be provided for at the same salary as he was in receipt of prior to the period of probation in the higher position.

(g.) A list of promotions shall be published in the *Weekly Notice*, and any officer who considers that he has been unjustly passed over may appeal, in the first place to the Head of his Branch and, if not satisfied with the latter's reply, may then appeal to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final, but no appeal will be considered unless forwarded so as to reach the Head of the Branch within fourteen days after receipt of the *Weekly Notice* and the Commissioner within fourteen days after date of receipt of the reply from the Head of the Branch.

21.—*Acting in Higher Capacities.*

An officer not employed on the relief staff and required to temporarily carry out the duties of a higher position or positions shall receive the minimum salary attached to such higher position, provided that he has relieved in the position or positions for at least one calendar month continuously, after which period the minimum salary attached to the position or positions relieved will be paid.

22.—*Temporary Clerks.*

(a.) Temporary clerks shall not be engaged without the approval of the Commissioner in any position classified above the Sixth Class.

(b.) The provisions of Clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18 will apply to temporary clerks.

(c.) The provisions of Clause 19, provided that the notice to leave received and given shall be one week in lieu of one calendar month, shall apply to temporary clerks.

(d.) Any temporary clerk may be granted, after six months' continuous service, sick leave as determined by the Commissioner.

(e.) The daily rate of pay shall be:—  
 First six months—14s. 10d. per day.  
 After six months—15s. 4d. per day.  
 After twelve months—15s. 10d. per day.

23.—*General Regulation.*

Any officer who is required to attend any medical or departmental examination shall be granted pay and out-of-pocket expenses, as the Commissioner may determine, for any period for which he is necessarily absent from his ordinary duties in connection therewith.

24.—*Classification.*

(a.) All positions set out in the schedule annexed hereto are in their respective proper classes and shown in alphabetical order.

(b.) The Commissioner shall, as soon as possible and not later than six months after the coming into force of this award, issue a printed classification for each officer, showing the officers in their order of seniority, position occupied, and salaries, in branch and section groups.

(c.) Officers performing Postal and/or Savings Bank duties shall be paid twenty per cent. (20%) of the allowance received by the Railway Department from these Departments in addition to their salary, but such shall not in any case be deemed part of the salary of such officer nor shall the officer claim Sunday time or overtime caused through Postal and/or Savings Bank duties.

(d.) Nothing in this classification shall lower the rate of salary any officer was in receipt of at the coming into force of this award.

Advancement from minimum to maximum of any class shall be by yearly increment, provided that such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioner upon satisfactory report from the Head of the Branch in which the officer is employed of his conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioner determines that such officer has not performed his duties satisfactorily for the preceding twelve months, or that such officer has been guilty of misconduct which in the opinion of the Commissioner justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.

(m.) An officer who is unable from any cause to perform the duties of his position and is in consequence provided with employment in another position in a lower class shall, unless the Commissioner directs otherwise, be paid the maximum rate for the class in which he has been provided.

## TRAFFIC ACT, 1919, AS AMENDED BY AMENDING ACT OF 1922.

*Traffic Regulations—Additions and Amendments.*  
PURSUANT to Section 41 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Regulation 22.—Paragraph 6 is amended by deleting from sub-paragraph (b), the following words:—"Vehicles plying for hire to also have the word 'hire' painted above identification letters and numbers in two-inch letters," and inserting in lieu thereof:—"Providing that when motor vehicles are kept in any garage approved by the licensing authority, and are not plying for hire on any public stand or on any road or public place, the licensing authority may at their discretion issue identification plates as issued for private motor vehicles as specified in sub-paragraph (a)."

Regulation 23 (b) is amended by adding the words "or the rear" after the word "side," in the third line thereof.

Regulation 27 is amended as follows:—

Paragraph (a), by adding at the end thereof the following words:—"Of the description both as regards size and colouring of plates, also as to the identification letters and numbers thereon as specified in Regulation No. 22 for motor cycles or other motor vehicles, as the case may be."

Paragraph (b), by inserting after the word "be," in the first line, the words:—"Two pounds ten for motor cycles and for other motor vehicles."

By adding a new paragraph, to read as follows:—

(h) Providing that no disc or tablet issued under this Regulation shall be used on any vehicle except on trial during or after assembly, construction, or repairs to demonstrate its efficiency.

Regulation 30 is further amended by relettering sub-paragraph (l), published in the *Gazette* of 17th December, 1920, to read as "(k)," also by adding the following paragraph:—

(l) Whilst riding any motor cycle through towns or other residential areas, do so in such a manner as to create any undue noise by riding at a high speed or use any cut-out or other appliance which may render the silencer less effective.

Regulation 77, paragraph (a), is amended by the insertion of the word "young" in front of the word "tree," and the words "of a diameter of less than six inches" after the word "tree," in the second line thereof; also, by adding the following after the words "tree guard":—"lamp post, electric light, telegraph, or tramway post, sewerage vent, or any verandah or balcony post, unless some notice is painted on such post or vent, with the approval of the local authority, notifying the public that horses may be tied thereto," after the word "engagement," at the end of the paragraph.

Regulation 92 is amended by adding the following graph:—"and any driver or conductor of a vehicle so standing on a public stand by pretending that his vehicle is engaged or hired when it is not so engaged or hired, shall commit an offence against these regulations."

Regulation 100a is hereby amended by adding an additional sub-paragraph, as follows:—

No vessels containing or which have contained spirit or oils of any description shall be carried in any part of a vehicle usually set apart for passengers.

Regulation 110 is amended by adding the following paragraphs:—

(a) Any police officer or traffic inspector may direct any number of persons congregating to attend any place of entertainment or other purpose to form into queues of not more than three abreast.

(b) Any person disobeying such directions or interfering with persons forming such queues, shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation.

Regulation 118 is amended by deleting the word "motor" when occurring in the first and second paragraphs of the said regulations.

Regulation 121 is amended by inserting the words "cattle, or," after the word "stallion," in the second line thereof, also by adding at the end of such regulation the following paragraph:—

In these regulations the word "cattle" whenever used, shall mean great and small cattle, and shall include the several animals mentioned in the

Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," No. 46 Victoria, No. 7. Regulation 130 is amended by the addition of the following paragraphs:—

(b) No picture, print, board, placard, or notice shall be carried or distributed in any road, street, or public place by any person, unless the approval of the form and manner shall have been first obtained in writing from the Commissioner of Police for within the Metropolitan Area or from the Traffic Inspector for any other district.

(c) This Regulation shall not apply to the sale of newspapers.

(d) The following Regulations are as to form and manner in which boards and placards may, by way of advertisement, be carried in any street within the specified limits:—

As to form—

The advertisements are to be written or printed on wood or pasteboard of not more than 32 inches in length, nor more than 20 inches in width.

As to manner—

(i) The boards and placards shall be suspended from the shoulders over the chest and back of the person carrying them, or carried overhead in the manner approved by the Commissioner of Police for the Metropolitan Area or the Traffic Inspector of the Local Authority outside that area.

(ii) Every board and placard shall be carried at a distance of not more than 30 yards from any other board or placard carried in the streets by way of advertisement.

(iii) Every board and placard shall be carried in the carriage way, close to the kerb of the footpath, but not on the footpath. Also with due regard to the rule of the road as prescribed in Regulations Nos. 40 and 45.

Regulation 144 is amended by adding the following paragraphs thereto:—

(d) A permit may be issued at the discretion of the Commissioner of Police for within the Metropolitan Area, or a Traffic Inspector of any other district, to an approved person, and shall authorise such person to play any musical instrument in any road, street, or public place.

(e) Every permit may be issued for any period not exceeding one calendar month, but may be renewed from time to time or revoked at the discretion of the issuing authority.

(f) Any member of the Police Force or a traffic inspector may require a street musician to depart from any street or other place for any reasonable cause, and any person playing or sounding upon any musical instruments in any such road, street, or public place shall immediately depart, and if such persons shall neglect so to do, such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations.

(g) Any person not being permitted under these Regulations who shall play any musical instrument upon any road, street, or public place for the purpose of gain, or obtaining money or otherwise, shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations.

(h) No person shall by speaking, shouting, singing, playing upon, or sounding any musical or noisy instrument, or doing anything whatsoever, attract together a number of persons in any road, street, or public place to the inconvenience, annoyance, or obstruction of the public.

Regulation 146 is amended by the addition of the following paragraph:—

(6) When any person engages a carrier, and such carrier completes the service for which he was so engaged, and the person so engaging him refuses to pay for the service so performed, such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations, and upon conviction be liable for payment of such service in addition to any fine imposed by these Regulations without further action as the Court may decide.

Regulation 149 is hereby revoked, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

149. For the purpose of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and of all Regulations made thereunder, "Heavy Traffic" shall mean and include the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers or other sawn timber, or hewn timber, fire-

wood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof (including any load) exceeds fifteen hundredweights per wheel.

The Second Schedule to the Regulations is amended by the following alterations:—

Form P.—By omitting all the words “after completion or by an intending purchaser,” and inserting in lieu thereof the words “in accordance with Regulation 27 as amended.”

Form Q.—By adding after the words “motor car” (under the heading of Particulars) the words “or motor cycle, as the case may be.”

Further Regulations are hereby added, to be numbered 149a, 151, and 152:—

149a. (i) No person shall use on any road any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic as herein defined, for which vehicle the additional license fee has not been paid in respect of a current license.

*Additional license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic.*

(ii) The annual license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic shall be £1 15s. per wheel.

(iii) Such amounts shall be additional to the license fees prescribed by Section 10 and the Third Schedule of “The Traffic Act, 1919.”

(iv.) This By-law shall not apply to—

(a) a vehicle which is only engaged in heavy carting upon some special occasion for which the permission in writing of the licensing authority controlling the roads on which the vehicle is to be used has been first had and obtained for each and every occasion.

(b) a vehicle used by a farmer or settler carrying farming, garden, or orchard produce.

(v) This regulation is subject to paragraph (k) of subsection (vii) of Section 41 of the Act; and—

(a) shall not be operative in any Goldfield as defined in “The Mining Act, 1904”;

(b) shall not be operative in the Metropolitan Area; and

(c) shall not have effect in any Road District where the public office of the Board is situated North of the 25th parallel of South latitude.

No vehicle shall pass over or along any street or way set apart for particular traffic, except in the direction so set apart.

The following streets, or parts of streets, are hereby set apart for the particular traffic, as follows:—

(a) Part of King Street, Perth, between Hay and Murray Streets—traffic must pass only in a north to south direction.

(b) Queen Street, Perth—traffic must pass only in a north to south direction.

CITY OF PERTH.

*Health By-laws.*

M.P.H. 2565/18; Ex. Co. No. 364.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the City of Perth, being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Perth, doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

1. No owner or occupier shall place, throw, leave, or suffer to remain on his premises any waste food, refuse, garbage, waste matter, or thing which would have a tendency to encourage or attract rats to visit or frequent premises, or to form or afford harbourage or shelter to rats.

2. For every hotel, restaurant, butcher's shop, small-goods shop, baker's shop, grocer's shop, fruit shop, fish shop, oyster saloon, produce store, hide store, flour mill,

stable, slaughter-house, and every dock or wharf, there shall be provided at least two rat traps of pattern approved by the Local Authority, or as many more as may be required from time to time by an Inspector. Every such trap shall be baited with fresh bait at least twice in each week, and shall be kept set. Every such trap shall be inspected daily by the owner, or occupier, or his agent, or his servant, and all rats found therein shall be killed and their carcasses forthwith disposed of so as not to cause a nuisance, and the trap or traps reset and rebaited by the said owner, or occupier, or his agent, or servant.

3. In addition to the foregoing, every owner and occupier shall use all reasonable means by blocking access ways, destroying harbourage, protecting foodstuffs, poisoning and trapping, the use of rat-killing dogs, cats, or other animals, and otherwise to keep the premises occupied by him free from rats, and to prevent and discourage the access or harbourage of rats in, on, or about such premises.

4. All public and private docks and wharves, including all sheds and other buildings thereon, shall be so protected as to prevent rats from gaining access to such docks or wharves or sheds or buildings, at any state of the tide, from vessels moored or anchored alongside of such docks or wharves or from other sources, and all goods, products, wares, and merchandise liable to attract rats on any dock or wharf shall be so kept or stored as to prevent rats from gaining access to or coming into contact therewith.

5. It shall be the duty of every owner and occupier to comply with the foregoing By-laws at his own expense, and to continue such compliance during the continuance of such By-laws.

6. If any person neglects to perform any duty cast upon him by these By-laws, or neglects to comply with any order served upon him under these By-laws, then the Local Authority may cause such work as is necessary to comply with the terms of these By-laws, or with the terms of any order issued under these By-laws, to be performed on behalf of the person guilty of such neglect; and the Local Authority may recover from such person the cost involved, in addition to any penalty or penalties recoverable under the next succeeding By-law.

7. Where anything by these By-laws is directed to be done, or where authority is given to the Local Authority or to any officer of the Local Authority to direct anything to be done, or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making default shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these By-laws and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for each day that such breach is continued.
