ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1899," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foreman and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Public Works Department should be vested in Mr. Herbert John Sheppard: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the said Herbert John Sheppard and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer, the appointment of foreman and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

The Road Districts Act, 1919. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 167 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may, subject as therein provided, place under the control and management of a Road Board any machine in the district of such Board (being the property of His Majesty's Government of the State) on such terms and conditions as to the Governor may seem fit: And whereas it is desirable to place under the control and whereas it is desirable to place under the control and management of the Shark Bay Road Board a Boring Plant and equipment at present situated at Hamelin Pool in the district of the said Shark Bay Road Board (being the property of His Majesty's Government of the said State) on the terms and conditions hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section, place under the control and management of the section, place under the control and management of the Shark Bay Road Board a Boring Plant and equipment at present situate at Hamelin Pool, in the district of the said Shark Bay Road Board (being the property of His Majesty's Government of the State) on the following terms and conditions:-

1. The Board shall, as soon as practicable and subject to the existing hiring of the Plant and equipment,

take possession of the Plant and equipment and shall at all times, when the same shall not be in the possession of a Hirer and as long as the Board's authority over the said Plant and equipment continues, store, keep, protect, and control and manage the same with all due care and skill so as to maintain the same in the like good working order and condition in which the same now are, but the Board shall not be liable for any damage or deterioration which the Plant and equipment may hereafter sustain if such damage or deterioration be not due to negligence or misconduct on the part of the Board or any officer or servant of the Board.

- 2. The Board shall hold the Plant and equipment as Agent of the Crown, and will at any time relinquish and deliver up the same to the Minister for the North-West or the Commissioner for the North-West or any person acting under the authority of either of them whenever required so to do; subject, however, to the rights of any Hirer in whose possession the Plant and equipment may be for the time being.
- 3. The Board may, as Agent of the Crown, let the Plant and equipment to any person to whom the Minister or the Commissioner for the North-West may authorise the Board to let the same, subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be imposed by the Minister or such Commissioner.
- 4. The Board may, as Agent for the Crown, receive any hire or rent that may become due for the said Plant and equipment by any Hirer, and shall forthwith, after the receipt thereof, transmit the same, without any deduction or abatement, to the Secretary, Department of the North-West, Perth; but this authority may be revoked at any time by the Minister or srch Commissioner.
- 5. The Board may, at any time, terminate its control and management of the said Plant and equipment by delivering the same to the Minister in good working order and condition, subject only to such damage or deterioration as aforesaid, but such termination shall be without prejudice to any cause of action that may previously have arisen.
- 6. Delivery of the Plant and equipment under Clauses 2 or 5 of these conditions shall be made at such place as the Minister shall require, and the whole cost of transporting the Plant and equipment to such place shall be borne by the Board.
- 7. The Board shall not be entitled to any recompense for services rendered by it in its control and management of the said Plant and equipment.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1893," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17855 (Dandanning Well) should vest in and be held by Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage in trust for the purpose of Water Supply: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before mentioned Reserve shell year by direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 748/21,

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:-

Queen's Park Improvements-Water Supply.

A 6-inch diameter C.I. water main with valves, specials, and all necessary connections and apparatus laid along Welshpool Road from Albany Road to Rutland Avenue, a distance of about 49 chains, as shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.U. No. 3979.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 3rd day of March, 1922.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1268/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute the whole of a Municipal District a Road District and may make other orders consequentially on the exercise of such power: And whereas it is desirable to constitute the Municipal District of South Perth a Road District and to make such consequential orders as are hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby constitute as from the beginning of the month of March, 1922, the whole of the Municipal District of South Perth a Road District to be called the South Perth Road District, and doth order and direct as follows:-

- 1. Until the conclusion of the first election of members of a Road Board for the said Road District, the persons in office at the date of this Order in Council as Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth shall constitute the local authority of the said Road District.
- 2. The local authority or the Road Board of the said Road District shall, on this Order in Council becoming operative, become liable in respect of all debts and liabilities of the Municipality of South Perth and any action or other proceeding by or against such Municipality may be continued by or against such local authority or Road Board, and the said local authority or Road Board shall be entitled to the property, rights, and assets of such Municipality.

South Perth Road District-Division into Wards. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1268/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council, divide a District into Wards: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the first day of March, 1922, the South Perth Road District was formed, and it is desirable to divide the said District into three Wards, to determine the number of Members for each Ward,

and to declare the dates for the various events leading up to the election of members for the said District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby divide the said District into three Wards with the names and boundaries as defined in Schedule "A" hereto, and doth determine that the said District shall be represented by nine members to be allocated as shown also in Schedule "A" hereto, and doth appoint Mr. James Wyley Patterson to do all things necessary for the holding of an election of members to be held on the eighth day of May, 1922, and the preparation of Rolls, and doth declare that the dates for the various events leading up to the said election shall be as set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.

Schedule "A."

West Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by the highwater mark of Perth Water from Pt. Belches to intersect the prolongation Northward of a line passing along the centre of Forrest Street.

On the Eastward by the prolongation of and the aforesaid line from the said intersection passing Southward through Perth Sub, Lot 7 and along the centre of Forrest Street to intersect a line passing along the centre of South Terrace.

On the Southward by the said centre line of Forrest Street from the said intersection to high-water mark of Melville Water.

On the Westward by the high-water mark of Melville Water Northward to the starting point. Three members.

East Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by the high-water mark of Perth Water from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the Municipal boundary, and by the said Municipal boundary and the South-Eastern side of George Street to the North-East corner of Location 40.

On the Southward by a line commencing at the said North-East corner and extending Westward along part of the North boundary of said Location 40 to the South-Eastern side of David Street, and along said side of David Street to a line passing along the centre of South Terrace; thence along said centre line to intersect the Eastern boundary of the West Ward.

On the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the starting point. Three members.

South Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by the South boundaries of the West and East Wards from high-water mark of Melville Water to the West corner of Location 705.

On the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the boundaries of the Municipality from the said West corner to the starting point (the intersection of a line passing along the centre of South Terrace with high-water of Melville Water). Three members.

CRIMINAL CODE ACT, 1913. Criminal Practice Rules, 1914.

The 28th day of February, 1922. IT is ordered by the Honourable Sir Robert Furse ourable John Alfred Northmore, and the Honourable Thomas Percy Draper, Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance and execution of all powers and authorities enabling them in that behalf, as follows:

Public Cemetery (Reserve 16444).

PUBLIC CEMETERY BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Corrigin, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

- All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-
- 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from
8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery. and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws,

- 16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave. or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein
- 19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- 26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of
- 27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be pre-pared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
 - 31. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-

- 33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
 - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material re moved in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
 - The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
 - (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- 34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

able excuse, to attend before the Board accordingly, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

By-laws relating to the licensing of Railway Restaurant Cars made pursuant to the provisions of Sections 23 and 59 of "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the twenty-second day of February, 1922.

- 1. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, "Restaurant Car" means a retaurant car leased by the Commissioner under Section 59 of the said Act, and includes the equipment connected therewith.
- 2. Upon the lease of a Restaurant Car being entered into the lessee shall, if the terms of the lease so provide, be granted a license for the sale of alcohola liquors in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.
- The fee for the said license shall be annually one pound, payable in advance.
- 4. Alcoholic liquor may only be served from the actual time of departure of the train from the station at which the Restaurant Car is attached until fae arrival of the train at the station where the Restaurant Car is detached, and to persons holding bona fide passengers' current railway tickets or passes, and who on being requested so to do shall produce their tickets or passes before being served.
- 5. The licensee shall not serve alcoholic liquor to any intoxicated person or to any person who may in any way appear to be under the influence of liquor.
- 6. Provided that such are obtainable, none but wines, beers, and mineral waters of Western Australian manufacture shall be sold or exhibited for sale in any Restaurant Car.
- 7. All liquors served shall be of the best quality and of such brands as the Commissioner may from time to time approve or direct.
- No alcoholic liquors shall be served to any of the servants of the Commissioner when wearing any part of the uniform of the Railway Department.
- 9. The licensee shall afford the Commissioner every reasonable opportunity for making such inspection from time to time as shall enable the Commissioner to be entirely satisfied that these By-laws have been duly complied with, and to take, without charge, samples of any liquor in the Restaurant Car, and which may reasonably be supposed to be intended for sale, without prejudice to any statutory right of inspection.
- 10. The license shall not be transferred without the consent in writing of the Commissioner first obtained.
 - The Commissioner reserves the right-
 - (a) to alter the time-table or reduce or increase the number of trains; or
- (b) to grant any other licenses for the sale of alcoholic liquors; without entitling the licensee to any compensation by

reason thereof or relief from any of the obligations under these By-laws.

12. The licensee shall duly observe and perform the provisions of the lease of the Restaurant Car and all Commonwealth and State laws and regulations in force for the time being affecting the sale of alcoholic liquors on the said premises or the hours thereof.

- 13. The Commissioner, with or without notice in writing, may forfeit the said license before the expiry thereof in any of the following events:-
 - (a) If the lessee commits a breach of any of these By-laws or of the laws for the time being in force respecting the inspection and adulteration of alcoholic liquors;
 - (b) on the happening of any event which shall entitle the Commissioner to terminate the lease:
 - (c) failure to continuously exercise the license in accordance with the By-laws.
- For each breach of these By-laws the lessee shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 15. All liquors must be sold at prices not exceeding those ruling in the district in which the Restaurant Car is run.
