WHEREAS by Crown Grant under the Land Regulations of 22nd May, 1873, and the Land Regulations of 17th April, 1874, registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Vol. II, Folio 186, Victoria Location 1114, containing 99 acres, was granted to Edward Hammersley, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to reserve for roads, tramways, railways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvements works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part of the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any bridges should be erected or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid, not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of "Sanitary Site": Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the 15th day of March, 1922, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of a "Sanitary Site."

By-laws, Williams Recreation Ground, Reserve No. 4307.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the management of the Williams Recreation Ground, Reserve 4307.

Williams Recreation Reserve By-laws.

1. Reserve to be open.—The Reserve to be open for the public at all times throughout the year.

2. Persons not to drive over the Reserve.—No person shall drive upon or over the said Reserve or any part thereof other than a carriage way, without permission from the Board first obtained.

3. Injuring or destroying trees.—No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserve.

4. Injuring the soil or surface or fences, etc.—No person shall cut up or damage or disfigure or interfere with the soil or turf or surface of any part of the said Reserve or the roads or footways across, around or over the same or with any part of the fences, buildings, rock-work, waterlocks, or seats around or upon the same or pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein in any manner whatsoever.

5. Persons misconducting themselves.—No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language or commit any nuisance on the said Reserve.

6. Posting Bills.—No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever, upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path or any place whatever on the said Reserve.

7. Shooting, etc., on the Reserve.—No person or persons shall shoot or discharge any firearms or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire-balloon or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Reserve unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

8. Selling goods on the Reserve.—No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise or things on any portion of the said Reserve unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

9. Races, etc., forbidden.—No racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise, nor any game of polo, nor any game which may be considered dangerous by the Board or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public or likely to injure the surface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Reserve, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary posts to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary.

10. Waste litter of picnics to be removed.—When any person, party, company, society, club or organisation of any kind shall play any game or picnic on the Reserve, he or they (as the case may be) shall immediately prior to leaving the ground collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

11. Cricket and other games.—No person or organised club shall play cricket, football, baseball, racket or any game of like nature on any portion of the Reserve except on such portion as shall have been or hereafter may be set apart for their peculiar purposes by the Board, neither shall any such games as aforesaid be played on those portions of the Reserve as are or may be set apart for these peculiar purposes unless and until the person or club shall have first obtained from the Board a permit in writing so to do.

12. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which any games or gymnastics may be permitted to take place upon the Reserve, or they may prohibit any games or gymnastics from taking place upon the said Reserve.

13. The Board may, if it thinks fit, let on rent the building on the Reserve at such price as the Board may agree upon from time to time.

14. Cattle not to be depastured.—No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, or camel, donkey, mule, or pig to stray or to depasture upon the Reserve grounds without the special approval of the Board in writing.

15. Lamps for vehicles.—Every person driving or riding any carriage, motor car, bicycle or tricycle, or other vehicle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have attached to such vehicle a lighted lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding and afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such vehicle.

16. Bells for motor cars and cycles.—No person shall drive or ride any motor car, bicycle or tricycle unless such machine shall have a bell or other sufficient means of warning affixed thereto.

17. Warning bell, etc.—Every person driving, riding or impelling a motor car, bicycle or tricycle which shall be overtaking any other vehicle or any animal or foot-passenger shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing or attempting to pass such other vehicle animal or foot-passenger, sound the bell or other sufficient means of warning.

18. Reckless driving.—No person shall at any time drive, ride or impel any carriage, motor car, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or in any circumstances at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.

19. The fees for use of the Reserve shall be as under—

For any cricket, football, or tennis club—£1 1s. per annum.

For any sports or show—£1 1s.

In the cause of charity—Free.

20. Penalty.—Every person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding twenty pounds.

WYALCATCHEM PUBLIC CEMETERY RESERVE.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, WYALCATCHEM.

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Wyalcatchem, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Wyaleatchem on the 1st day of February, 1922.

Regulation 6 is amended by substituting the letter "A" for the letter "G," and by cancelling the existing proviso and substituting the following:—

1. Provided that when a taxpayer has once rendered a Return of all land held, no subsequent returns need be furnished, unless a change in holding occurs, but will every year receive a Notice of Assessment based on the particulars supplied therein. If, however, any land is subsequently acquired or disposed of, full particulars must be given on Form GA; but every person upon acquiring land for the first time, and holding it at noon on the 30th June in any year, must supply a return on Form A.

2. Where the whole, or part of the land held by a taxpayer, who has already furnished returns for previous years, has been sold, or otherwise disposed of, or where additional land has been purchased, or acquired during the year ended the 30th June, Form GA must be filled in, but if a taxpayer is liable for the furnishing of both State and Federal land tax returns, Form C4 must be used instead of Form GA.

Regulation 7 is amended by substituting the word "Forms" for "Form," in the last line thereof, and after the letter "H," by adding "and HA."

Regulation 38 is amended by substituting "9" in the first line for "10," and by deleting "3" in the second line, and substituting "4-30," and further by deleting "10" in the third line, and substituting "9."

Following are the provisions of the Federal Income Tax Assessment Act in regard to statutory exemptions and calculation of tax. (Under the State Act there is no statutory deduction where the income chargeable exceeds £100 in the case of a single person without dependants, or £156 in the case of a married person, and the rate of tax on income from personal exertion and from property is the same):—

- Section 19 of the Federal Income Tax Assessment Act, 1915-18, reads:—*
- (1) In the case of a person (other than a company, an absentee, or a person who is not married and has no dependants) there shall be deducted, in addition to the sums set forth in the last preceding section, the sum of One hundred and fifty-six pounds less One pound for every Three pounds by which the income exceeds One hundred and fifty-six pounds.
 - (2) In the case of a person (not being a company or an absentee) who is not married and has no dependants there shall be deducted, in addition to the sums set forth in the last preceding section, the sum of One hundred pounds less One pound for every Five pounds by which the income exceeds One hundred pounds.
 - (3) When the income consists partly of income from personal exertion and partly of income from property the deduction under this section shall be made in the first place from the income from property, and when the deduction exceeds that income the excess shall be deducted from the income from personal exertion.
 - (4) For the purposes of this section "income" means the income of a taxpayer after allowing the deductions allowed by any other section of this Act."

The Third Schedule of the *Federal Income Tax Act, 1920*, provides that where the taxable income is derived partly from personal exertion and partly from property, the tax on the taxable income from each source shall be calculated at the rate per t hat would be applicable if the total taxable income from both sources were all derived from the one source.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919, AS AMENDED BY AMENDING ACT OF 1922.

Traffic Regulations—Additions and Amendments.

PURSUANT to Section 41 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Regulation 22.—Paragraph 6 is amended by deleting from sub-paragraph (b) the following words:—"Vehicles plying for hire to also have the word 'hire' painted above identification letters and numbers in two-inch letters," and inserting in lieu thereof:—"Providing that when motor vehicles are kept in any garage approved by the licensing authority, and are not plying for hire on any public stand or on any road or public place, the licensing authority may at their discretion issue identification plates as issued for private motor vehicles as specified in sub-paragraph (a)."

Regulation 23 (b) is amended by adding the words "or the rear" after the word "side," in the third line thereof.

Regulation 27 is amended as follows:—

Paragraph (a), by adding at the end thereof the following words:—"Of the description both as regards size and colouring of plates, also as to the identification letters and numbers thereon as specified in Regulation No. 22 for motor cycles or other motor vehicles, as the case may be."

Paragraph (b), by inserting after the word "be," in the first line, the words:—"Two pounds ten for motor cycles and for other motor vehicles."

By adding a new paragraph, to read as follows:—

(h) Providing that no disc or tablet issued under this Regulation shall be used on any vehicle except on trial during or after assembly, construction, or repairs to demonstrate its efficiency.

Regulation 30 is further amended by relettering sub-paragraph (1), published in the *Gazette* of 17th December, 1920, to read as "(k)," also by adding the following paragraph:—

(1) Whilst riding any motor cycle through towns or other residential areas, do so in such a manner as to create any undue noise by riding at a high speed or use any cut-out or other appliance which may render the silencer less effective.

Regulation 77, paragraph (a), is amended by the insertion of the word "young" in front of the word "tree," and the words "of a diameter of less than six inches" after the word "tree," in the second line thereof; also, by adding the following after the words "tree guard":—"Lamp post, electric light, telegraph, or tramway post, sewerage vent, or any verandah or balcony post, unless some notice is painted on such post or vent, with the approval of the local authority, notifying the public that horses may be tied thereto."

Regulation 92 is amended by adding the following after the word "engagement," at the end of the paragraph:—"and any driver or conductor of a vehicle so standing on a public stand by pretending that his vehicle is engaged or hired when it is not so engaged or hired, shall commit an offence against these regulations."

Regulation 100a is hereby amended by adding an additional sub-paragraph, as follows:—

No vessels containing or which have contained spirit or oils of any description shall be carried in any part of a vehicle usually set apart for passengers.

Regulation 110 is amended by adding the following paragraphs:—

(a) Any police officer or traffic inspector may direct any number of persons congregating to attend any place of entertainment or other purpose to form into queues of not more than three abreast.

(b) Any person disobeying such directions or interfering with persons forming such queues shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation.

Regulation 118 is amended by deleting the word "motor" when occurring in the first and second paragraphs of the said regulations.

Regulation 121 is amended by inserting the words "cattle, or," after the word "stallion," in the second line thereof, also by adding at the end of such regulation the following paragraph:—

In these regulations the word "cattle" wheresoever used, shall mean great and small cattle, and shall include the several animals mentioned in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," No. 46 Victoriae, No. 7.

Regulation 130 is amended by the addition of the following paragraphs:—

(b) No picture, print, board, placard, or notice shall be carried or distributed in any road, street, or public place by any person, unless the approval of the form and manner shall have been first obtained in writing from the Commissioner of Police for within the Metropolitan Area or from the Traffic Inspector for any other district.

(c) This Regulation shall not apply to the sale of newspapers.

(d) The following Regulations are as to form and manner in which boards and placards may, by way of advertisement, be carried in any street within the specified limits:—

As to form—

The advertisements are to be written or printed on wood or pasteboard of not more than 32 inches in length, nor more than 20 inches in width.

As to manner—

(i) The boards and placards shall be suspended from the shoulders over the chest and back of the person carrying them, or carried overhead in the manner approved by the Commissioner of Police for the Metropolitan Area or the Traffic Inspector of the Local Authority outside that area.

(ii) Every board and placard shall be carried at a distance of not more than 30 yards from any other board or placard carried in the streets by way of advertisement.

(iii) Every board and placard shall be carried in the carriage way, close to the kerb of the footpath, but not on the footpath. Also with due regard to the rule of the road as prescribed in Regulations Nos. 40 and 45.

Regulation 144 is amended by adding the following paragraphs thereto:—

(d) A permit may be issued at the discretion of the Commissioner of Police for within the Metropolitan Area, or a Traffic Inspector of any other district, to an approved person, and shall authorise such person to play any musical instrument in any road, street, or public place.

(e) Every permit may be issued for any period not exceeding one calendar month, but may be renewed from time to time or revoked at the discretion of the issuing authority.

(f) Any member of the Police Force or a traffic inspector may require a street musician to depart from any street or other place for any reasonable cause, and any person playing or sounding upon any musical instrument in any such road, street, or public place shall immediately depart, and if such persons shall neglect so to do, such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations.

(g) Any person not being permitted under these Regulations who shall play any musical instrument upon any road, street, or public place for the purpose of gain, or obtaining money or otherwise, shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations.

(h) No person shall by speaking, shouting, singing, playing upon, or sounding any musical or noisy instrument, or doing anything whatsoever, attract together a number of persons in any road, street, or public place to the inconvenience, annoyance, or obstruction of the public.

Regulation 146 is amended by the addition of the following paragraph:—

(6) When any person engages a carrier, and such carrier completes the service for which he was so engaged, and the person so engaging him refuses to pay for the service so performed, such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations, and upon conviction be liable for payment of such service in addition to any fine imposed by these Regulations without further action as the Court may decide.

Regulation 149 is hereby revoked, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

149. For the purpose of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and of all Regulations made thereunder, "Heavy Traffic" shall mean and include the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers or other sawn timber, or heavy timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof (including any load) exceeds fifteen hundredweights per wheel.

The Second Schedule to the Regulations is amended by the following alterations:—

Form P.—By omitting all the words "after completion or by an intending purchaser," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "in accordance with Regulation 27 as amended."

Form Q.—By adding after the words "motor car" (under the heading of Particulars) the words "or motor cycle, as the case may be."

Further Regulations are hereby added, to be numbered 149a, 151, and 152:—

149a. (i) No person shall use on any road any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic as herein defined, for which vehicle the additional license fee has not been paid in respect of a current license.

Additional license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic.

(ii) The annual license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic shall be £1 15s. per wheel.

(iii) Such amounts shall be additional to the license fees prescribed by Section 10 and the Third Schedule of "The Traffic Act, 1919."

(iv) This By-law shall not apply to—

(a) a vehicle which is only engaged in heavy carting upon some special occasion for which the permission in writing of the licensing authority controlling the roads on which the vehicle is to be used has been first had and obtained for each and every occasion.

(b) a vehicle used by a farmer or settler carrying farming, garden, or orchard produce.

(v) This regulation is subject to paragraph (k) of subsection (vii) of Section 41 of the Act; and—

(a) shall not be operative in any Goldfields as defined in "The Mining Act, 1904";

(b) shall not be operative in the Metropolitan Area; and

(c) shall not have effect in any Road District where the public office of the Board is situated North of the 25th parallel of South latitude.

No vehicle shall pass over or along any street or way set apart for particular traffic, except in the direction so set apart.

The following streets, or parts of streets, are hereby set apart for the particular traffic, as follows:—

(a) Part of King Street, Perth, between Hay and Murray Streets—traffic must pass only in a north to south direction.

(b) Queen Street, Perth—traffic must pass only in a north to south direction.
