Regulation No. 185.—Dietary.

As from the 1st July, 1922, prisoners shall be classified according to the undermentioned Schedule for the purpose of diet:—

(a) *For Prisons South of 28 degrees S. latitude.*

(c) General.

There shall be allowed to all prisoners pepper at the rate of 1 ounce per diem per 100 persons, and washing soda at the rate of 1 drachm per head per day.

The weights prescribed of meat, oatmeal, vegetables, rice, and beans are prior to cooking.

After cooking, the meat shall be weighed in bulk and divided proportionately, according to scale.

All diets may be reduced or increased and additional items added as the Medical Officer may from time to time order.

Any order made by the Medical Officer for special dieting of any prisoners shall be given in writing, and strictly adhered to.

1. The cost of survey of land shall be in accordance with the scale set out in the First Schedule hereto.
 2. Except as hereafter provided, where land is selected under Parts V. and VI. of "The Land Act, 1898," the cost of survey, with interest, is included in the price of the land, and shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
 3. The cost of survey of land purchased by direct payment under Section 57, of "The Land Act, 1898," with interest, is included in the price of the land, and shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
 4. The cost of survey of land purchased under Section 60 of the said Act, with interest, is included in the price of the land, and shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
 5. The cost of survey of land selected under Part VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898" (Homestead Farm), with interest, shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto.
 6. (a.) Except as hereafter provided no application for land under Parts V., VI., or VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898," shall be approved, if such land is not surveyed before selection, until the land applied for has been surveyed, classified, and valued.
(b.) After such survey and classification the application will be approved and the applicant duly notified, but in no case shall he be entitled to a return of any portion of the deposit paid in connection with his application.

 8. Where a lease is surrendered or forfeited, the Minister may direct that the cost of the survey, or the unpaid balance thereof, shall be paid to the Minister forthwith by the person in whom the lease was vested at the date of the surrender or forfeiture.
- These Regulations shall come into operation as from the 1st day of September, 1920 (inclusive).

LAND BOARD REGULATIONS.

Corres. 1995/10.

1. The Land Board constituted under Section 14 (3) of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1906," to deal with simultaneous applications for land, hereinafter called the "Board," shall consist of three members duly appointed by the Minister, at least one of whom shall be an officer of the Lands and Surveys Department.

2. The senior Government official of the Board shall preside, or alternatively, the members of the Board may elect their own chairman.

3. The Board shall sit at such places and at such times as may be determined, and, if necessary, may adjourn from time to time.

4. There shall be an interval of at least three days between the closing of the date for applications and the date on which the Board sits. When the date of the Board has been fixed due notice will be sent to each applicant of the time, place, and date of the sitting of the Board; also a form of declaration for completion by him, should he be unable to appear before the Board.

5. Declaration forms, setting out particulars required by the Board, may be obtained at time of application at the Department, at Perth, or at any District Land and Survey Office, and if the applicant is unable to attend the meeting of the Board, he may make the declaration before a Justice of the Peace, a Town Clerk, Secretary of a Road Board, Electoral Registrar, a Postmaster, Classified Officer in the State or Commonwealth Public Service, a classified State School Teacher, a member of the Police Force, or a Commissioner for Declarations under "The Declarations and Attestations Act, 1913."

6. Railway tickets, at excursion rates, are granted to any person who has to appear before the Board, on production of a certificate issued by a duly authorised officer of the Lands Department, and such certificates are obtainable on application to the Lands Department, Perth, or at any of the District Land Offices.

7. The Board shall take evidence on oath, and may call any evidence or witnesses they think fit.

8. The Board shall sit in open court in connection with each block dealt with, and any objector may be allowed to give evidence or produce any documents for the inspection of the Board.

9. The member and any officer of the Board (not being an officer in the Public Service) shall, when travelling, be paid 12s. 4d. per day for expenses, and the member of the Board (not being an officer employed in the Public Service) shall, in addition to travelling expenses, be paid one guinea per day for each day of sitting unless otherwise determined by the Minister. Members and officers of the Board (being officers in the Public Service) shall, when travelling, receive the travelling expenses prescribed by the Public Service Regulations.

10. It shall be necessary for any person appearing before the Board on behalf of an applicant to produce to the Chairman an order so authorising him to appear.

11. Any applicant for land or person appearing on behalf of an applicant who shall interview, prior to the sitting of the Board, any member of the Board, with a view to influencing an application, shall be disqualified both as an applicant and as an agent.

12. In all cases of adjudication the decision of the Board shall be final, and no applicant for land or any person acting on behalf of an applicant shall have the right to interview any member of the Board with a view to commenting on the decision arrived at.

13. No person shall interrupt the proceedings of the Board or cause a disturbance, and the Board may, if it think fit, while deliberating, order all persons present to retire at any time during the sitting of the Board, and such persons shall retire accordingly. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

14. There shall be a Secretary of the Board, who shall be responsible for the proper recording and indexing of the minutes, and all communications in connection with simultaneous applications prior to the sitting of the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary of the Land Board, Lands Department, Perth.

15. All previous Regulations are hereby repealed.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO IMPROVEMENTS ON RESERVES SET
APART FOR PUBLIC BODIES OR INSTITUTIONS.

3790/95.

Blocks of land reserved for public bodies or institutions shall, within 12 months of the date of reservation, be utilised in a *bonâ fide* manner for the purpose of which they have been set apart, failing which the reservation shall be cancelled: Provided that, where good and sufficient reason is shown for not utilising the land as aforesaid within the time allowed, the Minister may, in his discretion, extend such time for a further period not exceeding 12 months, but no Crown Grant or lease of such land shall be issued until the Minister is satisfied that this Regulation is being complied with.

REGULATION RESTRICTING THE AREAS OF HOLDINGS TO BE
SELECTED IN THE SUSSEX AND NELSON LAND DISTRICTS.

Corres. 11048/09.

No person being the holder of conditional purchase land in the Sussex or Nelson district under Parts V., VI., and VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898," or whose wife or husband, as the case may be, is the holder of any such land, shall be qualified to acquire any other conditional purchase land in either of the said districts, except in special cases approved by the Minister; and no person shall be qualified, without the said approval of the Minister, to acquire any conditional purchase land under either of the said parts, in the Sussex or Nelson district, exceeding the surveyed area of any block now open or hereafter to be thrown open for selection and acquired by him.

When any block of land is acquired under this regulation by any person, the wife or husband, as the case may be, of such person shall be disqualified from acquiring any other block of land in either of the said districts.

Provided that this regulation shall not affect the transfer of conditional purchase land acquired before the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, except so far as the general provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments relating to holdings and transfers apply.

RESIDENTIAL LEASES REGULATION.

The preferential right of renewal of residential leases granted under the Regulations for Residential Leases published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th day of February, 1901, and the 19th day of July, 1901, for the further term of 21 years, under and subject to the regulations in force for the time being, shall be subject to the condition that all rent under the original lease shall have been duly paid in accordance with Section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898," and all other obligations by the lessee thereunder shall have been duly observed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANTING OF LEASES FOR THE
COLLECTION AND MANUFACTURE OF SALT.

REGULATIONS.

1. Leases may be granted under Section 152 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the collection and manufacture of salt of not more than 500 acres in any one lease for a term of five years at a rental of Two pounds per annum for every 100 acres or portion thereof, and subject to the payment by the lessee of a royalty of Sixpence per ton on all salt marketed. The lease shall be in the form or to the effect of the Schedule in these Regulations.

2. Every application shall be accompanied by a deposit of rent as prescribed by Section 136 of the Act, together with the lease fee and registration fees. The cost of survey must, if so required by the Surveyor General, be paid by the applicant within 30 days of demand.

3. The lessee shall keep at least one man for every 100 acres constantly employed during the months of December, January, February, March, and April in each year, in gathering salt on the leased land.

4. No person or association of persons or company shall hold or be beneficially interested in more than 1,000 acres leased under these Regulations.

5. Adjoining leases granted under these Regulations, the aggregate area of which does not exceed 1,000 acres and held by the same person or association of persons or company may, with the approval of the Minister for Lands, be deemed one lease in respect to the labour conditions for such time as the Minister may think fit.

6. The Minister for Lands may, in his discretion, grant exemption from working the lease for any portion of the period referred to in Clause 3.

7. The lessee will be required to furnish returns half-yearly or otherwise as the Minister may direct of all salt collected and marketed, such returns to be verified by statutory declaration, and to produce his books of account for inspection on behalf of the Minister.

8. Every lease shall be granted on the condition that the Minister may authorise the construction of railways and tramways or the opening up of roads on the leased area on the application of any person or persons, and may grant permission to construct and use the same without compensation to the lessee, except so far as any improvements may be affected.

9. The lease will be liable to forfeiture if any of the prescribed conditions are not complied with to the satisfaction of the said Minister for Lands.

10. The lease will be open to renewal to the lessee at such rental and on such working conditions as may be prescribed at the termination of the period referred to in Regulation 1.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 7 of 1921.

The Federated Society of Boilermakers and Structural Iron and Steel Workers' Coastal District Union of W.A., Applicant, and

The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

1. Interpretation.

"Casual Hand" means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.

"Attended Barracks" means any building attended to by a whole or part time caretaker appointed for that purpose which is provided with bed, clean bedding, cooking utensils and light, lighting facilities, and water and fuel.

"Unattended Barracks" means any van used as a barracks provided with the accommodation mentioned in the previous definition, and any building which, whilst provided with the accommodation mentioned therein is wholly unattended.

"Married man" includes a single man who has a parent or child solely dependent on him and resident in the State of Western Australia, but does not include a married man whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him.

"Market Towns."—The undermentioned towns shall be market towns within the meaning of Clause 13 (f):—

2. Rates of Pay.

The respective minimum rates of pay for the several classes of workers covered by this award shall be as follows:—

Boilermaker continuously at big press	20 0
Boilermaker continuously at fire work	20 0
Boilermaker	18 6
Boilermaker, leading hand	21 0
Casual hands shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to the minimum rate specified above.	

The Oxy-acetylene plant and the electric welding plant shall be operated by a tradesman only, who shall be paid 1s. per day over the rate of his particular trade.

Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more other tradesmen or of six other workers shall be paid as a leading hand tradesman.

Boilermakers engaged in running sheds or in repairs of Babcock or Willcox or other stationary boilers or hot or dirty locomotive boilers or removing dirty spark arresters or bogie centres, or inside tenders, bunkers, or side tanks where the only entrance is less than one-third the area of top end or side, or engaged in stripping and cleaning ready for inspection locomotive boilers removed from frames, to be paid 1½d. per hour extra. Apprentices shall be paid this allowance.

3. Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. No day's work shall exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes. The week's work may extend over five or six days at the option of the Commissioner.

(b) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours, provided such work, exclusive of meal times, is not continuous with his shift, and provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(c) The Commissioner shall guarantee to each worker a full week's work exclusive of Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the

part of any section of his employees or for any other cause beyond his control, he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of the trains or workshops.

Each week shall stand by itself.

(d) The guaranteed period may be reduced as follows:—

(i.) In respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, one day for each in the weekly period in which the holiday occurs.

(ii.) In respect of any worker under suspension. Provided that any worker, suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.

(iii.) In respect of any day when as the result of a vote taken by the workers concerned with the consent of the Commissioner or by agreement between the union and the Commissioner a holiday is taken.

4. Overtime Rates.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside the usual working hours in any one day shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first four hours and thereafter at the rate of time and a-half, provided that double time shall be paid for overtime for all work other than work for any Department of the State.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day shall be paid at the rate of time and a half, and a worker working and paid at such rates on either of those days shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 12 hereof.

(c) All time worked during the usual meal time shall be paid for at overtime rates and such rate shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

5. Shift work.

(a) Whenever shift work is required, all shifts except the day shift shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.

(b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as night shift unless five consecutive nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime.

(c) Overtime on night shift shall be calculated under Clause 4 on the basis of the rate paid for night shift.

6. Retirement.

(a) No worker after six months' continuous service shall leave the Department until the expiration of fourteen days' written notice of his intention so to do without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such worker whose services are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal shall be given. Provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct, or to workers for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, or for any other cause beyond his control.

7. Away from Home Allowance.

The following allowances shall be granted to workers temporarily lodging away from their home stations:—

(a) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. where barracks are provided and used, and 8s. where they are not, and thereafter at the rate of 8s. per day. It shall be optional for boilermakers to use the barracks.

(b) Where attendance is not provided at barracks an extra 6d. shall be allowed for the first 24 hours, or part thereof.

(c) After the first 24 hours a charge of 1s per night with a maximum of 5s. per week shall be made where accommodation at barracks is available and used, and a charge of 6d per night, with a maximum of 2s. 6d. per week, shall be made where tent, bed and blankets are provided.

(d) A worker temporarily lodging away from Home Station in a district carrying a higher allowance than his Home Station shall receive the higher District Allowance, in addition to the allowance specified above.

(e) Nothing in the foregoing subclauses shall be taken to interfere with the discretion of the Commissioner to make any additional allowance in special cases.

(f) The allowance shall be calculated from the time of leaving to the time of return to Home Station.

(g) The allowance shall not be granted to any worker stationed in and sent to work within the Suburban Area.

(h) A worker absent from his Home Station on duty (not being a worker temporarily lodging away from his Home Station) shall be paid 2s. for his second and each succeeding meal: Provided that any worker who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be entitled to be paid 2s. in respect thereof.

(i) A worker travelling by sea shall be entitled to first class accommodation on the boat and to one-fourth only of the usual Away-from-home Allowance, and travelling time shall be paid at ordinary rates provided that not more than eight hours shall be paid for as travelling time in any one period of 24 hours.

8. Travelling Time.

(a) A worker travelling as a passenger going to work away from or returning to his Home Station shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling time or waiting time in his ordinary working hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., and for his actual travelling time or waiting time at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours in one day outside the hours mentioned.

(b) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(c) Workers in break-down gangs shall, in lieu of away-from-home allowance and travelling time, be provided with board and sleeping accommodation, and shall be paid from the time they leave until they return to their Home Station, except during such period as they shall be booked off duty if such period shall exceed 10 consecutive hours. Time occupied in travelling shall be paid at bare time rates. Actual working time shall be paid at overtime rates after eight hours' work per day.

(d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.

9. Transfers and Transfer Allowance.

(a) When any transfer is ordered by the Department, the worker transferred shall not lose his right of appeal against the transfer, and if on inquiry it is found that a transfer can be arranged with another worker to suit the convenience of the Department, then he shall be retransferred.

A worker transferred from one station to another over one mile distant shall—

- (1) Be paid expenses not less than £4 for a married man and 15s. for a single man;
- (2) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred;
- (3) be granted free passes to self and family, and free railway transport of his furniture and effects;
- (4) be paid actual travelling and waiting time up to a maximum of eight hours per day; no overtime rates shall apply.

(b) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided above to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(c) Any worker who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provisions of Subclause (3) only.

(d) At least ten days' notice shall be given to an employee required to permanently transfer from one station to another.

(e) A worker shall not be transferred for a less period than three months. If required to work temporarily at another depôt for relief or other purposes for a less period he shall be paid lodging allowance as per Clause 7.

10. District Allowance.

(a) Workers stationed at:—

- (i) Merredin or eastwards or northwards thereof on the Eastern Districts Goldfields line as far as Goongarrie; or
- (ii) on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway; or
- (iii) at Marne or northward, or northward and eastward thereof as far as Mt. Magnet on the Murchison Goldfields line, or northward or westward of Marne as far as Ajana or Yuna, except within a distance of twenty miles from Geraldton by rail,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and sixpence per day for seven days a week,

(b) Workers stationed:—

- (i) on the Eastern Goldfields line northward of Goongarrie; or
- (ii) on the Murchison Goldfields line northward or eastward of Mt. Magnet,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and ninepence per day for seven days a week.

(c) District Allowance shall not apply where the worker is absent without pay unless such absence is due to sickness and does not exceed three months.

(d) Workers leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays shall not be paid District Allowance for the period of such holidays.

11. Water Allowance.

Water shall be delivered alongside the line gratis to any worker on the following scale:—

To a married man 30 gallons a day.

To a single man 10 gallons a day.

This shall not apply at stations where a public water scheme is available.

12. Holidays.

(a) Every worker shall, after twelve months' continuous work, be granted twelve days' leave on full pay each year, the whole of which shall, except by agreement between the Commissioner and the union to the contrary, be taken at one time in each year. Provided always, that with the consent of the Commissioner holidays may be allowed to accumulate for two years. Two days' extra leave shall be granted to workers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and North and East thereof, and on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway.

(b) Workers shall be paid for holidays at the rate of pay they are drawing at or immediately before the time when such holidays are taken.

(c) Every worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(d) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for the period any worker is off duty through sickness unless the absence exceeds three calendar months.

(e) At depôts and stations where it can conveniently be done, a roster shall be posted showing the approximate dates on which each worker will go on his annual leave and resume duty. Such roster will be subject to alteration to meet the exigencies of the service: Provided always, that with the approval of the Head of the Branch any worker may change dates with another.

(f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause other than for pecculation, shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always, that if the worker has been dismissed for pecculation no claim for holidays shall be recognised.

13. Free Passes and Freight.

After twelve months' continuous service, any worker shall be allowed three second-class passes per annum, viz:—

(a) One "station to station" on the occasion of the annual holiday, provided that such holiday extends over two days, and may be issued to cover the full term of holidays due; and two return journey passes. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker and his wife and members of his family under eighteen years of age and unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, all of whom are resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings, and may be extended to the mother of a worker resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings.

(b) Upon request, a worker may be granted a separate "station to station" pass for his wife and dependents as mentioned in Subclause (a) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time.

(c) Workers who have not had an opportunity of allowing their holidays to accrue owing to having taken leave on individual public holidays, shall be granted their "station to station" pass when on special leave up to fourteen days. Should any worker through sickness be unable to use his "station to station" pass on the occasion of his annual leave, he shall be entitled to use such pass on the occasion of taking leave without pay during the year in which the same is due.

(d) After six months' service an employee shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in Subclause (a) in proportion to length of service.

(e) Any employee who may resign from the service and shall have holidays due shall be granted a free pass "station to station" for the time of such holidays.

(f) Workers stationed outside Suburban Areas will be issued market passes once per month to the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years; a worker's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight, if required.

(g) Free Freight.—Domestic supplies, up to a maximum weight, fortnightly, of two cwt. for married men and one cwt. for single men, shall be carried free by rail to Home Station from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, and, in addition, meat, bread, and vegetables, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, where the same are procurable. All such supplies must be for the sole use of the worker and his family. This Subclause shall not apply in the Suburban Areas.

14. Privilege Tickets.

After six months' continuous service any worker shall be allowed first or second class privilege tickets at one-half the ordinary single fare, with a minimum charge of 1s. for adults and 6d. for a child, to be issued as provided in Clause 13 (a).

Free passes shall not apply to race special, guaranteed special, or special excursion trains within a fifty mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the station-master at the station where the worker desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room in the train.

15. Privilege Season Tickets.

Second-class season tickets at half the ordinary season ticket rates, available between the station nearest his residence and his place of work, shall on application be issued to any worker. To any worker in receipt of 7s. or under per day, one quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

16. Absence through sickness.

Any worker losing time through sickness shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost.

17. Workers performing higher duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work, provided that acting time less than 20 minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

18. Secretary's Pass.

The Commissioner shall grant leave for a continuous period or otherwise of thirty days in each year to the Secretary of the Union (should such Secretary be a railway servant) to enable him to attend exclusively to the Union work, and a free pass will be issued to the said Secretary whether he be an employee or not, for that period, but the pass may be withdrawn at the Commissioner's discretion. Such pass shall be used exclusively for Union work in connection with railway employees and not for political purposes.

19. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.

To each worker covered by this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway—

(a) A District allowance of 5s. per day, seven days per week, shall be made, and such further amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate for his trade, plus 5s.

(b) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. 6d. when attended, and 7s. 6d. when unattended barracks are provided, and 8s. 6d. when there are no barracks.

(c) After the first 24 hours the sum of fivepence per hour for any succeeding hour or part thereof.

(d) The allowance in the last two preceding sub-clauses shall be in lieu of Clause 7 (a) and (b).

(e) An extra twelve days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at Home Station.

20. Apprentices.

Provision shall be made for Apprentices as follows:—

(a) Probationary period of six months shall be allowed.

(b) Wages:

During first year of service	..	20s. per week.
During second year of service	..	27s. per week.
During third year of service	..	39s. per week.
During fourth year of service	..	51s. per week.
During fifth year of service	..	63s. per week.

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is made.

(c) Apprentices shall be employed in the Department under such conditions as may be in force from time to time, at rates of pay stated herein. The term of all apprenticeships entered into with any trade or trades to which this Award applies shall be for a period of five years. Apprentices, on completing their term, if further employed by the Department, shall be paid the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination as hereinafter provided at the end of each twelve monthly period.

(e) The examination shall take place at the Technical School, Perth, or such other convenient place as may be decided upon, and shall include theory and practice as applied in the science and art of the calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(f) The examination shall be conducted by the officers of the Technical School, or other approved persons, who shall issue a certificate to each pupil indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served.

(g) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (b) hereof, if any apprentice fails to satisfy the Examiners.

(h) The Commissioner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award if he fails to give apprentices reasonable opportunity to learn.

(i) The number of apprentices shall not exceed the proportion of one to every two journeymen employed in shop work.

(j) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

21. Under-rate Workers.

A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lower rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest Resident or Police Magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

22. No Reduction.

The rate of wages reduced or increased by this award shall not come into operation until 14 days after the delivery of the award, and during such period of 14 days the rates payable under the last previous award shall continue to be paid.

23. Term of Award.

The currency of this Award shall be three years from the date hereof: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

24. Area and Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply only to workers employed by the Commissioner in and about the working and maintenance of the State Railways and shall be binding upon the above-named parties, and shall operate over the whole of the State Railways and the Workshops used in connection therewith.

25. Shop Stewards.

Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority shop stewards to be appointed by the union shall be recognised by the Commissioner.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 8 of 1921.

Between Western Australian Amalgamated Society of Railway Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and

The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

Part I.

1. Interpretation:

“Lifter”: A Lifter is a workman employed at Workshops in lifting rolling stock, and, in the case of all vehicles other than locomotives, in changing wheels and axle boxes, changing springs and spring gear including buffers, changing worn parts of vacuum and other brake gear and attending to bolts and nuts generally as required.

“Wireman”: A wireman is a worker engaged in installing electric light, bells, or telephones, or running wires for heating or power purposes, or repairing them.

“Lineman”: A Lineman is a worker engaged in erecting poles for electric wires or erecting wires or cables on poles, or over buildings, or tying it to insulators or joining or insulating it, or doing any work on electric poles off the ground.

“Line and Signal Maintainer” is a worker performing the duties of Lineman and Interlocking Adjuster separately or in conjunction.

“Casual Hand” means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.

“Attended barracks” means any building attended to by a whole or part time caretaker appointed for that purpose, which is provided with bed, clean bedding, cooking utensils, and light, lighting facilities, and water and fuel.

“Unattended barracks” means any van used as a barracks provided with the accommodation mentioned in the previous definition and any building which, whilst provided with the accommodation mentioned therein, is wholly unattended.

“Married man” includes a single man who has a parent or child solely dependent on him and resident in the State of Western Australia, but does not include a married man whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him.

“Market Towns”: The following shall be approved market towns:—

2. (a) Workers performing higher duties.—Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work.

Provided that acting time less than twenty minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade, his wage shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

3. Hours of Duty.—Except as hereinafter provided—

(a) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work for all workers included in Part I.

Forty-four hours, exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work for all workers included in Part II.

(b) All time, exclusive of Sunday time, worked over the hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.

(c) All time worked in excess of ten hours in any one shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a

half for the first two hours and thereafter double time. This subclause shall not apply to conductors.

(d) Time worked between midnight on Saturday and midnight on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(e) The above subclauses (a), (c), and (d) shall not apply to telephone operators, watchmen, caretakers, office cleaners (female), or waiting-room attendants, and other attendants, whose hours and conditions shall remain as they are at present.

(f) The Commissioner shall arrange as far as practicable that shifts shall not exceed eight hours, and, except in cases of emergency, where relief cannot be provided, a worker shall not be required to remain on duty at his “home” or temporary home station for more than ten hours.

(g) Time on which overtime rates as per subclause (c) is payable will not be subject to the extra rate provided for in subclause (b).

(h) The Commissioner shall guarantee to each worker other than a casual a full week's work, exclusive of Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of his employees, or for any other cause beyond his control, he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of the trains or Workshops. Each week shall stand by itself.

(i) The guaranteed period may be reduced as follows:—

(i) In respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day one day for each in the weekly period in which the holiday occurs.

(ii) In respect of workers in or about a goods shed one day for each goods shed holiday in addition to Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day in the weekly period in which the holiday occurs.

(iii) In respect of any worker under suspension. Provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.

(iv) In respect of office cleaners (female) the guaranteed period may be reduced by such time as is necessary to maintain the hours of work as at present.

(v) In respect of any worker in Part I. who ceases to work by reason of the workers in Part II. not working.

(j) Any worker brought on to work outside his ordinary working hours shall, except when such work, exclusive of meal times, is continuous with his ordinary shift, be paid a minimum of two hours' pay at ordinary rates, and provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(k) Except at country stations where the train arrangements render it impracticable, each day's work of eight hours shall be completed within ten hours from the time of starting.

(l) Except in cases of emergency, unless due to regular rotation of shifts, no head shunter, shunter, or signalman shall be called upon to work more than ten hours continuously, or shall be called on duty until he has had at least twelve hours off. In this subclause the word “emergency” shall not be construed to cover a mere increase of traffic which could have been foreseen and might reasonably have been provided for without encroaching on the twelve-hour rule.

(m) The present practice of calling shunters when rostered for duty outside their ordinary shifts shall be continued.

(n) No member of the running staff, including a shunter, shall be rostered for less than four hours in any one day.

(o) Except in cases of emergency juniors shall not be employed (except to act as call boys) between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m., but may be required, whilst not calling, to attend telephone and to sweep, dust, and clean.

(p) Any employee brought on duty on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of four hours' pay at ordinary rates.

(q) An employee of the Commissioner (such employee to be a member of and to be nominated by the Union) shall be permitted to attend the Departmental Biennial Time Table Conferences as representative of the union,

and may take part in any discussion as to whether any particular piece of night work involved in the proposed Time Table could be avoided.

The employee so acting shall be paid by the Commissioner his ordinary wages, travelling time, and expenses as provided in this award.

4. Promotion.

(a) A worker promoted to a higher position, the minimum pay for which is less than he received in the position vacated, shall be paid his former rate.

(b) A junior worker on attaining the age of 21 years shall, providing he has passed the prescribed examination, be entitled to be appointed as a porter. He shall be afforded the opportunity to receive the necessary instruction and to pass such examinations prior to reaching the age of 21.

(c) Before any promotion to a vacancy shall be made otherwise than by seniority, such vacancy shall be advertised in the "Weekly Notice," unless in any particular case it is necessary to fill a position without the delay involved by such advertisement.

(d) In the case of a married worker refusing promotion owing to lack of accommodation at the place where the vacancy exists, he shall not be penalised because of his refusal to accept such promotion.

5. Retirement.

(a) No worker after six months' continuous service shall leave the Department until the expiration of fourteen days' written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such worker whose services are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal shall be given.

6. Allowances and Arrangements re Guards.

(a) Any guard rostered for duty and being informed that he is not required shall, unless he has been notified as provided in sub-clause (e), be paid two hours' pay at ordinary rates, but may be called for further duty without any further period of rest.

(b) Any guard going out on traffic shall be paid not less than four hours' pay at ordinary rates, and no guard shall be called to work more than twice in one day.

(c) A guard attending at a depot with a hamper for a trip for which he is booked and which is cancelled, or who shall have received less than two hours' notice of the cancellation of a trip requiring a hamper, shall be allowed five shillings in respect of such hamper.

(d) Any guard having to proceed on an away-from-home job with less than four hours' notice shall be paid an amount of five shillings in addition to ordinary expenses.

(e) No guard rostered for duty shall be entitled to any pay or allowance when notice that he is not required has been left at his place of residence at least two hours before his rostered time.

(f) Guards of goods and mixed trains shall be allowed 30 minutes before departure time to prepare for their trip, and where the distance between the place where they sign on and where they commence duty exceeds a quarter of a mile they shall be allowed an extra five minutes for each quarter of a mile in excess thereof. Guards of passenger trains, other than suburban trains, shall be allowed 15 minutes to prepare before starting on a trip.

Guards of suburban passenger trains shall be allowed 15 minutes before beginning and 15 minutes at the close of each shift.

All guards other than guards on suburban passenger trains shall be allowed 15 minutes at the end of each trip.

Nothing in this subclause shall operate to reduce the time at present allowed to any guard so long as present conditions remain unaltered.

(g) Any guard booked off shall come on duty at such time as he may be directed, before leaving the station, by the responsible person in charge or by the roster posted at the station. Except in cases of emergency, or unless in special cases by agreement between the Union and the Commissioner, the minimum time a guard shall be off duty at home stations shall be twelve hours, and at foreign stations eight hours for the first time he is booked off after leaving the home station, and ten

hours for every subsequent time that he is booked off before returning to the home station. In cases of emergency, unless for good reason to the contrary, the guard who has been off duty the longest shall be the first to be called on. In this subclause the word "emergency" shall not be construed to cover a mere increase of traffic which could have been foreseen and might reasonably have been provided for without encroaching on the twelve-hour rule.

(h) The present practice in regard to the calling of guards shall be continued.

(i) At home stations, should a guard not be able to ascertain when booking off, from the responsible person in charge or from the roster, when he will be required for further work, he shall be free to assume that he will not be required for twelve (12) hours, but at the expiration of that time shall make personal inquiry at the depot as to when he will be required. If not then informed when he will be required, written notice shall be left at his place of residence at least two hours before he is required to go on duty: Provided that if the 12 hours expire after 5 p.m. and before 7 a.m., he shall not be required to make such inquiry until 8 a.m. following.

(j) Any guard standing by at a foreign station shall be allowed full time when not booked off, and half time when booked off up to five hours. If not required for active duty until the expiration of five hours, he shall be booked off.

(k) Guards stationed at Perth who usually run country trains shall receive a fair proportion of suburban work.

(l) Where practicable all guards shall be worked on a weekly roster.

When there is no weekly roster a roster shall, when practicable, be posted daily not later than 2 p.m. except on Saturday, when it shall be posted not later than 12 noon. The roster posted on Saturday shall show both Sunday's and Monday's working.

7. Knowledge of Roads.—Except in the case of new lines opened for traffic, and so far as the requirements of the service will permit, a guard before being required to take a train over a road with which he is not acquainted shall be allowed to travel over it at least twice with a guard familiar with the road, without loss of pay. Should the exigencies of the service require a guard to be sent over a road with which he is not acquainted, the station-master shall report the circumstance to the head of the branch.

8. Away from Home Allowance.—The following allowances shall be granted to workers in Part I, who are booked off or temporarily lodging away from their home station:—

(a) For the first thirty (30) hours, or part thereof, the sum of five shillings where attended, and six shillings where unattended barracks are provided, and seven shillings where there are no barracks.

(b) After the first thirty hours, and up to seven days, the sum of fourpence per hour, and thereafter threepence per hour, provided that the reduction from fourpence to threepence shall only be made in cases where the worker shall be stationed for over seven days in one place: Provided that a deduction of one shilling per day or night, with a maximum of five shillings per week, shall be made where attended barracks are provided, and a deduction of sixpence per day or night, with a maximum of two shillings and sixpence per week, shall be made where unattended barracks are provided. No such deduction shall be made if the worker returns to his home station within forty-four hours.

(c) The allowance shall be calculated from the time of booking on to the time of booking off at "home" station.

(d) A worker booked off or temporarily lodging away from "home" station in a district carrying a higher allowance than his "home" station shall receive the higher district allowance, in addition to allowance specified above, for each twenty-four hours or part thereof whilst in such district, calculated from time of departure from home station to time of departure from foreign station within such districts. A worker shall not receive more than one district allowance at the same time.

(e) The Commissioner may in his discretion make any allowance in addition to those provided in the foregoing subclauses, and the head of the department shall also have discretion to make any such additional allowances not exceeding seven shillings and sixpence per day.

(f) No away from home allowance shall be granted to any worker stationed in the suburban area in respect of any absence from his "home" station within the suburban area unless he is unable to return by passenger train to his "home" station for the night, or unless approved by the head of the branch.

(g) The above subclauses shall not apply to repairers at out-camps on their own lengths, but they shall be granted 1s. 6d. for each night during which their gang is stationed at an out-camp.

(h) Any worker other than a guard who is not temporarily lodging away from his home station, and who is absent from his home station on duty, shall be paid 2s. for his second and each succeeding meal. Provided that any worker who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be entitled to be paid 2s. in respect thereof.

(i) Workers shall not be booked away from their "home" station for two Sundays in succession where it can be avoided by any reasonable arrangement.

(j) Workers engaged in Part II. shall be paid at the rates set out in Clause 7 of the Engineers' Award. Nos. 4 and 6 of 1921.

9. Payment for Travelling Time.—(a) A worker travelling as a passenger going to work away, or returning to his "home" station, shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling or waiting time, up to a maximum of sixteen hours in one day.

(b) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week-days.

(c) Workers in breakdown gangs shall, in lieu of away-from-home allowance and travelling time, be provided with board and sleeping accommodation, and shall be paid from the time they leave until they return to their home station, except during such period as they shall be booked off duty if such period shall exceed 10 consecutive hours. Time occupied in travelling shall be paid at bare time rates. Actual working time shall be paid at overtime rates as provided in Part II. after eight hours' work per day.

(d) Workers on the permanent way when starting from camp shall travel in Department's time and return in their own time, unless they are required to propel the trolley they ride upon, in which case they shall travel both ways in the Department's time.

(e) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.

(f) Workers other than traffic workers whose home station is Perth, who are required to start work at some station on the suburban line between Fremantle and Midland Junction, shall, if notified the previous evening, travel one way (from work or to work) in their own time, provided there is a train by which they can conveniently travel. Department to provide free railway travelling from home station.

10. Transfers and Transfer Allowance:

(a) When any transfer is ordered by the Department, the worker transferred shall not lose his right of appeal against the transfer, and if on inquiry it is found that a transfer can be arranged with another worker to suit the convenience of the Department, then he shall be retransferred. A worker transferred from one station to another over one mile distant involving a change of residence shall—

(1) be paid not less than £4 for a married man and 15s. for a single man;

(2) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred;

(3) be granted free passes for self and family, and free railway transport of his furniture and effects;

(4) be paid actual travelling and waiting time up to a maximum of eight hours per day. No overtime rates shall apply.

(b) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided above to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(c) Any worker who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provision of sub-clause (3) only.

(d) At least 10 days' notice shall be given to an employee required to permanently transfer from one station to another.

(e) A worker shall not be transferred for a less period than three months. If required to work temporarily at another depot for relief or other purposes for a less period, he shall be paid lodging allowance as per Clause 8.

(f) Any worker who has been stationed in the gold-fields areas for a period exceeding three years shall be entitled to a transfer to a station not more than thirty miles from the coast, and such transfer shall, upon request, be arranged if the exigencies of the service will permit.

11. District Allowance.

(a) Workers stationed at—

(i) Merredin or eastward or northward thereof on the Eastern District Goldfields line, as far as Goongarrie; or

(ii) on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway; or

(iii) at Marne or northward or northward and eastward thereof, as far as Mt. Magnet, on the Murchison Goldfields line, or northward or westward of Marne as far as Ajana or Yuna, except within a distance of 20 miles from Geraldton by rail,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and sixpence per day for seven days a week.

(b) Workers stationed—

(i) on the Eastern Goldfields line northward of Goongarrie; or

(ii) on the Murchison Goldfields line northward or eastward of Mt. Magnet,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and ninepence per day for seven days a week.

(c) District allowance shall not apply where the worker is absent without pay unless such absence is due to sickness and does not exceed three months.

(d) Workers leaving the service for any cause, and due for payment in lieu of holidays, shall not be paid district allowance for the period of such holidays.

12. Water Allowance.—Water shall be delivered alongside the line gratis to any worker in the following scale:—

To a married man . . . 30 gallons per day.

To a single man . . . 10 gallons per day.

This shall not apply at stations where a public water scheme is available.

13. Uniforms.—The following uniforms shall be supplied by the Commissioner:—

Traffic Workers.

Foremen, guards, head porters, shunters, parcels draymen, ambulance worker, porters (other than those engaged solely on goods work), night watchmen, lavatory attendants, ticket collectors, ticket examiners, and conductors—One cap, one summer suit consisting of jacket, vest, and trousers; one winter suit consisting of jacket, vest, and trousers, annually.

Foreman and shunter—One hat in lieu of cap.

Lampmen and car cleaners—Two dungaree suits per year and one ordinary porter's cap without badge.

Raker-out and Tuber—Two dungaree suits per year.

Signalmen, checkers—One cap annually.

Foreman—One mackintosh or overcoat or oilskin suit every two years.

Passenger and express guards—One mackintosh or overcoat every two years.

Mixed and goods guards, head shunters, shunters, night watchmen, and number takers, hoarding hands, chainmen, and men employed on coal stages, and weighbridge checkers—One oilskin suit every two years.

Electric Battery hand and assistant, acid room attendant, electrical department loco—Two suits of woollen overalls per year at least.

One oilskin suit every two years shall be provided at Fremantle, Perth, Midland Junction, Northam, and Kalgoorlie for the exclusive use of the worker acting as

lampman, and for the worker hosing out stock trucks at Fremantle, Midland Junction, Northam, and Kalgoorlie, and for each repairer, length runner, and repairer ganger on lengths between Geraldton and Walkaway, Geraldton and Ajana, and Geraldton and Yuna, and on lengths on lines west of the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence, and south of Goomalling.

The uniforms shall be held by the worker and worn on duty only, and shall not be sold or disposed of. This clause does not apply to casual hands.

14. Free Passes.

(a) After twelve months' continuous service any worker shall be allowed three second class passes per annum, viz:—

One "station to station" on the occasion of the annual holiday, provided that such holiday extends over two days and may be issued to cover the full term of holidays due, and two return journey passes. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker and his wife, and members of his family under eighteen years of age, and unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, all of whom are resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings, and may be extended to the mother of a worker resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings.

(b) Upon request, a worker may be granted a separate "station to station" pass for his wife and dependants, as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time.

(c) Workers who have not had an opportunity of allowing their holidays to accrue owing to having taken leave on individual public holidays shall be granted their station to station pass, when on special leave, up to fourteen days.

(d) After six months' service an employee shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in sub-clause (a) in proportion to length of service. Should any worker through sickness be unable to use his station to station pass on the occasion of his annual leave, he shall be entitled to use such pass on the occasion of taking leave without pay during the year in which the same is due.

(e) Any employee who may resign from the service and shall have holidays due shall be granted a free pass, station to station, for the time of such holidays.

(f) Market Passes.—Workers stationed outside suburban areas will be issued market passes once per month to the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years. A worker's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight if required.

(g) Free Freight.—Domestic supplies up to a maximum weight fortnightly of 2cwt. for married men and 1cwt. for single men, shall be carried free by rail to home station from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, and, in addition, meat, bread, vegetables, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker where same are procurable. All such supplies shall be for the sole use of the worker and his family. This subclause shall not apply to the suburban areas.

(h) Free passes shall not apply to race, special, guaranteed special or special excursion trains, within a fifty-mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the station master at the station where the worker desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room in the train.

15. Privilege Tickets.

(a) After six months' service any worker shall be allowed first or second class privilege return tickets at one half the ordinary single fare, with a minimum charge of 1s. for adults and 6d. for a child, to be issued as provided in Clause 14 (a) and (h).

(b) Second-class season tickets at half the ordinary season ticket rates, available between the station nearest his residence and his place of work, shall, on application, be issued to any worker. To any worker in receipt of 7s. or under per day, one quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

16. Holidays.

(a) Every worker shall, after twelve months' continuous service, be granted twelve days' leave on full pay each year, the whole of which shall, except by agreement between the Commissioner and the union to the contrary, be taken at one time in each year. Provided always that, with the consent of the Commissioner, holidays may be allowed to accumulate for two years. Two days' extra

annual leave shall be granted to workers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and north and east thereof, and on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway.

(b) Foremen, guards, signalmen, and shunters, after twelve months' service, shall be allowed an additional four days' holiday in each year on full pay subject to good conduct.

(c) Workers shall be paid for holidays at the rate of pay they are drawing at or immediately before the time when such holidays are taken.

(d) Sunday conditions shall apply on Good Friday, Christmas Day, and Labour Day.

(e) Every worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(f) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for the period any worker is off duty through sickness, unless the absence exceeds three calendar months.

(g) At depots and stations, where it can conveniently be done, a roster shall be posted showing the approximate dates on which each worker will go on his annual leave and resume duty. Such roster will be subject to alteration to meet the exigencies of the service. Provided always, that with the approval of the head of the branch, any worker may change dates with another.

(h) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause other than for pecculation shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always, that if the worker has been dismissed for pecculation, no claim for holidays shall be recognised.

(i) Unless at his own request, no employee shall be booked off for a holiday at a foreign station.

(j) Goods sheds employees when called on to do duty on any holiday shall be paid for not less than four hours, provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the four hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

17. Absence through Sickness.—(a) Any member of the running staff being unable to attend to his duty through sickness shall notify his foreman in charge at least three hours before the time he is booked for duty, and he shall also satisfy such foreman that he is unfit to attend to his duties.

(b) Any worker so absent shall not again be booked up for duty unless he notifies such foreman not later than noon on any day that he is fit to resume.

(c) Any worker losing time through sickness or special leave shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost through sickness or actually granted as special leave.

18. Rates of Pay.

Casual hands shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to the rates specified above.

Any worker employed upon concrete work to be paid 1s. per day extra.

Any worker working in water over his boots shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra whilst so employed.

Any worker employed on jetties as a lumper shall be paid the ruling rate of wages for lumpers.

No goods shed worker shall be required to work more than five consecutive hours without a meal.

19. No new designation shall be introduced during the currency of this award so as to reduce the status of any worker covered thereby.

20. Under-rate Workers.—A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lower rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the workers' union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of

wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

21. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.—To all workers covered by this part of this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway—

- (a) A district allowance of 5s. per day, seven days per week, shall be made, and such further amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate for his trade plus 5s.
- (b) For the first 30 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. 6d. when attended and 7s. 6d. when unattended barracks are provided, and 8s. 6d. when there are no barracks.
- (c) After the first 30 hours the sum of fivepence per hour for any succeeding hour or part thereof.
- (d) The allowance in the two last preceding sub-clauses shall be in lieu of Clause 8 (a) and (b).
- (e) An extra 12 days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at home station.

Labourer, powellising plant, must be provided with suitable gloves.

Car builders, wagon builders, and carpenters shall be allowed one shilling per week tool allowance in addition to ordinary rates, and apprentices in their last three years ninepence per week.

Casual hands shall receive 1s. per day in addition to the minimum rates specified above.

Leading hand tradesmen to be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the minimum of their respective trades.

Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more other tradesmen or of six other workers shall be paid as a leading hand tradesman.

Marker-out, car and wagon building, to be paid as leading hand whilst so employed.

Boilermakers' and fitters' assistants shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra when employed in running sheds and shall also be paid 1½d. per hour extra whilst engaged upon any work in respect of which tradesmen receive such an allowance.

Any worker working in water over his boots shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra whilst so employed.

23. Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. No day's work shall exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes. The week's work may extend over five or six days, at the option of the Commissioner.

(b) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours, provided such work, exclusive of meal times, is not continuous with his shift; and provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(c) The Commissioner shall guarantee to each worker a full week's work exclusive of Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of his employees or for any other cause beyond his control he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of the trains or workshops. Each week shall stand by itself.

(d) The guaranteed period may be reduced as follows:—

- (i.) In respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, one day for each in the weekly period in which the holiday occurs.
- (ii.) In respect of any worker under suspension. Provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.
- (iii.) In respect of any day when, as the result of a vote by the workers concerned taken with the consent of the Commissioner or by agreement between the union and the Commissioner, a holiday is taken.

24. Overtime Rates.

(a) All time worked in excess of usual working hours in any one day shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first four hours and thereafter at time and a-half, provided that double time shall be paid for overtime on all work other than work for any department of the State.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half, and a worker working and paid at such rates on either of those days shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 16 hereof.

(c) All time worked during the usual meal time by any worker at his home station shall be paid for at overtime rates, and such rate shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

25. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.—To all workers covered by this part of this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway:—

(a) A district allowance of 5s. per day of seven days per week shall be made: Provided that in the case of tradesmen the allowance shall be increased by such amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate of his trade, plus 5s.

(b) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. 6d. when attended and 7s. 6d. when unattended barracks are provided, and 8s. 6d. when there are no barracks.

(c) After the first 24 hours the sum of fivepence per hour for every succeeding hour or part thereof.

(d) The allowance in the last two preceding sub-clauses shall be in lieu of Clause 8 (a) and (b).

(e) An extra 12 days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at Home Station.

26. The following clauses of Part 1 shall apply to the worker covered by this part of the award, viz.:—

- Clause 1.—“Interpretation.”
- Clause 2.—“Workers performing higher duties.”
- Clause 4.—“Promotion.”
- Clause 5.—“Retirement.”
- Clause 8.—(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), and (i); “Away from Home Allowance.”
- Clause 9.—(a), (b), and (c), “Travelling Time.”
- Clause 10.—“Transfers and Transfer Allowance.”
- Clause 11.—“District Allowance.”
- Clause 12.—“Water Allowance.”
- Clause 14.—“Free Passes.”
- Clause 15.—“Privilege Tickets.”
- Clause 16.—“Holidays”—(a), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i).
- Clause 17.—(c) “Absence through Sickness.”
- Clause 19.—“No New Designation.”
- Clause 20.—“Under-rate Worker.”

27. Apprentices.—Provision shall be made for apprentices as follows:—

(a) A probationary period of six months shall be allowed.

(b) Wages:—

During the first year of service—20s. per week.

During the second year of service—27s. per week.

During the third year of service—39s. per week.

During the fourth year of service—51s. per week.

During the fifth year of service—63s. per week.

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is made.

(c) Apprentices shall be employed in the Department under such conditions as may be in force from time to time at the rates of pay stated herein. The term of all apprenticeships entered into with any trade or trades to which this award applies shall be for a period of five years. Apprentices, on completing their term, if further employed by the Department, shall be paid the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination as hereinafter provided at the end of each twelve-monthly period.

(e) The examination shall take place at the Technical School, Perth, or such other convenient place as may be decided upon, and shall include theory and practice as applied in the science and art of the calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(f) The examination shall be conducted by the officers of the Technical School, or other approved persons, who shall issue a certificate to each pupil indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served.

(g) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (b) hereof, if any apprentice fails to satisfy the examiners.

(h) The Commissioner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award if he fails to give apprentices reasonable opportunity to learn.

(i) The number of apprentices shall not exceed the proportion of one to every two journeymen employed in shop work.

(j) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

PART III.

The provisions of this part of the award shall apply generally.

28. Shop Stewards.—Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the union shall be recognised by the Commissioner.

29. The rate of wages reduced or increased by this award shall not come into operation until 14 days after the delivery of the award, and during such period of 14 days the rates payable under the last previous award shall continue to be paid.

30. Secretary's Pass.—The Commissioner shall grant leave for a continuous period or otherwise of thirty days in each year to the secretary of the union (should such secretary be a railway servant) to enable him to attend exclusively to the union work, and a free pass will be issued to the said secretary whether he be an employee or not, for that period, but the pass may be withdrawn at the Commissioner's discretion. Such pass shall be used exclusively for railway union work and not for political purposes.

31. A worker when travelling by sea shall be entitled to first class accommodation on the boat and to one-fourth only of the usual Away-from-home Allowance, and travelling time shall be paid at ordinary rates provided that not more than eight hours shall be paid for as travelling time in any one period of twenty-four hours.

32. Term of Award.—The currency of this award shall be three years from the date hereof. Provided that at any time after the expiration of

twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

33. Area and Scope of Award.—This award shall apply only to workers employed by the Commissioner in and about the working and maintenance of the State Railways, and shall be binding upon the above-named parties, and shall operate over the whole of the State Railways and the workshops used in connection therewith.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Nos. 4 and 6 of 1921.

Between Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers and the Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicants, and The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

1. Interpretation.—“Casual Hand” means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.

“Attended Barracks” means any building attended to by a whole or part time caretaker appointed for that purpose, which is provided with bed, clean bedding, cooking utensils and light, lighting facilities and water and fuel.

“Unattended Barracks” means any van used as a barracks provided with the accommodation mentioned in the previous definition and any building whilst provided with the accommodation mentioned therein is wholly unattended.

“Wireman.” A wireman is a worker engaged in installing electric light, bells, or telephones, or running wires for heating or power purposes, or repairing them.

“Lineman.” A lineman is a worker engaged in erecting poles for electric wires or erecting wires or cables on poles or over buildings, or tying it to insulators, or joining or insulating it, or doing any work on electric poles off the ground.

“Line and Signal Maintainer” is a worker performing the duties of lineman and interlocking adjuster separately or in conjunction.

“Married man” includes a single man who has a parent or child solely dependent on him and resident in the State of Western Australia, but does not include a married man whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him.

“Market Towns.”—The undermentioned towns shall be market towns within the meaning of Clause 13:—

Leading tradesmen shall receive 2s. 6d. per day above the minimum rates specified above for their respective trades.

Casual hand shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to the minimum rates specified above.

A worker employed as a tapper-out if not a tradesman shall receive 1s. 6d. a day over his ordinary rate on casting days. The oxyacetylene and electric welding plant shall be operated by a tradesman only, who shall be paid 1s. per day over the rate of his particular trade.

Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more other tradesmen or of six other workers shall be paid as a leading hand tradesman.

Blacksmiths and their assistants employed on work which is heated in pot furnaces shall be paid one and a-quarter time of their current rate of pay whilst so engaged.

Blacksmiths employed stripping springs which have not been through the caustic soda process shall be paid 1½d. per hour whilst so employed.

Fitters employed in running sheds, or stripping locomotives or repairing babcocks, or other stationary boilers (except repairs on the bench to steam and water mountings of boilers) or upon the conveyor or gear in the conduit under the boilers in the Power House, or on boilers on frames in the shops, or on steam and electric cranes, shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra. Apprentices shall be paid this allowance.

Boilermakers' and fitters' assistants shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra when employed in Running Sheds, and outside Running Sheds they shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra whilst engaged upon any work in respect of which tradesmen receive such an allowance.

Pattermakers shall be allowed 1s. per week tool allowance, and apprentice pattermakers in their last three years 9d. per week.

Way and Works fitters when in charge of four or more men on outside work shall be paid as leading hands whilst so employed.

3. Hours of Duty—

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. No day's work shall exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes. The week's work may extend over five or six days at the option of the Commissioner.

(b) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours, provided such work exclusive of meal times is not continuous with his shift, and provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(c) The Commissioner shall guarantee to each worker a full week's work exclusive of Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of his employees or for any other cause beyond his control he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of the trains or workshops. Each week shall stand by itself.

(d) The guaranteed period may be reduced as follows:—

(i) In respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, one day for each in the weekly period in which the holiday occurs.

(ii) In respect of any worker under suspension. Provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.

(iii.) In respect of any day when, as the result of a vote taken by the workers concerned, with the consent of the Commissioner, or by agreement between the unions and the Commissioner, a holiday is taken.

4. Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside of the usual working hours in any one day shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first four hours and thereafter at time and a-half; provided that double time shall be paid for overtime on all work other than work for any Department of the State.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half, and a worker working and paid at such rates on either of those days shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 12 hereof.

(c) All time worked during the usual meal time shall be paid for at overtime rates, and such rate shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

5. Shift Work.

(a) Whenever shift work is required all shifts except the day shift shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.

(b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as night shift unless five consecutive nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime.

(c) Overtime on night shift shall be calculated under Clause 4 on the basis of the rate paid for night shift.

6. Retirement.

(a) No worker after six months continuous service shall leave the Department until the expiration of fourteen days' written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such worker whose services are no longer required and the reason for dismissal shall be given. Provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct, or to workers for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, or for any other cause beyond his control.

7. Away from Home Allowance.—The following allowances shall be granted to workers temporarily lodging away from their Home Station:—

(a) For the first twenty-four hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. where barracks are provided and used, and 8s. where they are not, and thereafter at the rate of 8s. for each twenty-four hours. It shall be optional for workers to use the barracks.

(b) Where attendance is not provided at barracks an extra 6d. shall be allowed for the first 24 hours or part thereof.

(c) After the first 24 hours a charge of 1s. per night with a maximum of 5s. per week shall be made where accommodation at barracks other than a van is provided, and a charge of 6d. per night with a maximum of 2s. 6d. per week shall be made where barracks in the shape of van or tent, bed and blankets are provided.

(d) A worker temporarily lodging away from Home Station in a district carrying a higher allowance than his Home Station shall receive the higher district allowance in addition to the allowance specified above.

(e) Nothing in the foregoing subclauses shall be taken to interfere with the discretion of the Commissioner to make any additional allowance in special cases.

(f) The allowance shall be calculated from the time of leaving to the time of return to Home Station.

(g) The allowance shall not be granted to any worker stationed in and sent to work within the Suburban Area.

(h) A worker absent from his Home Station on duty (not being a worker temporarily lodging away from his Home Station) shall be paid 2s. for his second and each succeeding meal: Provided that any worker who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be entitled to be paid 2s. in respect thereof.

A worker when travelling by sea shall be entitled to first class accommodation on the boat and to one-fourth only of the usual Away-from-home Allowance, and travelling time shall be paid at ordinary rates, provided that not more than eight hours shall be paid for as travelling time in any one period of twenty-four hours.

8. Travelling Time.

(a) A worker travelling as a passenger going to work away from or returning to his Home Station shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling time or waiting time in his ordinary working hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., and for his actual travelling time or waiting time at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours in one day outside the hours mentioned.

(b) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(c) Workers in break-down gangs shall, in lieu of away from home allowance and travelling time, be provided with board and sleeping accommodation, and shall be paid from the time they leave until they return to their Home Station except during such period as they shall be booked off duty if such period shall exceed 10 consecutive hours. Time occupied in travelling shall be paid at bare time rates. Actual working time shall be paid at overtime rates after eight hours work per day.

(d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.

9. Transfers and Transfer Allowance.

(a) When any transfer is ordered by the Department, the worker transferred shall not lose his right of appeal against the transfer, and if on inquiry it is found that a transfer can be arranged with another worker to suit the convenience of the Department, then he shall be re-transferred. A worker transferred from one station to another over one mile distant shall—

(1) Be paid not less than £4 for a married man, and 15s. for a single man.

(2) Be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred.

(3) Be granted free passes to self and family, and free railway transport of his furniture and effects.

(4) Be paid actual travelling and waiting time up to a maximum of eight hours per day; no overtime rates shall apply.

(b) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided above to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(c) Any worker who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provisions of subclause 3 only.

(d) At least ten days' notice shall be given to an employee required to permanently transfer from one station to another.

(e) A worker shall not be transferred for a less period than three months. If required to work temporarily at another depot for relief or other purposes for a less period he shall be paid lodging allowance as per Clause 7.

10. District Allowance.

(a) Workers stationed at—

(i) Merredin or eastward or northward thereof on the Eastern District Goldfields line as far as Goongarrie; or

(ii) On the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway; or

(iii) At Marne or northward or northward and eastward thereof as far as Mt. Magnet on the Murchison Goldfields line or northward or westward of Marne as far as Ajana or Yuna, except within a distance of twenty miles from Geraldton by rail,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and sixpence per day for seven days a week.

(b) Workers stationed—

(i) On the Eastern Goldfields line northward of Goongarrie; or

(ii) On the Murchison Goldfields line northward or eastward of Mt. Magnet,

shall receive a district allowance of one shilling and ninepence per day for seven days a week.

(c) District Allowance shall not apply where the worker is absent without pay, unless such absence is due to sickness and does not exceed three months.

(d) Workers leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays shall not be paid District Allowance for the period of such holidays.

11. Water Allowance.

Water shall be delivered alongside the line gratis to any worker on the following scale:—

To a married man—30 gallons per day.

To a single man—10 gallons per day.

This shall not apply at stations where a public water scheme is available.

12. Holidays.

(a) Every worker shall, after twelve months' continuous work, be granted twelve days' leave on full pay each year, the whole of which shall, except by agreement between the Commissioner and the union to the contrary, be taken at one time in each year, provided always that with the consent of the Commissioner holidays may be allowed to accumulate for two years. Two days' extra leave shall be granted to workers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and North and East thereof and on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Railway.

(b) Workers shall be paid for holidays at the rate of pay they are drawing at or immediately before the time when such holidays are taken.

(c) Every worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(d) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for the period any worker is off duty through sickness unless the absence exceeds three calendar months.

(e) At Depots and Stations where it can conveniently be done a roster shall be posted showing the approximate dates on which each worker will go on his annual leave and resume duty. Such roster will be subject to alteration to meet the exigencies of the service: Provided always that with the approval of the Head of the Branch any worker may change dates with another.

(f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause other than for peculation shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service, provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation no claim for holidays shall be recognised.

13. Free Passes and Freight.

After twelve months' continuous service, any worker shall be allowed three second class passes per annum, viz.:—

(a) One "Station to Station" on the occasion of the annual holiday, provided that such holiday extends over two days and may be issued to cover the full term of holidays due; and two return journey passes. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker and his wife and members of his family under eighteen years of age, and unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, all of whom are resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings, and may be extended to the mother of a worker resident with him, and solely dependent upon his earnings.

(b) Upon request, a worker may be granted a separate "Station to Station" pass for his wife and dependents as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time.

(c) Workers who have not had an opportunity of allowing their holidays to accrue owing to having taken leave on individual public holidays, shall be granted their "Station to Station" pass when on special leave up to fourteen days. Should any worker through sickness be unable to use his "Station to Station" pass on the occasion of his annual leave he shall be entitled to use such pass on the occasion of taking leave without pay during the year in which the same is due.

(d) After six months' service an employee shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in subclause (a) in proportion to length of service.

(e) Any employee who may resign from the service and shall have holidays due shall be granted a free pass "Station to Station" for the time of such holidays.

(f) Workers stationed outside Suburban Areas will be issued market passes once per month to the market town most convenient to the worker and the Commissioner. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years; a worker's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight, if required.

(g) Free Freight.—Domestic supplies, up to a maximum weight fortnightly of two cwt. for married men, and one cwt. for single men shall be carried free by rail to Home Station from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, and, in addition, meat, bread, and vegetables when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker where same are procurable. All such supplies must be for the sole use of the worker and his family. This subclause shall not apply in the Suburban Areas.

14. Privilege Tickets.

After six months' continuous service any worker shall be allowed first or second class privilege return tickets at one-half the ordinary single fare, with minimum charge of 1s. for adults and 6d. for a child, to be issued as provided in Clause 13 (a).

Free passes shall not apply to race special, guaranteed special, or special excursion trains within a fifty-mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the Station-master at the station where the worker desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room in the train.

15. Privilege Season Tickets.

Second class season tickets at half the ordinary season ticket rates, available between the station nearest his residence and his place of work, shall on application be issued to any worker. To any worker in receipt of 7s. or under per day, one quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

16. Absence through sickness.

Any worker losing time through sickness shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost.

17. Workers performing higher duties.

Any worker called on to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work, provided that acting time less than 20 minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

18. Secretary's Pass.

The Commissioner shall grant leave for a continuous period or otherwise of thirty days in each year to the Secretary of the Union (should such Secretary be a Railway servant) to enable him to attend exclusively to the Union work, and a free pass will be issued to the said Secretary whether he be an employee or not, for that period, but the pass may be withdrawn at the Commissioner's discretion. Such pass shall be used exclusively for union work in connection with Railway employees, and not for political purposes.

19. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.—To each worker covered by this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway:—

(a) A District Allowance of 5s. per day, seven days per week, shall be made, and such further amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate for his trade, plus 5s.

(b) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. 6d. when attended, and 7s. 6d. when unattended barracks are provided, and 8s. 6d. when there are no barracks.

(c) After the first 24 hours the sum of fivepence per hour for any succeeding hour or part thereof.

(d) The allowance in the two last preceding sub-clauses shall be in lieu of clause 7 (a) and (b).

(e) An extra twelve days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at Home Station.

20. Apprentices.—Provision shall be made for Apprentices as follows:—

(a) A probationary period of six months shall be allowed.

(b) Wages.

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is being made.

(c) Apprentices shall be employed in the Department under such conditions as may be in force from time to time at the rates of pay stated herein. The term of all apprenticeships entered into with any trade or trades to which this Award applies shall be for a period of five years. Apprentices, on completing their term, if further employed by the Department, shall be paid the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination as hereinafter provided at the end of each twelve monthly period.

(e) The examination shall take place at the Technical School, Perth, or such other convenient place as may be decided upon, and shall include theory and practice as applied in the science and art of the calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(f) The examination shall be conducted by the officers of the Technical School, or other approved persons, who shall issue a certificate to each pupil indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served.

(g) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (b) hereof, if any apprentice fails to satisfy the examiners.

(h) The Commissioner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award if he fails to give apprentices reasonable opportunity to learn.

(i) The number of apprentices shall not exceed the proportion of one to every two journeymen employed in shop work.

(j) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

21. Under-rate Workers.

A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lower rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the workers' union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police-magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

22. The rate of wages reduced or increased by this award shall not come into operation until 14 days after the delivery of the award, and during such period of fourteen days the rates payable under the last previous award shall continue to be paid.

23. Term of Award.—The currency of this award shall be three years from the date hereof. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

24. Area and Scope of Award.—This award shall apply to workers employed by the Commissioner in and about the working and maintenance of the State Railways and shall be binding upon the above-named parties, and shall operate over the whole of the State Railways and the workshops used in connection therewith.

This award shall also apply to workers in trades and callings included in it who are employed by the Commissioner in connection with the Tramways in Perth.

25. Shop Stewards.—Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the unions shall be recognised by the Commissioner.

Between Federated Moulders' (Metals) Industrial Union
of Workers, Applicant, and

The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia,

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth
hereby make the following Award in connection with
the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned
parties:—

AWARD.

1. Interpretation.

"Casual Hand" means a worker employed for less
than one week continuously.

"Attended Barracks" means any building attended
to by a whole or part time caretaker appointed
for that purpose which is provided with bed,
clean bedding, cooking utensils and light, light-
ing facilities and water and fuel.

"Unattended Barracks" means any van used as a
barracks provided with accommodation men-
tioned in the previous definition and any build-
ing which, whilst provided with the accommo-
dation therein mentioned, is wholly unattended.

"Married man" includes a single man who has a
parent or child solely dependent on him and
resident in the State of Western Australia,
but does not include a married man whose
wife and family are neither resident with nor
dependent upon him.

"Market Towns"—The following shall be ap-
proved market towns:—

2. Rates of Pay.

The respective minimum rates of pay for the several
classes of workers covered by this award shall be as
follows:—

Moulders—18s. per day of 8 hours.

Moulder, leading hand—20s. 6d. per day of 8 hours.

Casual hands shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to
the minimum rate specified above.

Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more
other tradesmen or of six other workers shall be paid
as a leading hand tradesman.

3. Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.
No day's work shall exceed eight hours forty-eight
minutes. The week's work may extend over five or six
days, at the option of the Commissioner.

(b) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose
outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a
minimum of two hours, provided such work, exclusive
of meal times, is not continuous with his shift: And
provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work
for the two hours if the job for which he has been
brought on has been completed in less time.

(c) The Commissioner shall guarantee to each worker
a full week's work exclusive of Sunday work, except
during such period as by reason of any action on the
part of any section of his employees or for any other
cause beyond his control he is unable wholly or partially
to carry on the running of the trains or workshops.
Each week shall stand by itself.

(d) The guaranteed period may be reduced as fol-
lows:—

(i.) In respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday,
and Labour Day, one day for each in the
weekly period in which the holiday occurs.

(ii.) In respect of any worker under suspension.
Provided that any worker suspended on a
charge which is not sustained shall be en-
titled to the benefit of the guarantee during
the period of his suspension.

(iii.) In respect of any day when as the result of a
vote taken by the workers concerned with the
consent of the Commissioner or by agree-
ment between the union and the Commissioner
a holiday is taken.

4. Overtime Rates.

All time worked in excess of or outside the usual
working hours in any one day shall be paid at the rate
of time and a-quarter for the first four hours, and there-
after at the rate of time and a-half, provided that
double time shall be paid for overtime on all work
other than work for any Department of the State.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day,
Good Friday, and Labour Day shall be paid at the rate
of time and a-half, and a worker working and paid at
such rates on either of those days shall not thereby lose
his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 12 hereof.

(c) All time worked during the usual meal time shall
be paid for at overtime rates and such rate shall con-
tinue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

5. Shift Work.

(a) Whenever shift work is required, all shifts, ex-
cept the daily shift, shall be paid for at the rate of
time and a-quarter.

(b) Work other than day shift shall not be recog-
nised as night shift unless five consecutive nights are
worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime.

(c) Overtime on night shift shall be calculated under
Clause 4 on the basis of the rate paid for night shift.

6. Retirement.

(a) No worker, after six months' continuous ser-
vice, shall leave the Department until the expiration of
fourteen days' written notice of his intention so to do,
without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given
by the Commissioner to any such worker whose services
are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal
shall be given. Provided that this subclause shall not
apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct,
or to workers for whom the Commissioner is unable to
find work by reason of any action on the part of any of
his employees, or for any other cause beyond his con-
trol.

7. Away from Home Allowance.

The following allowances shall be granted to workers
temporarily lodging away from their home station.

(a) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum
of 6s. where barracks are provided and used and 8s.

(e) Nothing in the foregoing subclauses shall be
taken to interfere with the discretion of the Commis-
sioner to make any additional allowance in special
cases.

(f) The allowance shall be calculated from the time
of booking on to the time of booking off at home
station.

(g) The allowance shall not be granted to any
worker stationed in and sent to work within the sub-
urban area.

(h) A worker absent from his home station on duty
(not being a worker temporarily lodging away from his
home station) shall be paid 2s. for his second and each
succeeding meal: Provided that any worker who in
fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be
entitled to be paid 2s. in respect thereof.

(f) Workers stationed outside suburban areas will be issued market passes once per month to the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years; a worker's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight, if required.

(g) Free freight.

Domestic supplies, up to a maximum weight, fortnightly, of two cwt. for married men and one cwt. for single men, shall be carried free on rail to home station from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, and, in addition, meat, bread, and vegetables, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the market town most convenient to the Commissioner and the worker, where same are procurable. All such supplies must be for the sole use of the worker and his family. This subclause shall not apply in the suburban areas.

14. Privilege Tickets.

After six months' continuous service any worker shall be allowed first or second class privilege return tickets at one half the ordinary single fare, with a minimum charge of 1s. for adults and 6d. for a child, to be issued as provided in Clause 13 (a).

Free passes shall not apply to race special, guaranteed special, or special excursion trains within a fifty-mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the station-master at the station where the worker desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room in the train.

15. Privilege Season Tickets.

Second class season tickets at half the ordinary season ticket rates, available between the station nearest his residence and his place of work, shall, on application, be issued to any worker. To any worker in receipt of 7s. or under per day, one quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

16. Workers performing Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work, provided that acting time for less than 20 minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

17. Absence through Sickness.

Any worker losing time through sickness shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost.

18. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.

To each worker covered by this award stationed on the Port-Hedland-Marble Bar Railway:—

(a) A district allowance of 5s. per day, seven days per week, shall be made, and such further amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate for his trade, plus 5s.

(b) For the first 24 hours or part thereof the sum of 6s. 6d. when attended, and 7s. 6d. when unattended barracks are provided, and 8s. 6d. when there are no barracks.

(c) After the first 24 hours the sum of fivepence per hour for any succeeding hour or part thereof.

(d) The allowance in the last two preceding sub-clauses shall be in lieu of Clause 7 (a) and (b).

(e) An extra twelve days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at home station.

19. Apprentices.

Provision shall be made for apprentices as follows:—

(a) A probationary period of six months shall be allowed.

(b) Wages:—

During first year of service ..	20s. per week.
During second year of service ..	27s. per week.
During third year of service ..	39s. per week.
During fourth year of service ..	51s. per week.
During fifth year of service ..	63s. per week.

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is being made.

(c) Apprentices shall be employed in the Department under such conditions as may be in force from time to time at the rates of pay stated herein. The term of all apprenticeships entered into with any trade to which this award applies shall be for a period of five years. Apprentices, on completing their term, if further employed by the Department, shall be paid the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination as hereinafter provided at the end of each twelve monthly period.

(e) The examination shall take place at the Technical School, Perth, or such other convenient place as may be decided upon, and shall include theory and practice as applied in the science and art of the calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(f) The examination shall be conducted by the officers of the Technical School, or other approved persons, who shall issue a certificate to each pupil indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served.

(g) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (b) hereof, if any apprentice fails to satisfy the examiners.

(h) The Commissioner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award if he fails to give apprentices reasonable opportunity to learn.

(i) The number of apprentices shall not exceed the proportion of one to every two journeymen employed in shop work.

(j) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

20. Under-rate workers.

A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lower rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

21. The rate of wages reduced or increased by this award shall not come into operation until 14 days after the delivery of the award, and during such period of 14 days the rates payable under the last previous award shall continue to be paid.

22. Term of Award.

The currency of this award shall be three years from the date hereof. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from that date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

23. Area and Scope of Award.

This award shall apply only to workers employed by the Commissioner in and about the working and maintenance of the State Railways, and shall be binding upon the above-named parties, and shall operate over the whole of the State Railways and the Workshops used in connection therewith.

24. Shop Stewards.

Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the union shall be recognised by the Commissioner.

THE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ACT, 1892.

General Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Electric Lighting Regulations, 1922."

Interpretations.

2. The several words, terms, and expressions to which meanings are assigned in "The Electric Lighting Act of 1892," or in "The Electric Lighting Amendment Act, 1905," have the same respective meanings in these Regulations.

And in these Regulations:—

"Consumer's Wires" means any electric lines on a consumer's premises which are connected with the service lines of the "Undertakers" at the consumer's terminals.

"Overhead Line" means any electric line which is placed above ground in the open air.

"Inspector" means any person appointed by the Minister under these Regulations.

"Pressure" means the difference of electrical potential between any two conductors or between any part of either conductor and the earth; and—

(a) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure at any pair of consumer's terminals does not exceed 275 volts, the supply shall be deemed a low pressure supply.

(b) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure exceeds 275 volts, but does not exceed 650 volts, the supply shall be deemed a medium pressure supply.

(c) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure exceeds 650 volts but does not exceed 3,000 volts, the supply shall be deemed a high pressure supply.

(d) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure exceeds 3,000 volts, the supply shall be deemed an extra high pressure supply.

Where these Regulations require any metallic body to be "efficiently connected with the earth," that phrase means that such metallic body shall be connected with the general mass of earth in such manner as will ensure, as far as practicable, at all times, an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

Responsibility of Undertakers.

3. Undertakers supplying electricity through, over, or above any public street, road, or place shall be responsible for the acts or neglects of their servants in carrying out these Regulations.

Records at Power Stations.

4. This Regulation only applies to Power Stations of under 1,000 kilowatts of generating capacity.

(a) Every Undertaker shall provide a log book in the form prescribed by the Minister to be kept by the attendant at each Power Station in which he shall enter every alarm or other emergency call, together with the action taken in regard thereto, at the time of the occurrence, as directed by the instructions printed upon the cover of such log book.

(b) The attendant shall be responsible for the safe custody of the log book, which must be produced for inspection by any inspector authorised under these Regulations or the Minister for Works, also at any inquiry.

(c) During any absence of log book (or at any inquiry as aforesaid) a supplementary log book must be provided for use.

(d) Upon receiving intimation of any accident or circumstances in which the continuance of supply of current on any section would involve risk to life or property; also in the event of a fire, where live cables would involve risk of life or property, the attendant shall cut off the current from the circuits affected, and such circuits shall be kept cut off until further instructions have been given by a responsible officer, or until the attendant is satisfied that danger has ceased to exist.

(e) The time and particulars of all such actions are to be entered in log book.

(f) Every Undertaker shall give notice to the Minister on the prescribed form of any accident which causes serious or fatal injury to any person.

(g) The person having charge of electric light plants or installations owned or controlled by Undertakers or local governing bodies may be required to produce evidence of competency to the satisfaction of the Government or a Board appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

(h) All power stations shall be placed in direct telephonic communication with the telephone exchange, the telephone or extension bell being so placed that the call can easily be heard by the attendant on duty.

Extra High Pressure Main Transmission Lines.

5. All poles and supports carrying 20,000 volt mains or over shall have some clear indication of danger thereon, and shall be protected by having at least four turns of barbed wire affixed around at a distance of eight (8) feet from the ground.

Distance from other Cables.

6. (a) Cables carrying current exceeding 6,600 volts shall be so erected and maintained that they shall not be closer than three feet from any other cable carrying current at lower voltages, excepting connections to transformers and other apparatus.

(b) In cases where existing cables are in closer proximity than the three feet prescribed, they shall be altered to comply with this Regulation within six months, or such other extended time as may be granted by the written approval of the Minister.

Distance from Building.

7. (a) Cables carrying current exceeding 650 volts shall be so erected that the minimum distance from any bridge, or public structure, also any balcony, verandah, or other part of a building accessible without a ladder or special appliances shall not be less than seven feet vertically or three feet six inches in a horizontal direction or otherwise to the satisfaction of an inspector authorised under these Regulations.

(b) In cases where existing cables are in closer proximity than prescribed they shall be altered to comply with this Regulation within six months or such other extended time as may be granted by the written approval of the Minister.

Protection for High Pressure Lines, etc.

8. Every high pressure main conductor, or other apparatus, shall be protected by a suitable fuse or automatic circuit breaker.

9. In every case where a high pressure supply is transformed for the purpose of supply to one or more consumers, some suitable primary fuse or cut-off shall be provided to protect the consumer's pressure system either within or without the transforming apparatus.

10. Precautions are to be taken that in the event of a high pressure circuit being cut off at the Power Station, or elsewhere, for the purposes of repairs, alterations, or other cause, this circuit so cut off shall not be charged or kept "alive" by leakage, or by medium of any transformer, motor, or other induction apparatus.

Overhead Lines and Poles.

11. (a) An overhead line shall not in any part thereof be at less height from the ground than fifteen feet, where such lines are through or over any road, street, or public place, except service lines to buildings.

(b) In cases where overhead lines are placed near any bridge or public structure, also any balcony or building attachments accessible without a ladder or special appliances, they must be placed beyond the reach of persons using such balcony or building attachments or to the satisfaction of an inspector authorised under these Regulations, and in cases where existing cables are in closer proximity than prescribed they shall be altered to comply with this Regulation within six months, or such other extended time as may be granted by the written approval of the Minister.

(c) All poles carrying electric cables are to be maintained in good condition, and to be of sufficient strength to support the cables, and with a view of preventing injury (as in the case of wooden poles by dry rot, white ants, etc.), are to be examined every twelve months, and any pole found to be unsound shall be at once made safe.

(d) All cables, connections, cross arms, insulators, and attachments of cables are to be examined as necessary, and all defective cross arms, insulators, and attachments removed and replaced, and the cables restrained if required.

Earth Return.

12. The earth shall not be used as a return circuit on any electric light or power circuit.

Provided that in the case of motors run off Tramway services already in existence, the Minister may grant permission in writing to continue same for such period as he may determine upon.

Wiring of Buildings.

13. After the date of publication of these Regulations, no electric installation in any public or private building shall be connected to any public electricity supply system, unless such electric installation has been carried out to the satisfaction of the Undertakers supplying the current.

Inspection.

14. The Minister may appoint any person or persons to be inspectors for the proper carrying out of these Regulations, and any inspector authorised under these Regulations may at all reasonable times inspect any of the works, and no person shall impede or hinder him or them in such inspection.

Exemption.

15. These Regulations shall not apply to electrical installation in Mines.

Regulation to be exhibited.

16. A copy of these Regulations must be exhibited in a conspicuous place in every Power Station, by the Undertakers, for the information of attendants and others concerned.

Alarms.

17. Any person wilfully or knowingly giving a false or erroneous alarm shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

Penalties.

18. Any person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50 in each case.
