WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (5) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Administrator may from time to time by Proclamation, issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Administrator by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Cuballing, praying that the day on which such shops in such district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in the said District shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 180/22.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works herein-after mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed 24-inch diameter Water Main from Mt. Hawthorn Reservoir to Redfern Street, as shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4006.

Heavy Traffic By-law.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

BUNBURY HARBOUR BOARD ACT, 1909.

633/22.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations made under "The Bunbury Harbour Board Act, 1909," with effect as from 1st July, 1922.

Interest on Capital and provision of Sinking and Replacement Funds.

All dues, charges, rents, and other moneys levied and collected by the Bunbury Harbour Board and paid into the Treasury to the credit of the Bunbury Harbour Board Account shall, after payment of all fees, salaries, wages, and other expenditure lawfully incurred by the Board in exercise of its power under the Act, be charged with the payment to the Colonial Treasurer of interest—

- (a) on the value of property vested in or charged to the Board under Sections 52 and 53 of "The Bunbury Harbour Board Act, 1909," up to the 30th day of June, 1911, at the rate of 3½ per cent. per annum; and
- (b) on property so vested or charged from the 1st day of July, 1911, to the 30th day of June, 1918, inclusive, at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum, and

(c) on property so vested or charged from the 1st day of July, 1918, to the 30th day of June, 1919, and thereafter until further order, at the rate of 6½ per cent. per annum; and with the payment of one per cent. per annum on the aggregate value of the property so vested as a recoup to the Consolidated Revenue Fund in respect to contributions to the Statutory Sinking Fund, and compound interest on such contributions will be allowed at a rate to be fixed in each year by the Colonial Treasurer; also of a sum of £500 per annum as a provision for a replacement fund, to be invested in such manner as the Colonial Treasurer may think fit and accumulated at compound interest, and the balance shall be carried to the Consolidated Revenue as provided by Section 54 of the Act.

*Navigation of Inner Harbour Basin, Fremantle Harbour.
Passing Dredges in the Fairway.*

Notice to Mariners.

2648/20.

MARINERS and all persons navigating the Inner Harbour Basin at Fremantle, Western Australia, are hereby notified that dredges are engaged in deepening operations in the basin, and Mariners approaching these dredges must use the whistle (sound) signals laid down in Article No. 28 of the Board of Trade Regulations for preventing collisions, viz.:—

One short blast—"I am directing my course to starboard."

Two short blasts—"I am directing my course to port."

Upon which the dredge will (provided she is not showing by day a red flag or by night two vertical red lights as provided for hereunder) haul over as far as possible in the direction opposite to the side which the approaching vessel has indicated as above that she desires to use. Approaching Mariners must be careful in using these sound signals to give sufficient time for the dredge to move as indicated.

If the approaching vessel makes no signal the dredge will remain stationary.

The signals exhibited by dredges working in the fairway are as follows:—

1. When dredge exhibits a Black Ball shape by day or a Green Light under a White Light, four feet apart by night—Vessels coming in must leave dredge on their own starboard hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own port hands.
2. When dredge exhibits a Black Diamond shape by day or a Red Light under a White Light, four feet apart, by night—Vessels coming in must leave the dredge on their own port hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own starboard hands.
3. When dredge exhibits a Red Flag by day or two Red Lights vertically four feet apart by night, this denotes that dredge cannot be moved from her position, and if sufficient room exists for vessels to pass, the side on which they are to pass will be indicated by one of the signals detailed under No. 1 and 2 above being also shown. If, however, neither of these latter signals is shown, the dredge must not be passed till either daylight appears or definite orders have been received from the Harbour Master.
