AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 7th day of June, 1922, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Administrator in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foreman and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Public Works Department should be vested in Mr. Herbert John Sheppard: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the said Herbert John Sheppard, and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer, the appointment of foreman and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage. To take effect as from the 2nd day of March, 1921.

Repurchased Estates.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. 570/22.

WHEREAS by Section 2, Subsection 2, of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act Amendment Act, 1922," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to declare that the expenditure after the first day of January, 1918, under Section 5 of "The Land Act, 1898," or other statutory authority relating to the acquisition of land for closer settlement shall be dealt with in like manner as expenditure under the principal Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act Amendment Act, 1922," doth hereby declare that the expenditure after the first day of January, 1918, under Section 5 of "The Land Act, 1898," or other statutory authority relating to the acquisition of land for closer settlement, amounting to the sum of £501,675, shall be dealt with in like manner as expenditure under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1909."

Constitution of Health District at Kununoppin under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.P.H 1387/20; Ex. Co. No. 1754.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State not being a Municipal District to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name herein-after specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Kununoppin Health District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," the Governor may, by Order in Council, excise from any Fire District any specified portion thereof, and thereupon such portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be no longer included in or be part of such District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of all powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby excise from the Katanning Fire District that portion of the said Fire District which is outside the limits defined in the Schedule hereto:—

The Schedule.

Bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of a line passing along the centre of Andrews Road with the prolongation Eastward of the North boundary of Katanning Lot 593, and extending Southward along the centre of said Andrews Road to the centre of Conroy Street, and South-Eastward along the centre of Conroy Street to the centre of Forrest Street, and along the centre of Forrest Street to the prolongation North-Westward of the North-East boundary of Sublot 18 of Lot 442; thence Northward to the intersection of the prolongation South-Westward of the North-Western boundary of Sublot 32 of Lot 422 with the centre of Frederick Street, and along the centre of Frederick Street to the centre of Clive Street, and along the centre of Clive Street to the prolongation North-Westward of the North-West boundary of Sublot 3 of Lot 441; thence South-Eastward along the said prolongation and North-East boundary and its prolongation South-Eastward through Lots 442, 443, 444, 448, 449, 450, 453, 454, and 456 to the centre of Drove Street, and South-Westward along the centre of Drove Street to the centre of Lisle Street; then Westward to intersect the prolongation Northward of the centre of Bay Street, and South-Westward along said prolongation, and centre of Bay street

to the centre of Blantyre Street, and North-Westward along the centre of Blantyre Street to the centre of Acton Street, and along the centre of Acton Street to the centre of Andover Street; thence North-Westward along the centre of Andover Street to the centre of Pemble Street, and North-Eastward along the centre of Pemble Street and its prolongation North-Eastward to the centre of Taylor Street, and North-Westward along the centre of Taylor Street to the centre of a street passing along the North-Western boundaries of Lots 557 and 548, and along the centre of said street to the centre of Carew Street; thence North-Westward along the centre of a street passing along the South-Western boundary of Lot 581 to the prolongation South-Westward of the North-Western boundary of Lot 581; thence North-Eastward along said prolongation and North-West boundary of Lot 581 and the North-Western boundaries of Lots 580, 579, 582 to 593 inclusive, and their prolongation North-Eastward to the starting point.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve the annexed By-laws made by Joseph Robert Campbell, General Manager of State Hotels, by virtue of the powers conferred by Order in Council made under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th June, 1922.

By-laws.

I, Joseph Robert Campbell, General Manager of State Hotels, by virtue of the powers committed to me by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th June, 1922, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," do hereby revoke all the By-laws heretofore made in respect of the Reserves mentioned in the Schedule to the said Order in Council, or any of them, and do hereby make the By-laws following, which shall have effect in respect of all of the said Reserves except in so far as the control is indicated in such By-laws:—

Visitors must be accompanied by the Caretaker or Guide.

1. No person or persons shall enter any Cave unless accompanied by the authorised guide or caretaker.

Admission Fees.

2. Every person entering a Cave shall pay to the caretaker or authorised guide, before entering, such admission fees as may be approved by the Colonial Secretary from time to time.

Injuring or destroying Trees.

3. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove or destroy, or interfere in any way with any tree, shrub, plant or flower growing on the said reserves.

Injuring or disfiguring Caves.

4. No person shall break, remove, injure, or deface by writing or by marking, or in any way damage any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or remove any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or in any way injure, damage, or disfigure the stairways, ladders, cave gates, railings, seats, fences, buildings, machinery, lighting appliances, or other structures or improvements, or gardens, or pleasure grounds and appurtenances within any cave or upon any reserve.

Injuring the Soil or Surface, or destroying Birds or Animals.

5. No person shall cut up, damage or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or rocks or turf or surface of the caves, reserves, or gardens, or pleasure grounds and appurtenances, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or pollute or interfere with any water thereon, interfere with or destroy any birds or animals thereon, in any manner whatsoever.

Visitors to act in obedience to instructions of Caretaker or Authorised Guide.

6. Every visitor to the reserves or caves therein shall act in obedience to the instructions of the Caretaker or authorised Guide whilst being shown through or over any cave or caves or part of the reserves.

Persons misconducting themselves.

7. No person or persons shall misconduct themselves in any way by indulging in riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on or within the said reserves or caves.

Posting Bills.

8. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road path, building, or any place whatever, upon or within the said reserves and caves.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserves.

9. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or missile, upon or within any of the said reserves and caves.

Selling Goods on the Reserves.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said reserves or caves unless the consent, in writing, of the Board shall be previously obtained, and upon payment of such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Waste Litter of Picnics to be removed.

11. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game, or shall picnic in or upon the reserves, he or they (as the case may be) shall immediately prior to leaving the grounds collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

Camping and lighting Fires.

12. No person or persons shall camp or light any fire upon any cave reserve, except in such position and under such conditions as may be approved by the authorised guide or caretaker, or a servant of the Board duly authorised, and upon permission of such authorised guide or caretaker or servant of the Board having first been obtained.

Cattle not to be depastured.

13. No person shall cause, suffer, or allow any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, camel, donkey, mule, pig or other animal to stray or depasture upon any reserve or reserves without the special approval of the Board having been first obtained in writing, and upon payment of such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Lights to be used.

14. No person shall use in any cave any artificial light or lights except those provided by the Board or its servants.

Smoking in Caves.

15. No person shall smoke within any cave.

Taking Photographs.

16. No person shall take photographs in any cave without the permission of the guide or caretaker, and upon payment of any or such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Guide or Caretaker may remove any person guilty of improper conduct.

17. Any guide, caretaker, or servant of the Board may exclude or remove from the reserves or caves any person or persons guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

18. No person shall, without the permission of the Board first obtained, ply for motor or other vehicular hire or carry and/or convey any passenger or luggage for hire within Reserve A 8427, within which Cave House, Yallingup, is situated.

Any such permission as aforesaid may be given for such period as the Board of Management may from time to time determine.

The Board of Management may make it a condition of the granting of any permission under these By-laws that the person applying for such permission shall pay such fees as may be from time to time ordered by the Board of Management with the approval of the Colonial Secretary.

Penalty.

19. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Navigation of Inner Harbour Basin, Fremantle Harbour. Passing Dredges in the Fairway.

Notice to Mariners.

2648/20.

MARINERS and all persons navigating the Inner Harbour Basin at Fremantle, Western Australia, are hereby notified that dredges are engaged in deepening operations in the basin, and Mariners approaching these dredges must use the whistle (sound) signals laid down in Article No. 28 of the Board of Trade Regulations for preventing collisions, viz.:—

One short blast—"I am directing my course to starboard."

Two short blasts—"I am directing my course to port."

Upon which the dredge will (provided she is not showing by day a red flag or by night two vertical red lights as provided for hereunder) haul over as far as possible in the direction opposite to the side which the approaching vessel has indicated as above that she desires to use. Approaching Mariners must be careful in using these sound signals to give sufficient time for the dredge to move as indicated.

If the approaching vessel makes no signal the dredge will remain stationary.

The signals exhibited by dredges working in the fairway are as follows:—

1. When dredge exhibits a Black Ball shape by day or a Green Light under a White Light, four feet apart by night—Vessels coming in must leave dredge on their own starboard hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own port hands.
2. When dredge exhibits a Black Diamond shape by day or a Red Light under a White Light, four feet apart, by night—Vessels coming in must leave the dredge on their own port hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own starboard hands.
3. When dredge exhibits a Red Flag by day or two Red Lights vertically four feet apart by night, this denotes that dredge cannot be moved from her position, and if sufficient room exists for vessels to pass, the side on which they are to pass will be indicated by one of the signals detailed under No. 1 and 2 above being also shown. If, however, neither of these latter signals is shown, the dredge must not be passed till either daylight appears or definite orders have been received from the Harbour Master.

The wages under this Award are payable under a contract of daily service.

4. *Hours of Labour.*—(a.) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface the forty-eight hours shall then be inclusive of crib time.

(b.) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work underground, including crib time.

(c.) On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight hours, including crib time, and on Saturdays four hours, excluding crib time, shall comprise the week's work for underground workers.

(d.) A day's work on the surface shall be deemed to be satisfied if time of duty be eight and three-quarter hours on five days in each week, and four and a quarter hours on one day.

(e.) Six hours shall constitute a shift's work in all rises, or in sinking specially wet shafts and winzes, and for men engaged as boiler cleaners, or in cleaning dust bins or flues.

5. *Overtime*.—(a.) For work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b.) Duty on Sundays or holidays shall be paid at double time.

(c.) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the employees themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts or which is owing to a relieving man not coming at the appointed time.

The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming at the proper time shall not exceed two hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply.

(d.) When workers are engaged on a process which is necessarily continuous such process may be worked on Sunday at the ordinary rate, if the workers are not required to work more than six days consecutively.

(e.) When computing overtime the district allowances shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

6. *Wet Places*.—In all wet or hot places eighteen-pence extra per shift shall be paid in addition to the rates set out. This extra payment shall not apply to Subclause (e) of Clause 4.

7. *Dry Crushing Plants*.—No dry crushing plant shall be operated unless such conditions as obviate dust as far as is reasonably practicable. It shall be the duty of the Inspector of Mines to make an examination of all dry crushing plants in his districts, once in each month, and at such other times as he may be requested so to do by the Secretary of the Union. He shall examine and report to the Court, and such report shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.

8. *Piece Workers*.—There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rates fixed by this Award, the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, viz.:—

(a.) Where the engagement is for a period of time such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof, without the written consent of the worker.

(b.) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work the amount of work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than 5 per cent.

(c.) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.

(d.) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages fixed by this Award for the work done.

(e.) The price of any article supplied by the employer for the use of the worker during the period of his engagement shall not be increased during the period, and shall in no case exceed the cost or price of the article to the employer at the place of supply.

(f.) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Award, or by the contract whichever shall be the greatest, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.

(g.) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wages remuneration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period of their several employment by the rate fixed by this Award, or the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to

charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors. A printed copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the change room on the mine.

9. *Holidays*.—The following shall be holidays:—Christmas Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

10. *Casual Workers*.—Men employed for less than one week shall be considered casual, and shall receive one shilling per shift above the rates specified for the work.

11. *Drinking Water*.—Good drinking water shall be supplied on all levels where men are working and kept cool and free from dust.

12. *Free Water*.—In all districts where free water is supplied by the employer, single men shall get three gallons, and married men six gallons per day.

13. *No Reduction*.—Any worker who may be at the date of issue of this Award in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed shall not suffer by reason of this Award any reduction in the amount which such worker was receiving above the rate prescribed by Award No. 7 of 1920.

14. *Mixed Functions*.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift, shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift, provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

15. *Change Rooms*.—If more than four persons are employed underground in any mine in one shift, sufficient accommodation shall be provided above ground near the principal entrance to the mine, and not in the engine room or boiler house, for enabling the persons employed in the mine to conveniently dry and change their clothes, and in no case shall men change their clothes upon a boiler.

16. *Union Official*.—A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to collect Union fees at the offices of the mine on pay days, and shall be allowed to inspect time sheets and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this Award, and make extracts therefrom.

17. *Reduction of Hands*.—Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed, the management, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and, all things being equal, shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the company.

18. *Accident Pay*.—In the event of an employee meeting with an accident during the shift, or being required to attend to one who has met with an accident, he shall be deemed to have rendered duty during the whole of the shift, and be paid accordingly.

19. *Full Payment for Shift*.—After beginning a shift workers shall not be paid less than for a full shift, unless they leave of their own account, or are dismissed for misconduct. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

20. *Water Jets*.—Provision of the regulations made under the Mines Regulation Act for the prevention of dust shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Award.

21. *Payment of Wages*.—Pay day shall be in accordance with Section 55 of the Mines Regulation Act. Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the mine office, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, or if the work done requires to be measured or assessed, within two hours of ceasing work.

22. *Hours in Hot Places*.—No person shall be allowed to work for a longer period than six hours in any part of the underground working of a mine when the temperature in that part ascertained by the reading of the wet bulb thermometer exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit for a period of four consecutive hours. The reading of the thermometer shall be ascertained at intervals of one-half hour over four hours, and the average of such readings shall be taken as the temperature during that period. The Inspector of Mines shall take readings when required so to do by any worker or by the Secretary of the Union. The manager of the mine shall provide a wet bulb thermometer.

23. *Annual Holidays*.—A fortnight's holiday, including twelve working days, shall be granted once in each year to every worker on full pay. Provided that, should the employment be terminated before the holiday is due, the worker shall, after the completion of one month's service, be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month and proportionately for any portion of month of service. Provided further that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause. A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid when on holiday the minimum rate for his grade.

24. *Underground Workers*.—All men who have to go underground to work, and the bracedmen, shall work the same hours as miners.

25. *Explosives*.—All men using explosives shall be classed as miners.

26. *Lime*.—Lime used in the reduction of ore shall not be mixed in battery bins.

27. *District Allowances*.—In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 3 of this Award, the following allowances shall be paid for six days per week to workers employed in the districts of:—

- (1.) Hampton Plains, Mount Monger, Murrin, Gwalia, Laverton, and St. Ives—One shilling per day or portion of a day extra.
- (2.) Mulline, Riverina, Yundamindera, and Linden—One shilling and sixpence per day or portion of a day extra.
- (3.) Lawlers and Wiluna—One shilling and ninepence per day or portion of a day extra.
- (4.) Norseman—Sixpence per day or portion of a day extra.

In addition to the above the Court reserves to itself the power on the application of any person or party bound by this Award to prescribe a district allowance for any area not specified and comprised within the area covered by this Award.

28. *Definitions*.—

"Wet Places."—Should any dispute arise as to whether any place is wet or especially wet within the meaning of Clause 4, Subclause (e), such dispute shall be referred to a Board, constituted of a representative appointed by the employer and a representative appointed by the Miners' Union of which the worker concerned is a member, with the Warden of the Goldfields in which such mine is situated as Chairman. The decision of a majority of the Board shall be final.

"Timber Man" (ordinary).—Timber man shall mean a worker engaged in underground timberwork, but a miner timbering his own workings shall not be classed as a timber man.

"Timber Man" (shaft).—A shaft timber man shall mean a worker engaged in shaft timbering or timber work, but a miner timbering his own shaft shall not be classed as a shaft timber man.

"Braceman."—Braceman shall mean any worker in charge of a cage at the mouth of a shaft; if more than one cage each worker shall be classed as a braceman, but shall not include any worker who may be temporarily assisting a braceman in loading.

"Platman" (or "Skipman") shall mean any worker in charge of a cage or skip; if more than one cage or skip each worker so in charge shall be classed as a platman or skipman.

"Hot Places" shall mean places underground where the temperature exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit, using the wet bulb.

29. *Amendment of Award*.—This Award may, on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions, be amended by the Court after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof.
