ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Tambellup Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, transfer to one Ward of a District any portion of another Ward: And whereas it is desirable to transfer certain portions of the several Wards of the Tambellup Road District to other Wards of the said District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Adminis-

trator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

- (a.) That portion of the South-West Ward of the said District described in Part I. of the First Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the North-West Ward.
- (b.) That portion of the East Ward of the said District described in Part II. of the First Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the South Ward.
- (c.) That portion of the South-West Ward of the said District described in Part III. of the First Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the South Ward.
- (d.) That portion of the South Ward of the said District described in Part IV. of the First Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the South-West Ward.
- (e.) That portion of the North-West Ward of the said District described in Part V. of the First Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the South-West Ward.

And it is hereby declared and directed that no new election of members need be held for any of the Wards of the said District affected by this Order.

The boundaries of the Wards of the said District, as amended by this Order, are as stated in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Part I.

Transfer of Territory from the South-West to the North-West Ward.

1. All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at a point on the Western boundary of Kojonup Location 5835, 81 chains 13 links Northward from its South-West corner, and extending Eastward through the said location along the Southern side of a surveyed road and continuing along the North boundaries of Locations 2489 and 6298, a North, a West, the Northernmost and part of the East boundary of Location 5376, the North boundary of Location 6430, the Northernmost boundary of Location 6078, the North and East boundaries of Location 6489, the East and South boundaries of Location 7120, a South, an East, a North, again an East, the Southernmost and part of the Westernmost boundary of Location 6078, the South and part of the West boundary of Location 7239, the South boundary of Location 7257, part of an East, the Southernmost, a West, a South, and the Westernmost boundary of Location 6298, part of the South boundary of Location 2489, part of the East, a South, a West, and again a South boundary of Location 1426, to the District boundary, and along said District boundary to the starting point.

Part II.

From East Ward to South Ward.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at a point on the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve in prolongation Westward of the North boundary of Plantagenet Location 1078, and extending along said prolongation and North boundary, a North boundary of Location 1216, the North boundaries of Locations 1257 and 1339, a West boundary of Location 3081, a North and the Easternmost boundary of Location 3366, and Southward along the Western side of Road No. 4266 to the 2-mile post on Road No. 2986; thence South-Eastward along the South-Western side of said Road No. 4266 to the prolongation North of the Westernmost boundary of Location 2400, and along said prolongation and Westernmost boundary and the Southernmost and an East boundary of said Location 2400, the North boundary of Location 2299, part of the South boundary of Location 1160, the South boundary of Location 1136, parts of the North and East boundaries of late W.A. Land Co.'s and Location 407 to the 2-mile post on the said East boundary; thence Westward to the North-East corner of Location 3481, and along its East, its South, and part of its West boundary, the South and part of the West boundary of Location 2604, a North, an East, again a North and an East, the North-Western and the Westernmost boundary of Location 2636, part of the West boundary of Location 3428, the South, the West, and part of the North-Western boundary of Location 1243, a West boundary of Location

2224, part of the South boundary of Location 1599, the East and South boundaries of Location 572, the South boundary of Location 1169, the South-Western boundaries of Locations 1169 and 1613, the South-Eastern and the South boundary of Location 1253 to the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve, and Northward along same to the starting point.

Part III.

From South-West Ward to South Ward.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the left bank of the Gordon River at the South-West corner of Plantagenet Location 3550, and extending Northward along said bank of the river to the West boundary of Location 2283, and along part of the West, the South, and the East boundaries of said location, the Northernmost and part of the Easternmost boundary of Location 3442, a South, a West, the Southernmost and the Easternmost boundary of Location 1418, part of the South boundary of Location 1225, the South-Western and the East boundary of Location 1348, part of the North boundary of Location 1218, the Western boundaries of Locations 3706 and 1503, the South boundaries of Locations 1429 and 1179 to the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve, and Southward along said side of the Railway Reserve to the prolongation East of the South boundary of Location 2459; thence Westward along said prolongation and South boundary, the South boundary of Location 2409, and again a South boundary of Location 2459, the East and the South boundary of Location 3136, the South, South-Western and part of the West boundary of Location 2073, the South and the West boundary of Location 1398, parts of the South and West boundaries of Location 2721, the Northernmost and part of the West boundary of Location 3779, the South boundary of Location 3550 to the starting point.

Part IV.

From the South Ward to the South-West Ward.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the District boundary at the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 5767, and extending Eastward along the North boundary of said location, a North, a West, and the Northernmost boundary of Location 5997, the North boundary of Location 5706, part of the West, the Southernmost, an East, and a South boundary of Location 6211, part of the South-Western boundary of Location 5338, South-Western boundaries of Locations 5775 and 6056, part of the North boundary of Location 6055, the Westernmost, the North, and the East boundary of Location 6335, parts of the North and East boundaries of Location 6336, the Southernmost, an East, and part of a South boundary of Location 7006, part of the North boundary of Location 2687 to the left bank of the Gordon River, and Southward along said bank of the river to the District boundary, and Westward and Northward along said District boundary to the starting point.

Part V.

From the North-West to the South-West Ward.

1. Kojonup Locations 629, 631, and 2308.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

North-West Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the District boundary from the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 4168 to its intersection with the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve. On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Southward along the said side of the Railway Reserve to the Northernmost boundary of Tambellup Townsite, and along part of said Northernmost boundary and a West, the North-Eastern, and part of the Westernmost boundary of said Townsite to the South-East corner of Location 2759. the latter's South boundary, the South boundaries of Locations 2481, 621, 620, 511, and 632, the East boundaries of Locations 501 and 650, the South boundaries of Locations 650, 649, and 648, part of the East and the North boundaries of Locations 2506 and 2313, an East boundary of Location 3517, the North boundary of Location 2268, part of the East, the North, and part of the West boundary of Location 2287, the North boundaries of Locations 7409, 7803, and 5454, an East, a North, an East, the Southernmost and part of the Westernmost boundary of Location 6078, the South and part of the West boundary of Location 7239, the South boundary of Location 7257, part of an East, the Southernmost, a West, a South, and the Westernmost boundary of Location 6298, part of the South boundary of Location 2439, part of the East boundary of Location 1426, to the right bank of Slab Hut Gully, and along said bank to the East boundary of Location 1678; thence along the East and North boundaries of said location to intersect the District boundary. On the Westward by part of the District boundary from the said intersection to the starting point.

Central Ward.—Bounded on the Northward, Eastward, Southward, and Westward by the gazetted boundaries of the Tambellup Townsite.

East Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the District boundary, from its intersection with the Eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve to the South-East corner of Plantagenet Location 3039. On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Westward along the South and part of the West boundary of said Location 3039, the South boundaries of Locations 3038, 3037, and 2494, part of the East, the South, and the West boundaries of Location 2495 to its North-West corner; thence Westward to the 2 M.P. on the East boundary of late W.A. Land Company's Location 407; thence Northward and Westward along parts of the East and North boundaries of said Location 407 to the South-East corner of Location 1136, and along its South boundary and the South boundary of Location 1160 to its South-West corner; thence along the Northern side of Road No. 985 to its junction with the Eastern side of Road No. 4266, opposite the North-West corner of Location 2400. On the Westward by lines commencing at the said junction and extending North-Westward along the North-Eastern side of said Road No. 4266 to the 2 M.P. on Road No. 2986; thence Northward and again along the Eastern side of Road No. 4266 and part of the West boundary of Location 1960, a North boundary of Location 3366, a West boundary of Location 3081, part of the South boundary of Location 2731, the South boundaries of Locations 1259 and 612 to the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve, and Northward along said side of the Railway Reserve to the South boundary of Tambellup Townsite, and Eastward, Northward, and Westward along part of the South, the East, and part of the Northernmost boundary of said townsite to the East boundary of the North-West Ward, and Northward along said boundary to the starting point.

South Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by the left bank of the Gordon River, from the North corner of Location 3237 to the West boundary of Location 2283, and along part of said West boundary and the South and East boundaries of said Location 2283, part of the South boundary of Location 1518, part of a West, a South, a West, the Southernmost and the Easternmost boundary of Location 1418, part of the South boundary of Location 1225, the South-Western and the East boundary of Location 1348, part of the North boundary of Location 1218, Western boundaries of Locations 3706 and 1503, the South boundaries of Locations 1429 and 1179, the West boundary of Location 1078; thence by part of the boundaries of the East Ward to the District boundary at the South-East corner of Location 3039. On the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the District boundaries, from the said South-East corner to the starting point.

South-West Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of the North-West Ward and parts of the West and South boundaries of the Central Ward. On the Eastward and South-Eastward by parts of the Western boundary of the East Ward and the Northern boundary of the South Ward. On the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundary.

THE following Report and Finding relative to the grounding of the s.s. "Bambra," in Shark Bay, has been approved by the Hon. Colonial Secretary.

"Bambra" S.S.—Grounding at Shark Bay on
28th May, 1922.

1. I have to report, for the information of the Hon. Minister, having held a preliminary inquiry into the circumstances attending the stranding of the s.s. "Bambra," in Shark Bay, on the 28th May, 1922.

2. The s.s. "Bambra" is a steel twin screw steamship of 3,302 tons gross and 1,844 tons nett register, requisitioned by the Commonwealth of Australia, and chartered by the Western Australian Government.

3. After taking the evidence of the Master, William Scott Wyles, who holds a Board of Trade foreign-going Master's Certificate, No. 005,528, issued at Liverpool; John Enoch Turner, the 2nd Officer, and Henry William Norris, 3rd Officer, I have to report that:—

(1) The s.s. "Bambra" left Carnarvon at 7 a.m. on the 28th May, 1922, for Denham, Shark Bay, and the usual courses were steered.

(2) When the vessel left Carnarvon the weather was fine and clear, but about 10 a.m. light rain set in.

(3) At 0.10 p.m. Peron Peninsula was sighted, and Dirk Hartog Island twenty minutes later, but the weather was not sufficiently clear to take bearings of known points.

(4) At 0.45 p.m. a heavy squall was passing over the vessel and at 0.50 p.m. she grounded on the North side of the Northern banks of Denham Channel between Nos. 1 and 2 buoys.

(5) Every endeavour was made with the appliances to hand to refloat the vessel, but without success.

- (6) It was then decided to despatch the s.s. "Kurnalpi" from Fremantle to Shark Bay, and also to utilise the lighter at Denham to relieve the s.s. "Bambra" of a part of her cargo, and this was done.
- (7) The M.S. "Kangaroo" left Fremantle on the 1st June, and was instructed to call at Shark Bay to render assistance. She arrived there on the 4th June, and on the 6th June succeeded in towing the s.s. "Bambra" into deep water.
- (8) The s.s. "Bambra" arrived at Fremantle on the 9th June. Her bottom was examined by a diver and found to be undamaged.
4. After careful consideration of the evidence, I find:—
- (a) That the s.s. "Bambra" whilst on a return voyage from Port Darwin to Fremantle, via intermediate ports, grounded on the North side of the Northern banks of Denham Channel, Shark Bay, at 0.50 p.m. on the 28th May, 1922.
- (b) That the grounding was caused by the vessel having been set 4½ miles Eastward of her course by an abnormal tide, and the weather being too thick to fix her position by bearings.
- (c) That not having been able to verify the ship's position since leaving Carnarvon, the Master, when approaching Bar Flats, should have reduced her speed, or even anchored until the ship's position could be determined.
5. Considering that, unknown to the Master, there was on the date of the s.s. "Bambra" stranding an unusually high tide, which no doubt caused a strong set through Naturaliste Channel across the vessel's course; further, that the Master visited the bridge frequently from the time the vessel left Carnarvon until noon, and from that time remained on the bridge until the vessel grounded, also his previous good record, I recommend that no further action be taken.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts for the management of the Boscabel Public Cemetery (Reserve 17988).

PUBLIC CEMETERY, BOSCABEL.

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Boscabel, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office at Boscabel on the 25th May, 1922.
