WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Pro-

clamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Native Game.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of twelve months as from the 23rd day of September, 1922.

Schedule.

All that portion of the Avon River (near the town-site of York) lying between Gwambygine and the road which crosses the said river near Burges' Siding.

WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (5) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Administrator by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Mingenew praying that the day on which such shops in such district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in the said District shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 6th day of September, 1922, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 1738/22.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 18081 for "Watering Place for Travellers," near Martagallup Swamp, should be placed under the control of the Plantagenet Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Plantagenet Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 18086 should vest in and be held by the Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 516/21 & 975/20.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted:

Claremont Road Board District.

Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed 4 inches diameter cast-iron water main, Easterly along Princess Road from Dalkeith Road to Webster Street (length about 18 chains), and 3 inches diameter cast-iron water main from Webster Street to Lyrell Street (length about 11 chains), with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, including lifting 11 chains of existing 1½ inches diameter galvanised iron piping.

Proposed 3 inches diameter cast-iron water mains along Bruce Street from Perth-Fremantle Road Southerly to existing main at Lot 151 (length about 14 chains); and along Cooper Street, from Bruce Street Easterly to existing main at Lot 384 (length about 3 chains); and along Clark Street, from Bruce Street Easterly to existing main at Lot 409 (length about 7 chains); including valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus.

The whole of the above works are as indicated in red on Plan Met. W.S., S., & D.D. No. 4071.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 8th day of September, 1922.

THE CEMETERIES ACT, 1897.

By-laws—Dalwallinu Public Cemetery.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Dalwallinu Public Cemetery (Reserve 15853).

PUBLIC CEMETERY, DALWALLINU.

By-laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dalwallinu, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

THE WATER BOARDS ACT, 1904.

Derby Water Area.

North-West 371/22.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of the By-laws made under the Derby Water Area, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th January, 1920, and amended on 28th September, 1920, 27th July, 1921, 3rd March, 1922, and 7th July, 1922, that is to say, by deleting the Schedule of Fees in By-law 54 and substituting therefor the following new Schedule of Fees:—

Schedule of Fees.

For horses, donkeys, mules, camels, horned cattle or other large stock travelling for sale, or for delivery, or

for shipment, or being transferred from one station or stations to another station or stations: Three-pence per head for every twenty-four hours or part thereof (subject to minimum charge). The charge being payable whether the animals be watered or not.

For small stock (sheep, pigs, goats) at two-pence per head for the first twenty-four hours or part thereof; One penny per head for the second twenty-four hours or part thereof; One half-penny per head for every succeeding twenty-four hours or part thereof (subject to minimum rate).

Teams.—Horses, donkeys, mules, bullocks, and camels (including packing teams): Two-pence per head per day or part thereof for the first three days; One penny per head per day or part thereof after the first three days.

For all large stock yarded at the Jetty Cattle Yards: One penny per head for every twelve hours or part thereof; such charge being payable whether water is consumed or not.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919 AS AMENDED BY AMENDING ACT OF 1922.

Traffic Regulations—Additions and Amendments.

REGULATION 149 as published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th March, 1922, is hereby revoked, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

149. For the purposes of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and of all Regulations made thereunder, "Heavy Traffic" shall mean and include the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers or other sawn, hewn, split, and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, farming produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof (including any load) exceeds twelve hundred-weights per wheel.

Subparagraph (iv.) (b) of Regulation 149a is hereby repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

(b) a vehicle owned and used by a farmer or settler carrying his own farming, garden, or orchard produce.

Subparagraph (v) (b) of Regulation 149a is hereby repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

(b) shall not be operative in the Metropolitan area; providing that such exemption shall no longer apply to vehicles engaged in heavy traffic operating outside the Metropolitan Area; and
