AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 6th day of September, 1922, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued, and dated as from the 1st July, 1921:—

Correspondence No. 1048/11.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which, by Order in Council, are vested in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Agriculture should be vested in Reginald George Courtenay: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Reginald George Courtenay, and any person temporarily appointed to act in the place of such officer, the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 6th day of September, 1922, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

*The Water Boards Act, 1904.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 528/22.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the district of a Local Authority or two or more Local Authorities or any part or parts of such District or Districts a Water Area under such name as may be directed: And whereas under the provisions of the said Act the Governor may authorise the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to exercise within a Water Area, all the functions of a Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act, under the name of the Narrogin Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to exercise all the functions of a Water Board under the said Act in such area.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 15th day of September, 1922.

Northerly 5 chains 30 links, and North-Easterly 16 chains 70 links to Katta road, crossing the road Northerly to a point 86.6 links from the South-East corner of Lot 152; thence generally North-Westerly 60 chains 65.6 links, crossing the South boundary of Lot 151 at a point about 20 chains 95.6 links from its South-East corner; thence generally South-Westerly about 19 chains 80 links to the North boundary of Lot 152 and along said boundary 3 chains 20 links to its North-West corner on Coaramining road, crossing the road and continuing thence Northerly along the Eastern boundary of Narrogin Experimental Farm to a point about 24 chains 95 links South from the North East corner of Lot 59; thence through Lot 59 South-Westerly about 34 chains 30.8 links; thence generally Westerly about 18 chains 4.5 links, crossing the East boundary of Lot 60 at a point about 29 chains 55.1 links from its North-East corner; thence North-Westerly about 33 chains 39.7 links, crossing Coolgardie road at a point about 14 chains 30.2 links from the South-East corner of Lot 62; thence North-North-Easterly about 22 chains 62 links, crossing the South boundary of Lot 165 at a point about 16 chains 4.5 links from its South-East corner; thence generally Westerly about 52 chains 32.9 links to a corner of Dumberning road, and along said road and part of the West boundary of Lot 165 and the West boundary of Lot 136 to the South-West corner of Lot 92; thence Easterly along the North boundary of Lot 136; Northerly along part of the Western boundary and again Easterly along the whole of the Northern boundary of Lot 39 to the Coaramining road; thence Southerly to a point in the East boundary of Lot 39; thence across Coaramining road to the West boundary of Lot 200, about 6 chains 57.9 links from the South-West corner of Lot 161; thence South-Easterly 7 chains, and generally North-Easterly about 35 chains 53 links, crossing the West boundary of Lot 40 at a point 24 chains 33 links from its South-West corner; thence Easterly about 16 chains 30 links and

North-Easterly about 7 chains 54.7 links to a point on the West boundary of Narrogin townsite about 23 chains 28.9 links from the South-East corner of Lot 40 on the Coolgardie road; thence along said townsite boundary Northerly, then Easterly, then Southerly, then again Easterly, again Northerly, again Easterly, and again Southerly to the South-East corner of the townsite and the point of commencement as shown outlined in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 22210.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2285/22.

WHEREAS it is desirable, pursuant to the powers in this behalf contained in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," to unite the adjoining Road Districts of Kalgoorlie and Kanowna, and to exercise in connection with such union the further powers hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby unite the Kalgoorlie Road District and the Kanowna Road District into one Road District, which shall bear the name of the "Kalgoorlie Road District"; and doth hereby, with the advice and consent aforesaid, declare and direct that P. BUNBURY HARBOUR BOARD.

*Amendment to Regulations.*

Regulations numbered 82 to 92 (both inclusive) made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the 1st day of October, 1909, and subsequent amendments made to same, are hereby repealed, and the following Regulations enacted in lieu thereof:—

*Port Dues.*

Regulations Nos. 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91 and 92.

No. 82.

*When Payable.*—The Port Dues provided for hereunder shall be paid to the Board prior to the clearing of the vessel to which they apply.

No. 83.

*Foreign-going Vessels.*—All vessels, except where otherwise specially provided by these Regulations, discharging at the port cargo beyond one-fourth in extent of their gross registered tonnage, shall pay threepence (3d.) per ton on their gross registered tonnage.

All vessels, except where otherwise specially provided by these Regulations, loading from the port with cargo less than one-fourth in extent of their gross registered tonnage, shall pay threepence (3d.) per ton on all cargo taken away.

No. 87.

*Port Dues Payable by Vessels loading full cargoes at different Western Australian Ports.*—Vessels, not being Interstate or coasting vessels, loading part cargo at Bunbury and going to other ports within the State of Western Australia to complete loading, or vessels with part cargo loaded at other ports within the State calling at Bunbury to complete their loading, shall pay

Port Dues at the rate of threepence per ton on the cargo shipped at Bunbury, provided that the sum total does not exceed the amount that would have to be paid under Regulation 85.

*Vessels calling for bunker coal, orders, passengers, or in distress, etc.*—Vessels arriving at the Port of Bunbury for bunker coal, supplies, or orders, and not broaching or shipping cargo or loading and (or) embarking passengers not exceeding ten (10) in number shall not pay the harbour dues calculated as for ordinary traders, but shall in lieu thereof pay a consolidated rate to embrace all harbour dues, but not including pilotage and berthing dues, of £5 per entry into the port.

Vessels calling at the Port of Bunbury in distress, and not broaching or shipping cargo or landing or embarking passengers, shall be exempt from the payment of port dues and tonnage dues.

Where, however, a wharf berth is occupied, the minimum berthing dues provided for in Regulation 93 shall be paid as though the vessel had worked cargo.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of every Municipality is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Municipal Council of Busselton that, from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, the following By-laws shall be enforced:—

##### By-law No. 1.—*Additions.*

The word "jetty" shall mean the structure commencing at the North end of Queen Street, and extending in a Northerly direction to its junction with the Railway jetty; and includes all steps leading from it, slip, rotunda, and other buildings erected on or attached to it.

"Baths" shall mean the portion of water and foreshore between the two jetties and leased from the Lands Department and numbered 1642/153, and includes all buildings, platforms, fences, etc., erected.

1a. No person shall take any motor car, or motor lorry, or any horse-drawn vehicle on any part of the jetty, without having first obtained permission in writing from the Council.

1b. No person shall place boxes, nets, boats, lumber of any kind, on any portion of the jetty.

1c. No person shall clean large fish on any portion of the jetty, or throw the refuse of such fish into the water near such jetty.

1d. No person shall fish from the platforms attached to the baths.

1e. No person shall throw bottles, tins, or broken glass into the baths.

1f. No male person shall be permitted to use the platform or dressing-rooms of the ladies' baths, or *vice versa*.

1g. All persons bathing in the baths or near thereto shall wear the recognised costumes.

1h. All persons using the jetty or baths shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public, or committing a nuisance in any building, or doing anything which, in the opinion of the Council, is dangerous or objectionable, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any officer of the Council or any police constable, and may be prosecuted for any such offence.

1i. The Council may grant permission for a charge to be made for admission to the jetty or baths, on the occasion of a carnival or sports gathering.

1j. No person shall swim horses in the baths, or ride horses along the foreshore between the two jetties, or tie any horse up to any lamp post or shelter shed or near them.

1k. No person shall use the roofs of the dressing rooms, or shall dive therefrom.

1l. No boats shall be allowed in the baths or tied to any portion thereof, without permission in writing from the Council.

1m. No person shall cast a net in the baths for the purpose of taking fish therefrom.

##### *Penalties.*

For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws the offender shall, upon conviction before any two Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
