WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Game Act, 1912-13," dated the 14th day of December, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th December, 1921, it was declared that the Opossum should be at all times strictly preserved throughout the State from the 1st day of January, 1922, until the 31st day of December, 1922; and whereas it is desirable to temporarily suspend the operation of the said Proclamation throughout the State: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that, notwithstanding the provisions of the said Proclamation, the taking or killing of Opossums shall be lawful for a period of two months on and after the 1st day of October next, throughout the State of Western Australia.

(c) 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main along Kanimbla Street, from Hardy Street Southerly to Park Road (length about 16 chains).
