WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such proclamation a reserve for native game or any particular native game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities men-

tioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a reserve for native game.

### Schedule.

The Avon River within the boundaries of the Central Ward of the Beverley Road District; also Reserve No. 1784 (Public Park), Beverley Townsite.

WHEREAS by a Crown Grant dated the 24th day of December, 1847, Swan Location 113 was granted to the person therein named, subject to the reservations to Her Majesty the Queen, her heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads and any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, as of her or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed from such location should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such buildings, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth there-

of) for the purpose of a Trigonometrical Station; Now know ye that I, the Administrator of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the 18th day of October, 1922, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of a Trigonometrical Station.

*Schedule.*

All that portion, containing half an acre, of Swan Location 113; bounded by lines starting at a point situate South about 41 links and East about 2,679 links from the South-East corner of Swan Location 103 and extending 90 degrees 27 minutes, 223.6 links; thence 180 degrees 27 minutes, 223.7 links; thence 270 degrees 27 minutes, 223.6 links, and thence 0 degrees 27 minutes, 223.7 links, to the starting point. WHEREAS by a Crown Grant under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Vol. 766, Folio 33, Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 227, containing 237 acres, was granted to Ronald Rothsay Clark, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing-paths, harbour or river improvements, works, drainage, or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part of the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building without compensation; And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of Quarry (Gravel) and access thereto: Now know ye that I, the Administrator of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the eighteenth day of October, 1922, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of Quarry (Gravel) and access thereto.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, on the 18th day of October, 1922, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

*The Forests Act, 1918.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1548/20.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, reserve from sale any Crown Land as a timber reserve, and may revoke in whole or in part any such reservation; And whereas it is desirable that the reservation of such Crown Land as is comprised in Timber Reserve 3/25 (St. Ives) should be partially revoked: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the reservation of Crown Land as Timber Reserve 3/25, by excising that portion of such timber reserve as is described in the Schedule hereto:—

*Schedule.*

That portion of unsurveyed land bounded by lines starting at a point about 50 chains North of the North-East corner of Reserve 2564, and proceeding in a Northerly direction about 150 chains; thence North-West along the St. Ives Timber Reserve 3/25 Eastern boundary about 860 chains; thence South 920 chains; thence East about 395 chains to the starting point.

*The Road Districts Act, 1919.*

*Rockingham, Armadale-Kelmscott, and Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Districts.*

*Alteration of Boundaries.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2547/22.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom, and annex it to an existing Road District; and whereas it is desirable to sever portions of the Rockingham Road District, and annex them to the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District and the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road District respectively: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1) Sever that portion of the Rockingham Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District.
- (2) Sever that portion of the Rockingham Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road District.

To come into force on the first day of January, 1923.

SCHEDULE "A."

*Armadale-Kelmscott Road District.*

*Transfer of Territory from the Rockingham Road District.*

All that piece of land bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the present boundaries of the Rockingham Road District, from the West corner of Peel Estate Lot 694 to the South-East corner of Lot 711 of Cockburn Sound Location 16 (Titles Office Plan 3484).

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Westward along the South and part of the West boundary of said Lot 711, the North boundary of Lot 713, the North boundary of Lot 21 (Titles Office Plan 3950) to its North-West corner.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said North-West corner and extending Northward along the West boundary of Lot 20, the Western boundaries of Lot 703 (Titles Office Plan 3484), Peel Estate Lots 109, 103, 696, 689 and 688, the North-Western boundaries of Lots 688 and 690, the North-Western and North boundaries of Lot 691, the South-Eastern boundaries of Lot 104, the West boundary of Lot 105, part of the South-West boundary of Lot 694 to the starting point.

## SCHEDULE "B."

*Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road District.  
Transfer of Territory from the Rockingham Road  
District.*

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at a North-West corner of Lot 1 of Cockburn Sound Location 16 (T.O. Plan 4632), and extending Eastward along the Northernmost boundary of said lot and part of the Northernmost boundary of Lot 2 to intersect the present District boundary; thence South along said District boundary to intersect a South boundary of said Lot 2; thence along part of said South boundary and an East, the Southernmost, the Westernmost, and a North boundary of Lot 2 aforesaid, and a North and West boundary of Lot 1 to the starting point.

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1921.

Between the Coastal Operative Bootmakers' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and

The Metropolitan Bespoke Bootmakers and Repairers' Industrial Union of Employers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

## AWARD.

1. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages to be paid to male employees on time work shall be two shillings per hour.

2. *Piecework.*—Piecework is permissible provided that the rates paid therefor shall be such as to enable an adult worker to earn not less than two shillings and two pence halfpenny per hour.

3. *Apprentices.*—(i.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court according to the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(ii.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving to the Clerk of the Court notice in the prescribed form (Form 1 in the Appendix hereto).

(iii.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(iv.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by him. Provided that the fraction of three shall not be less than one.

(v.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. An employer who is himself a competent worker may, for the purpose of estimating the number of apprentices, be deemed a journeyman. Provided that before this provision is used the Clerk of the Court shall notify the secretaries of the employers' and workers' unions, who may object to the apprentice being taken, and proof to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the Court of competence to teach the trade may be required. Provided that this award shall not operate to render unlawful or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(vi.) Apprentices shall be taught the trade of boot and shoe repairing by hand and/or machining method, according to the practice of the shop in which the apprenticeship is served.

(vii.) The term of apprenticeship shall be four years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(viii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced.

(ix.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (xv.), pay the apprentice at the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate of the time actually served.
- (3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(x.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

During the fourth year .. ..	60	0 "

The wages prescribed by this clause are subject to alteration by any subsequent award of the Court.

(xi.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(xii.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination. The Clerk of the Court shall notify each apprentice due for examination and require him to pay an examination fee in accordance with the following scale:—

For examination at the end of third year ..	12	6
For examination at the end of fourth year ..	15	0

The apprentice may authorise his employer to deduct the above fees from his wages, to be paid by the employer to the Clerk of the Court.

(xiii.) The examination shall be held in the month of March in each year on a date to be fixed by the examiners. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the union and employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or failing such nomination, or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xiv.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(xv.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (x.) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners or fails to pay the fee prescribed by Subclause (xii.) to the Clerk of the Court.

(xvi.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xvii.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

4. *Overtime*.—Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours, and time and a-half thereafter for time workers. Overtime shall commence at the usual time for knocking off for each day at each establishment.

5. *Hours*.—The regular week's work shall be forty-eight hours, to be worked in six days if required.

6. *Grindery, etc.*—The employer shall find all grindery, workshops, and light, and shall serve out all colours and materials used in connection with the trade.

7. *Weekly Payments*.—Each employee shall be paid at least once a week moneys due to him up to the night previous to pay day. Any employee working only a portion of the week must be paid before ceasing work for that week, and all payment must be made in working hours.

8. *Posting of Notices*.—Every employer shall allow shop and union notices to be posted in an accessible place.

9. *Hot Water*.—Employers shall provide hot water free of charge at lunch time.

10. *Sub-letting*.—No sub-letting of piecework shall be allowed.

11. *Record Book*.—Each employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker, ordinary time worked each day, overtime worked each day, and amount paid for piecework and details of piecework, together with the worker's signature for the same. Such record shall be open for inspection by the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the union during working hours.

12. *Under-rate Workers*.—(a.) A worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the workers' union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give to the secretary two days' notice of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

(b.) Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause: Provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

13. *Term of Award*.—This award shall be for a term of three years from the date thereof: Provided that after the expiration of twelve months application may be made for alteration, or revision, by any party affected thereby.

14. *Application of Award*.—This award shall apply to the bespoke bootmaking and repairing industry carried on within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

Between the South-West District (W.A.) Clothing Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and

A. Broom, MacPherson & Co., Edwards & Co., M. Haines, I. Harrison, and P. Miller, respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Hours and Overtime.*—(a.) The ordinary working hours shall be forty-four in any week, and shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., except on Saturday or other day on which a half-holiday is usually observed, when the hours shall be between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m.

(b.) Time worked beyond four hours on Saturday or other day on which a half-holiday is observed, or eight hours on any other day, or forty-four hours in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half. Each day to stand alone, with a minimum overtime of one shilling for each day on which overtime is worked. In addition one shilling tea money shall be paid on each day on which overtime is worked beyond six o'clock p.m.

(c.) Wages shall be paid on any day except Saturday.

2. *Distribution of Work.*—The employer shall in slack time observe turns for all workers (including out-door workers) in each section of the industry, provided that journeymen and journeywomen having apprentices shall be allowed on their turn extra work equivalent to the wages of the apprentices during the time the turn system is in operation. The employer shall keep in the workroom a true record of every turn, which shall be open to the inspection of the employees.

3. *Out-door Work.*—All work shall be done in the workshop provided and controlled by the employer except as hereinafter provided:—

- (i.) Persons doing outside work shall not employ labour except members of their family resident with them.
- (ii.) Such out-door work shall be paid for at piece-work rates provided by this award.
- (iii.) Out-door workers shall be provided free of charge with cotton, silk, thread, and all other sewings and trimmings used in the manufacturing of garments.

4. *Mid-day Meal.*—In no circumstances shall less than three-quarters of an hour be fixed for the time of the mid-day meal.

5. *Wages.*—The minimum rates of wages payable to the several classes of work-ers (other than juniors and duly registered apprentices and probationers) shall be as follow:—

In order tailoring no male apprentice to coat-making, vestmaking, trousermaking, machining, or pressing, respectively, shall be taken in excess of one to every three journeymen hands, or fraction of three, employed in each of the above branches, respectively, by each employer, or firm of employers. No apprentice under sixteen years shall be taken to the pressing.

(f.) In order tailoring no female apprentice to coat-making, vestmaking, trousermaking, machining, or pressing, respectively, shall be taken in excess of one to every two journeywomen hands, or fraction thereof, employed in each of the above branches, respectively, by each employer or firm of employers.

(g.) In order dressmaking (every operation) no female apprentice shall be taken in excess of two apprentices to every woman.

(h.) Provided that in reference to the three immediately preceding Subclauses (e), (f), and (g), that at the expiration of three years (and subject to the apprentices having qualified by examination for the period) an additional apprentice may be taken on in the same proportion.

(i.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen and journeywomen employed, taken respectively, shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen and journeywomen employed for at least two-thirds of full time on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time: Provided that if the employer is an actual operative he or she shall for the purpose of this clause count as an employee.

(j.) The terms of service for apprentices shall be:—

- (1.) To the coatmaking, fitting up and trimming—Five years.
- (2.) To coat, trouser, and vest machining—Four years.
- (3.) To trousermaking, vestmaking, skirtmaking, either or all—Three years.
- (4.) To the order dressmaking—Five years.

A probationary period previous to being bound shall be lawful. In the case of classes 1, 2, and 4, of three months, and in the case of class 3 of one month.

(k.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commences (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto).

(l.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (c), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his or her apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served,

and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(m.) In the order tailoring the minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is made.

(n.) An apprentice who after having served the full term of five years is under the age of 21 years may continue in his master's employment at less than a journeyman's minimum wage until the expiration of one year thereafter or until he becomes 21 years of age, whichever first happens: Provided that during the first six months after the expiration of the apprenticeship he shall be paid £2 17s. 6d. per week and for the balance of the period £3 10s. per week.

(o.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each twelve months of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(p.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(q.) The examination will be held in the month of June in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the union and the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(r.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(s.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his or her examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (m) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(t.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(u.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

7. Notwithstanding the limitation imposed by this award on the number of apprentices who may be taken, all junior workers now employed may continue to be so employed for a period of six months, or may be apprenticed; but the employer taking such apprentices shall not be entitled to take any further apprentices until the number of apprentices so taken shall fall below the number of apprentices he or she would be entitled to take under the foregoing provision of this award. All junior workers taken as apprentices under the provisions of this clause shall be registered within one month after the date of this award, except as aforesaid junior workers shall not be employed.

The rate of wages to junior workers permitted by this award shall be the same as that payable to apprentices from and after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of this award.

8. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. *Record Book.*—A time and wage book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker paid by time, the nature of the work he or she is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wage received by him or her each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary or the organiser of the union during working hours.

10. *Termination of Employment.*—Where the employer gives two working days' notice of any day or days on which the services of an employee will not be required, he shall not be liable to pay any wage for that day or days.

In the event of an employee being discharged or leaving within one week of the day on which a holiday occurs he shall be paid for such holiday or holidays.

No employee without just cause shall be absent from his or her place of employment during the prescribed hours whilst there is work ready to be done by such employee, and where weekly wages are fixed the employee to be entitled to the sum so fixed must be available and ready and willing to do the work on days and during hours fixed by this award.

11. *Respite.*—Where females or apprentices are employed for more than four hours continuously, they shall be allowed an interval of 10 minutes for refreshments during that period without deduction from the wage, and such interval shall be computed as part of the working time.

12. *Posting Award.*—A copy of the award shall be posted by the employer in a prominent place in work-room on receipt of same from the secretary of the union.

13. *Piecework.*—The minimum rate to be paid for piecework shall be the rates provided by award No. 14 of 1915 as amended by Industrial Agreements No. 16 of 1920 and No. 10 of 1921.

14. *Visiting Workshops.*—In each factory or workshop the secretary or other representative of the union shall be allowed during lunch time to interview workers in the luncheon room (if one be provided by the employer) and to post notices relating to union matters.

15. *Holidays.*—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, 'Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; or such other days as by law or otherwise are observed in lieu of the said days, respectively.

16. *Area.*—This award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office at Northam.

17. *Term.*—This award shall come into operation on the 13th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and shall operate for a period of six months from that date.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 13 of 1922.

Between The Coastal Painters' and Paperhangers' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Coastal Painters' and Signwriters' Industrial Union of Employers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Scope.*—This award shall apply to the industry or trades of painting, glazing, decorating, paper-hanging, sign-writing, and graining, and any other branch of the trade where oil or water paints (including their substitutes and refrigerating compounds of all kinds) or like matter are applied with a spray or brush.

2. *Area.*—This award shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3. *Terms.*—This award shall have effect for a period of twelve months from the date of issue.

4. *Hours.*—The week's work shall consist of forty-eight hours, which shall be worked during the first five working days of the week between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with forty-five minutes off for meal time, and on Saturdays between 7.30 a.m. and 11.45 a.m.

5. *Rates of Pay.*—The minimum rate of pay for all workers shall be two shillings and one penny half-penny per hour.

6. *Overtime.*—All work done outside the hours hereinbefore prescribed shall be considered overtime. It shall be performed when considered necessary by the employer and shall be paid for at the following rates:—

- (a) On the first five working days of the week, between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m., time and a-quarter;
- (b) Between 7 p.m. and midnight, time and a-half;
- (c) Between midnight and 7.30 a.m., double time;
- (d) On Saturday between 11.45 a.m. and midnight, time and a-half; and
- (e) Thereafter until 7.30 a.m. the next following Monday, double time.

7. *Mode of Payment of Wages.*—Wages shall be paid not later than Friday in each week at leaving-off time on the job, or at the shop of the employer, or, where he has no recognised place of business, at his residence. Payment shall be made within fifteen minutes of leaving-off time. If this is not done, the employee shall be entitled to overtime rates for the time lost in waiting. When an employee is discharged before the usual pay time, he shall be paid on ceasing work the wages then due to him.

8. *Notice of Termination of Employment.*—(a) An employee leaving his employment shall give his employer one hour's notice thereof, and any employer discharging an employee shall give such employee one hour's notice thereof.

(b) When an employee comes to his work in the morning and is then for the first time informed that he will not be wanted any further on the job, he shall be paid one hour's wages and all fares.

(c) When an employee comes to the shop for his pay, and is then told that he will not be wanted any further on the job, and has to return to the job for his tools or his clothes, he shall be paid one hour's extra wages and all fares necessarily incurred in connection therewith.

9. *Meal Money.*—Meal money of two shillings shall be paid to all workers who are required to work overtime for more than one hour after leaving-off time, unless they have been notified the day before.

10. *Hourly Engagement.*—Workers shall be employed by the hour only.

11. *Travelling Expenses.*—(a) Employers shall in all cases pay all the travelling expenses actually and reasonably incurred by their employees in going from the shop to their employer, or if he has no recognised place of business, his residence, to the job, or from one job to another.

(b) In cases where an employee is not required to attend at the shop or residence as above of his employer, but goes direct to the job, all expenses actually and reasonably incurred which are in excess of what the employee would have incurred in going to such shop or residence shall be paid by the employer. Under this clause employees using their own bicycles shall be paid the travelling expenses they would have been entitled to if they had used the ordinary means of transit.

12. *Country Work*.—On country work an additional allowance of five-pence per hour shall be paid, but this amount shall not be taken into consideration when calculating the day's pay for the purpose of overtime. Time occupied in travelling to and from country work shall be paid for at ordinary rates, and no worker shall receive more than an ordinary day's wages for any day spent in travelling, though the hours so spent on such day shall exceed eight, unless the worker is on the same day occupied in working for his employer. If on country work any employee states that he wishes to work overtime, the parties may agree that he shall do so at ordinary country rates. "Country work" means work that is inconvenient for daily travelling or situated more than twenty miles by the nearest formed public road or railway from the General Post Office, Perth.

13. *Under-rate Workers*.—A worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wages and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by the employer for such wage for the period of six months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause: Provided always, that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

14. *Apprentices*.—(i) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice notice of whose apprenticeship has been given to the clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(ii.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving to the Clerk of the Court notice in the prescribed form (Form 1 in the Appendix hereto).

(iii.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(iv.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every four or fraction of four journeymen employed by him in that branch. Provided that an employer who has only one apprentice to the branch of sign-writing may be allowed to take another apprentice to such branch after his first apprentice has for three years duly passed the examinations prescribed by this award: Provided also, that the fraction of four shall not be less than one.

(v.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed.

(vi.) Apprentices shall not be allowed except to one of the following branches of the Painting trade:—

1. Painting, decorating, glazing, paper-hanging, and graining;
2. Sign-writing.

(vii.) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, and such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(viii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(ix.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (xv.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). (x.) The minimum wages payable to an apprentice shall be:—

- During the first year—17s. 6d. per week;
- During the second year—22s. 6d. per week;
- During the third year—27s. 6d. per week;
- During the fourth year—37s. 6d. per week;
- During the fifth year—47s. 6d. per week.

The wages of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration at such time as the Court may determine. Provided that no such alteration shall be made except when the wages of tradesmen under this award are being reviewed.

(xi.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(xii.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination. The Clerk of the Court shall notify each apprentice due for examination and require him to pay an examination fee in accordance with the following scale:—

- For examination at end of first year—5s.
- For examination at end of second year—7s. 6d.
- For examination at end of third year—10s.
- For examination at end of fourth year—12s. 6d.
- For examination at end of fifth year—15s.

The apprentice may authorise his employer to deduct the above fees from his wages to be paid by the employer to the Clerk of the Court.

(xiii.) The examination shall be held in the month of September in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners. The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the Union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of either member, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided for each apprentice to learn.

(xiv.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(xv.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (x.) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners, or fails to pay the fee prescribed by subclause (xii.) to the Clerk of the Court.

(xvi.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this award and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xvii.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

(xviii.) If classes for any of the trades governed by this award exist or are established by the Technical School, it shall be the duty of the apprentice to attend such class with reasonable regularity and diligence. Should he fail to obtain from the Technical School a certificate that he has so attended it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (x.) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

15. Double Rate.—Double time rates shall be paid for work performed on the following days:—Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Sundays, and Picnic Day (provided that sufficient notice has been given of picnic).

16. Tools of Trade.—The workers shall be required to provide themselves with the following tools:—Putty knives, strippers, scissors, duster, paper-hanging brush, roller, two lining fitches, and a two-foot rule. A sign-writer shall provide himself with a full set of pencils and fitches.

17. Washing Hands.—Five minutes shall be allowed before lunch and before leaving work at 5 p.m. and before 11.45 a.m. on Saturdays for washing hands, etc.

18. Preparation.—All preparatory work of any kind shall be painters' work.

19. Width of Brushes.—Oil paint brushes shall not exceed four and a-half inches in width, or eight ounces in weight. No calsimo brush to be more than seven inches in width.

20. Record Book.—Each employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker, ordinary time worked each day, overtime worked each day, and different rates, amount paid including fares, together with the worker's signature for the same. Such record shall be open for inspection by the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Union during working hours.

21. Leading Hand.—Employees who have charge of a job that carries four or more employees for at least one week shall be paid one penny half-penny per hour extra.

22. Dangerous Work.—All work from a swinging scaffold shall be paid for at the rate of one shilling per day extra.

23. Piecework.—A worker employed on piecework shall be paid at least the minimum rate of wage.

24. Spraying.—All workers applying paint by spraying shall be paid two-pence half-penny per hour extra: Provided that this clause shall not apply to a sign-writer using a sign-writer's spray.
