

4. The registration label, as prescribed to these regulations, shall be securely affixed to a collar and worn round the dog's neck.

5. Any person or persons who contravene any provision of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-laws of the South Perth Road Board, made under Section 196 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," for the General Management of Public Reserve 10250, in pursuance of Act No. 5 of 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the South Perth Road Board order as follows:—

Hours.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all hours free of charge, but subject to the restrictions hereinafter contained.

Injury to Things.

2. No person shall pluck any of the wild or cultivated flowers, or walk on the beds, borders, or putting greens, nor pull up or dig or otherwise disturb any grass, or climb upon or get through or over the fences or remove or injure any of the gates, turnstiles, fences, buildings, or flags, nor disturb, damage, or destroy any of the property or things within the bounds of the Reserve.

Shooting.

3. No person shall carry or discharge firearms through or on the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds or animals, except as in the next paragraph mentioned.

Dogs, Goats, etc.

4. All dogs, goats, and poultry found within the Reserve may be destroyed by any of the persons hereinafter referred to as being authorised to prosecute for breaches of this By-law, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, for any damage done by such dogs, goats, or poultry.

Works.

5. During the constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining of any beds, borders, or greens, links, buildings, or other improvements, no person shall interfere with the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers, or do, or cause to be done, any act which will, or may be likely to interfere with, or prevent such constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining.

Misconduct.

6. Any person in a state of intoxication or misconducting himself or herself shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.

Rubbish.

7. No person shall deposit rubbish or any offensive matter on any part of the Reserve.

Fires.

8. No person other than the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers referred to in paragraph 5 hereof shall light any fires on the Reserve.

Games.

9. In the event of the lease or permit of the Reserve being granted to any person or persons, or club, for the purpose of enabling any particular game or games to be established on the Reserve, then so long as such lease or permit remains in force, no game shall be played on the Reserve which may prevent, hamper, interfere, or compete with such person or persons or club in the use of the Reserve for the purposes set forth in such lease or permit, and no person shall do or cause to be done anything which will, or may be likely to interfere or compete with such person or persons or club, in any manner, in commencing, playing, or carrying on such game or games.

Enforcement.

10. Any member of the South Perth Road Board, or the Secretary or Acting Secretary, Engineer, or Supervisor to the South Perth Road Board, or any person authorised under the seal of the South Perth Road Board, or in the event of the Reserve being leased to any person or persons or club, such lessee or permit holder shall have power to enforce this By-law and take any proceedings hereunder at any time.

Penalties.

11. Any person offending against any part of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.

NURSES' REGISTRATION ACT, 1921.

Regulations.

HIS Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to approve the following Regulations made under the provisions of "The Nurses' Registration Act, 1921."

EVERITT ATKINSON,
Commissioner of Public Health.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Nurses' Registration Regulations, 1922."

2. The Regulations are divided into parts, as follows:—

Part 1.—Preliminary.

Part 2.—The business and procedure of the Nurses' Registration Board.

Part 3.—Training Hospitals and Institutions.

Part 4.—Training and Examination of Nurses—Certificates of Registration.

Part 5.—Miscellaneous.

3. In the interpretation of these Regulations, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively set against them, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The Board" shall mean the Nurses' Registration Board; "The Secretary" shall mean the person appointed by the Board to that office; "The Act" shall mean "The Nurses Registration Act, 1921"; "Registered Nurse" shall mean a nurse registered under this Act; "Regulations" shall mean the regulations made under the provisions of the Act.

PART II.—BUSINESS AND PROCEDURE OF THE BOARD.

1. Meetings.—The Board shall meet in each month, unless otherwise decided at a previous meeting, on such day as will suit the convenience of its members and at such times as may be necessary. The Chairman may at any time convene a meeting, and the Secretary shall convene a meeting if so required in writing by any two members of the Board.

2. *Notice of Meeting.*—Not less than two days' notice of any meeting shall be given to each member of the Board.

3. *Quorum.*—Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

4. *Order of Business.*—The order of business shall be as follows:—

1. Minutes of previous meeting.

2. Correspondence.

3. Reports.

4. Registrations.

5. Notices of motion.

6. Any other business.

7. Date of next meeting.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the above order, on the ground of urgency or convenience.

5. *Voting.*—Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of members present and voting, and the Chairman shall have a vote in his own right, together with a casting vote.

6. *Motions.*—Every motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded, and shall be reduced to writing and handed to the Chairman (if so required by him), and shall be read before it is further discussed or put to the meeting.

7. *Notices of Motion.*—Every notice of motion shall be in writing signed by the member giving the notice, and shall be given or sent to the Secretary, who shall insert in the Agenda Paper of the next ordinary meeting of the Board all notices of motion received, not less than one clear day prior to the day on which the Agenda Paper is sent out to members. All notices of motion shall be placed on the Agenda Paper in the order in which they have been received.

8. *Rescinding of Resolution.*—No resolution of the Board shall be altered or rescinded at a subsequent meeting except upon a notice of motion, of which a copy has been sent out to members by the Secretary seven clear days before such meeting.

9. *Committees.*—Every committee appointed by the Board shall make a report of its proceedings to the Board, and the recommendations of every committee shall, so far as practicable, be in the form of resolutions, to be considered by the Board; and the acts and proceedings of every committee shall be submitted to the Board for approval, unless the resolution of the Board appointing the committee shall otherwise so direct in respect of all or any of the matters referred to it.

10. *Reports.*—Every report from a committee shall be submitted by the Chairman of the committee (if present), who shall move that it be received by the Board, and, on the motion being carried, the Chairman, or any other member of the committee, may move to agree with the resolutions of the committee; but such resolutions shall be considered seriatim. The question that the report (if necessary, as amended) be now approved shall be put from the Chair, but no debate shall be allowed thereon.

11. *Decision of Chairman.*—The presiding Chairman shall decide upon any point of order or procedure, and his decision shall be final.

Nomination of two Nurses to be Members of the Board.

The nomination of two nurses shall be secured from time to time as may be necessary, in the following manner:—

(1.) The Principal Medical Officer shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* call for nominations from registered nurses for the positions.

(2.) In the event of more than two nominations being received the Principal Medical Officer shall fix a date on which an election shall be held: Provided that at least one month shall elapse between the date fixed for the closing of nominations and the date fixed for such election.

(3.) He shall appoint a returning officer, who shall conduct the poll in connection with the election.

(4.) Every registered nurse shall be entitled to a vote, and shall be provided by the returning officer with a ballot paper upon making personal or written application for same.

(5.) Ballot papers may be returned to the returning officer either personally or through the post.

(6.) On the completion of the poll, the names of the two nurses securing the greatest number of votes shall be forwarded by the Principal Medical Officer to the Governor for appointment as members of the Board.

PART III.—TRAINING HOSPITALS IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

1. A list of hospitals in this State, approved by the Board, at which the training of nurses may be undertaken, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and such list may be amended whenever the Board shall so direct.

2. The Board may cancel its approval of any such hospital if satisfied that such hospital has failed to comply with the Regulations.

3. Hospitals desiring the approval of the Board as training hospitals shall make application to the Board through the Medical Officer in Charge, or the matron of such hospital, and such application shall be accompanied by a clear statement regarding:—

- (a.) Daily average number of beds occupied for each of the last two years.
- (b.) Name and qualifications of matron.
- (c.) Names of the medical staff.
- (d.) Statement that the consent of the medical staff to deliver lectures in accordance with the schedule of training has been obtained.
- (e.) Number of trained nurses and probationers employed.
- (f.) Number of operations performed in the hospital during the previous year.
- (g.) The proportion of medical and surgical cases dealt with during the past year.
- (h.) Number and variety of cases of infectious diseases dealt with during the past year.
- (i.) Relative proportion of adult and child cases dealt with (all cases over 14 years to be regarded as adult).

4. Every hospital which fulfils the following requirements to the satisfaction of the Board shall be eligible for the approval of the Board as a training hospital for general nurses namely, that:—

- (a.) The matron is a registered nurse.
- (b.) Three years is prescribed as a course of training; provided that the Board may require the period of training to be longer.
- (c.) The trainees receive practical instruction in the wards of the hospital from the matron or other registered nurse.
- (d.) A systematic course of lectures by duly qualified and registered medical practitioners, in accordance with the curriculum specified in these regulations, is given.

(e.) A report is furnished to the Board by the hospital authorities annually regarding:—

(a.) The daily average number of beds occupied during the year immediately preceding.

(b.) The names of lecturers.

(c.) The subjects of lectures and number of lectures delivered in each course.

(d.) The attendances of trainees at such lectures (three-fourths of the lectures delivered must be attended by each trainee).

(f.) Trainees under instruction are examined at the end of each yearly course of lectures and demonstrations in the subjects taught, and that the results of such examination are furnished to the Board in the annual report.

5. In respect of the Government hospitals approved by the Board, the wards of Woorloo Sanatorium shall be regarded as medical wards, and the period of training in the said wards shall not exceed one year.

PART IV.—TRAINING OF NURSES.

Regulations dealing with Applicants for admission to Training Hospitals.

1. Applicants for admission as trainees into any approved hospital shall apply to the matron of such hospital, or in the case of Government hospitals, to the Principal Medical Officer (such application being in the handwriting of the candidate in each case), and shall produce: (a) three approved personal references; (b) a certificate of physical and mental fitness from a legally qualified medical practitioner.

2. The matron shall forward to the Board all applications for admission as trainees, together with a statement as to whether a personal interview with the applicant has taken place, and giving her impression of the applicant's personal and physical fitness as required in Regulation 1.

3. The applicant shall be required to pass, before commencing her training, an examination in general education held by the Board. Such examination shall include English composition and précis writing, and arithmetic (including the first four rules, simple and compound, easy questions in vulgar fractions, non-recurring decimals, and simple proportion).

4. Pursuant to these qualifications, each applicant shall, as vacancies occur, enter upon a three months' probation, at the end of which time the matron shall forward to the Board a satisfactory certificate as to the general fitness of each trainee to continue her training, together with a statement that her health has not suffered during the probationary period.

5. The matron of each training hospital shall annually forward to the Secretary of the Board the names of all probationers in training, stating in each case:—

- (a.) The date on which probation commenced.
- (b.) Particulars of any period during which, apart from ordinary leave or holiday, a probationer may have been unavoidably absent from her duties from illness or other sufficient cause.
- (c.) The number of lectures in each prescribed course of study attended during the year.

CURRICULUM.

Lectures on General Nursing and Practical Instructions to be given by Matron.

Medical and Surgical Lectures by Resident and Honorary Staff.

Attendance.

First Year.

12 Anatomy and Physiology. 12 General Nursing.

Second Year.

12 Medical Nursing. 12 Surgical Nursing.

Third Year.

6 Invalid Cookery, Practical. Urine testing. 6 Hygiene.

This is to be accepted as a minimum course, but all teachers are urged to make such course as complete as they can, and wherever possible to give a course of instruction in housekeeping to at least the extent laid down below.

**General Nursing—12 Lectures.*

Qualifications of a nurse.

Distinction between the doctor's work and that of the nurse.

Hospital etiquette.

The nurse's general work:—

- (a.) Bed-making, management of helpless patients.
- (b.) Hygiene of the sick room, ventilation, lighting, temperature, etc.
- (c.) Baths (different kinds), sponging.
- (d.) Cleansing and padding splints.
- (e.) Prevention of infection.
- (f.) Use of clinical thermometer.

The pulse, its variations and method of record.

Respiration, its method of record.

External applications. Preparation of fomentations and poultices, local application of heat and cold, cold and hot packs, hot-air baths, counter irritation, leeches, blisters.

Various methods of administering drugs, enemata, subcutaneous injections (hypodermic, saline, etc.).

Lotions in common use, preparation of in varying strengths.

Hypnotics, doses and actions of more commonly used, and methods of administration.

Poison, dosage and effects. Symptoms of poisoning by morphia, strychnine, arsenic, belladonna, alcohol, chloroform, mercury, iodoform, carbolic acid, etc.

What to use in case of poisoning.

Drug rashes.

Methods of observing symptoms, and manner of reporting same to doctor.

Dressings, and their preparation.

Operation case—preparation of patient and room.

Instruments—their care and use.

Disinfectants and antiseptics.

Anatomy and Physiology—12 Lectures to be given.

The structural composition of the human body—bone, ligament, muscles, arteries, veins, nerves, glands, lymphatics, organs of assimilation, or secretion and excretion.

The skeleton, names and functions of various bones—joints, nature of, chief varieties, functions, ball and socket, hinge, etc.

Muscles, anatomical description of, action of, names of most important, physiology of muscles.

Arteries and veins—structure and functions, names of position of chief arteries and veins.

Nervous system—brief sketch of—Brain—structure and functions: spinal cord, structure and functions; motor nerves, structure and functions.

The heart, structure and functions, its position.

The circulation.

The blood, its constitution and use.

The lungs, structure, position, functions. Respiration.

The larynx—speech.

Animal heat.

Digestion and absorption.

Mastication—the teeth.

Saliva and salivary glands.

The stomach, its position, structure, and functions.

The small intestine, position, structure, and functions.

The colon, position, structure, and functions.

Defæcation.

The liver, position, structure, and functions.

The pancreas, position, structure, and functions.

The kidneys, position structure, and functions.

Secretion of urine. The ureters.

The bladder, its position and functions. Excretion.

The urine, its composition and quantity.

The spleen, its position and functions.

The thyroid, supra-renals.

The skin, its structure and functions. The sweat.

The organs of special sense. The eye, nose, ear, taste.

Housekeeping.

Instructions should be given in keeping house for patients, nursing staff, men employed, etc., in the superintendence of the work of the servants; in the price and relative values of all food stuff, household requisites, linen, etc.; in keeping accounts of moneys received in connection with housekeeping. Where possible pupils should for a time personally carry out the repairs of linen, receive stores as they are bought or issued, and give them out day by day as required, and be responsible for their preservation in good order.

Instructions should also be given in the drawing up of official reports for the committee relating to any of the above matters.

Regulations dealing with Examinations.

1. The examination shall be both written and practical.

2. For admission to the Register, candidates will be examined in General Nursing, Medical Nursing, Surgical Nursing, Hygiene, and Invalid Cookery (except where proof is produced of having already passed a satisfactory examination in the latter subject).

3. No nurse shall be eligible for the final examination until she has completed the required course of training, provided that in the event of the end of her period of training falling between two examinations, the Board may permit her to present herself at the earlier one, but she must complete her term of training before receiving her certificate.

4. Candidates must produce certificates (a) of attendance at lectures as provided in the schedule of study; (b) of having passed a satisfactory examination in Anatomy and Physiology; (c) that they have attended the Operating Theatre, taken part in the active preparation of patients and actually assisted during the progress of practical surgical work.

5. (a.) Before registration can be effected, applicants must present evidence of having undergone at least two months' training in the nursing of infectious cases.

(b.) Applicants whose training has been entirely undergone at a children's hospital must present evidence of having had at least two months' experience in the handling of adult cases.

For this purpose the wards of the Woorloo Sanatorium shall be regarded as wards dealing with adult cases.

6. Candidates who have passed the final examination and have otherwise complied with the conditions laid down in the Regulations of the Board shall receive a certificate to that effect, signed by the Examiners and by the Chairman and the Secretary of the Board.

7. All examination papers shall be examined conjointly by the Examiners. The practical examination shall be held at centres to be decided on from time to time by the Board.

8. Examinations shall take place in May and November of each year. The first such examination shall be held in November, 1922.

9. An entrance fee of one guinea shall be charged for examination; such fee, in the event of a candidate passing, shall entitle her to a certificate of registration and the prescribed badge. In the event of a candidate failing to satisfy the examiners, she may present herself at two successive examinations without further fee.

10. Candidates shall make application to the Secretary, on the prescribed form, for admission to the examination not later than the first day of the preceding April in the case of the May examinations, and the first day of October in the case of the November examinations. The necessary certificates must be enclosed, with an intimation of the centre at which the candidate proposes to present herself.

11. The Board shall have power to appoint from time to time such centres for examination as it may deem desirable.

12. The examination papers shall be sent sealed to the various centres, where at the appointed time the seals shall be broken in the presence of the candidates, and the papers given out. After the examination the papers shall be forwarded to the examiners, who shall report to the Board.

Method of Allotment of Numbers.

13. Each candidate shall be provided with a numbered card. Sealed envelopes containing numbered cards shall be sent to the various centres and distributed among the candidates immediately before the distribution of the examination papers.

14. The practical examination shall be conducted at each centre by the local examiners, appointed as provided in the Act. As the object of this part of the examination is that the examiner shall be satisfied that the candidates possess a sound knowledge of practical nursing, special attention shall be given to such points as the following, in each of which a practical demonstration may be asked for:—Bed-making; the moving of helpless patients; the sponging of patients; the administration of baths of various kinds, local and general including hot air baths; nacks, enemata, purgative and nutrient; hypodermic injections; the cleansing of the various cavities of the body, including nose and ears; bathing the eyes; catheterisation of the bladder; the application of poultices, fomentations, blisters, mustard plasters and leeches; the preparation of the patient and the apparatus required for various minor surgical procedures, such as cupping, drainage of the pleural and peritoneal cavities, lumbar puncture, drainage of subcutaneous tissues, aspiration, catheterisation and washing out of the bladder, dilatation of the urethra, administration of subcutaneous saline injections, lavage of the stomach, etc.

15. They will also be required to make the necessary preparations and personally carry out the dressing of one or more surgical cases in the presence of the examiners, and to display a practical knowledge of bandaging and of splints, instruments, and surgical appliances in common use. Questions will be asked the candidates with a view to showing that they understand the reasons for the various procedures they carry out, the incidental risks where there are any, and the part the nurse should play in dealing with each.

Method of conducting the Practical Examination.

16. The practical examination shall be held after the written examination, on a date to be fixed by the examiners. On completion of the examination the examiners shall forward to the Board a report on each candidate. For the practical examination the maximum number of marks to be allotted in each subject is one hundred.
