WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—

- (a) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year: And whereas the "Crayfish" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of the hereinbefore recited provisions: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1923, until the 31st day of December, 1923.

### *Locality Schedule.*

- (a) The whole of the waters of Rottnest Island within a radius of half-a-mile from the line of fore-shore.
- (b) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries.
- (c) The waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury).

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, from the 1st day of January, 1923, until the 31st day of December, 1925.

*Schedule.*

(1.) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries extending in a North, Easterly, and North-Easterly direction from a line drawn from the North-Eastern extremity of the Mill Point Wharf (situated on the Western side of Belches or Mill Point) to the North-Western extremity of the Harbour and Lights Wharf (situated on the Western side of the river between the

Swan Brewery and Eliza Point, to the Railway Bridge at Guildford (except for prawns; *vide* separate Proclamation).

(2.) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries extending from the Upper Swan Bridge (near Midland) to the head of the Swan River (except for prawns; *vide* separate Proclamation).

(3.) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries West, South, and South-West of a line drawn from the South-Western extremity of Point Resolution to the South-Western extremity of the Point Walter Jetty (situated at Point Walter) to a line drawn from the Western extremity of the South Mole to the Western extremity of the North Mole (at Fremantle).

(4.) The waters of the Canning River and its tributaries from the Lower Canning Bridge to the head of the said river (except for prawns; *vide* separate Proclamation).

(5.) The whole of the waters of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah), bounded on the North by a line drawn in an Easterly direction from the extremity of the Western point of Entrance (at the Bar) to a point on the mainland on the Eastern shore, and on the South by lines drawn in an Easterly direction from the South-Eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the Southern extremity of Channel Island; thence to the South-Western extremity of Creery Island and by its Southern foreshore to the Eastern extremity of that island; thence by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland.

(6.) The whole of the waters of the Murray River and the Serpentine River (including their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which during any time of the year have access directly or indirectly to the sea) lying North, East, and South-East of a line drawn from a point on the Eastern foreshore of Peel's Inlet, situated East of the Southernmost point of Goongoolup Island, and extending in a Westerly direction half-a-mile; thence in a Northerly direction to the foreshore of Peel's Inlet to a point lying West of the Western side of the entrance to the Serpentine River.

(7.) The whole of the waters of the Harvey River and that portion of the Harvey Estuary South of that part known as the "Ford," which extends from Reserve No. 2990, on the Western side of the said Estuary, to Reserve No. 2991, on the Eastern side of the said Estuary.

(8.) That portion of the waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury) situated Southward of a line drawn from the junction of the Stone Causeway with the Bunbury Jetty to a white post situated on the foreshore 27 chains Eastward of the North-Eastern corner of the Quarantine Reserve at North Bunbury.

(9.) The whole of the waters of Toby's Inlet and that portion of the ocean waters within a radius of a quarter-of-a-mile from the entrance on either side to the said Toby's Inlet.

(10.) The whole of the waters of the King River (Albany), including its tributaries, West of a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from a point on the Western foreshore of Oyster Harbour, 25 chains South from the Southern extremity of the King River Bridge to a point on the Northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour, 57 chains East of the Northern extremity of the said bridge.

(11.) The whole of the waters of the Kalgan River (Albany), including its tributaries, North of a line drawn in a South-Easterly direction from a point on the Northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains East of the Northern extremity of the King River Bridge to a point on the foreshore at Swan Point (on the Eastern side of Oyster Harbour) 68 chains South from the Eastern extremity of the Kalgan River Bridge.

(12.) The waters of the Channel Entrance between King George's Sound and Oyster Harbour (Albany), the Northern boundary being a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains North of Emu Point (on the Western side of the entrance aforesaid), and the Southern boundary being a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains South of the said Emu Point.

(13.) The whole of the waters of the Denmark River and its tributaries and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Denmark River.

(14.) The whole of the waters of the Hay River and its tributaries, and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Hay River.

(15.) The whole of the waters of the Preston River, the Collic River, and the Capel River, with their tributaries.

(16.) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards Eastward of the Geraldton Railway Jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards to the Westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(17.) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards Eastward of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards Westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(18.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Dead" Water, situated in Sussex Location No. 11.

(19.) All that portion of the waters of Cockburn Sound (near Rockingham Beach) lying South of a line drawn from the North-Western extremity of Point John, intersecting the North-Western extremity of the Northernmost pier or jetty at Rockingham Beach, and extending to a point on the foreshore at the said Rockingham Beach.

(20.) All that portion of the Western Australian waters contained in the Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries.

(21.) The whole of the waters of Torbay Inlet (near Albany), including the Channel Entrance both North and South of the Flood Gates, and the waters of the creeks flowing into the inlet.

(22.) That portion of the waters of the Gascoyne River (Carnarvon) lying between the Jetty Tramway Bridge and a line drawn from the Beacon on the South-Eastern corner of Babbage Island to Mangrove Point on the mainland.

(23.) All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottneet Island lying East of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and East of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island), and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

(24.) The whole of the waters of Grassmere Lake, also known as Nine-Mile Lake (near Albany), and the waters of the creeks flowing into it.

(25.) The waters of Geographe Bay, near Wonnerup Inlet, bounded on the South by a North-Westerly line drawn from a point on the foreshore fifteen (15) chains South-East from the Southern side of the "Old Jetty," and extending into the waters of the said bay a distance of 40 chains; thence by a line drawn in a North-Eastern direction a distance of about 120 chains; thence by a line drawn in a South-Eastern direction extending to the foreshore of the said bay at a point 60 chains North of the Northern point of entrance to Wonnerup Inlet, and thence in a South-Westerly direction by the foreshore of the said bay to the point of commencement.

(26.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as "The Quarries," or Channel, near Cape Naturaliste.

(27.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as Yallingup Bay, starting from the point of high water mark at the Rocky Point half-a-chain South of the mouth of Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter-of-a-mile; thence North-Eastern to a point a quarter-of-a-mile from the North-West corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence Eastern to the point of high water mark on the foreshore, and back to the point of commencement.

*Resumption of Land from Victoria Location 1419.*

WHEREAS by Crown Grant under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Vol. 23, Fol. 101, Victoria Location 1419, containing 100 acres, was granted to David Blaney, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter into possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvements works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part of the whole of the land aforesaid and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid, not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of "Water": Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the twentieth day of December, 1922, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of "Water."

*The Schedule.*

That portion of Victoria Location 1419, containing 4 perches, being the area surveyed and shown on Lands and Surveys Diagram 43908 as Victoria Location 7855, hereafter to be known and distinguished as Reserve 18181. (Plan 126A/40, C1.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2285/22.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, transfer to one Ward of a Road District any portion of another Ward; and whereas it is desirable:—

- (1) To transfer part of the territory of the Kalgoorlie Ward to the Broad Arrow Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District.
- (2) To transfer part of the territory of the Kalgoorlie Ward to the Kanowna Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District.
- (3) To transfer part of the territory of the Kanowna Ward to the Kalgoorlie Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Coun-

oil, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1) Transfer all that territory described in Schedule "A" hereto from the Kalgoorlie Ward to the Broad Arrow Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District.
- (2) Transfer all that territory described in Schedule "B" hereto from the Kalgoorlie Ward to the Kanowna Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District.
- (3) Transfer all that territory described in Schedule "C" hereto from the Kanowna Ward to the Kalgoorlie Ward of the Kalgoorlie Road District.

To come into force on and from the first day of January, 1923.

#### Schedule "A."

##### KALGOORLIE ROAD DISTRICT.

###### *Transfer of Territory from the Kalgoorlie Ward to the Broad Arrow Ward.*

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the District boundary at the 40 M.P., being the Westernmost corner of the East Coolgardie Goldfield, and extending North-Eastward to the 30½ M.P., being a North corner of the said goldfield; thence Southward to the junction of the Northern loop of the Great Western Railway with the Kalgoorlie-Kanowna Railway Reserve, and along the latter reserve to the boundaries of the Kalgoorlie municipality; thence North-Westward along part of said municipal boundaries to the Northernmost corner of the municipality; thence North-Westward to the Easternmost corner of Hampton Location 11 (Rifle Range Reserve 7897), and along a North-East, a South-East, a North-East, the North-West, and part of a South-West boundary of said reserve to the production North-Eastward of the North-West boundary of Reserve 8603, and along said production and North-West boundary to the West corner of said Reserve 8603; thence Westward to the South-East corner of State Forest No. 2, and along its South boundary and its production West to the District boundary, and along said District boundary to the starting point.

#### Schedule "B."

###### *Transfer of Territory from the Kalgoorlie to the Kanowna Ward.*

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the 30½ M.P., being a North corner of the East Coolgardie Goldfield, and extending South-Eastward along a North-East boundary of said goldfield to its intersection with the West boundary of Reserve 7466, and along part of said West boundary and part of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 2824/97A to the production East of the North boundary of Parkeston Townsite, and along said production and part North boundary to the North-Eastern side of the Great Western Railway and North-Westward along said side of the railway to the junction of its Northern loop with the Kalgoorlie-Kanowna Railway Reserve; thence Northward to the starting point.

#### Schedule "C."

###### *Transfer of Territory from the Kanowna Ward to the Kalgoorlie Ward.*

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the North-West corner of Reserve 7466, and extending Eastward along the Northernmost, an East, and a North boundary of said reserve and the latter's production East to Road No. 1259 and South-Eastward along said road to a North-Western boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence South-Westward and North-Westward along part of the boundaries of the said goldfield, passing through survey mark B5, Mt. Youle, and the 18 M.P. to the West boundary of Reserve 7466 aforesaid, and Northward along part of said West boundary to the starting point.

##### *Katanning and Dumbleyung Road Districts.*

###### *Alteration of Boundaries and the Constitution of the Lake Grace Road District.*

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 245/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and either annex it to an existing Road District or constitute such portion a Road District, and may divide a Road District into Wards; and whereas it is desirable to:—

- (1) Sever portion of the Katanning Road District and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District.
- (2) Sever portion of the Dumbleyung Road District and constitute a new Road District to be called the Lake Grace Road District.
- (3) Divide the said Lake Grace Road District into Wards:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1) Sever that portion of the Katanning Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Dumbleyung Road District.
- (2) Sever that portion of the Dumbleyung Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto and constitute such severed portion a Road District to be called the Lake Grace Road District.
- (3) Divide the said Lake Grace Road District into four Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "C" hereto.
- (4) Appoint the Chairman of the Dumbleyung Road Board as Returning Officer at the election of the members of the Lake Grace Road Board, and to fix the date for the various events leading up to the said election, as shown in Schedule "D" hereto.

##### KATANNING ROAD DISTRICT.

###### *Transfer of territory to Dumbleyung Road District.*

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the present District boundary at the North-East corner of Williams Location 8732 and extending along part of said boundary to the North-East corner of Location 8534; thence along the East and part of the South boundary of said Location 8534, the Easternmost and the Southern boundary of Location 9179, the Southern boundaries of Location 9175, a West and a North boundary of Location 9174, the Northern boundaries of Locations 9177 and 12242 and the latter's production to the East boundary of Location 8732 and along part of said East boundary to the starting point.

#### SCHEDULE "B."

##### LAKE GRACE ROAD DISTRICT.

###### *Description of Boundaries.*

Bounded on the North by lines commencing at the intersection of the production North of the East boundary of Williams Location 10814 with the Southern side of a surveyed road extending in prolongation Westward of the North boundary of Location 10980, and extending Eastward along said side of the road and the North boundary of said Location 10980, part of the North boundary of Location 10981, the West and the North boundary of Location 10224, the West, North, and part of the East boundaries of Location 7178, the North boundary of Location 10985, a North and North-West boundaries of Location 9520, a North-West, a West and the Northernmost boundary of Location 9521 to its North-East corner; thence Eastward (passing through the 133 M.P. on the Rabbit-Proof Fence) to intersect a line passing through the 145 M.P. on the Rabbit-Proof Fence and Koorarawalyee Well (on the Eastern Railway). On the

Eastward by part of said line from the said intersection Southward for a distance of about 2,080 chains; thence Westward for about 510 chains, to a line extending Southward from the 135 M.P. on the Rabbit-Proof Fence and Southward along said line to intersect the production Eastward of the South boundary of Location 9784. On the Southward by the production of the said South boundary from the last mentioned intersection to the East boundary of Reserve 10740 and along part of the East, the North and part of the West boundaries of said reserve, and again along the aforesaid production of the South boundary of said Location 9784, and the East and North boundaries of same, part of the East, the North, and the Western boundaries of Location 9794, to its South-West corner; thence Westward along the production West of the South boundary of said Location 9794 to the East boundary of Location 11486, part of the East, the North and the West boundary of said Location 11486, part of the North-East boundary of Location 11298, the North-East and North boundaries of Location 11299, the North boundary of Location 11104, parts of the East and North boundaries of Location 11099 to intersect the production South of the Westernmost boundary of Location 11100. On the Westward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Northward along the said production and Westernmost boundary and its production Northward to the South boundary of Location 10766, and along part of the South and the West boundary of said Location 10766, part of the South, the West and part of the North boundary of said Location 8374, the West and part of the North boundary of Location 10771, the West boundaries of Locations 10772, 12379 and 12380 and part of the lattermost's North boundary, West boundaries of Locations 10778 and 10738 (Water Reserve), part of the South boundary of Location 10779, the South and West boundaries of Location 12319, the West boundaries of Locations 10780 and 9737 and part of the latter's North boundary, the West and part of the North boundary of Location 9738 to the production South of the West boundary of Location 11072; thence along said production and West boundary and the North boundary of said Location 11072 to the production South of the East boundary of Location 14003; thence along said production and East boundary and East boundaries of Locations 10797, 10815, and 10814 and their production Northward to the starting point.

#### SCHEDULE "C."

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the undermentioned arrangement with the Commonwealth Government under Sections 76, 79, 80, and 81 of "The Public Service Act, 1904":—

*Arrangement with the Commonwealth Government in relation to Commonwealth and State Officers called as witnesses on behalf of the Commonwealth or of the State of Western Australia.*

1. When any person who is in the employ of the Commonwealth (including members of the permanent Naval, Military, and Air Forces) is summoned or called as a witness on behalf of the State, he shall as regards his attendance to give evidence be deemed to be in the performance of his duty as a Commonwealth employee, and no witness fees (other than the expenses, if any, paid by the Commonwealth for his travelling allowances) shall be charged by or paid to him on account of his being so summoned or called; but the State shall pay to the Commonwealth such sum as is sufficient to recoup the sum (if any) paid by it for the travelling allowances of the employee.

2. When any person who is in the employ of the State is summoned or called as a witness on behalf of the Commonwealth he shall, as regards his attendance to give evidence, be deemed to be in the performance of his duty as a State employee, and no witness fees (other than the expenses, if any, paid by the State for his travelling allowances) shall be charged by or paid to him on account of his being so summoned or called; but the Commonwealth shall pay to the State such sum as is sufficient to recoup the sum (if any) paid by it for the travelling allowances of the employee.

3. Any claim for travelling allowances of an employee payable to the Commonwealth by the State pursuant to this arrangement may be rendered direct by the proper officer of the Commonwealth Department concerned to the proper officer of the State department concerned, and any such claim payable to the State by the Commonwealth may be rendered direct by the proper officer of the State Department concerned to the proper officer of the Commonwealth Department concerned.

4. This arrangement shall not apply to employees of the Commonwealth or of the State giving evidence in their private capacity.

5. The previous arrangement made between the Commonwealth and the State Governments is hereby cancelled.

MAINTENANCE ORDERS (RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT  
ACT, 1921.)

NO. 27 OF 1921.

RULES REGULATING PROCEEDINGS.

WHEREAS it is desirable to regulate proceedings under "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921," and to prescribe the fees to be taken in connection therewith: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and "The Justices Act, 1902-1920," and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Maintenance Orders Regulations, 1922.*

2. In the construction of these regulations, subject to the context—  
"Act" means the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921:

"Clerk" means the clerk of petty sessions acting in connection with the court of summary jurisdiction in reference to which the expression is used:

"Order" means a maintenance order.

3. When a certified copy of an order has been transmitted to the Governor by a governing officer or Secretary of State, the officer to whom a copy of the order shall be sent shall, in case the order is to be registered in the Supreme Court, be the Master, and in case the order is to be registered in a court of summary jurisdiction, be the clerk of the court.

4. Registration of such an order as aforesaid in the Supreme Court shall be effected by the Master entering or causing to be entered in a register, to be kept for that purpose, such particulars of the order as are indicated in the Schedule "A" hereto.

5. Registration in a court of summary jurisdiction of such an order as aforesaid shall be effected by the clerk entering it in his charge book, on the date on which he receives it, in the same manner as though the order had been made in his court, distinguishing it from the other entries in such manner as he may find most convenient, so as to show that it is entered in pursuance of the Act.

6. Every order shall after registration have a certificate of registration endorsed thereon signed by the Master or the clerk, and shall be numbered, and the number shall be entered in the register.

7. An index of all orders registered in a court shall be kept by the registering officer, and the entries therein shall be arranged in alphabetical order according to the surname of the defendant or person against whom the order was made.

8. A search may be made in the index on payment of a fee of one shilling, and any copy order so registered and the registration thereof may be inspected on payment of a similar amount.

9. Notice in writing of the registration of the order shall be served on the defendant. Such notice shall contain particulars of the order as appearing in the register.

10. The provisions of "The Justices Act, 1902-1920," applicable to the service of summonses shall apply to the service of notices of registration.

11. After notice of registration has been served the Master or clerk, as the case may be, shall indorse on the copy order in his possession a note of such service stating the date and place thereof.

12. An entry of any proceedings taken and any payment made under a registered order shall be made in the appropriate place by the Master or clerk as occasion requires.

13. (1.) When a provisional order made by a court in this State, and transmitted to a court in another part of the King's Dominions, has been remitted to the court which made the order for the purpose of taking further evidence, the clerk shall forthwith cause the matter to be brought before that court, or before some other court of summary jurisdiction.

(2.) Before taking such evidence the court shall cause notice to be served on the complainant according to the Form "B" in the Schedule hereto.

14. The clerk of a court of summary jurisdiction shall be the person to whom documents which the Governor desires to send to an officer of such court shall be sent pursuant to section six of the Act.

15. To every summons issued by a court and by such court ordered to be served, pursuant to a requisition of the Governor under section six, subsection (1) of the Act, there shall be attached a copy of the documents sent to the court by the Governor.

Such summons may be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and shall be served in manner applicable to the service of summonses on complaints under "The Justices Act, 1902-1920."

16. When an order provisionally made outside the State has been confirmed with or without modification under section six of the Act by a court of summary jurisdiction or the court has decided not to confirm it, the clerk shall send notice thereof to the court from which it issued and also to the Governor.

17. When the court before which any provisional order comes, whether on an application for confirmation or for rescission or variation, is satisfied that it is necessary to remit the case to the court which made the order for the purpose of taking any further evidence, the clerk of such court may remit the case by sending to the clerk or some other officer of the court which made the order (through the post in a registered letter) a notice according to the Form "D" in the Schedule, to which shall be attached a copy of the provisional order, and which shall state the matters in respect of which further evidence is necessary.

18. When depositions taken by a court in any of the King's Dominions in connection with an order remitted to such court for the purpose of taking further evidence have been sent to a court of summary jurisdiction in this State, the clerk shall send notice to the parties concerned of the date and time when the matter will be considered by the court (according to the Form "E" in the Schedule), and such notice shall be served at least two clear days before the hearing.

19. When an order has been registered in a court of summary jurisdiction under section three of the Act, or a provisional order has been confirmed under section six that court shall, unless satisfied that it is undesirable to do so, direct that all payments due thereunder shall be made through an officer of the court or such other person as it may specify for the purpose.

20. The person through whom the payments are directed to be made shall collect the moneys due under the order as though it were an affiliation order, and may take proceedings in his own name for enforcing payment, and shall send the moneys when so collected to the court from which the order originally issued.

Unless exemption or partial exemption from labour conditions has been granted by the Minister or Warden, every lease, other than a gold mining lease, on which labour conditions are prescribed shall be efficiently worked on every working day after the expiration of thirty days from the date of the posting at the Warden's office of the *Government Gazette* containing notice of the approval thereof.

A lease granted for coal shall be efficiently worked from the like date by not less than one man for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for the first twelve months; by not less than two men for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for the second twelve months, and by not less than three men for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for every succeeding year.

Leases coming under the description of (c) or (e) of Regulation 80 shall be worked by not less than one man for every twelve acres, or fraction thereof, from the like date.

Every lease other than gold mining leases and leases granted for coal shall be worked on every working day

from the like date by not less than two men for the first twelve months or such longer period not exceeding a further twelve months as may be approved by the Minister on the application of the lessee, and thereafter by not less than one man for every six acres, or fraction thereof; but in no case shall any lease be worked by less than two men.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 21 of 1922.

Between Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch), Applicant, and The Boards of Management of the Perth Public Hospital; Fremantle Public Hospital; Children's Hospital; and King Edward Memorial Hospital, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Area*.—The award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of 14 miles from the Central Postal Office in the City of Perth.

2. *Term*.—The term of the award shall be for a period of twelve months.

3. *Definitions*:

The term "Head Orderly" shall mean a person performing the duties of an orderly and who is responsible for directing the activities of other orderlies.

The term "Hall Porter" shall mean a person who is required to attend to all telephone inquiries inside and outside of hospital, and is responsible for booking in and out of the whole staff.

4. *Hours*.—The hours to be worked on and after the 1st January, 1923, shall be as follows:—

*Laundry Staff*.—Forty-four hours per week, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturday.

All other staff, forty-eight hours per week, to be worked on any six days of the week.

5. *Overtime*.—(a.) *Laundry Staff*.—All time worked in excess of forty-four hours per week to be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(b.) All other Employees.—For all time worked in excess of forty-eight hours per week, to be worked on any six days in the week, overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half.

(c.) Employees called upon to work in the venereal clinic at night, in addition to ordinary duties, shall for time so worked during the night be paid at time and a-half rate.

6. *Holidays*.—(a.) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. Any employee required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half, or be allowed time off in lieu thereof.

(b.) A holiday of two weeks on full pay, together with board and lodging allowance of £1 2s. 6d. per week, shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service. Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

7. *Sick Leave*.—Conditions as at present observed in each hospital to continue.

8. *Wages*:

Head orderly—£4 7s. 6d. per week, with a deduction of £1 2s. 6d. per week for board and lodging.

Hall porter and all other orderlies—£3 12s. 6d. per week, with a deduction of £1 2s. 6d. per week for board and lodging.

Orderlies performing special duties such as night calls, shaving for surgical purposes, bath orderly, mortuary orderly, V.D. orderly, laundry boiler attendant, splint maker, and instrument attendant, and when employed driving motor ambulance or horse to be paid at the rate of 5s. (Five shillings) per week extra.

Workers in this section—kitchen and general staff—whose wages are computed on living-in basis and are required to live out shall receive £1 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the rate specified. If required to lodge out only, they shall be paid 7s. 6d. per week in addition to the rate specified.

9. *Payment of Wages*.—Wages, including overtime if any, shall be paid twice monthly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

10. *Dressing Room*.—Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding in, and dressing rooms for laundry staff living out, shall be provided.

11. *Uniforms*.—All uniforms (*i.e.*, uniformity in dress) shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them.

12. *Casual Workers*.—All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any week shall be paid ten per cent. on the wages paid in cash in addition to the rates prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day. Provided this shall not apply in the case of an employee summarily dismissed for misconduct.

13. *General Clauses*.—(a.) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about the hospitals.

(b.) An employee required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so informed before booking off the day previous.

(c.) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d.) Space shall be provided at the employees' quarters for the purpose of posting union notices.

(e.) A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate in this award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(f.) Weekly rosters to be kept posted in a convenient place setting out the hours of starting and finishing and the duties of each employee thereon, together with the day each employee is booked off duty. Such roster must be posted not less than twenty-four hours preceding the day on which the roster commences.

(g.) A copy of this award shall be placed in a conspicuous position by the Secretary or Chief Resident Medical Officer of the hospital.
