meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1923, until the 31st day of December, 1923, inclusive: And further that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it is provided by Ordinance 37 Victoriae, No. 14, that the Governor may, from time to time, frame, vary, or alter rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance for the preservation of good order within all ports or harbours or any port or harbour, to be observed by all persons whatsoever, but so that such rules and regulations shall come into force on the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of all other powers by me in this behalf enabling, do hereby frame and enact the regulations set out hereunder:—

1. The following regulations shall apply to the Port of Perth.

2. No boat shall be moored or anchored or kept or left moored or anchored or unattended opposite to or near that part of the Point Walter Beach which extends from the Point Walter Jetty in a South-Easterly direction to a line being the prolongation of the Eastern wall of the Bathing Sheds unless such boat, anchor, and moorings are and remain at least one chain below low water mark.

3. If it be necessary to bring any boat nearer to the said beach than is mentioned in the preceding regulation, for the purpose of passengers or any of the crew embarking or disembarking, the purpose shall be effected as speedily as possible, and the boat shall then be immediately removed to and kept at a distance of at least one chain below low water mark.

4. If any person shall, by act or omission, be guilty of any contravention of these regulations or be party or privy to any such contravention, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

By-laws for the preparation of a special roll for a Loan Poll, and for carrying into effect of the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," in connection with the taking of such poll.

Whereas by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, the Merredin District Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following special By-laws regarding the preparation of a special roll and the taking of a poll, in respect of proposed loans.

In these By-laws "The Act" shall mean "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and "Prescribed" shall mean prescribed by the Act, unless otherwise stated or inconsistent with the context.

1. The various forms mentioned by numbers in these By-laws are those prescribed under the Act, and approved of by Order in Council and published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th September, 1913, and 5th March, 1920.

2. When demand shall have been duly made under Section 285 of the Act, the secretary shall forthwith prepare a special roll of the names of all persons who appear to him to be resident owners of rateable land within the meaning of Section 285.

3. The said roll shall be as prescribed by form No. 40, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the office of the Board within the usual office hours, not later than ten days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll, and shall be in alphabetical order of surnames.

4. On or before the fifth day before the holding of the poll, any resident owner—

- (a) whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered to the secretary or addressed to him through the post, apply to have his or her name inserted, and shall give particulars of his or her claim;
- (b) whose name has been inserted in the roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll, as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him, may in like manner apply to the secretary to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and give particulars of his claim;
- (c) whose name appears in the roll or who claims to have his or her name inserted in the roll may, in like manner, object to the name of any other person appearing in such roll, as not being entitled to be enrolled or as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his or her name.
- (d) any such claims and objections shall be in the form of forms number 4, 5, 6, and 7 or to the like effect, and any objections under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the secretary to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

5. (a) The Board shall hold an open court (to be called a Revision Court) within the Road Board District, for the purpose of revising and authenticating the roll, and such revision and authentication shall take place on or before the second day before the day fixed for the holding of the poll, and at such time and place as the Chairman may appoint, and the chairman shall give notice of the holding of such court, and the time and place thereof, by placing such notice on some building within the Road Board District, and by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the district.

(b) Provided that if no application or objection under section number 4 of these By-laws is received within the prescribed time, it shall not be necessary to hold a revision court, and the chairman and two members of the Board may forthwith sign and certify the said list, and such list shall thereupon be deemed to have been duly certified under Section 6 of these By-laws.

6. Sections 44 to 49 of the Act are hereby adopted and deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws, except that wherever the word "list" appears in the said sections, it shall be read as "Roll."

7. The following sections of the Act, with such alterations as are herein mentioned, are adopted and shall be deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws:—

Sections 72 to 78, Sections 80 and 81, Sections 84 and 85, with the following alterations:—

In Section 75 the words "each candidate" shall read "the chairman," and the words "one scrutineer" shall read "two scrutineers."

In Section 84 (a) the words "the roll now in force" shall read "the special roll for this poll."

Section 86 of the Act is adopted, and shall be deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws, with the following alterations:—

In Subsection 1, the words "elector whose name is on an electoral roll" shall read "resident owner," and in Subsection 1, Clause (c), "nomination day" shall read "the presentation of the demand for a poll."

In Subsection 12, the words "an election to fill an extraordinary vacancy" are altered to read "a loan poll."

8. Sections 87 to 96 of the Act are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws, and shall apply as nearly as may be.
