The Fisheries Act, 1905-13.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Francis

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—

- (a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1923, until the thirtieth day of April, 1923, and as from the first day of August, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive.

(2.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1923, until the thirtieth day of April, 1923, and from the first day of November, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive.

(3.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets

as from the first day of January, 1923, until the thirty-first day of March, 1923, and from the first day of October, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive.

(4.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1923, until the twenty-third day of March, 1923, and from the Sixteenth day of May, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive.

(5.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive; provided that subject to certain provisions (*vide* separate Proclamation) it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday, and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.

(6.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch, by any method of capture, as from the first day of July, 1923, until the thirty-first day of October, 1923 inclusive.

(7.) That all those waters mentioned in the Seventh Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the first day of January, 1923, until the thirty-first day of December, 1923, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottneet Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore,

Second Locality Schedule.

(a.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a-half miles from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half-a-mile from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

(a.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter-of-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter-of-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—

On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter-of-a-mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Seventh Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street and the Lower Canning Bridge.

Part IV.—*Dairies and Milk Shops.*

2. (d.) Provided that after the coming into force of this By-law, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to establish or open any dairy or dairies within the following area of the Claremont Road District:—

All that portion of the Claremont Road District as described on page 2082 of the *Government Gazette* issue on the 5th day of December, 1919, with the exception of that part of Reserve 9299 situated East of Servetus Street or a line therefrom produced due North.

Education Department,

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the cancellation of Appendix I. under the Education Acts and amendments, and to substitute therefor the following:—

Appendix I.

Secondary School Scholarships, and Admission to Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools.

1. Scholarships, not exceeding fifty in each year, are annually offered for boys and girls attending Government or other efficient schools. The Scholarships will entitle the holders to receive a grant to defray the necessary expenses incurred in the provision of books, provided that no such grant shall exceed £3 per annum, and to have their entrance fees paid by the Department on sitting for the Junior Examination in the third year, and for the Leaving Certificate Examination in the fifth year of their Scholarships. Scholarship holders living at home may also receive a grant to defray their necessary travelling expenses, provided that their homes are at a greater distance than two miles from the school. The winners of these Scholarships must attend Secondary Schools approved by the Department. If the winner of a Scholarship resides at such a distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a boarder or to live away from home, an additional allowance of £30 per annum will be given.

2. The Scholarships will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further

period of two years if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension.

3. A candidate for these Scholarships must—
 - (a) Be over twelve years old on the last day of the year in which the examination for the Scholarship is held, and not more than thirteen years old on 31st October of that year.
 - (b) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the Head Teacher of the school last attended.
4. The Scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department.
5. A number of Scholarships, not exceeding one-fifth of the total number offered, will be reserved for pupils from country schools, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. A school with not more than four teachers and not within two miles of a school with more than four teachers shall be deemed a country school for purposes of this section.

6. The conditions upon which the Scholarships are tenable are:—

- (a) That the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil at a Secondary School approved by the Minister. The Minister may require that the school be inspected.
- (b) That he shall continue to attend such school, and at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school, and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct, progress, and attendance have been satisfactory. Full particulars of attendance, of success in study, and of promotion, if any, must be given. If an unfavourable report is received, or if at any time his conduct be disorderly, or immoral, the Scholarship may, at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.
- (c) Payment will be made to the parent or guardian. The cost of the necessary books, up to £3, may be deducted and paid to the Principal of the School.

7. The examination will be on the following subjects:—

- (1.) *English* (300 marks).—The paper will be designed to test the candidate's powers of understanding the language and of using it freely and correctly. It will include Composition and questions on Simple Grammar and Analysis of Sentences.
- (2.) *Arithmetic* (200 marks).—The ordinary course of Arithmetic as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in State Schools.
- (3.) *History* (100 marks).—Outlines of British History, Text Books, such as Lay's History, Book IV., "Story of the British Nation," Book V., Warner's "Tillage, Trade, and Invention," and Scott's "History of Australasia," will give sufficient material. Two alternative papers will be set. One paper will be on the courses prescribed for Class VI., and the other on the course prescribed for Class VII.
- (4.) *Geography* (100 marks).—Two alternative papers will be set—one on the courses prescribed for Class VI., and one on the course prescribed for Class VII.

For Schools of Classes V., VI., and VII., which are working under the curriculum for small schools, the examination in History and Geography will be based on the curriculum as set out in that syllabus.

8. The examination will be held in such centres as shall be fixed annually by the Department.

9. Schools desiring to be included on the list of approved Secondary Schools at which these Scholarships are tenable must apply to the Department for inclusion. The Minister must be satisfied that the school possesses suitable premises and equipment and is adequately staffed; and that it provides a five years' course of instruction beyond the primary stage, leading up to a standard not lower than that of the Leaving Certificate in such a number and range of subjects as the Minister may deem adequate.
