WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared near Cossack: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a reserve of about 800 acres near Cossack, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Schedule.

An island surrounded by marsh near the sea-coast and situate between Cossack and Mount Wanger, known as Reserve 612a.

Alteration of Ward Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 67/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council transfer to one Ward of a Road District any portion of another Ward: And whereas it is desirable—

- (1) to transfer part of the territory of the Central Ward to the North-East Ward of the Albany Road District;
- (2) to transfer part of the territory of the North-East Ward to the Central Ward of the Albany Road District;
- (3) to transfer part of the territory of the West Ward to the Central Ward of the Albany Road District:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—

- (1) transfer all that territory described in Schedule "A" hereto from the Central Ward to the North-East Ward of the Albany Road District;
- (2) transfer all that territory described in Schedule "B" hereto from the North-East Ward to the Central Ward of the Albany Road District;
- (3) transfer all that territory described in Schedule "C" hereto from the West Ward to the Central Ward of the Albany Road District.

Transfer of Territory from the Central to the North-East Ward.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the District boundary at the North-East corner of Location 162, and extending Eastward along part of said District boundary to the present East boundary of the West Ward and Southward along part of said East boundary to the Western side of the Perth-Albany Road and Northward along said side of the road to the South boundary of Location 49 and along part of the South, the West, and part of the North boundary of said Location 49, and again along the Western side of the Perth-Albany Road to the starting point.
