COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 12 of 1921.

Between the United Furniture Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Foy & Gibson, W. Zimpel, W. H. Moore, Sedgwick Limited, Barnett Brothers Limited, and Others, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

1. *Definition*.—A "wickerworker" shall mean a worker in cane, pith, seagrass, bamboo, rush or any material used in the manufacture or repair of wicker furniture, go-carts, and baskets.

2. *Hours*.—In the case of males the week's work shall consist of 48 hours, and shall be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., on the first five week days and between 7.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. In the case of females the week's work shall not exceed 44 hours, to be worked within the same hours as are prescribed for males.

3. *Overtime*.—On the first five days of the week the following rates shall be paid for work performed outside the usual hours per day or beyond the limit of the hours prescribed:—Time and a-quarter for the first two hours; time and a-half thereafter up to 10 p.m., and double time after 10 p.m. until the usual starting time on the next working day. All work performed on Saturday after closing time, time and a-half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. Sunday, double time.

4. *Holidays*.—A worker required to work on New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day shall be paid at double time rate.

These days when taken as holidays are to be paid at the ordinary rate.

For any work done on these days double time, which includes the ordinary rate, is to be paid.

5. *Country Work*.—Any worker sent to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be provided with board and lodging. All travelling, not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job, shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares and for necessary meals whilst travelling.

6. *Mixed Functions*.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his usual rate shall be paid while engaged on such work at the rate prescribed for such work.

7. *Travelling Time*.—All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during working hours, shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

8. *Wages*.—The minimum rate of wage payable to others than lap-boys and duly registered apprentices shall be as follows:—

Between 15 and 16 years—15s. per week.

Between 16 and 17 years—20s. per week.

Between 19 and 20 years—35s. per week.

Between 20 and 21 years—40s. per week.

Over 21 years—8s. 4d. per day.

Lap-boys may be employed in the wicker-working industry to lap, varnish, clean up the factory, and go messages.

Lap-boys shall be between the ages of 14 and 16, and shall be paid a minimum wage equal to that paid to apprentices during the first two years of the term of apprenticeship.

Lap-boys shall not be employed in a proportion of more than 1 to 3 or portion of three fully paid journeymen. Provided, also, that an employer shall not be entitled to employ a lap-boy unless he employs two journeymen.

The number of journeymen employed by an employer at any time shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the three months immediately preceding such time.

Girls may be employed instead of and in the same proportion as lap-boys.

9. *Wages in Cash*.—All wages shall be paid in cash on or before Friday in each week, within fifteen minutes of the usual time for ceasing work. No charge shall be made against the worker for use of bench, appliances, or tools of trade supplied by the employer, and workers shall not be permitted to sleep or board on the employer's premises.

10. *Notice*.—Notice shall be given on either side to terminate employment, except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, before noon on the last day of employment. Provided that no such notice shall be given on the last working day immediately preceding a holiday.

11. *Grinding Time*.—When a worker is discharged or ordered to stand by for two consecutive days, if he has been employed for six consecutive working days he shall be allowed one hour's pay or time equivalent; or if he has been employed for twelve consecutive working days, he shall be allowed two hours' pay or time equivalent.

12. *Under-rate Workers*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser rate as may be agreed upon in writing (from time to time) between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within 24 hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desire, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

13. *Piecework*.—A worker employed on piecework shall be paid not less than the minimum rate herein prescribed for a worker employed in the same class of work.

14. *Apprentices*.—(a) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court, in the prescribed form.

(c) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him in that branch. Provided that an employer shall not be entitled to have apprentices to any branch in the same year of their apprenticeship in a greater proportion than one to every four or fraction of four journeymen employed by him in that branch. Provided that the fraction of two or four shall not be less than one. Provided also, that this award shall not operate to render unlawful, or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Provided that in the wicker-working branch workers in cane, pith, seagrass, bamboo, or rush only shall be considered for the purpose of determining the number of apprentices.

(f) Apprentices may be taken to any one of the branches of the trades mentioned in the classification set out in Clause 8, and shall be engaged under the terms hereinafter set forth.

- (g) The term of apprenticeship shall be:—
- To the picture framing—3 years.
 - To the glass bevelling—4 years.
 - To the glass silvers—4 years.
 - To the wire-mattress making—4 years.
 - To the mattress making—4 years.
 - To the wood machining—4 years.
 - To the wood carving—5 years.
 - To the cabinet making—5 years.
 - To the chair making—5 years.
 - To the wood turning—5 years.
 - To the lead lighting—5 years.
 - To the upholstering—5 years.
 - To the French polishing—5 years.
 - To the wicker working—5 years.

A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. In the event of a lap-boy becoming apprenticed, one-half of the time during which he has been employed as a lap-boy shall be counted as service under his indentures of apprenticeship.

Any junior worker now employed on picture framing under the terms of Agreement No. 47/1920 may continue to be so employed upon such terms for a period of two years from the date of this award and shall be entitled to go up for examination as an apprentice who has served two years under this award in May next, and as an apprentice who has served three years under this award in the May following.

On passing both these examinations such junior worker shall be entitled to a certificate of competency in the same manner as an apprentice under this award.

(h) Should any employer, for unforeseen circumstances, be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2, in the Appendix hereto.)

(i) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (o), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay

him the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time served.

(3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglect to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice, in writing, of the discharge and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(j) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

For a three years' apprenticeship—	
First year	20/- per week
Second year	40/- "
Third year	60/- "
For a four years' apprenticeship—	
First year	18/- per week.
Second year	30/- "
Third year	45/- "
Fourth year	65/- "
For a five years' apprenticeship—	
First year	15/- per week.
Second year	22/6 "
Third year	35/- "
Fourth year	50/- "
Fifth year	65/- "

The wages of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration at such time as the Court may determine. Provided that no such alteration shall be made except when the wages of tradesmen under this award are being reviewed.

(k) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of Court so to do.

(l) The Clerk of Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(m) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the union and the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(n) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(o) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (j) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(p) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Sec-

tion 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(q) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

Record Book.—The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages book wherein shall be entered the name of each employee, the time he commences and finishes work each day, and the hours worked on each day, the overtime worked each day, and the total wages received or due therefor. Such book shall be entered up from day to day in legible English characters, and shall be initialed weekly, if correct, by each employee.

16. Posting Award.—A copy of this award to be supplied by the union shall be posted up by the employer in a conspicuous place in his workshop.

17. Area.—This award shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

18. Term.—This award shall operate for a period of three years from its date, provided that after the expiration of any period of twelve months application may be made to the Court for alteration, revision, or amendment, by any party or person affected by its provisions.
