WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 13787/55W (Avon Location 4772), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 8 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Hall Site: Now therefore I, Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 13787/55W (Avon Location 4772), for the purpose aforesaid.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 888/16.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves 16367 and 16163 (near Warriup Hill) should be placed under the control of the Albany Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Albany Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon: for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 355/23.

WHEREAS by "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, by Order in Council, constitute any defined part of the State an Irrigation District for the purposes of the said Act; specify the boundaries of such district; assign a name to such district; state the particulars of the scheme of local works for the servces of such district; state the estimated cost of such scheme; and state the quantities of water assigned to such district and the sources from which, the seasons at which, and the conditions under and subject to which they are to be received: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the said Commissioners, doth hereby:—

- (a) constitute that portion of the State defined in the schedule hereto an Irrigation District for the purposes of "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914";
- (b) declare that the boundaries of such district are as set forth in the said schedule;
- (c) declare that the name of such district is "The Lower Canning River Irrigation District";
- (d) declare that the particulars of the scheme of local works for the service of the said district are as follows:—

The construction of a Steel Sheet Piling Weir on the Canning River, near Kent Street and Queen's Park Road;

- (e) declare that the estimated cost of such scheme is £880;
- (f) declare that the quantity of water assigned to the district, and the sources from which, the seasons at which, and the conditions under which and subject to which they are to be received are as follows:—

Such portion as shall be available for irrigation, of the summer flow of the Canning River, with the water from time to time conserved by the weir, such water to be taken as required throughout the year;

- (g) declare that this Order in Council shall take effect from the third day of October, 1923.

thence South-Westerly and North-Westerly along Queen's Park Road to its intersection with Kent Street; thence North-Easterly along Kent Street across Chapman Road to Albany Road; thence South-Easterly along Albany Road to the intersection of Albany Road and Fremantle Road at Gosnells; thence Westerly along Fremantle Road to King Street; thence South-Westerly along King Street to Blanche Street; thence Westerly along Blanche Street to Prince Street; thence South-Westerly along Prince Street to Moss Street; thence North-Westerly along Moss Street to Warton Road; thence South-Westerly along Warton Road to the South corner of Lot 17; thence North-Westerly along the South-West boundary of the said Lot 17 to the North corner of Lot 111 at Fraser Road; thence South-Westerly along Fraser Road to the South corner of Lot 100; thence North-Westerly along the South-West boundary of Lot 100 to its intersection with Lot 18; thence North-Easterly along the North-West boundary of Lot 100 to Hughes Street; thence North-Westerly along Hughes Street to Wilfred Road; thence South-Westerly along Wilfred Road to Nichol Road; thence North-Westerly along Nichol Road to the South-West corner of Lot 21; thence North-Easterly along the North-West boundary of Lot 21 to the South corner of Lot 23A; thence North-Westerly along the South-West boundary of the said Lot 23A to its intersection with the Canning River opposite the point of commencement, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., No. 4198.

By-laws of Reserves at Carnarvon.

(Reserves 610, 1225, 6084.)

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 3rd October, 1923.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of “The Land Act, 1898,” the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality with power to lease as in the said section provided: And whereas by Section 43 of the said Act the Governor may by Order in Council place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality as a Board of Management, with power to make, repeal, and alter By-laws for the purpose in the said section provided: And whereas the Governor has by Orders in Council vested in and placed under the control of the Carnarvon Municipality Reserves Nos. 610, 1225, and 6084, with power to lease and make, repeal, and alter By-laws as in the said Orders respectively provided: Now His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council

has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the following By-laws for the management of the aforesaid Reserves Nos. 610, 1225, and 6084.

CARNARVON RESERVES BY-LAWS.

Carnarvon Municipality.

1. These By-laws shall be known and cited as "The Carnarvon Common By-laws."

2. The following words and expressions used in these By-laws shall, unless there is something in the context repugnant thereto, have the meaning set against them respectively:—

"Owner"—The person having the property in or having the possession or apparent possession, control, management, or custody of animals or stock.

"Cattle"—Bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf.

"Camels"—Bull, bullock, cow, calf.

"Travelling Camels"—Any camels taken or driven or about to be taken or driven to any place more than 30 miles from the place upon which such camels were depasturing previously to starting.

"Travelling Stock"—Any stock taken or driven or about to be taken or driven to any place more than 30 miles from the place upon which such stock were depasturing previously to starting.

"Stock"—Any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, camel, bull, ox, cow, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, and the young of any of them.

"Council"—The Carnarvon Municipal Council, howsoever constituted.

"Municipality"—The Carnarvon Municipality.

"Common"—All that country under the control and management of the Carnarvon Municipal Council, together with part of the Municipal Townsite South of the Gascoyne River and Babbage Island used as a Common.

"Ranger"—Any person appointed by the Municipal Council, or the lessee of the Common for the time being.

"Constable"—Any officer or member of the police force.

3. All stock running on the Common otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Victoria, No. 7) and its amendments, and may be dealt with as provided for by the said Act or these By-laws, or otherwise, according to law.

4. No person or persons shall depasture any animal or animals upon the Common or any part thereof without having first given notice and obtained permission from the Town Clerk, Lessee, or Ranger in writing.

(a) The following fees shall be paid by any person or persons (except butchers and dairymen) for depasturing stock on the Common under these By-laws, and such fees shall be paid on demand to the Town Clerk or Ranger or Lessee, and if any payment due be not made on demand, the owner or owners and the stock in question shall be subject to these By-laws, and be dealt with accordingly.

For horses, cattle, asses, and mules—15s. per head per annum.

For goats—10s. per head per annum.

For camels—2s. per week, to the number of 10.

In the case of butchers the fee for a license to be issued under these By-laws shall be the sum of Ten pounds per annum or part thereof, payable on or before the first day of November in each year, and for dairymen 7s. 6d. per head up to 25 head of milking cows, in lieu of the aforesaid fees, and over 25 head of milking cows at the rate aforesaid, viz., 15s. per head: Provided that travelling camels shall be allowed to depasture on the Common for seven days without payment of any fee, after the expiration of seven days 2s. per week per

head: Provided, further, that the Commonage Ranger shall have full power to direct the area of the Common upon which camels shall depasture at any time, and the owners shall depasture camels only on the area so directed: Provided, further, that no bull camel, except under the direct and continued control of a shepherd, shall be allowed to run on the Common: Provided, also, that no fees shall be payable under these By-laws in respect of horses, cattle, and camels under the age of 12 months and of goats under the age of six months: Provided, also, that horses, pigs, camels, asses, mules, sheep, cattle, and goats awaiting shipment from Carnarvon by sea or for treatment by a meatworks, shall be allowed to depasture for seven days on that part of the Common known as "Bibbawarra Reserve" without payment of any fee; and after expiration of the aforesaid seven days, a fee of one-eighth of a penny per head per day, or any part of a day, shall be paid in lieu of the aforesaid fees, in respect of pigs and sheep, and a fee of a half-penny per head per day or any part of a day shall be paid in lieu of the aforesaid fees in respect of horses, cattle, camels, asses, and mules. No stock awaiting shipment by sea from Carnarvon or for treatment by a meatworks shall be allowed to depasture on any other part of the Common, except the aforesaid Bibbawarra Reserve, without the written permission of the Common Ranger, and when such permission has been granted, the owner shall pay double the above fees, except in the case of stock whilst travelling from "Bibbawarra Reserve" to Carnarvon for shipment or treatment by a meatworks. No owner of stock on which Common fees are due and payable shall be allowed to remove the stock from the Common unless such fees are paid, or payment thereof guaranteed in writing by some responsible person approved of by the written approval of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the Municipality; and any owner removing, causing, or allowing such stock to be removed (the fact of removal shall be *prima facie* evidence of removal by the owner), shall be guilty of an offence under the within By-laws, exclusive of the liability for the fees aforesaid. No travelling stock, with the exception of stock travelling to and from the port of Carnarvon shall be allowed to traverse the Common. The owner of stock shall give written notice to the Commonage Ranger or Town Clerk of his intention to travel such stock, and shall comply strictly with the provisions of "The Droving Act, 1902," and its amendments. Any *bona fide* traveller, teamster, and packer shall, after having obtained permission so to do from the Town Clerk or Commonage Ranger, be allowed to depasture their horses, bullocks, asses, mules, or camels on the Common without payment of any fee, for a period not exceeding seven days, and after the expiration of such seven days a fee of 2s. per week per head and every part of a week shall be paid in respect thereof, in lieu of the aforesaid fees. No one person shall depasture more than 10 head of cattle at any one time on the Common.

5. Every applicant for permission to depasture under these By-laws shall give a correct list in writing of the number of horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, asses and mules that he or she shall intend to depasture on the Common, and shall describe therein the brands, numbers, and other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain permission signed by the Town Clerk or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and the description of the animals permitted by the Council to depasture on the Common, upon the terms and conditions of the within By-laws.

6. No permission shall be granted to any person, excepting butchers and dairymen, to depasture on the Common at any one time a greater number of horses, cattle, or camels than ten, or a greater number of goats than four, and no person shall be allowed to depasture on the Common at any one time a greater number than ten head of horses, cattle, or camels under the age of twelve months, or a greater number of four goats under the age of six months. Provided that a *bona fide* teamster may depasture on the Common (subject to these By-laws) up to 23 head of camels, cattle, or horses *bona fide* used by him in his team during the time he is in Carnarvon with his team.

7. No license shall be granted to any butcher to depasture on the Common, at any one time, more than 300 sheep, or 30 head of cattle for killing purposes, and no license shall be granted to any dairyman to depasture on the Common, at any one time, more than 25 head of cattle for dairying purposes, without the written permission of the Town Clerk be first had and obtained.

8. The Chairman of the Council, Town Clerk, or other person duly authorised in that behalf may grant permission under these By-laws to substitute any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, camels, asses, or mules, not exceeding the number prescribed by such permission, for those included and described in such permit, and the particulars of such stock shall be indorsed on such permit and signed as provided by By-law 5 hereof.

9. No stock shall be mustered on the Common without the written permission of the Common Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand stock running or depasturing on the Common unless in the presence of the Town Clerk or Common Ranger.

10. No person shall remove, cause, or permit to be removed from the Common any horse, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, asses, or mules in respect of which any fees payable under these By-laws shall not have been paid, and the fact of the removal shall be *prima facie* evidence of the removal by the owner.

11. No person shall run or depasture any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, camels, asses, or mules on the Common except in accordance with the provisions of the within By-laws.

12. No entire horse over the age of twelve months or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Council) shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common, and in addition to the penalty herein-after prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, such entire horse or bull found thereon shall be dealt with as trespassing stock in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Victoria, No. 7), and its amendments.

12a. There shall be a general muster of stock on the Common at such time or times and at such place or places as the Town Clerk may direct. Any entire horse, bull, or bull camel found running on the Common in contravention of these By-laws at such muster may be castrated and branded by the Ranger, lessee, or Council's representative without and responsibility to the owner, or owners of such horse, bull, or bull camel for loss, injury, or damage or otherwise whatsoever, and a castration fee of 10s. for each horse and £1 for each camel and 2s. 6d. for each bull, and a branding fee of 2s. 6d. for each animal, may be charged and shall constitute a debt owing by the owner or owners of such animals to the Ranger, lessee, or Council, recoverable in a manner provided for the recovery of fees and expenses by these By-laws.

13. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any damage or loss sustained by any person by reason of the injury or death from any cause whatsoever of any horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, asses, or mules traversing or depasturing on the Common under the provisions of these By-laws or any of them and whether permission to depasture has or has not been obtained.

14. No person shall remove stock from the Common unless with the written permission of the Town Clerk or Common Ranger.

(a.) The Common Ranger shall, upon the request of any owner of horses, cattle, or camels depasturing on the Common bring or cause same to be brought to the pound yard within 24 hours after such request, and shall be entitled to charge a fee of ten shillings per head of animals over the age of twelve months, or in the alternative shall give permission to the owner or his representative to run in such stock without charge.

15. Stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Common (the onus of proof that the stock are accidentally upon the Common to be upon the owner) shall not be liable to pay Common fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and its amendments.

16. The Common Ranger, Town Clerk, or lessee for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing upon the Common from the owner or any person who is in possession or control or apparent possession or control of such stock and in his opinion able to give such particulars, and any owner or person refusing to give such particulars as aforesaid on demand shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws.

17. (a.) Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause, or allow to be introduced or depastured any diseased animal or animals upon the Common, or allow the same to depasture on the Common, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence and £2 per day per head of animals affected for a continuation of the offence, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

(b) The Mayor, Town Clerk, or Common Ranger or other person authorised may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common, and if he thinks fit to cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid by the owner, and until paid the Council shall have a lien over this and any other animal or animals of such owner on the Common or in the Pound, and such lien shall authorise the Council by its officers to sell such animal or animals to defray the above expenses and costs of sale, and this procedure shall be exclusive of the procedure for the penalty set out in Subsection (a) hereof. And it is further provided, that in the event of any owner of diseased stock or animal which is in the opinion of the Mayor, Town Clerk, or Common Ranger, or other authorised person incurably diseased or injured or in such a condition as to be a nuisance or menace to other stock running on the Common, refusing to remove such diseased or injured stock or animal, the Council shall have power to destroy same and recover all expenses of such destruction, and also all fees due on such stock or animal from the owner thereof. And, in the event of the owner of such diseased or injured stock or animal not being known or not being able to be found, the Council shall have the like powers of destruction after one advertisement in the local newspaper with like powers to recover the expenses of such advertising, destruction, and fees from the owner on his becoming known to or being found by the Council.

(c) The owner of any stock dying on the Common shall be liable for the removal of same, failing which the Council may remove such dead stock, and recover the cost of such removal from the owner by law if necessary.

18. Any person or persons killing stock taken off the Common must render to the Common Ranger each Monday of every week a list of brands of each head of stock killed, and the Town Clerk or Ranger shall have the right to inspect the hides of any stock killed at any time.

19. The Council shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* butcher, dairyman, teamster, drover, and packer within the meaning of the within By-laws.

20. No person shall cut, fell, or remove green or growing timber on or from the Common.

21. Every person having permission to depasture stock under these By-laws shall produce his permit upon being required by any constable or officer of the Council so to do.

22. Any person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for any breach and £2 per day for a continued breach but not more than £20 in the aggregate, where no other penalty is imposed by the By-laws in respect of the specific offence.

23. All moneys for fees and expenses owing to the Council (or the Lessee of the Common for the time being) under these By-laws for the depasturing of stock on the Common, or expenses incurred in connection therewith under these By-laws, shall constitute a debt to the said Council or Lessee recoverable by civil action at the suit of the said Council or Lessee in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

24. The Town Clerk, Lessee, or Common Ranger shall at any time with the approval of the Mayor or Council, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty for any breach of the within By-laws, or any of them.

25. All existing By-laws relating to the Common are repealed as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazette*.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS AND ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES UNDER SECTION 26 OF "THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1909."

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 3rd October, 1923.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the Regulations for the conduct of examinations and issue of certificates under Section 26 of "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909," as set out hereunder:—

THE LICENSED SURVEYORS' ACT, 1909.

Regulations for the Conduct of Examinations and Issue of Certificates and Licenses under Section 26 of "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909" (9 Edu. VII., No. 25).

THE Land Surveyors' Licensing Board appointed under the above Act has, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, made the following Regulations for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act, and revoked the Regulations gazetted on the 16th February, 1917, and additions to Regulations 6 and 12 gazetted on the 5th September, 1919.

In the interpretations of these Regulations the following words within quotation marks shall, unless the context necessarily requires a different meaning, have the meanings set against them respectively:—

"Articles"—An Indenture or writing containing a Contract or an Agreement for the tuition of land surveying made between the Crown or some qualified surveyor or surveyors and a person seeking to qualify himself for the purpose of obtaining a License to practise as a land surveyor.

"Board"—The Land Surveyors' Licensing Board constituted under "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909."

"Reciprocating Board"—A duly constituted Land Surveyors' Licensing Board in one of the reciprocating States.

"Reciprocating State"—Any State, Colony, Dominion, or Commonwealth within His Majesty's Dominions with which reciprocal arrangements have been made by the Board for the recognition of the status of surveyors.

"Qualified Surveyor"—Any person entitled to practise as a Land Surveyor in any part of the British Empire where the preliminary conditions and the standard of examination and of field work are, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to those prescribed by these Regulations.

"University"—A University in the Commonwealth of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand or a University recognised by any such University.

1. An examination of candidates desirous of qualifying themselves to be registered as licensed surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of March of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable. One notice of such examination shall be given in the *Government Gazette*.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board:—

Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, and a fee of £5 5s., all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of 20 years at the time of examination, but no license to practise as a Surveyor will be issued until the candidate attains the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

ARTICLED PUPILS.

5. (a) Before the Board will register articles, the applicant for registration shall furnish satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has passed an examination or examinations accepted by a University as being of Matriculation standard in English, Mathematics, and one of the following subjects:—Applied Mathematics, Physics, Geology, or Forestry.

5. (b) All articles made in Western Australia for the teaching of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be submitted for registration to the Secretary of the Board within three months after the commencement of the term of Articles, and a copy of such Articles deposited with him. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence that the applicant has passed the examination prescribed in Regulation No. 5 (a). Transfers of Articles shall be registered within three months of date of transfer thereof. Each application for registration of Articles or transfer shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

6. A candidate shall have been professionally employed under Articles for a period of four years, of which not less than two and half years must have been served in the field.

(Extension of term of service will not affect candidates who have registered their Articles prior to the gazettal of these Regulations.)

Note A.—The following shall be accepted in lieu of four years' service under Articles:—A University degree of Bachelor of Engineering and 18 months' professional employment under Articles in field work.

Note B.—The following shall be accepted in lieu of one year's office experience of the four years' service under Articles:—A University certificate showing that he had passed the 1st year's course in Mathematics, Science, Theoretical Surveying, and Municipal Engineering.

Note C.—The following shall be considered equivalent to six months' field experience with a qualified surveyor or surveyors:—Not less than twelve months' engineering experience in the Department of Public Works or with a civil engineer, approved by the Board.

7. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from some qualified surveyor or surveyors with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

FORM OF CERTIFICATE FOR PRESENTATION TO THE BOARD.

I, A.B., a qualified surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed under Articles with me in the practise of land surveying for a period of..... from..... to..... (of which..... have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys. (Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.)

(Signed) A.B.

(Date.)

8. A candidate shall produce—

- (a) The plan and field notes of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road.
- (b) The plan and field notes of a survey of a Town Lot, upon which buildings have been erected, as made for the purpose of an application or transfer under the Transfer of Land Act; also a technical description of the said lot.
- (c) On and after 1st March, 1924, a candidate will also be required to produce a plan, field notes, and section of a proposed road, railway, or drainage work; sections to be not less than 10 chains in length.

Note.—Each plan shall bear the following certificate signed and dated by the candidate:—

“I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work.”

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions, and the conditions relating to the registration of Articles are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate shall be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

PART I.—WRITTEN.

Computations.—Computations in connection with cadastral and settlement surveys, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying.

Design.—The use of contour maps, the location thereon of well graded streets and roads, designs for subdivision into town, suburban and rural allotments on modern town planning lines, drainage, and necessary reserves for public utility.

Drawing.—Preparation of field notes, plotting and compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Engineering Surveys.—Computations in connection with levelling, grading, and earthworks.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, etc.—Computations in connection with the determination of azimuth, latitude and time, use of the Nautical Almanac, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; and measurements of altitudes.

(Text book recommended—Chapman's "Astronomy for Surveyors.")

Miscellaneous.—Elementary physics, elementary geology, and elementary forestry.

(The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by Millikan & Gale's "A First Course in Physics"; the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by Geikie's "Class Book of Geology," fourth edition, or Watt's "Geology for Beginners"; and that of elementary forestry, the distribution of native timbers and their economic values; the influence of forests on climate and water supply; the principles to be observed in establishing new forests.)

PART II.—ORAL AND PRACTICAL.

Field Practice.—

- (a) Original boundary marks on Crown surveys, and Land Titles Office survey marks and procedure.
- (b) Measurements and standards of length.
- (c) Selection of townsites and roads.
- (d) Subdivision of land for rural settlement.
- (e) Classification of land and valuation of improvements.
- (f) General and Departmental Regulations under "The Licensed Surveyors' Act, 1909," Department of Lands and Surveys, Land Titles Office and Mines Department.
- (g) General.

Instruments.—Principles of construction and adjustment of the following instruments, with practical field tests:—

Theodolite	Sextant
Tacheometer	Box Sextant
Magnetic Compass	Dumpy Level.

Field Astronomy.—

- Azimuth from solar and stellar observations.
- Latitude by circum-meridian and meridian altitudes.
- Time from solar and stellar observations.

Levelling.—A candidate will be required to adjust his level and run a line of levels between selected B.M.s., and will be questioned on the general principles of levelling.

Surveys.—A candidate may be required to effect surveys under the Board's supervision.

Note.—Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of mathematical tables, 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

11. Candidates holding certificates satisfactory to the Board from a University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and if so exempted shall be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

12. A candidate who has failed in not more than two subjects in Part I., but has otherwise passed a satisfactory examination, may be allowed to present himself again for examination at either or both of the next two succeeding examinations in those subjects only, and will be required to obtain not less than 60 per cent. in each subject to obtain a pass. In the event of failure a candidate must take the full course in any subsequent examination. A similar concession may be allowed in Part II. of the examination.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY AND LICENSE.

13. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall receive from the Board a Certificate of Competency.

14. The Board may, upon being satisfied as to character and identity, and on compliance with the provisions of the Act and these Regulations, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a Certificate of Competency, or to any person who holds a Certificate of Competency issued subsequent to September, 1895, by any reciprocating Board. Each application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

15. A surveyor holding a license entitling him to practise in any reciprocating State, applying to the Board for registration as a Licensed Surveyor without examination, shall produce—

- (a) His license ;
- (b) Evidence that such license is still in force ;
- (c) Evidence as to character and identity satisfactory to the Board ;

and on compliance with the conditions of the Act and these Regulations shall be registered—

- (a) Provided that should such license have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation dated not more than twelve months previously from the Board issuing the License.
- (b) Provided that any surveyor prevented, by absence from the reciprocating State in which his license was issued, from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of such State, shall pass such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee ;
- (c) Provided that a surveyor applying to the Board for registration as a licensed surveyor on the ground of his holding a license entitling him to practise in any country being part of the British Empire prepared to reciprocate in this particular with Australia and New Zealand, shall be entitled to registration, provided he has passed an examination recognised by the Board as being equivalent to the examinations prescribed by the reciprocating Boards and has completed not less than six months' field service with a practising licensed surveyor in a reciprocating State and has also passed such further examination as the Board may require, and has complied with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder.

16. The Board may grant a Letter of Recommendation to any surveyor licensed in Western Australia, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary. Application for such Letter of Recommendation shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

REGISTER.

17. The Board shall cause to be kept a register of the names of:—

- (1) All articulated pupils who have complied with the Board's requirements.
- (2) All surveyors to whom certificates of competency have been issued by the Board.
- (3) All surveyors licensed by the Board.
