WHEREAS by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops; and whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act on the 24th, 25th, and 26th days of October, 1923, between the hours of six and eight o'clock in the evening, in so far as it applies to the closing times of hairdressers' shops situate in the Katanning Shop District.

Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act, and specify the boundaries of and assign a name to such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute as from the 15th day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the Carnamah Road District to be a Vermin District under the said Act, to be known as the Carnamah Vermin District.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 974/23.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from

certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

*Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.**Canning Road Board.**Water Supply Improvements.*

Proposed 4-inch diameter cast-iron water main along the South-East side of Hamilton Street, from the existing main at Perth-Albany Road to the end of the existing tube main in Hamilton Street; together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary connections and apparatus (length about 28 chains), as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., No. 4233.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the eleventh day of October, 1923.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 11765/04.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 18267, for Stock Route near Roebourne, should be placed under the control of the Roebourne Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Re-

serve under the control of the Roebourne Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

THE FIRE BRIGADES ACT, 1916.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment of Regulation 108 of the Rules and Regulations under "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," as adopted by the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board:—

Regulation 108.—Delete paragraph 1, and insert the following in lieu:—

"Officers and members of volunteer brigades who shall have efficiently served for seven years in any one or more brigades in Western Australia shall be entitled to a Long Service Badge; after 10 years' service, a 10 years' bar, and, after 15 years, a 15 years' bar shall also be awarded. Applications, on prescribed form, for badges or bars must show all details of service, and be duly certified by the Captain and Secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation."

"Officers and members of volunteer brigades who shall have efficiently served not less than 15 years in any one or more brigades in Western Australia, of which at least 12 years shall have been under the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board, shall be entitled to the Board's volunteer firemen's Long Service Medal. This medal shall supersede the badge and bars mentioned in the preceding clause and be worn exclusively. Firemen with 20 years' service may wear a red clasp above the medal; with 25 years' service an additional white clasp, and with 30 years' service, an additional blue clasp. Applications, on prescribed form, for medals must show all details of service, and be certified by the Captain and Secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods mentioned in this regulation."

"Officers and members of permanent brigades who shall have efficiently served not less than 15 years in any one or more brigades in Western Australia, of which at least 12 years shall have been under the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board, shall be entitled to the Board's permanent firemen's Long Service Medal."
