P.W. 2049/23. WHEREAS it is provided by Section 233 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that rates throughout a district shall be uniform, except in so far as a Board may fix the rates for any townsite or any area defined for that purpose by proclamation at a higher figure within the limits in the said section set forth; and whereas it is desirable to approve of and define the area hereinafter described as an area within which the Greenough Road Board may not at such higher figure. The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke Regulation 1 as published in the Government Gazette dated the 18th day of December, 1923, and doth hereby make the following Regulation in lieu thereof:

1. This Regulation shall be read as one with the Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of December, 1923, and the 18th day of December, 1923.

"The said area" shall mean all that portion of the State situated within the area bounded by an imaginary line from Rockingham Jetty along the Rockingham Jarrah Timber Company's railway line to the South-Western line; thence North and North-West to a point where the line is cut by Brookman Road, Victoria Park; thence North-East along Brookman Road to Abernethy Road; along Abernethy Road to May Street; along May Street and Corang Street to the South Kalamunda Road; thence East along such road to the infersection of the North Kalamunda Road at Maida Vale; thence North along a Road No. 1135 to the Bellevue Bridge over the Helena River; thence to the Southern end of Farrell Street, where it crosses the Woodbridge Creek running through Bellevue Railway Station; along such creek in a Westerly direction to the intersection of the Toodyay and Gingin Roads; thence due West across the Swan River to meet the Benara Road; along such road to Wanneroo Road; thence South and South-East to Charles Street; along Charles Street to Newcastle Street; along Newcastle Street in a North-Westerly direction to the intersection of Loftus Street; thence South-West along Thomas Street to King's Park Road; along such road to Malcolm Street; thence in a straight line to Point Lewis on the Swan River; thence along the North Point Lewis on the Swan River; thence along the North bank of the Swan River to the North Mole; thence along the coast to the starting point (except the harbour of Fremantle as defined by or under "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902"), established as a quarantine area by the said Regulations; and the words "Infected premises or premises which have been infected" mean premises which the Chief Inspector of Stock shall, by writing under his hand, declare to be or to have been infected. to have been infected.

For the purposes of these Regulations the word "stock" includes cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, and dogs.

96. (a) Every prisoner shall submit himself or herself to be photographed, and to have the prints of his or her fingers, measurements, and other particulars taken and recorded on reception and discharge, and also at any other time when ordered by the Comptroller General. Any photograph or finger prints taken of any person under remand or committed for trial who shall not be ultimately convicted shall, with the plates, be destroyed and not recorded.

(b) No copy of any photograph of a prisoner taken under these regulations shall be shown, given, or sold to any person or persons other than those whose public duty require it.

Amended By-laws-Broome Cemetery.

Department of Lands and Surveys, 1479/89. Perth, 10th January, 1924.

THE Roads Board of Broome, as the Trustees of the Broome Public Cemetery, do hereby, under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, make and publish the following By-laws for the management of the Broome Public Cemetery.

Broome Public Cemetery (Reserve 1647).

- All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise or-
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in Schedule C.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees, in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice being given as above.
 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug,

and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. All coffins shall be made perfectly water-tight. Any coffin not complying with this By-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the receased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representa-tives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall have a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory rea-sons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering same.

The hours for burials shall be from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., Sundays included; and no burial shall be allowed to take place at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

11. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery.

and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

- 13. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Trustees for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representatives.
- 14. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.
- 15. No person shall remove, or cause and induce and person to carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without the written authority of the Trustees or their representatives.
- 16. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Carreton and any person infringing this Break and any person infringing the person in the person and any person in the person of the Trustees, and any person infringing this Bylaw shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plan and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Upon being satisfied on the matters aforesaid,

and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or if no work is to be done may issue a "Grant" in the form "E" in the

Schedule.

- 20. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the form "E; in the Schedule.
- 21. Every such grant shall be subject to the Bylaws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 22. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 23. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Trustees, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead-lined and hermetically sealed.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."
- 25. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be re-opened, for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in the Schedule "A," before an "Order for Burial' will be issued by the Trustees.
- 26. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).
- 27. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 28. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the

Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

29. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

31. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in, broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

32. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slute, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kent in the rough require and mener gendition by conditions. kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

33. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

34. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Super-

35. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Super-intendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

36. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees, in the form contained in Schedule "G"; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoin-ing ground shall be removed immediately the

work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.

to the supervision of the Superintendent.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours. 38. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

39. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work the grantees may either to it themselves or

this work, the grantees may either to it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

40. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall

permitted to decorate any grave.

41. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act, relating to Cemeteries shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the act of a continuing breach a further sum not £20, and in case of a continuing breach a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

42. A plan of the Cemetrey showing the distribu-42. A plan of the Cemetrey showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

43. The area of ground allotted for each grave shall not exceed nine feet by five feet. No more than one interment shall be allowed in each allotted area.

44. The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on 6th November, 1923, and adopted.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19.

Amendment.

M.P.H. No. 2747/23; Ex. Co. No. 4161.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Beverley Road Board, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby repeal By-laws 24 and 25 of Part 1 of its By-laws, and doth hereby make the following By-laws to stand as By-laws 24 and 25 of Fart 1:-

24. The occupier of any premises shall not permit any liquid refuse to be discharged or deposited upon the surface of any street or other land under the control of the local authority, or upon the surface of any part of his premises, except as hereinafter specified.

The occupier of any premises shall dispose of the liquid refuse produced upon the premises by such one of the following methods as may be required by the local authority:-

- (1) By discharging it on the surface of two prepared beds complying with the following conditions:-
 - (a) Each bed shall be of an area of not less than 20 square yards, or such larger area as shall be required by the inspector.
 - (b) Each bed shall be used for receiving liquid wastes for one week at a time, and shall then be allowed to rest for one week. During the resting week, the bed shall be dug up to full spade depth.
 - (c) Where the inspector considers the soil too stiff for the purpose required, the occupier shall cart in sufficient sand to bring the soil to an approved tex-
 - (d) The liquid wastes shall be discharged evenly on the surface of the bed, and not allowed to saturate any one por-
- (2) By discharging into an approved ventilated impervious receptacle fitted with a gas-tight cover, which shall comply with the following condi-
 - (a) The contents of such receptacle shall be removed at such times and in such frequency and in such manner as is directed by an inspector.

- (b) The occupier shall not permit any such receptacle to overflow or become offen-
- (c) The receptacle shall be situated where directed by an inspector.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19.

Resolution.

M.P.H. 862/17; Ex. Co. 4163.

WHEREAS by Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Meekatharra Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that Part III. of such Model By-laws, with the following addition to stand as Clause 3a, be adopted for the district of Meekatharra:-

No person who is not a nurse registered with the Nurses' Registration Board under the provisions of "The Nurses' Registration Act, 1921," shall be granted registration as a keeper of a private hospital of either Class "A" or "B": Provided that this By-law shall not apply to any person not so registered who at the time of the gazettal of the said By-law was the holder of a certificate of registration in respect of a private hospital kept by her.

And whereas under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make Bylaws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Meekatharra Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Meekatharra Health District, doth hereby make the following By-law to stand as By-law 46a of Part I. of its By-laws:-

Part I .-- By-law 46a.

Prohibiting any person executing or undertaking the execution of any work specified in Section 93.

46a. The Local Health Authority having under-

taken or contracted for the efficient execution of the taken or contracted for the emeient execution of the several works specified in Section 93 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," this is to prohibit any person or persons executing or undertaking the execution of any of the several works specified in Section 93; and any person who executes or undertakes to execute any such work shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and liable to penalties provided in By-
