AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 20th day of February, 1924, the following Orders in Council were authorized to be issued. authorised to be issued :-

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. No. 3001/23. WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby re-voke.Regulation 1 as published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 8th February, 1924, and doth hereby make the following Regulation in lieu thereof:---

1. This Regulation shall be read as one with the Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of December, 1923, and the 18th day of December,

1923. "The said area" shall mean "all that portion of the State situated within an area bounded by an imaginary line from the intersection of the Belmont Railway Line with the Swan River; thence in a Northerly direction along Belmont Railway Line to Northerly direction along Belmont Railway Line to its junction with the Eastern Railway Line; thence in a North-Eastern direction along the Southern boundary of the Eastern Railway Line to the Guild-ford-Bassendean Bridge; thence in a South-West-erly direction along the Southern bank of the Swan River to the North-East corner of Location 25; thence in a South-Easterly direction along the North-East boundary of Location 25 to its South-East corner; thence South-East along the North-East boundary of Location 687 and Location 783 to the South-East corner of Location 783; thence South-West along the Southern boundary of Location 783 to its South-West corner; thence due South to the to its South-West corner; thence due South to the intersection of Kalamunuda Road and Corang Street; thence West along Kalamunda Road to Epsom Avenue; thence North-West along Epsom Avenue to the South bank of the Swan River," and

"All that portion of the State situated within an area bounded by an imaginary line starting at the intersection of the Armadale-Jandakot Railway Line intersection of the Armadale-Jandakot Railway Line and the Southern boundary of Fremantle Harbour as defined by Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902; thence in an Easterly direction along the Southern boundary of Fremantle Harbour to the North Fre-mantle Road Bridge; thence in an Easterly direc-tion along Canning Road to its interesection with North Lake Road; thence South along North Lake Road to the Armadale-Jandakot Railway Line; thence in a Westerly and Northerly direction along the Armadale-Jandakot Railway Line to the South the Armadale-Jandakot Railway Line to the South boundary of Fremantle Harbour," and which said area is established as a Quarantine Area by the said Regulations; and the words "Infected premises or premises which have been infected" mean premises which the Chief Inspector of Stock shall, by writing under his hand, declare to be or to have been infected.

Motor Vehicles.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corpora-tions Act, 1906," and numbered 29, for the regulating of the standing of Motor Cars in Streets.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order that By-law No. 29 be repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof :--

The following stands are hereby appointed as stands for Motor Cars licensed under "The Traffic Act, 1919":--

- (1) For Private Motor Cars-
 - (a) A stand in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point 113 yards west of the western side of Barrack Street and extending westwards 37 yards.
 (b) A stand in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point opposite the eastern side of Pier Street and extending contracting for air chains.
 - eastwards for six chains.
 - (c) A stand in the centre of St. George's Ter-race, beginning at the western side of William Street west of the underground
 - (d) A stand on the western side of Foy & Gibson's buildings.
 (d) A stand on the western side of Pier Street, beginning at a point two chains south of the southern side of Hay Street and extending southwards six chains.
 - stand on the northern side of Murray (e) A Street, beginning at a point twenty feet east of the castern side of Pier Street and
 - (f) A stand, with the width of one chain, on the western side of the Esplanade, beginning at the southern side of Bazaar Terrace and extending southwards five chains.
