vision of and issued by the Chief Electoral Officer, whenever directed by Proclamation, and shall come into operation at a date to be stated in the same or any subsequent Proclamation: And Whereas the Chief Elec-toral Officer was directed by Proclamation dated the thirty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to prepare under his supervision and issue new Rolls for each District: And Whereas the new Rolls were duly prepared and issued: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Monday, the third day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twentyfour, as the day upon which the new Rolls for each District will come into operation.

Regulation 2, Subsections (a), (b), and (c) cancelled, and the following substituted:-

- (a) The Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of W.A. in English, Mathematics, and one of the following subjects: -Applied Mathematics or Physics; or
- (b) Such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Surveyor General, be equivalent thereto.

Regulation 4.—Cancelled.

Regulation 6 .- Amended to read as follows:-

A cadet will be required to serve under Articles for a term of four years, of which not less than two and a-ralf years shall be in the field and the balance in the Head Office or a District Survey Office, where he will be instructed in drafting, plotting from field notes, computations, the use adjustment of instruments, field astronomy, geodesy, etc. He will be placed under a Departmental Surveyor for field practice, when every facility will be given him to acquire a thorough knowledge of the survey system of the State.

Note.—A candidate holding a University Certifi-

ente showing that he has passed the first year's course in Mathematics, Science, Theoretical Surveying, and Municipal Engineering will be exempt from one year's office experience under Articles.

For the management and the use of the Town Hall and other Buildings under the control of the Board.

- 1. Interpretation Clause .- In the construction of these By-laws-
 - (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Bayswater Road Board.
 - (b) The word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, or corridor, or stairway or annexe of any such hall or room under the control of the Board.
- 2. Applications for the hire of any building or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such building or furniture is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building or furniture is required.
- 3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in the application for the use
- of such building or furniture.

 4. The rent of the building or furniture (inclusive of the use of crockeryware) shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out on schedule hereunder.
- The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall be-
 - (a) Day: 9.0 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.
 (b) Evening: 7 o'clock p.m. to 11 o'clock p.m.

(c) Extension of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees.

6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.
7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any

building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or furniture shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of any building. the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts above mentioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building.

- In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding bylaw, the hire shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the
- 12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement except when permitted by the Board in writing.
- 13. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons, in the said building whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

14. No person shall, in any part of any building—

(a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxi-

cated;

(b) use profane or improper language;

(c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever. (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage, shall

be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these

(e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage ways of any building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested so to do by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable whether in uniform or otherwise.

15. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be per-

mitted in any building.

16. The hirer of any building shall be responsible for-

(a) maintaining good order and enforcing these by-laws;

(b) any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockeryware, or other part of the property.

The Secretary of the Board, or other duly auth-

orised officer of the Board, or police constable, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the building or any part thereof, at all times during the term of engage-ment, and every facility shall be given them for en-

forcing these by-laws.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect hereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for

FORWARDING OF SAMPLES OF FOOD OR DRUGS TO CONSIGNERS.
