The LAND ACT, 1898. Williams Common By-laws.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Corr. No. 10337/04. Perth, 14th May, 1924. If 18 Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the control of Reserves 8708 and 9576 (temporary Commons in the Williams Townsite), in lieu of those previously published, which are hereby cancelled.

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the fellowing terms shall have the meanings as stated:— $\,$

- "District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Williams District Road Board.
- "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Board"—The Williams District Road Board.
- "Member"—A member of the Williams District Road Board.
- "Road"—Any road as defined by "The Roads Act, 1911."
- "Reserve"—Any reserve or common under control of the Board.
- "Person" shall include the plural, also a body corporate.
- "Officer" shall mean any officer of the Board.
- "Ranger" shall mean the Ranger appointed by the Board.
- "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Board.
- 1. All stock running on the common, otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.
- 2. That with the exception of stock owned by bona fdc travellers, travelling teamsters, or as packers, as hereinafter provided for, no person shall run or depasture stock of any description on the common unless the owner of such stock is the holder of a license under these By-laws and prescribed fees are paid, except as hereinafter provided, and the following fees shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or despasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Williams Townsite and the Williams Road District only to have the right to a license to run stock upon the common.
 - 3. The scale of fees shall be as follows:-
 - Hei'ers over six months—£2 per head per aunum or portion of year.
 - Dairy cows—£1 per had per annum or portion of year.
- 4. Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses and cattle on the common for the space of three clear days free of charge. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 3s. per head per week or part of a week for all horses and cattle.
- 5. Travelling cattle and sheep waiting for railway trucks shall be allowed to run on the common for one clear day free of charge, and travelling cattle and sheep being unloaded from railway trucks shall be allowed to run on the common one (1) day free of charge. If these times are exceeded a charge of five shillings per 100 for sheep and 6d. per head for cattle per day or part of a day will be made.
- 6. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Reserve No. 8708 at any one time a greater number of cows than one head and one heifer, and no license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Reserve No. 9576 at any one time a greater number of cows than one head and one calf under four months old, and from sundown to sunrise these cows and calves must be kept off the town streets.

- 7. Any person or persons running stock on the common may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall pay commonage fees.
- 8. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the common as heretofore provided to furnish the Secretary of the Board or Ranger of the Board with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them on the common, within twelve hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 9. That all annual license fees shall be due and payable on the first day of July in each year, or on the date of issue of license, if applied for and issued during a current year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 10. That no bull over the age of four months (except by permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the common, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
- 11. The Secretary of the Board shall decide upon which portion of the common any licensed or travelling stock shall at any time depasture, and shall have power to travel such stock at any time from any portion of the common to another portion of the same.
- 12. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any eattle depasturing on the said common under the provisions of these By-laws.
- 13. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover or packer within the meaning of these Bylaws.
- 14. The Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws; and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any constable or officer of the Board.
- 16. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, and £2 per day for each succeeding breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
- 17. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.
- 18. The Board may cancel a license without giving a reason at any time by giving seven days' notice of its intention to do so.

By-laws.

8074796 HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and its amendments, to approve of the cancellation of all By-laws for the Management of Karrakatta General Cemetery (Reserve 745) previously published in the Government Gazette, and to approve, in lieu thereof, of the amended By-laws as set out become decrease. hereunder.

C. G. MORRIS, Under Secretary for Lands.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Karrakatta General Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.
- Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
- The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required,
- 5. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.
- 6. Every grave shall be at least 7ft, deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft, from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representatives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.
- 9. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by a Medical Officer of Health, or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.
- 10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.
 - 11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-

Week days-From 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Sundays-From 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

And no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates. and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.
- 13. If for any reason the funeral shall, on arrival at the entrance gates of the Cemetery, remain there for more than 15 minutes prior to proceeding to the graveside, undertakers responsible shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings and sixpence.

- 14. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.
- 15. If application be made to the Trustees to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or of his family, an order from the Governor authorising the Trustees to permit of the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

16. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

17. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

18. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

19. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

20. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Trustees for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representatives.

21. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

22. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without the written authority of the Trustees or their representative.

No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

24. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

25. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

26. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in each case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person

whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
27. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

28. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form ' in the Schedule.

29. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Grant" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the consent of the Trustees.

30. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space sur-rounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Trustees, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead lined and hermetically sealed.

32. If application be made for an "Interment" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."

33. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Berial" on making application for a grave to be reopened, for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the tee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before the interment takes

34. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

35. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend

to the bottom of the grave.

36. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

37. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the

satisfaction of the Superintendent.

38. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall. before commencing any work within the Cemetery, de posit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of cither of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

- 39. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be pre-pared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and ro vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in, broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
 - 40. No catacomb shall be allowed.

40a. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the Cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturday and Sunday excepted, when no work is to be done from noon Saturday to the opening of gates on the Monday morning, without

the written permission of the Trustees.

- 41. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.
- 42. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.
- 43. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.
- 44. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of

these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

45. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

46. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil, or learn shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
- (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
- (d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- In every case where the funeral train from Roe Street platform, Perth, is availed of, the coffin shall be placed in the Funeral Car provided for that purpose the undertaker, and all railway charges shall be paid by him.

The train will be met at Karrakatta Station by the Board's Coffin Car and employees, and the coffin will be borne to the assigned grave by them, at the expense of the applicant for burial.

48. The undertaker or any one of his assistants shall be allowed to accompany the Funeral Train, and enter the Cemetery with the funeral for the purpose of discharging the usual duties of an undertaker.

49. Save as otherwise provided in the last preceding regulation, no undertaker, nor any assistant or servant of any undertaker, shall be allowed in the said train, or to enter the said Cemetery, or in any other manner be connected with the funeral after the cossin has been deposited in the Funeral Car at the

Roe Street platform as aforesaid.

50. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

51. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for

that purpose.

52. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

53. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the

Trustees find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from off the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Trustees the charges laid down in Schedule A.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

55. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees—

(a) That the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received in the late war, and

(b) That the relatives of the deceased are Provided that necessitous circumstances. necessitous circumstances. Frovided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

56. The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers, free of cost, for a term of seven years.

57. Any person committing any breach of any of
