The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 686/23. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works. And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage and Drainage. Subiaco District.

Re-inforced Concrete Outfall Pipes, Re-inforced Concrete Stormwater Drains, Sewerage Treatment Works constructed of Re-inforced Concrete, Re-inforced Concrete Main Sewers and Reticulation Sewers of various sizes, with all manholes, inspection shafts, flushing chambers, pumping stations, and all other apparatus confined therewith.

The locality in which the proposed works will be constructed and the areas to be drained and sewered are shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4267, deposited at the office of the Minister.
