Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of water supply: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.
