WHEREAS by "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, Amendment Act, 1896" (60 Vict., No. 22), the Governor is empowered, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to re-vest in His Majesty, as of his former estate, all or any lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor: And whereas His Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Kalgoorlie Lots R931, R1071, and R1334, registered in the Office of Titles in Volume 217, Folio 69 (R1334), Volume 340, Folio 134 (R1071), Volume 212, Folio 131 (R931): Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation re-vest in His Majesty, his heirs and successors, Kalgoorlie Lots R931, R1071, and R1334 aforesaid, as of his former estate.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are

vested in heads of departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Public Works Department should be vested in Messrs. E. E. Hawkins and A. G. Kirkwood: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the said E. E. Hawkins and A. G. Kirkwood, and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in place of such officers, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 689/21; Ex. Co. No. 5498.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any Public Work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to construct and provide a drain across the North-West corner of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 21, from Buller Road to Summers Road, as shown on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 23192, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works at Perth.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 826/24; Ex. Co. No. 5500.

WHEREAS by Section 29 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to approve of the sale by private contract of any land acquired for any public work, but no longer required for such public work: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section aforesaid, doth hereby authorise the sale by private treaty of the whole of Victoria Location 690, comprising 40 acres, and more particularly delineated and coloured red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 23228; such land not now being required for the purposes for which it was acquired, namely, Mullewa-Cue Railway, Water Supply at Kojareena.

*The Road Districts Act, 1919.**Bruce Rock Road District.**Alteration of Boundaries with Merredin, Corrigin, and Yilgarn Road Districts, and Re-division into Wards, and Constitution of Narembeen Road District.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2816/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and either annex it to an existing Road District or constitute such portion a Road District; divide or re-divide a District into Wards, and may, from time to time, declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board: And whereas it is desirable to:—

- (1) Sever portion of the Bruce Rock Road District and annex it to the Merredin Road District.
- (2) Sever portion of the Corrigin Road District and annex it to the Bruce Rock Road District.
- (3) Sever portion of the Yilgarn Road District and annex it to the Bruce Rock Road District.
- (4) Sever portion of the Bruce Rock Road District (as amended) and constitute such severed portion a Road District to be called the Narembeen Road District.
- (5) Divide the said Narembeen Road District into Wards.
- (6) Re-divide the Bruce Rock Road District into Wards and increase the number of members of the Bruce Rock Road Board.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1) Sever that portion of the Bruce Rock Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Merredin Road District.
- (2) Sever that portion of the Corrigin Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Bruce Rock Road District.
- (3) Sever that portion of the Yilgarn Road District as described in Schedule "C" hereto, and annex it to the Bruce Rock Road District.
- (4) Sever that portion of the Bruce Rock Road District (as amended by Schedules "A," "B," and "C") as described in Schedule "D" hereto, and constitute such severed portion a Road District to be called Narembeen Road District.
- (5) Divide the said Narembeen Road District into three wards, with names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each ward, as described in Schedule "E" hereto.
- (6) Re-divide the Bruce Rock Road District (as amended by Schedules "A," "B," "C," and "D") into six wards, with the names and boundaries as described in Schedule "F" hereto; also to increase the number of members from 9 to 11 and allocate same to the wards as likewise set forth in Schedule "F."

To come into force on and from the 1st day of July, 1924.

MERREDIN ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Territory from the Bruce Rock Road District.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, for the management of the Canning Public Cemetery at Maddington.

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Canning Public Cemetery, Maddington, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "F" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery, or construct a brick grave or vault, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees (on no account will tombstones, railings or the like in timber or other inflammable materials be allowed), and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of twenty shillings (20s.), which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at Gosnells the 10th day of January 1924.

STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under the provisions of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," to be cited as the Transport of Stock Regulations, 1924.

Transport of Stock Regulations.

1. No stock shall be transported by sea from one part to another part of Western Australia except in a clean vessel.

2. The Chief Inspector of Stock may at any time, by writing under his hand, declare any ship to be a clean ship for the purposes of these regulations, but no such declaration shall be made in respect of any ship unless the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that such ship has not, during the last preceding three months, been used for the carriage of any stock, carcases (except dressed poultry), skins, hides, animal products, or fodder of other than Australian origin or loaded at any port outside Australia.

3. If any application is made for such declaration in respect of any ship which has within the last preceding three months been used for the carriage of Australian stock, carcases, skins, hides, animal products, or fodder on any voyage to any port outside Australia, the declara-

tion shall not be issued unless the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that the ship was cleared of such stock, carcases, skins, hides, animal products or fodder before the ship left its terminal port of clearance outside Australia, and that immediately after the departure of such vessel from such port all fittings used in connection with such stock or other things so carried had been thoroughly cleansed by flushing with water: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to dressed poultry intended for use as ship's stores or provisions, or to dressed carcases of Australian origin intended for such use which, or the animals from which the same were derived, were taken on board in Australia and have never since left the ship.

4. The master of any ship arriving at any port in Western Australia from any port outside Australia shall immediately cause all fittings used in connection with stock thereon to be disinfected with a 5 per cent. solution of formalin, under the supervision of an Inspector under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," or under "The Health Act, 1911-1919," or a Medical Officer under such latter Act, or by any person authorised in this behalf by the Chief Inspector, and the person under whose supervision the disinfection shall be effected shall, on being satisfied that such disinfection has been effected, issue to the master his certificate to that effect, which certificate shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

5. A declaration issued hereunder may be revoked at any time by the Chief Inspector, but shall remain in force until so revoked.

6. Any person who by act or omission contravenes any of these regulations or is party or privy to any such contravention shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £250 and not less than £5.

7. These regulations may be cited as the Transport of Stock Regulations, 1924.

The Second Schedule.

ROYALTIES.

1. The Conservator may, with the approval of the Governor, classify permits (as defined in Regulation 20) and concessions and timber or special leases in respect of which royalty is payable under Section 6 of the Act, as of Class A, B, C, D, E, F, G, or H.

2. The royalty to be assessed and payable on Jarrah logs in the round taken under permits as defined (which have not been submitted to public auction or tender) or under timber concessions and timber or special leases by virtue of Section 6 of the Act, shall be as follows:—

In respect of permits and leases of—

- Class A.—£— —. 1.55d. per cubic foot.
- Class B.—£— —. 1.41d. per cubic foot.
- Class C.—£— —. 1.27d. per cubic foot.
- Class D.—£— —. 1.13d. per cubic foot.
- Class E.—£— —. 0.99d. per cubic foot.
- Class F.—£— —. 0.85d. per cubic foot.
- Class G.—£— —. 0.71d. per cubic foot.
- Class H.—£— —. 0.6d. per cubic foot.

3. The royalty—
- (a) on Karri logs in the round shall be £— —. 0.6d. per cubic foot;
 - (b) on Hewn Jarrah or Karri sleepers measured in the square shall be three times the rates prescribed in paragraphs 2 and 3 (a);
 - (c) on Sawn and Hewn Beams with heart in, shall be £— —. 3.6d. per lineal foot;
 - (d) on Split, Sawn, and Round timber cut for mining purposes other than firewood, shall be £— —. 1.2d. per cubic foot.

4. Royalty on Mallet bark shall be 10/-d. per ton.

5. The foregoing scale of Royalties shall come into force on the first day of July, 1924. Provided that where the rate payable by virtue of any permit or lease under the foregoing scale is less than the rate prescribed in the Schedule of Royalties published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th June, 1923, the rate set out above for such permit or lease shall apply as from the first day of January, 1924. Provided also that such royalties shall be payable on timber obtained from the timber leases referred to only during the period of extension granted in accordance with Section 6 (b) (1) of "The Forests Act, 1918."
