PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir Francis AlexTO WII.

F A. Newdegate, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor n and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Greatte until the 31st day of December, 1924, inclusive.

Schedule.

Carlecatup Creek (near Kojonup): The whole of the waters of Carlecatup Creek.
