WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Public Works Department should be vested in Mr. C. H. R. Heale: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the said Mr. C. H. R. Heale, and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in place of such officers, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 599/18.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act, and may divide the area into Districts and define the boundaries of the District; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 30th day of November, 1910, and by Orders in Council dated the 30th day of January, 1912, 6th day of August, 1912, 15th day of July, 1913, 25th day of September, 1914, and 1st day of February, 1924, respectively, alterations were approved in respect of the Schedule of the Order in Council dated the 30th November, 1910; and whereas it is desired to alter the boundaries of the Districts therein defined: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council and under the powers conferred in the said Act, doth order that as from the date of this Order the following alterations shall be made in the Schedule of the above-mentioned Orders in Council:—

By adding thereto the following definition of the boundaries of a new District, to be called the Belka Water District:—

dary of said Location 11498 to its North-West corner; thence along the South boundary of Location 11411 to the West boundary of Location 17077; thence Northerly and along the East boundary of Wickepin-Merredin Railway to South boundary of Korbel Townsite; thence Easterly along South boundary to South-East corner of Korbel Townsite; thence Northerly along the Eastern boundary of Korbel Townsite to its North-East corner; thence Easterly along road to South-West corner of Location 11439; thence Northerly along Eastern boundary of Locations 11436 and 11437 to North-East corner of Location 11437; thence North-Easterly along road to its intersection with Road 4999; thence North-Westerly along road to Wickepin-Merredin Railway; thence along Railway to the prolongation of the North boundary of Reserve 1313; thence along North boundary of said Reserve to its North-East corner; thence North-Easterly along road to South corner of Location 19445; thence North-Westerly along road to North-West corner of Location 11695; thence Easterly along road to South-East corner of Location 19446; thence North to North-West corner of Location 20360; thence along the South and East boundaries of Location 13208 to South-West corner of Merredin Townsite; thence East to point of commencement.

Meat Inspection and Branding Regulations.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," His Excellency the Governor may make Regulations, and may repeal, alter, or amend Regulations so made: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1918, as follows:—

Schedule B is hereby amended by the addition at the end of the said Schedule, of "Osborne Park Health District."

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19.

Amendment.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Perth City Council, being the Local Authority for the Municipal District of Perth, hereby orders as follows:—

That Clause 29 of Part VIII. of the Health By-laws is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:—

Meat.

29. (i.) Every occupier of premises where meat shall be kept for sale shall cause such meat to be protected from contamination by flies or dust, by one of the following methods:—

- (a.) By causing all such meat to be kept in enclosures covered by glass or fine wire mesh gauze; or
- (b.) By covering all doors and window openings and other apertures on the premises with screens of fine mesh wire gauze, and by fitting all doors so that they are self-closing.

Every such occupier shall at all times maintain the fittings provided under this subclause in good repair and order.

(ii.) Every person transporting meat or causing meat to be transported shall, during and in connection with such transportation, comply with the following provisions:—

- (a.) No meat shall be transported or carried in any vehicle unless such vehicle is covered and is provided with efficient ventilation.
- (b.) Throughout the operation of transportation all meat shall be completely covered with clean canvas or other wrapping approved by the Chief Health Inspector of the Council, in such manner as thoroughly to protect such meat from flies and dust.
- (c.) No vehicle used in the transport of meat shall be at any time used in the transport of any offensive matter.
- (d.) No meat shall be carried on any railway except in trucks provided for that purpose, or unless such meat is hung on hooks and is clear of the floor.
- (e.) Any person engaged or employed in the transport or delivery of carcase meat within the district shall, at all times when so engaged, wear a cap which shall be constantly covered with a detachable covering made of washable material, and he shall wear overalls of washable materials which shall completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such covering and overalls to be kept thoroughly clean.
