STATE CITILDREN ACT, 1907-21.

294/20. HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of additional Regulations in connection with Section J50 of "The State Children Act, 1907-21," as set out hereunder.

Regulations concerning State Children placed at Service by Institutions.

These Regulations shall take effect as from the 1st

July, 1924. 2. All 2. All Institutions from which State Children are placed at service shall keep a Register of Wages Accounts as approved by the Sceretary of the State Children Department, which shall be posted up regularly.

3. All agreements shall be numbered consecutively and filed. Such numbering shall harmonise with the accounts

in the Register.
4. Claims for wages due shall be rendered to employers at least quarterly, i.e., September, December,

March, and June.

5. Receipts for moneys received shall be acknowledged on the official receipt form, and moneys brought to account in the State Savings Bank as soon as possible. Receipt books will be issued by the State Children Depart-

6. Money due to the child by the employer must not remain outstanding beyond one month after each quarter. Pailing recovery after that period, each individual case shall be reported in writing to the Secretary of the State Children Department.

7. Accounts will be subject to audit by the Auditor General at least once in each year.
8. In the months of January and June of each year a return shall be furnished to the Secretary of the State Children Department, disclosing on each individual ac-count the balance due by the employer to the child.

9. Official receipts of acknowledgment on the approved form shall be obtained from any child who has received moneys from the Management of the Institution.
