Alteration of Ward Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2438/22.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, transfer to one ward of a district any portion of another ward; and whereas it is desirable to transfer portion of the Kenwick Ward to the Yale Ward of the Gosnells Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby transfer that portion of the Kenwick Ward as described in the Schedule hereto to the Yale Ward of the Gosnells Road District.

GOSNELLS ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Land from the Kenwick to the Yale Ward.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the North-Western boundary of Canning Location 9 with the South-Western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve, and extending South-Eastward along the said side of the Railway Reserve to the right bank of Bickley Brook; thence South-Westward along the said bank of the brook and North-Western boundaries of Reserve 11614 and Location 724 and the North-Western side of Liddelow Street to the right bank of Bickley Brook, and again along the said bank of the brook to the right bank of the Canning

*The Road Districts Act, 1919.**Wyalcatchem Road District.**Re-division into Wards and Increase of Membership.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 4896/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, redivide a district into Wards, and may from time to time declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board; and whereas it is desirable to redivide the Wyalcatchem Road District into Wards and increase the number of members of the Board from seven to nine: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1.) Redivide the Wyalcatchem Road District into six Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in Schedule "A" hereto.
- (2.) Declare and determine that the number of members constituting the Wyalcatchem Road Board shall be nine in lieu of seven as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in Schedule "B" hereto.

To come into force on and from the first day of July, 1924.

WYALCATCHEM ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Wyalcatchem Ward.—Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Avon Location 16155, and extending East passing along a North boundary of Location 17580, to the West boundary of Location 8742; thence 359 degrees 59 minutes, 4 chains 58 and three-tenth links; 66 degrees 11 minutes, 23 chains 13 and eight-tenth links to the Western side of a public road; thence 166 degrees 21 minutes, 31 and three-tenth links; 119 degrees 49 minutes, 10 chains 86 and seven-tenth links; 157 degrees 6 minutes, 72 and five-tenth links along the Western and South-Western side of said public road; thence East to the Western boundary of Reserve 16626; thence North-North-Westerly, North-Westerly, North-Easterly, and North along the Western boundary of said Reserve 16626 and part of the West boundary of Reserve 688 to the Southernmost boundary of Location 17808; thence West, passing along said boundary and the South side of a public road to a point situate North from the North-East corner of Location 14449; thence South, passing along its East boundary to its South corner; thence North-Westerly, Westerly, and again North-Westerly along part of its South-Western boundary to a point situate North from the starting point; thence South passing along the East boundaries of Locations 19384 and 13418 onward to said starting point.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner, and extending Westward along the South boundaries of Locations 11635 and 12843, part of the East boundary of Location 8742; thence by the East, the North, and part of the West boundary of

Wyalcatchem Ward; thence along the Southern side of the Railway Reserve to the North-West corner of Location 16160, and continuing along the Northern boundaries of Locations 16169, 9575, and 16421 to the East and a North boundary of Location 11716, part of the East and the North boundary of Location 11608, part of the Eastern and the North boundary of Location 16520, a North and an East boundary of Location 16584, the East, the North, and part of the West boundary of Location 16533, the North boundaries of Locations 8942 and 8941 to the starting point.

Wallambin Ward.—Bounded on the North by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Coweowing Agricultural Area Lot 90 and extending East along its South boundary and the South boundary of Lot 153, part of the South-Western and the Eastern boundaries of Lot 169, part of the Southern, the Eastern, and part of the Northern boundaries of Location 21678, the Eastern boundaries of Lot 246, Southern boundaries of Lots 115, 116, and 117, Western, Southern, and Eastern boundaries of Location 18083, Southern boundaries of Locations 22215, 20710, and 14831, and the Eastern boundaries of the lattermost, Southern boundaries of Locations 23631, 22870, and 22224 to the District boundary, and along same to the South-East corner of Location 14580.

On the Eastward by part of the District boundary from the last-mentioned South-East corner to the North-East corner of Location 11759.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the North-East corner of Location 11759 aforesaid, and extending Westward along the North and the Westernmost boundary of Location 11759 to the Southern side of the Railway Reserve, and along said side of the Railway Reserve to the East boundary of Location 11629, part of the East, the South, and part of the West boundary of said Location 11629, and again along the Southern side of the Railway Reserve to a point in prolongation Southward of the East boundary of Location 11635.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said point and extending Northward to the South-East corner of Location 11635, and thence by the Eastern boundary of the Coweowing Ward to the starting point.

Koorda Ward.—Bounded on the Westward, Northward, and Eastward by part of the District boundaries, from the South-West corner of Location 20650 to their intersection with the North boundary of the Wallambin Ward.

On the Southward by the North boundary of the Wallambin Ward, parts of the East and North boundaries of the Coweowing Ward, and part of the District boundary to the starting point.

Benjabbering Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the Coweowing Ward, part of the West and the South boundary of the Wyalcatchem Ward, and again part of the South boundary of the Coweowing and part of the South boundary of the Wallambin Ward, from the North-West corner of Location 8941 to the North-East corner of Location 15712.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner and extending Southward along the East boundaries of Locations 15712, 20966, 15717, 11677, 11679, 12919, 12908, 11676, 12898, 11681, part of the North and the East boundaries of Reserve 10992, the East and part of the South boundaries of Locations 17837 and 16190, the West boundary of Location 20194, part of the North and the East boundaries of Location 11520, the East boundary of Location 11521, parts of the North and the East boundaries of Locations 11513 and 11523 to the District boundaries.

On the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundaries to the starting point.

*Harvey No. 1 District.**Additional By-laws.*

IT is notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," of the amendment of the By-laws for the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th April, 1916, in manner following, that is to say, by the addition of By-laws:—

19. For the year commencing the 1st day of July, 1924, and for every subsequent year until otherwise prescribed, the irrigation rate shall be Seven shillings and sixpence per acre of all irrigable land within the district.

20. Irrigation rates shall be payable, in advance, within one calendar month from publication in the *Gazette* and a newspaper usually circulating in the district of notice that the said rate has been ordered to be made and levied.

21. (a.) Subject as provided by the said Act and the regulations, and to the payment of the said annual rate, every ratepayer shall be entitled to receive one watering, which means the application of a volume of water of not less than four inches in depth over the area of irrigable land watered in respect of which area the rate has been paid.

(b.) Subject as provided by the said Act and the regulations, every ratepayer who has duly paid his rates for the then current year shall, during such year, so far as water is available, on payment in advance of the further sum of Two shillings and sixpence per acre of his rateable land for each watering, be supplied with consequent waterings at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Minister may direct.

(c.) If any ratepayer shall in writing notify the Minister, within one month from a rate becoming due and payable, that he will not require to receive a watering during the then current year, the Minister may allow a rebate of the rate as prescribed by Regulation 19 equal to Two shillings and sixpence per acre.

L.W.O.S.T.

Owing to the Middle Ground Bank extending across Hare Channel beacons to the extent of 200 yards to the Northward and 600 yards to the Southward of Laffan Point buoy, the Western edge of Hare Channel is now about 1,200ft. to the Westward of the line of Hare Channel beacons. When Laffan Point buoy is left 600 yards astern, Mariners may then gradually get the Hare Channel beacons in line or slightly open to the Eastward.
